

COLOGNE, Germany (UPI)= Count Karel Godin De Beaufort of the Netherlands, who drove his own four-cylinder Prosche-against-the-best-drivers and cars in the world for eight of his 30 years, died Sunday night as a result of injuries sustained during training runs for the Grand Prix of Germany.
