

Circosta, Hinegardner Voted Top OVAC Coaches for 1973-74

Jay Circosta, who guided Woodsfield High to the Ohio Valley's lone perfect record in football last season, and Bill Hinegardner, highly-successful wrestling coach at John Marshall High, are the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference's 1973-74 coaches of the year.

They tied in balloting conducted among members in the sports news media of the Ohio Valley area and each received an award at the OVAC's Spring Awards fete at Oglebay Park's Glessner Auditorium Thursday night.

Circosta, in his third season as head coach, guided the Redskins to a 10-0 mark, the OVAC Class A title and the Pioneer Valley League crown. His team also ranked fourth in the Ohio high school regional ratings.

Hinegardner's Monarch wrestlers have won three straight West Virginia state championships and have compiled a 54-7-1 dual meet record over the last six years. The OVAC also honored three veteran Ohio Valley sports figures, retired West Liberty State football coach Bob Roe; retiring Bellaire High principal and former coach, Ed Garda; and Brooke High athletic director and former coach, Carllin Dodrill.

Championship awards were presented in basketball to coaches Frank Baxter of Bridgeport in Class AA; Stan Kanleck of Wheeling Central in Class AA; and Sam Andy of Wheeling in Class AAA; in track

in Class A; Jim Crosier of Union Local in Class AA; and Mike Warbel of Steubenville and Hinegardner in Class AAA. Sheldon Grace, a sophomore at Weirton High, received the swimming to coach Paul Blair of Linsly; and in wrestling to coach Eric Carder of Warwood

outstanding performer in the OVAC wrestling tourney.

The \$750 Picoma Industries scholarship went to Steve Wilson of Oak Glen, while the \$500 Morris Plan Bank scholarship went to Joe Tomlan of Bellaire.

Evan Reese of the Ohio Valley Board of Approved Football Officials, presented sportsmanship awards to Woodsfield in Class A, Magnolia in Class AA and Triadelphia in Class AAA, while Charles (Moe) King of the basketball officials' association, presented sportsmanship awards to Linsly in Class A, Barnesville in Class AA and Triadelphia in Class AA. Harry Chorpenning of Linsly officially assumed the 1974-75 presidency of the OVAC and outgoing president Calvin Griffin of St. Clairsville was given a special award in recognition of his work with the conference during the past school year.
