





Bridgeport captures OVAC mat tourney seventh time

Ferry finishes runnerup to Kovalick's Bulldogs

Bridgeport, the perennial champion, again reigns supreme in the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference.

The Bulldogs won the conference crown for the seventh straight year Saturday as they out-distanced a field of six rivals at the Martins Ferry High gymnasium. The host Ferrians were runnersup and offered the Blue its only serious competition.

In fact, the finals nearly turned into another Ferry-Bridgeport dual meet, 10 Bulldogs and eight Purple Riders qualifying for the championship round, along with three matmen from Weirton and one from Linsly.

Bridgeport and Ferry swept the individual honors, with six Bulldogs and five Ferrians winning titles. Coach George Kovalick's champs scored 65 points to 52 for the Purple, coached by John Vrotsos.

Weirton was a distant third with 17 points, followed by Linsly with seven, Steubenville with six, Barnesville with two and Wheeling with one.

The tourney was divided into two sessions, preliminaries and semifinals being run off in the matinee hours and the championship bouts taking place at night. Saturday's heavy snow reduced the size of the turnout for the night session, but nevertheless, an enthusiastic audience was on hand to hail the champs.

Three Bridgeport grapplers — captain Walter Tolarchyk, Frank Cunningham and Bobby Douglas — won OVAC titles for the third straight year. Tolarchyk, defending state champion, pinned Ferry's Bill Schmidt to repeat as 145-pound kingpin; Douglas, moving up from the 112-pound class where he was state champ last year, decisioned Weirton's Larry Ritchie for 120-pound laurels; and Cunningham, last year's OVAC 120-pound titlist, won the 127-pound championship with an 8-1 nod over Ferry's Dick Dunbar. Tolarchyk has not lost a match the last two years, while Douglas and Cunningham have

dropped only one apiece during that span.

One of the 1959 champions, Ferry's George Toundas, was dethroned. He and 280-pound Bridgeport junior, Phil Ward, were tied at 1-1 at the end of regulation time in the heavyweight final. Each scored a point in overtime and a referee's decision was necessary to decide the match in favor of Ward, unbeaten although tied by Toundas in an earlier bout this year.

Bridgeport's other winners were Dennis Bowman, who decisioned Weirton's Harry Burns, 7-5, in the 165-pound final, and Ted Wierzbicki, who decisioned Linsly's John Dezio, 3-1, for the 175-pound crown.

Ferry swept the first two finals of the night, Jerry McDaniel pinning Bridgeport freshman Craig Burley in the 103-pound class, and cocaptain Jeff Jones taking Weirton's Gary Virtue, 4-0, at 112-pounds.

Thus, McDaniel and Jones preserved perfect season's records, as did Rider co-captain Bob Bruney, who decisioned Bridgeport's John Mastusek, 6-3, in the 154-pound class. Another Rider, Jack Kardules, is unbeaten though once tied. He topped Bridgeport's Bob Kuhar, 8-2, in the 138-pound final.

A surprise winner for the Riders was John Heiniger, at 133 pounds. Pinned by Bridgeport's John O'Hara in a regular season match, Heiniger got even by scoring an 8-5 decision in the exciting rematch.

A MAT SALUTE TO DENNIS BOWMAN

"OVAC Wrestling's Trouble-Shooter"

Dennis Bowman has been associated with Ohio Valley Wrestling for more than twenty-five years as a wrestler, coach, official, and promoter.

Denny's participation in wrestling began at Bridgeport High, a school that has developed many great athletes. He was on George Kovalick's 1959 Ohio State Championship squad. Moreover, Bowman was a two-time OVAC champ (1960 and 1961) for the "Bulldogs." Dennis Bowman then followed the man he revered (Coach "K") to West Liberty State College, where he lettered for four seasons and was captain of the wrestling team his junior and senior years.

In 1965, Dennis Bowman began his coaching career when he initiated the first wrest-ling program at Bellaire St. John Central High School. Furthermore, his 1971 "Fighting Irish" team won the OVAC Tournament Championship. Denny then moved across the street to Bellaire High where he again produced many fine matmen, including Mike Kovalick who became the Big Reds' first Ohio State Champ at 185 pounds in 1975.

After leaving coaching, Dennis Bowman truly became a "troubleshooter" for area wrestling. First, Denny spent some time as a very competent official (Who would dare to question his calls!). Second, he co-sponsored the idea of recognizing past OVAC individual champions on the 25th anniversary of their victories. Third, Bowman has literally become the "historian" for wrestling in the Valley. There are very few mat facts that Denny doesn't know. And finally, Mr. Bowman yearly assists at all OVAC Tournament meetings, helps coordinate the souvenir program, and fills in as announcer during the competition.

In closing, Dennis Bowman is affectionately referred to as "The Beast," but he is as gentle as a lamb when it comes to his athletic love — Ohio Valley Wrestling!

The Legacy of George E. Kovalick

This program is dedicated, with love and respect, to the late George Kovalick, who won more championships in more sports than any other man ever to coach in this area, and who was, to a great degree, responsible for the growth in the popularity of Ohio Valley high school wrestling.

Coach Kovalick died on his 61st birthday, April 8, 1984, but left as his legacy to wrestling a group of inspired people who are determined to carry on the program which he developed and nutured with such energy, vision, and devotion.

"Coach K" was not the founding father of high school wrestling in our valley but did more to promote and expand interest in the sport than any other individual. He always stood ready to help any coach or any school which wanted to develop a wrestling team. He also led by example for he enjoyed unparalleled success.

The first seven OVAC wrestling tournaments were won by Kovalick-coached Bridgeport High teams. The next eight were won by Martins Ferry, where John "Cocky" Vrotsos introduced the sport after being indoctrinated into the finer points of wrestling by his good

friend, George Kovalick.

A man who was marvelously competitive, meticulous in organization and detail and with an enormous capacity for work, George was driven not so much by the need to excel as by a sense of responsibility that would not permit him to leave any stone unturned, any avenue unexplored. He was a disciplinarian with little patience for incompetence and even less for laggardly performance.

Coach Kovalick was a man

concerned with more than victory and defeat. He cared about his athletes as boys and men and he cared about what happened to them outside the athletic arena. A great number of coaches, as well as people who have succeeded in other pursuits, were touched by his influence. He never pro-mised them a rose garden but he taught them how to survive the brambles and tangles. He made them winners - not only on the scoreboard but in life.

A graduate of Bridgeport High School himself, Coach "K" served with the U.S. Army in the China-Burma-India Theatre of Operations during World War II. He subsequently enrolled at Kent State University. He played four years of varsity football for the Golden Flashes and captained the team in his junior year. He made All-Ohio collegiate guard as a senior.

George Kovalick began his coaching career in 1950 at Bridgeport as an assistant football and head baseball coach and also initiated wrestling and gymnastics programs. He was to coach for programs. 28 years.

By 1955, he produced a wrestling team which was runnerup in the Ohio state tournament. In 1959, his Bulldogs made history as they broke a straglehold on the Ohio state championship which Cleveland schools had held since 1942. He produced six individual state champions while at Bridgeport and his teams not only were dominant in the OVAC but won five straight Eastern Ohio district

The versatile coach also guided Bridgeport's baseball team to four Eastern Ohio championships, four district tournament titles and three OVAC crowns. Promoted to head football coach in 1960, he moulded a team that lost only

one game.

His work at Bridgeport won him a coaching post at West Liberty State College. Originally hired as head mentor in wrestling and baseball and as an assistant in football, he became head football coach in 1962 and his team that year lost only one game. The following year, his Hilltoppers dropped their opener to Glenville and bounced back to go the rest of the way unbeaten to capture the West Virginia Conference title.

Coach Kovalick, who received his master's degree from the University of Pittsburgh, was presented the 1963 achievement award at the Ohio Valley Coaches banquet at Belmont Hills Country Club to celebrate his feat of directing conference title-winning teams in three sports at West Liberty. He promptly followed up by directing his baseball team to the NAIA championship in 1964.

At West Liberty, one of

his wrestling stars was Bob Douglas, who won an NAIA championship in 1962 and was runnerup in both the NAIA and NCAA tournaments in 1963 before transferring to Oklahoma State University.

Coach Kovalick subsequently moved on to Moundsville High, where he served as football, wrestling and track coach. His wrestlers won the Mountaineer League title in 1967 and were Region One champions and fourth in West Virginia in '68,

In May of 1968, the veteran coach accepted an appointment as wrestling coach at Barstow, California, High School. He returned to the Ohio Valley in 1971 at the behest of his friend and former coaching associate, Gene Remenar, then principal at Weir High. Two years later, he guided Weir High's football team to an OVAC "Big School" championship, a Mountaineer League crown, and to the finals

of the state playoffs.


All four of Evelyn and George Kovalick's sons — George, Mike, Will, and Joe — wrestled and played football with distinct the control of the c Mike Kovalick accomplished the unique feat of being a state champion in West Virginia as a high school junior in '74 and an Ohio titlist in '75 as a senior — after his father had accepted duties at Bellaire High as transportation chief and assistant football and wrestling Will Kovalick became a state champion at John Marshall

Retiring from coaching in 1978, "Coach K" served as athletic director at Bellaire High until the time of his death. He continued to give of his energies and knowledge to the OVAC as baseball and track chairman, as head of the football all-star selection committee and as the sage of the wrestling committee.

Coach Kovalick is a member of four Halls of Fame — at Kent State University, West Liberty State College, the Ohio High School Wrestling Coaches Association, and the Ohio High School Athletic Directors Association.

He was the first recipient of the OVAC's prestigious "Mr. Mat" Award because of his contributions to high school wrestling. The Ohio Valley Wrestling Coaches Association has named its annual scholarship award in his memory.
