

He enlisted the help of the Osiris Shrine and this group gave the game a more meaningful purpose as it would eventually gain the lion's share of the charity proceeds.

Through his good friend, the late George Strager, another mid-week event, "An Evening With the Stars," was initiated and handled with impeccable care by two other longtime friends, Mike Young and Pete Cuffaro.

From the time the OVAC assumed sponsorship of the game, Mumley brought back the Stone & Thomas "Queen of Queens" Pageant which had been a part of the All-Star Game series when it was sponsored by the booster club associations. Stone & Thomas continued to sponsor the event over the next two decades-plus. In recent years, the queen's pageant has continued under the sponsorship of Kaufman's of Wheeling and WTOV-9.

In the meantime, Mumley enlisted the help of Glenn Didriksen and his family, which owned and operated several McDonald's Family Restaurants in the area, to form the McDonald's All-Star Band. This has become an increasingly popular feature of the game.

Mumley's innovative mind produced a game that would help kick off the Ohio Valley football season, a classic that would involve some 60 to 70 football players annually and several hundred bandsmen. Add to that some 25 to 30 queen candidates and a myriad of volunteers who helped make the 10-day to two-week experience a memorable part of their lives.

For a number of years, Rudy and his nephew Sam, along with other OVAC officials and the dedicated men from the Osiris Shrine, would hold a pep rally at Russek Field on the campus of West Liberty State College. Several thousands of people attended these events and, of course, it was Rudy who usually stole the show.

From his days at old Wheeling High to those at West Liberty State College, Rudy was always there to help. Following a stint in the military service, he spent the next three decades or so as an educator, primarily in Eastern Ohio. He was principal at Buckeye South High when he retired.

His service to the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference was ongoing for more than three decades, and he served as president on two different occasions.

Through his efforts and those of his many friends who joined with him to work on various facets of the all-star classic, more than \$600,000 has been provided to Ohio Valley charitable groups.

Several years before his death, which came in early February of 1999, Mumley relinquished directorship of the game to his longtime associate and close friend, Ron Mauck.

Nonetheless, Rudy still remained a familiar figure on the sidelines. His walk had slowed considerably although he had bounced back from a series of illnesses. But, the enthusiasm was as great as ever. He had seen the game reach new heights last year when it was televised live by WTOV-9 and the game still drew a near-capacity crowd.

It was a fitting tribute that OVAC officials several years ago renamed the contest as the Rudy Mumley OVAC Charity All-Star Game.

Rudy was to become one of the most recognizable sports figures the Ohio Valley had ever produced. He was honored as the Dapper Dan's "Man of the Year" in 1992, and earlier was inducted into the Athletic Hall of Fame at his beloved West Liberty State College, following in the footsteps of his late brother, Eli, Rudy was the first non-athlete or non-coach to earn this honor, and in recent years, he became a prominent benefactor to the school.

Educator, humanitarian and philanthropist. That's the legacy of a guy who wanted to be known simply as Rudy.

And as long as this game can survive, fans of the Ohio Valley for the coming generations will be able to look skyward and say, "Thanks, Rudy!"





For more than three decades, Samuel A. Mumley served the youth of this area as executive secretary of the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference.

Last February, "Sammy" was called home by his maker to receive his just reward for a lifetime spent in service to others.

Perhaps the greatest compliment one can pay Sam Mumley following his passing is to say that he made his world a much better place to live because he once walked among us.

Mumley devoted nearly five decades to working for the youth of our Ohio Valley. In addition to his time as executive secretary of the OVAC, which is still

believed to be the largest high school athletic conference of its kind in the United States, Mumley was an athletic trainer, coach, basketball official, teacher and a school administrator.

If that wasn't enough time to give, Mumley joined Eric Carder, an assistant principal and director of activities at Wheeling Park High School, in serving as co-director for the West Virginia Super Six state high school football championships, which they brought to Wheeling Island Stadium six years ago.

Additionally, the pair helped secure the West virginia state soccer championships held last year at the brand new athletic facility at Wheeling Jesuit University.

Sam also played a major role in the wonderful mid-summer football spectacle you are attending tonight at Wheeling Island Stadium. Renamed several years ago to honor his uncle, who also passed away earlier this year, the Rudy Mumley Charity All-Star Football Classic was revived in 1972 under the sponsorship of the OVAC.

In those days, the NCAA made things difficult for sponsors seeking sanction to hold various all-star contest. The local Ohio-West Virginia Ali-Star game had been dormant for many eyars after having been a fixture on the Ohio Valley gridiron scene since the early 1940s.

Both Mumley's spent hundreds of hours putting together the formula for a program that the NCAA found acceptable. Today, the game is more vibrant and popular than ever among the area football fans, who nearly pack the Island Stadium each and every July to kick off a new gridiron campaign.

They also helped turn this event into more than just a football game. It has become a mid-summer spectacular complete with an All-Star Band, cheerleaders and the pageantry of a Queen of Queens contest.

It also helped raise hundreds of thousands of dollars for charitable organizations in the Ohio Valley over the past 26 years.

Much of these wonders have been achieved because Mumley refused to take "no" for an answer from anyone and because he dared to dream what many of us have considered to be impossible dreams.

Who would have believed that the state high school football championships could ever be lured out of Charleston to the Northern Panhandle?

Sam did.

And Wheeling will host the state title games for the sixth straight year the first weekend of December. Through his fund-raising efforts and the help of countless corporate sponsors and Super Six volunteers from up and down the Ohio Valley, the state football finals have been raised to a level that may never be matched in the Mountain State.

When Mumley came back to take over a second time as executive secretary of the OVAC, the league was in dire financial straits.

Through Mumley's efforts and the backing of other leaders in the community, an OVAC Foundation Board was formed to serve as a fund-raising arm of the bi-state league. That board is still in existence today.

The sports programs at the various schools were improved immensely. All-star games are now held each year in football, boys' and girls' basketball, baseball, softball and boys' and girls' soccer. The OVAC sponsors championship tournaments in wrestling, swimming, tennis, golf, volleyball, baseball, softball, boys' and girls' soccer, boys' and girls' cross country, boys' and girls' track, cheerleading, etc.

Girls sports have risen to equal importance because Sam had the foresight and the courage to support each and every program offered by the OVAC. His efforts with girls' sports earned Mumley a seat on the equity panels for both the Ohio High School Athletic Association and the West virginia Secondary School Athletic Commission.

The scholarship program also has been enhanced by Sam's ability to involve the corporate sector of the various communities within the extensive OVAC map. At last May's OVAC Banquet of Champions held at the Wheeling Civic Center, more than \$15,000 in scholarship money was awarded to deserving OVAC student-athletes.

That money wasn't just found on the street corner; it was obtained largely through tireless efforts of the late executive secretary.

Sam put the OVAC's "kids" first in all his dreams and work for the conference. "What can we do for the 'kids'? How can we make things better for them?" Those were the first questions he posed whenever the OVAC or Super Six would discuss changes in their programs.

He took great pains to involve everyone in conference business. He was constantly in touch with media members, keeping them updated on matters and seeking their opinions.

When important final decisions had to be made, Sam didn't mind being the one to make them. But he did so after many discussions among his constituents and his own private soul-searching. And, of course, his main concern was making sure that the decisions were in the best interest of the OVAC student-athletes.

From a personal standpoint, if Sam became your friend, he was your friend for life. He was always there with a kind word, a bit of advice if it was asked for, and encouragement when any of his friends were in a difficult situation.

I once wrote in a column that Sam was no saint, but that he was sent to us by angels to perform good works and turn our impossible dreams into reality.

He dearly loved his wife, Nancy, who remained by his side through good times and rough times. No different from the rest of us, Nancy became part of the OVAC family as well, taking care of the conference's financial books, a role she continues to handle today.

They were married just 11 years when Sam passed away. But, as Nancy once said, they crammed 40 years of happiness into that short time.

A long bout with cancer terminated Mumley's life at the too young age of 67. But, as this writer has stated before, you won't make me believe "Sammy" lost that fight with cancer. Nothing defeated Sam Mumley in his lifetime. God, whom Sam believed in with all his heart, simply decided it was time to call him home.

Sam Mumley was one of a kind.


He will remain in our thoughts and prayers forever.







27 Years... OVAC All-Star Football Classic in Retrospect ...and The Tradition Continues

vast majority of people said it would never happen, many felt that it was impossible and some believing that it was to no avail..."The OVAC would not gain NCAA sanction for the resurrection of the defunct Ohio-West Virginia All-Star Football Game." True, as it was, the 1960's did not allow the conference much latitude for its quest for an NCAA sanction.

As general information, at that time it was mandatory to have NCAA sanction, otherwise those college bound grant-in-aid players would be declared ineligible for their freshman year. Therefore, during the early and middle 1960's, the Ohio-West Virginia All-Star Football Game drew those athletes of lesser athleticism or those not considering to participate on the collegiate level. Through such sanctioning, the NCAA could totally regulate any and all summer all-star contests, thus putting the "squeeze" on booster clubs and civic organizations who endeavored to work around such regulations. The Ohio-West Virginia All-Star Football Game fell into this category, thus ending the game in the late 1960's and with it the once celebrated official opening of the Ohio Valley's "pigskin" season.

"We are not going to be denied," said Sam A. Mumley, Executive Secretary of the OVAC. "The rich athletic heritage of this valley as well as having one of the most prolific scholastic conferences in the country should entitle us the opportunity of showcasing our student athletes." In this respect the conference executive board passed legislation which directed the executive secretary to set the course in obtaining NCAA sanctioning, all of which would cover three years of time, effort and patience.

Beginning in early 1968, and with the intent of gathering preliminary information, it readily became apparent that the "deck was stacked" and those who originally commented on the impossibility of such an adventure their opinions seemed correct. However, the decision to move forward with our game plan remained and it was full speed ahead with enthusiasm, confidence and faith. What followed were days and months of endless phone conversations ranging from those with NCAA officials in Kansas City to those local and state political leaders as well as keeping the media constantly informed. Additionally there were endless committee and board meetings as well as dinner and luncheon engagements all designed with the purpose of seeking sanction approval.

1968 and 1969 quickly became history and among all of the other conference business, the OVAC was very busy in Implementing its Title IX Program for Girls. Such female programs were introduced with the 1970 school year, two years before the federal mandatory date of September 1972. During this time period the conference was also formulating a full scale scholarship program, Partners in Academic and Athletic Programs, re-designing those needed changes in many sport levels and maintaining a sound financial base for all conference operations. Regardless, the NCAA all-star sanction movement was in full swing with constant communication between the NCAA and the OVAC on target.

Late in 1971, a remarkable turn of events took place as the NCAA informed the OVAC that they reviewed one of our many proposed all-star formats and found some definite interests in the overall structure. This, then, lead to three continuous months of very intense correspondence and phone conversations. At this juncture it was felt that we were closing in on gaining sanction and the pendulum was swinging toward our future.

Then it happened...late February 1972, a registered letter from the NCAA arrived at the conference office officially notifying the OVAC that the NCAA Review Board for all-star contests had awarded total sanction for a conference all-star game for the summer of 1972. Overwhelmed and overjoyed, the conference held a monumental press meeting at the McClure Hotel in Wheeling announcing all the details relative to the first OVAC All-Star Football Game. Rudy Mumley was already in the fold as our first director and remained as such for 23 years. In 1986, the game was officially re-named as: The Rudy Mumley OVAC Ohio-West Virginia Charity Football All-Star Classic.

Tonight's 27th Annual Extravaganza will have produced...1,500 players • 3,220 musicians and directors (since 1982) • 500 cheerleaders • 750 queen candidates • 300 coaches, trainers, doctors, and managers • 225,000 fans...and an enormous array of Shriners and volunteers, all major contributors in distributing over \$600,000.00 to local upper Ohio Valley charities.

While the Ohio and West Virginia gridders are resting for their annual clash tonight at the Island Stadium, the sixteen lovely girls who are vying for the Queen of Queens crown of the 10th Annual All-Star Game, will participate in a parade and a tour of the Ohio Valley prior to appearing at the game.

A motorcade of 16 convertibles will parade over the streets of Wheeling starting at the McClure Hotel, where the girls will be quartered in a suite of rooms at 11:45 a.m.

The convertibles with the 16 attractive girls will leave the McClure Hotel and travel south on Eoff Street to 16th, then west on 16th Street to Market, north on Market to 10th Street west on 10th to Main and South on Main to 22nd Street and then on to Benwood. From Benwood the motorcade will move on to Moundsville and then back to Benwood, from where it will cross the river and visit Bellaire and move through the towns to Steubenville. From Steubenville the parade will travel to Weirton, Chester, Wellsburg, Follansbee, and then back to the McClure where the girls will rest for the game.

The girls will make a grand appearance at the Stadium at 8:15 p.m. The Queen of the High School Queens will be crowned at colorful halftime ceremonies.

The following seven pages are a detailed document of the history of the Ohio-West Virginia All-Star Football Game. A sincere "Thank You" to Babe Schmitt of the OVAC Game Committee for all the hard work that he has put into this document.

In the beginning... "1940" The First All-Star Game

West Virginia's senior All-Star schoolboys today held a 13 to 17 victory as the aftermath of their first meeting with the eastern Ohio team in the maiden football contest played under the new lighting system at the Island Stadium.

The victory of the mountain state youths, who had trailed from the opening quarter until the last seven minutes of the ball game, 7-0, came as a mild surprise as two well-drilled and highly efficient combinations delighted an early season crowd of some 8,000 fans.

The Ohioans drew first blood in the spectacular contest. A Mallery-Shackleford pass, late in the first period, moved the Buckeyes from midfield to the West Virginia 25. Sadlowski, another Bellaire back, took a pass that planted the ball on the nine, from where Sadlowski scored in two plays.

The remainder of the half was devoid of a distinct threat on the part of either team although the Rowe-Howell coached combine had advanced to the Ohio 25 when the intermission arrived.

The mountaineer sturdy rush line battled the equally effective Ohio forwards on fairly even terms into the final period before Johnny August, a Shadyside youth, who shared the starting role for the Bucks, was hit hard on his own 30 and Joe Corba, a Follansbee back, seized the white leather for the eventual winners.

Charlie Helinski, Union product, became a ball of fire at this stage. He wheeled off tackle to the Ohio 19 and then lugged the leather to the five aided by a too many times out penalty. Helinski picked up a yard and Mike "Punchy" Dimitro punched his way into the payoff zone. Dimitro cracked the line for the extra point and the issue was deadlocked. Passes Decide Battle The West Virginia stands settled back after this furious display satisfied with a 7-7 standoff, but the mountaineers were fired with the idea of victory when one of Joe Mallery's passes was intercepted near the 50 shortly after the succeeding kickoff.

Helinski niched successive passes to Phil Saseen and after the second toss to the Central Catholic back had planted the ball on the Ohioans nine. Helinski and Dimitro required three tries before the former had found the pay dirt and the West Virginia youths had a 13-7 lead.

The remaining time allowed for another kickoff and the West Virginians successfully negotiated an onside kick, recovering the ball as the fray ended.

Coaches Bill Kerns of WVU and Don C. Pedden of Ohio University were the honorary mentors and in addition to sitting on the benches of the contesting squads, both spoke over the P.A. system at halftime. Kerns was accompanied here by Frank Kutz, one of his line mentors, and Ray Carnelly, his plebe mentor. The trio departed today for Charleston and tonight's North-South Game, although Kerns had an opportunity to talk to some local prospects.

Bill Stobbs, the Wheeling native who tutors the Wittenberg athletic teams, was one of the spectators in the stands. Another was George Roark, coach of W & J's Presidents, and probably there were others.

Carl Hamill, Weirton's cagey tutor was in the dressing room to minister to a pair of his former Red Riders. Tony Brown aggravated an old should injury while Luke Tomasovich received a cracked rib.

The West Virginians showed big Sedor due respect while the prospective Ohio State youth was in the game. His Shadyside backfield mate, August despite his costly fumble, was one of the big guns in the Bucks' effort and the Niemiec-Hartwig combinations thrusts left the West Virginia fans worried.

Lou Caffaro, recovering from nasal a operation, held the sticks for the West Virginians but felt the call of battle in his impassive role. Paul Bricker, Weirton end who handled the kicking for Howell and Rowe, and did an effective job although one of his boots slipped off the side of his foot and out of bounds.

"1949" All-Star Game – 50 Years Ago

Punching through the strong Ohio forward wall for a touchdown in the first period, West Virginia regained the lead in the Ohio Vall all-star series last night as they downed the Buckeyes, 6-0, at Wheeling stadium before an estimated crowd of 10,000 people.

The West Virginia team generated a concerted drive, coupled with two Ohio penalties to put across the only score of the game. The Buckeyes, after receiving the opening kickoff, were forced to punt to West Virginia. An offside penalty against Ohio and a nine-yard gain by Bill Renyolds, of Saint Mary's gave West Virginia a first down at the 42. A series of plays failed to move the Mountaineers forward and Norman kicked out on the Ohio 31.

But a 15-yard penalty against the Buckeyes gave W.Va. the ball on the Ohio 40. Gene Kamensky of Weirton, Ed Norman of Triadelphia, co-captain Sonny Fromhart of Moundsville, and Renyolds alternated to carry the ball to pay dirt. It was Norman who hit the center of the line and finally put the ball on the one-yard line. On the fourth down, Norman gave the hand off to Renyolds who swept around right end for the touchdown. Co-Captain Jim Sperlazzo failed to convert the extra point.

After the kickoff, Ohio moved to its own 37 before Kamensky intercepted a pass to Clark Street of St. Clairsville on the W.Va. 40 and ran it back to the Ohio 37.

In the evening's most spectacular piece of razzle-dazzle, Fromhart and Norman teamed up to execute the ancient Statue of Liberty play. It was nullified by a holding penalty, which set W.Va. back on the Ohio 45m after the play had gone to the 20-yard line.

Earlier in the second quarter the Ohio team found itself in a bad spot after Norman had punted out on the Ohio 6. Ben Kernik of Powhatten, and Joe Porter of Bridgeport sparked the Ohio team in a drive that carried to the 37. Kernik's line plunges and Porter's passes raised the hopes of the Buckeye fans, but Kernik

was forced to punt out on the W.Va. 40.

After W.Va. had driven deep into Ohio territory, Coach Slick Morton's team took to the air to try to get back into the game. Ben Kernik and Lee Simpson, who later suffered a dislocated shoulder, made a first down for the Buckeyes on the W.Va. 45. Porter's passing carried to the 25, but two possible chances to tie the score slipped through receivers hands. The first half ended with W.Va. in possession of the ball on its own 37.

Ohio opened up an offensive threat that produced four first downs to only one for West Virginia. It was this period that Ohio made its most serious scoring threat with the ball in West Virginia's possession. Norman intercepted a pass by Porter on the West Virginia 8, and the next play found the ball bobbling around in the W.Va. end zone. sive back, grabbed the ball and raced out to the W.Va. 12. Jim West's run back of a 45 yard punt to the midfield mark gave Ohio its last scoring chance. Reynolds interception of a Porter pass on the West Virginia 30 ended the threat.

Coach Charley Caldwell's Mountaineers drove to the Ohio 25 before losing the ball. A funble by Kernick gave West Virginia the ball at about the same spot again when Jim Sperlaza of Wellsburg pounced on the loose oval. The final whistle sounded with W.Va. on the Ohio 8.

The victory gave West Virginia a 4-3 edge in the seven game history of the series.

Lee Sampson, whose flashy running for the Ohio squad kept the W.Va. defense in trouble, was removed to Wheeling hospitsl when he suffered a separated shoulder in the third period.

"1959" All-Star Game – 40 Years Ago

West Virginia's "home grown" Mountaineer All-Stars ground out a sapage 7-6 victory over the Ohio Stars last night in the 17th renewal of the dream classic at Wheeling Stadium.

The sure-footed toe of Bob Butts, Union fullback was the margin of victory as the Mountaineers came from behind to break the victory famine. Ohio had wond the four previous starts.

With the Buckeyes sitting atop a sixpoint margin, West Virginia launched a 66-yard touchdown drive for victory. After the Mountaineers pounded down to the goal line, Parkersburg's Dave Boston blasted over from one yard out for the equalizer, and Butts' placement broke up the game.

For the first time in history of the fray, the rival quarterbacks were the stars of stars. Larry Tracewell, Parkersburg quarterback was voted the most valuable player on the Mountaineer squad, while his Ohio counterpart, Jim Hayes of Wintersville, who scored the Buckeye touchdown late in the first quarter, was named the Ohio MVP by the sportswriters.

Larry Tracewell downed Floyd White's kickoff in the end zone and West virginia took over at the 20. Bob Butts drove for three yards at guard. Dave Boston hit off tackle and went 46 yards to the Ohio 41. Catfish Hearst's fumble was recovered by Tracewell for a nine-yeard loss. Boston then picked up three. George Mills then dropped Tracewell's pass and Roger Crow's punt was blocked by White. Crow grabbed the ball and got back to the West Virginia 48 but Ohio took over.

Bill Seach hit center for five yards and then Jim Hayes, on a keeper gained 18 yards to the W.Va. 25. Jerry Dougherty added twelve around end. Hayes picked up six more on another keeper. Ohio was fined five yards for offside. The Mountaineers tossed Hayes for a three yard loss and three passes fell incomplete with West Virginia taking over at its own 14.

Butts crashed for six, Boston added one, and then Butts hit for 10 and a first down at the 35. Boston picked up a yard; Rod Albaugh's pass fell incomplete. Butts was held for no gain, and Crow's punt went off the side of his foot and out of bounds at the Ohio 38.

The Buckeyes struck from there for their touchdown. Seach picked up his own fumble for a one-yard gain, and Hayes picked up eight on his favorite keeper play. Seach made it first down at the 50-yard line. Hayes hit right end on the keeper to score the touchdown with 1:15 to play in the quarter. Jack Kirkpatrick's placement was blocked.

Tracewell took the kickoff from the one to his own 26. Butts crashed for four, Boston three, and Butts cracked through for four and a first down at the 46 as the quarter expired. Albaugh lost two and then Catfish Hearst hit off the right side, cut back and sprinted for 26 yards to the Ohio 29. Butts got six, Boston added one, but Ken Civinski pounced on a Mountaineer fumble to give Ohio possession at their own 24.

Jim Roach carried for one and then passed to Dege Christian for 10 yards and a first down at the 35. Dougherty picked up one, Roach added four, and then Hayes, fading to pass, was thrown for a whopping 17-yard loss by three rushing gold clad defenders. Hayes punted and Tracewell returned to the Ohio 34.

Butts got nine and West Virginia advanced to the Ohio 18 via an Ohio roughness penalty. Butts picked up three yards, Catfish lost four back to the 19, but then Butts roared through for 14 yards and a first down at the five. Tracewell sneaked for one, Butts crashed for two, and Boston leaped over for the touchdown. Butts placement was good and West Virginia lead 7-6.

Butts kickoff was taken by Christian on a reverse to the 18. He picked up two more, Dougherty added seven and Seach gained two for the first down. Dougherty lost three and Ohio dropped five more on an offside penalty. Hayes threw to Christian for 11 yards and then with time running out, hit the same target for 13 more yards to the Ohio 48. Roach's pass to White was good on an interference charge to the West Virginia 38. Another long pass was batted down and then he hit Christian for six yards as the half ended.

White took Butts' short kickoff to open the second half on the Ohio 25 and returned to the 47. Christian on a crossbuck picked up three, Albaugh stopped Doiugherty out in the flat for a loss of seven yards. Hayes threw to White for 17 yards to the West Virginia 40. A personal foul on the Mountaineers hiked Ohio down to the 25. Larry Marquis then recovered a Dougherty fumble on the West Virginia 26.

The Mountaineers opened up with Butts running for three and then gave the ball back as Jim Wallace recovered a fumble at the 27.

Seach blasted for two, Mel Mason, the same. An incomplete pass by Hayes was followed by Roach's fourth down pass that was broked up by Walt Steinman.

Hearst was held for no gain. Butts turned right end for eleven to the 34 and Butts then picked up another yard. Tracewell lost eight but then, on a twisting, running sprint picked up 24 yards to the West Virginia 47. Boston hit for three, the Catfish reversed to the left for 16 yards and a first down at the Ohio 34. Boston picked up six, and then Ohio drew a five-yard penalty but it still wasn't a first down Tracewell made it with a keeper to the 22-yard line. He added three on the next play. Hayes fumbled but Tracewell recovered for a three-yard gain. Butts added one; Boston was short by inches of a first down at the 12 as Ohio took over.

Hayes skirted end for four; Dougherty put the ball on the 19 as the quarter ended. Steve Kokovitch hauled in a 33 yard aerial to the W.Va. 48. Hayes hit right tackle for six, and Dougherty added two, and then Dougherty added two, and Hayes threw to Bill O'Niel for 19 yards to the 21-yard line. Hayes then took personal charge of the game. He turned left end for three, hit right tackle for 11 to the seven, another yard off tackle to the six, but his pass to the endzone was batted down by Tracewell. He fumbled on the next play and Walt Steinman recovered at the three.

West Virginia gave the ball to Boston for a yard and Ohio drew a five-yard penalty for delay of game. Boston picked up two. Tracewell was stopped for no gain. Hearst hit for two, but a backfield in motion penalty cost five yards. Tracewell flipped a flat pass to Boston for six yards to the 21-yard line. Tracewell hurled to Mills on a buttonhook to the 27. Crow punted to the 38 but a five-yard penalty set the Mountaineers back to the 22. His next try was brought in by Christian who returned it to the West Virginia 47.

Bob Fuller downed Dougherty for no gain. Hayes' long pass was just barely missed by Christian. Roach's jump pass Kokovitch advanced the ball to the 37 for a first down. The next pass was intercepted by Albaugh at the 27 with three minuted to go.

Boston roared around right end to the W.Va 48. Butts bulled for six over left tackle into Ohio territory. He hit the other side for three more. Tracewell sneaked for the first down to the 38. Butts was held for no gain with seconds ticking off. Boston hit tackle for four, and then West Virginia drew a five-yard penalty for delay of game. Tracewell hugged the ball for no gain and Ohio took possession with three seconds left in the game. Hayes threw a long pass but Tracewell knocked it down as the game ended.

"1969" All-Star Game – 30 Years Ago

Scoring two touchdowns before they had ever run a play from offensive formation, the underdog West Virginia gridders made an early lead stand-up in a 12-0 victory over Ohio in the annual Ohio-Valley all-star football game, played before 3,800 fans Saturday night at Wheeling Stadium.

The intrepid Mountaineers shocked the favored Buckeyes with two long and sudden scoring strikes in the first six minutes of the ball game as Wellsburg's little Kit Kull raced 70 yards with a punt for the initial TD and Weirton's Jeff Jenessee picked a fumble out of the air and rambled 63 yards for the second score.

A giant defense line and the celebrated passing arm of St. John's Central quarterback Allen Hornyak had made Ohio the pre-game pick but West Virginia laughed at the odds. The Mountaineers short-circuited the touted Ohio Aerial game with six interceptions - five on passes by Hornyak and one throw by Wintersville's Pat Kuzum. After the quick Mountaineer scores early in the game, Ohio fought back and made deep penetrations into West Virginia's territory but was twarted once by a fumble at the Mountaineer four and subsequently by interceptions - one each in the second quarter by Triadelphia's Gary Tominack and Bishop Donahue's Mark Skypack and four more in the second half.

The Buckeyes never really mounted a serious offensive threat in the second half. In fact after intermission they were never inside the W.Va. 45 as two interceptions by Weirton's Tom Battista and one each by John Marshall's Iggie Kalcum and Tridelphia's Don Ward took the steam out of their attack.

On the other had, coach Dan Hamill's Mountaineers mounted two serious bids in the third quarter. The John Marshall passing combination of quarterback Tweedlie and flanker Norm Whitlatch combined for three straight completions good for 45 yards and advanced the W.Va. Club to the Buckeye 27 but there the threat petered out. Subsequently, a Bastitsta interception gave W.Va. the oval at the Ohio 37. It was Tweedlie to Witlatch for seven yards and Kalcum made a first down at the 26. However, a pass interception by Gary Clutter, of Wintersville, in his own end zone killed this bid. Early in the fourth quarter, Tweeklie's 36-yard punt that rolled out of bounds at the Ohio six put the Bucks in a deep hgole and they were never able to climb out of their own territory the rest of the warm evening. Hornyak was intercepted three times in the last five minutes of the game.

Actually, Mountaineer defenders latched on to more Buckeye passes than did Ohio recievers. Ohio completed just 5 of 22 aerials for 54 yards while West Virginia hit nine of 23 for 93 yards. Coach Denny Bowman's ground game, with St. John's star Tom Kouski, Martins Ferry's hard running Dave Bruney and Wintersville's Clutter doing the heavy duty ball-toting, managed 135 yards but the West Virginia defenders stopped it when they had to. The Mountaineers made just 93 yards rushing and had only seven first downs to Ohio's 10. Moreover, West Virginia backs were tossed for losses of 32 yards to Ohio's 11. Each side lost 20 yards to penalties. At game's end it was announced that Kull had been selected as the outstanding W.Va. back and Skypack as its outstanding lineman. On the Ohio side, honors went to Kouski and St. Clairsville giant Tom Baxa.

West Virginia played alert opportunistic football to attain and protect a 12-0 lead in the first half. Kull's sprint to the initial TD came before the game was five minutes old as he gathered in a punt by Ron Bobek of Shadyside at the West virginia 30, zipped up the west sidelines as his teammates mowed down the would be tacklers, and galloped 70 yards to the end zone. The placement for extra point by Triadelphia's Gary Tominack was wide.

Ohio bounced back after the next kickoff to penetrate to the West Virginia 37 but then Hornyak's handoff attempt was popped into the air and Weirton's Jeff Jannessee grabbed it and sprinted 63 yards to a second six pointer which came with 4:45 left in the period. The placement attempt for the extra point by John Marshall's Tom Tweedlie was partially blocked by Bobek.

Late in the opening frame, Ohio was presented with a scoring opportunity when Greg Harris, husky tackle from Bellaire, covered a fumble by Wheeling quarterback Jim Brinkman at the Mountaineer 25. The white shirted Buckeyes ground out nine yards in three tries but on the fourth down St. John's halfback Tom Kouski was pilled up short of the necessary real estate by Greg Turner of Triadelphia, Gary Roman of Weirton Madonna and Jennessee.

Early in the second quarter, Wintersville's Gary Clutter returned a punt by Tweedlie 16 yards to the West Virginia 35. After Kouski made six yards and Ferry's Dave Bruney got two at the line, Hornyak passed to Ferry's Rich Weiskircher for seven yards and threw down the middle to tight end Len Masci of Wintersville, to put the oval at the four. At this point, Wintersville's QB Pat Nuzum came in for Hornyak but fumbled on the attempted handoff with Lambert Tsubiares, big tackle from Wellsburg, recovering for the Mountaineers at the four.

Later, a Hornyak pass was picked off by Tomanick, who carried it from the W.Va 37 to the Ohio 34. However, the Mountaineers could not take advantage of this opportunity. They made one first down on Tweedlie's passing but the threat died on an unsuccessful dive by Kill of a Tweedlie fourth down throw at the goal line.

As time ran out in the first half, a penalty for grabbing the facemask advanced West Virginia to the Ohio 40, and gave the blue shirts a chance for one more play. With the Bucks obviously expecting a pass, West Virginia broke Iggie Kalcum loose and the John Marshall back carried to within 14 yards of the goal line before being stopped.

"1979" All-Star Game – 20 Years Ago

Sparkled by the ball carrying of St. Clairsville sensation Tim Spencer and the pass pilfering of Steubenville's Dale Taylor, Ohio squared the long and colorful Ohio Valley interstate football series with a 47-13 humbling of West Virginia Saturday night before 9,000 witnesses at Wheeling Stadium.

In perhaps the most brilliant performance in All-Star annals since John Henry Martin's memorable one man show in 1955, Spencer scored four touchdowns for the Buckeyes with the first of these coming on a 90 yard return of the opening kickoff. The prize Ohio State recruit gained 122 yards in 19 attempts from scrimmage but had to share the limelight with the ballhawking Taylor, as the steubenville defensive back, who is headed for Muskingum College, intercepted three West Virginia passes. The Big Red ace returned the interceptions a total of 154 yards, with its third theft resulting in a 64-yard sprint to paydirt.

After Spencer's long return of the first kickoff, West Virginia retaliated with a quick TD and grabbed a 7-6 lead. However, West Virginia could not match Ohio's speed and power. By the end of the first quarter, the Buckeyes, piloted by new Martins Ferry coach Dave Bruney, enjoyed a 20-7 advantage. The lead mounted to 27-7 by halftime.

Ohio tacked on two more TD's in the third quarter, one of them on a 46-yard jaunt by the remarkable Spencer, and the issue was clearly decided, though early-bird departees missed Taylor's long interception return for a score, plus a consolation West Virginia TD in the final chapter.

The Buckeyes built a 273-214 advantage in total yardage, but also benefited greatly from four interceptions - one by Bellaire's Dirk Fitch and three by Taylor - and the great opening kickoff return by Spencer.

Strangely enough, each side accumulated 13 first downs. Ohio piled up an advantage of 176 to 61 in net rushing yardage and added 97 yards in the air with seven completions in 11 attempts.

Trying to play catch-up football most of the night, the West Virginian's coached by Dave Cisar, went to the air 22 times and made good on 10 of the aerials. But those four interceptions helped to break their backs in the OVAC sponsored contest.

Although the OVAC has been putting on the game for only the last eight years, the series dates back to 1940 and the rivalry now stands at 17 victories apiece. Ohio has now won three in a row after losing five straight to the Mountaineers.

The fans were still filling into the stadium and the sun still glowed high in the sky when the jet-propelled Spencer electrified the audience as he grabbed the 7 p.m. kickoff by John Cain, of Magnolia, at the Ohio 10-yard line and went all the way. He followed his blocking to about the Buckeye 40, then suddenly accelerated when he saw an opening in the West Virginia idefense. Cutting toward the West Virginia sideline, "Terrific Tim" had only one defender to beat by the time he reached the West Virginia 35. Another quick cut, and he was breezing into the end zone. The score came with only 12 seconds elapsed on the game clock. The usually accurate toe of Bellaire's Jo-Joe Campbell failed on the extra point try, which was wide left.

West Virginia struck back almost immediately. On Campbell's kickoff, John Marshall High's Fritz Loy made the catch and then slipped the leather to speedster Jeff Paterson of Brooke High, on a criss-cross. Paterson returned the oval from his own 10 to the Ohio 36 before he was pulled down. It took the Mountaineers only four plays to score from there.

On a trap up the middle, Magnolia's quick hitting Phil Merriman bolted to the 17; Sistersville's workhorse, C.R. Howdyshell made a yard up the middle, and Merriman garnered only two over right tackle. In an obvious passing situation, Rick Isreal, the quarterback for Weir High, found Magnolia's Mark Dills open in the end zone for the TD. Cain's conversion put the Mountaineers ahead 7-6 with only 2:03 elapsed.

Cisar, wisely, had Cain kick away from Spencer, but Cambridge's Jeff Seckman returned from the 21 to the 30. Then the Buckeyes marched 70 yards in 15 plays for the go ahead score. The entire foray was on the ground, except for a 12yard gain on a pass from Keith Votros, slick handed quarterback from Martins Ferry, to Seckman. Seckman also inserted a 12-yard run on a revers.

The West Virginia defense was keying on Spencer and he was stopped dead in his tracks several times, particularly by linebacker Mike Doran, of Paden City, and Greg Morris, of John Marshall. But the St. C. swifty gained 30 yards on nine carries during the advance and scored the TD from the three as he swept right end with a pitchout from Votros. Campbell's conversion made it 13-7 in favor of the Buckeyes with 3:16 left in the opening frame.

The West Virginia offense was unable to get untracked against the Ohio defense after the next kickoff. The Mountaineers were forced to punt. Loy's 24-yard kick was taken at the 38 by Woodsfield's Lance LaFollette on a fair catch. Thus Ohio was in scoring position again. The Bucks struck quickly as LaFollette went up for a leaping catch of a Votros pass between Wheeling Park defenders Jamie Clark and Bernie Dolan for a 33-yard catch at the five yard line. Two plays later, Spencer went in on an off-tackle smash. Campbell's conversion made it 20-7 with 14 seconds left in the opening stanza. It appeared that the game was turning into a rout when Taylor intercepted an Isreal pass on the first play of the second quarter and raced from the Mountaineer 45 to the 13. But the gallant West Virginia defense refused to yield. The Bucks could get no closer than the eight and ultimately settled for a 31-yard field goal attempt by Campbell that was wide.

The Bucks regained possession on another interception, this one by Fitch who short-circuited a southpaw pass by John Marshall's Combs at the Mountaineer 25. Ohio went to work at the West Virginia 22 but yielded the ball at the 15 when Spencer was nailed by Brooke's Dartell Cheripko after a three-yard gain on a fourth down sweep.

Subsequently, Ohio moved 58 yards in 10 plays to tack on its final score of the half. The key move in this march came when the Bucks lined up in punt formation at midfield with fourth down and one to go. The ball was snapped to Spencer, the short man, and he broke through for a 21-yard gain to keep the drive alive. The touchdown came on a 20-yard pass from Moke Forbes, a quarterback from Bellaire St. John's Central, to Beallsville's sprinter Larry Burkett in the end zone.

At the outset of the third quarter, West Virginia put together a pair of first downs but yielded the oval at its own 46 after a 16-yard loss on an errant pitchout. On Ohio's first play of the half, Spencer exploded for 46 yards and his final score of the night.

Use of Spencer as a decoy helped the Bucks to their next score, which was set up by another of Taylor's interceptions. With the oval at the West Virginia 19, Votros faked to Spencer and as the West Virginia defense went for the fake, the Martins Ferry QB handed off to Barnesville's Pat Hunkler who sped around left end to paydirt.

West Virginia squeezed its second and last TD of the night before the clock ran out, thanks to a flurry of passes from Combs to Dills and Paterson. The southpaw from John Marshall hit Dills for the final 13 yards with just seconds left on the clock.

Forbes who was playing defense at the time suffered an apparent broken arm on the West Virginia scoring play.

While Taylor stood out in the Ohio secondary, Bruney also got some outstanding defensive play from the Brown brothers, John and Jim, of Jefferson Union, and Rich Brothers of Bridgeport.

"1989" All-Star Game – 10 Years Ago

For the first time since the heydays of the Wheeling Ironman and the Ohio Valley Panthers, Sunday night football returned to the Wheeling Island Stadium. And from all indications it's here to stay at least as far as the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference's Rudy Mumley Charity All-Star Football Game is concerned.

On a picture-perfect mid-summer night for gridiron warfare, a crowd some estimated at excess of 7,000 gathered at the Island ballyard for the 18th addition of the Ohio-West Virginia All-Star series since the OVAC took over the sponsorship of the game. Contrary to some reports, the turnout was not the lowest in the history of the classic but, in fact, was one of the largest in recent years.

The Mountaineers won last night's battle, 22-14, dominating on defense against the turnover-plagued Ohioans from the outset. But the true outcome of the game was that everyone went home winners, including Stone and Thomas Queen of Queens Pageant titlist Carrie Lee Day of Weir High; members of the McDonald's OVAC All-Star band, which put on an outstanding halftime presentation; the coaches, players, and trainers of both squads.

"We could not have asked for anything better," OVAC Executive Secretary Sam Mumley said Monday morning. "The evening was a total testimonial to the hard-working kids in our conference and to the fans who support our programs.

"There is no doubt in my mind that by playing this game on Sunday night, we have struck that happy medium to attract the fans," Mumley continued. "Especially when we play the game in Wheeling. Road construction problems and traffic congestion because of the dog track when we've played the game on Friday and Saturday, really cut down on the crowd in the past."

"Also, we have to listen to the people (fans) who support this game. It's our job to give them what they want, and they showed us Sunday night that this is when they want the game to be played."

Keith Jeter, the University of Tennessee-bound tailback from Weir High who won last year's Kennedy Award given to the Mountain State's high school football player of the year, accounted for two of West Virginia's TD's. The flashy one broke loose on runs of 10 and 8 yards, sandwiched around a 22-yard field goal by Jamie Clegg, former Magnolia High three-sports standout who handled the first half quarterback duties for West Virginia coach Jim Potts, the Cameron High mentor.

Rick Lazasz, the ex-Linsly quarterback, fired the only TD aerial for the winners, teaming up with John Marshall grad Dougan Dietz on a well-executed 40-yard tight end hookup.

West Virginia looked like they were headed for a shutout last night until the fourth quarter. But a tipped screen pass wound up being intercepted by Union Local's Corey Hall and returned 28 yards to the Mountaineer 23. That resulted in a 19-yard scoring toss from Bellaire High's Scott Woods to Bellaire St. John's flanker Pat Staley.

Staley, a dynamo in a football uniform, then turned in the play of the night when, with under a minute on the clock, he fielded a Clegg punt on his own 24. Staley hesitated a fraction and then took off as a convoy of blockers helped spring him near the sideline in front of the Ohio bench. Once in the open, nobody had a chance to run down the former Fighting Irish Ace, whose trip ended 76 yards later in the end zone. Michael Honeycutt, another former Big Red, tacked on a two pointer that closed the scoring with only 39 seconds to go.

Ohio's last-ditch effort to recover an onside kick as Bishop Donahue's Tony Reilly, one of many Mountaineer defensive stickouts, was able to fall on the pigskin.

It was a botched onside kick at the outset of the game that got the Buckeyes in a first-half hole.

Mingo's Bill Seach booted the ball on a surprise attempt and fell on the bouncing pigskin. The problem was that he didn't allow the ball to travel the necessary 10yards, thus giving West Virginia possession at the Ohio 45.

"The onside kick was there if we had only kicked the football 10 yards," said a disappointed Dave Caldwell, Ohio's coach who has directed Beallsville High to backto-back 9-1 record seasons. "If we had gotten the ball in their territory right away, things could have worked out differently.

"But the game was lost on our own turnovers. You can't turn the ball over five times like we did and expect to win. Despite the mistakes we were just eight points away at the end," he added wistfully.

Although the Mountaineers failed to score on this early opportunity, they punted to Ohio's 16 and got another break two plays later when Scott Woods' pass over the middle was picked off by Weir High's Levi Livingston near the 30 and returned to the 11. Again, Ohio held forcing a 25-yard field goal try by Oak Glen's Damain Derante that was wide right.

West Virginia started a third straight possession in Ohio territory when Wheeling Park's Dave Hanna fielded a punt at the Mountaineer 45 and brought it back to the Bucks 49. Jeter and Wheeling Central's Reese Coles, a tailback type who plays fullback, took over from there to spark a seven-play drive.

Bowling Green-bound Coles, the game's leading rusher with 85 yards in 15 carries had a big 14-yard pickup on a second and eight from the 47, bouncing outside after finding no room inside. Witht he ball at the 10, Jeter displayed his well-known rushing style as he started to break outside tackle, saw a seam and then zipped between two defenders who wound up grabbing at nothing but air as the former Red Rider went in for a TD. Clegg's placement made it 7-0 with 4:23 on the clock.

The ensuing kickoff resulted in another Buckeye turnover. Toronto's John Taylor found some daylight as he ran from the four to the 31 before the ball was jarred loose by a vicious hit by Magnolia's Pat Dawson. The alert Hanna made the recovery.

A 14-yard completion from Clegg to Tyler dandy Jason Smith, accompanied by a dead ball foul on the Buckeyes put the ball on the eight. Staley then led an Ohio defensive surge that prevented the Mountaineers from getting into the end zone. Clegg was called on for a threepoint try this time and he connected for a 10-0 spread at 2:44.

Honeycutt's 45-yard kickoff return put Ohio in business at midfield for the first time. He nearly borke this one all the way but Reilly came through with a clutch stop. After getting one first down, a holding penalty found the Buckeyes stymied at the Mountaineer 45. On fourth and 18, punter Seach had trouble with the snap and then tried to run for it but advanced just 12 yards to the 33 before Wheeling Central's James Bryant, another Bowling Green recruit made the stop.

The Mountaineers then moved 67 yards to paydirt, the highlight being a third and 17 aerial that sailed right through the hands of would-be interceptor Staley to Magnolia's Mike Fox for the first down at the Buckeye 41. Coles ripped off another 13-yard gainer and Clegg found Jason Smith for 12 more. Finally, Jeter scored again on a quick opener from eight yards out. Clegg missed the PAT but the score was 16-0 with 7:15 left in the half.

The Mountaineer defense aided by four Ohio first half turnovers, permitted its rival just two first downs in the opening two quarters. They sut off the Bucks' best scoring threat, with the aid of one of the officials, who in trying to get out of the way, slipped to the turf and actually helped make the stop on Staley, who had hauled in a 38yard aerial from Buckeye North's quarterback Jeff King at the WV 27.

"Staley was definitely going to take that one in,"

Caldwell said. "But I'm not crying about it and I don't want to take anything away from West Virginia. They played very well and took advantage of their opportunities."

This Ohio drive ended two plays later on a Satley fumble. He was hit by Hanna just after taking in an aerial. When the ball popped out, Weirton Madonna's Jeff Milbert fell on it.

Until Ohio got its two late scores, the second half was a ho-hummer following the 40-yard TD strike from Lazasz to Dietz. This was a well-executed play that Potts said his team actually tried to pull off in the first half. "We knew it was there," the winning coach said. "They were releasing early on the tight end. We waited for the right opportunity and Dietz did the rest." The 6'4", 235-pounder showed surprising speed once he caught the ball in the open field.

"Believe it or not, Dietz is one of the fastest kids we had in camp," Potts continued. "One day, we timed him at 4.79 (in the 40-yard dash) in the heat after we had finished a long practice."

Potts, who has had some tough times during his eight previous years as head coach at Cameron High until last season's fine 7-3 record, was extremely pleased with the all-star game triumph, that cut Ohio's advantage to 10-8 since the OVAC has sponsored the interstate rivalry. "It's one of the most exciting wins I've ever had," Potts said. "We had 10 great days in camp. The kids were tremendous and we're coming out of here with some great memories that we'll keep for a long time."

Both he and assistant coach Dave Bohrer, who handled the defense, were filled with praise for a Mountaineer stop corps, that featured some outstanding play by such players as Bishop Donahue duo of Reilly and Jake Padlow; Tyler's Kevin Kissner; Central's bryant, Parks Hanna, and Weir's Livingston and Randy Kamacko.

"I think we won the game up front on both sides of the ball," said Potts. "Our line did a superb job, especially in the first half opening some big holes that allowed us to run at will. Having both Jeter and Coles in the backfield gave Ohio a lot to worry about. Defensively we set out to stop the run and we did it. Kissner reads as well as any linebacker you'll see."

28th ANNUAL OVAC RUDY MUMLEY ALL STAR FOOTBALL CLASSIC

Dr. Robert Jones, the team doctor for the West Virginia All-Stars in tonight's Rudy Mumley OVAC All-Star Charity Football Classic, has a simple self-diagnosis to explain his affection for football. The game, he says, is in his blood. And no antibiotic, no pill or shot can get the sport out of his system. "I got involved because of the game of football," he said. (The appeal) is the game itself... it doesn't matter what aspect it is."

Football found its way into the heart of Dr. Jones in the mid-1960s, when he played for the legendary Wheeling Ironmen. Jones played defensive end, linebacker, offensive line -- "Back then, you had to do it all," he said. -- and remembers cross-state clashes with Charleston fondly. Even if memories of the game's details remain cloudy, the atmosphere of Wheeling Island Stadium will always remain indelibly etched in Jones' heart and mind. "I remember my first game... we played Charleston," Jones said. "It was the only time I've ever seen the island (stadium) completely packed. We had a little bit of a rivalry with them." And he still gets the same chills up his spine every time he visits the stadium, which was remodeled in the 1980s. "It's still the same place," Jones said. "Even if it is a different stadium. It's still a great place to play football."

Of course, the main purpose of football and other sports is to teach the participants qualities they can take with themselves throughout their lives. Football was no different for Jones. Currently a general surgeon who also performs thoracic and vascular work at Wheeling Hospital, Jones says he learned self-discipline --- a necessary component in any surgeon's mental makeup --- by playing football all his life. "The discipline of football pushed me to be a surgeon and in the medical field," Jones said

Jones has been involved with the OVAC Football Classic for the past 15 years, getting his first taste of the game when Ohio team doctor -- Luis Vazquez -- invited him to the 1984 game.

Many of the games that he's seen and worked were good. But one -- the 1987 classic -- stands out as great; because of the luminous stars who played in the contest. Ohio - featuring St. Clairsville's duo of Shawn Vincent and John Spencer - defeated the Alex Shook- led West Virginia team 13-11 in the all-star game, played at Steubenville because of the renovations to Wheeling Island Stadium. "That was the best year, as far as players go," Jones said.

Jones earned his bachelor's degree from the University of Nebraska and graduated from the West Virginia University School of Medicine. Jones lives in Wheeling with his wife, Rita and has three children - Patricia and Pamela, both 31, and Robert, 7.

After studying pre-med at Ripon College in the state of Wisconsin, Luis Vazquez decided the midwest would be a great place to live and raise a family.

A native of Caguas, Puerto Rico, Vazquez later studied and obtained a doctorate at the University of Seville in Spain.

"When it came time to apply for an internship in the States, I hoped to return to Wisconsin, or somewhere close to that region of the country," he recalls.

Fortunately for the Ohio Valley, an opening became available at old Wheeling Hospital in 1957. Vazquez accepted, and the rest -- as they say -- is history.

And what a history for one of the area's most respected and successful physicians.

Doctor Vazquez has been on the Ohio sideline, donating his services each and every year the Rudy Mumley OVAC All-Star Game has been in existence.

"I can't think of a finer organization to be involved with," he said from his St. Clairsville-based offices where he first established practice in 1961.

A long-time sports enthusiast, Vazquez has served in a similar capacity 32 years at St. Clairsville High. He's also aided the prep grid programs at Bridgeport and Martins Ferry.

"I'm fortunate that my four sons were involved in football. That helped me stay close to the sport," he noted. "Today, I enjoy it today as much as I ever have." Through the years, Dr. Vazquez has served on numerous committees, includ-

Through the years, Dr. Vazquez has served on numerous committees, including Ohio's prestigious Sports Medicine Advisory Board where he worked alongside the legendary Woody Hayes, longtime Buckeyes' head football coach.

Currently, Vazquez is Chairman of the OVAC Foundation Committee.

Doctor Vazquez has been married 41 years to the former Bonnie Watkins, a Wheeling native. They are the parents of six children. Each own college degrees.

Son Louie played quarterback under the late George Strager at St. Clairsville High. Last fall, Lou was on the staff at state playoff qualifier Fisher Catholic High in Lancaster where he earned a district honor as defensive coach. He played collegiately at Capital University.




Mike Vazquez holds a maters degree in Political Science from the University of Akron and is working on a doctorate. Mike was a standout lineman at St. C. High.

Scott Tusic will be tonight's umpire. Tusic is a resident of New Martinsville.



O.V.A.C. Official Pat DiMeo Retires

There's one simple reason why high school football in the Ohio Valley is as good, if not better, than anyplace else in the country. Pat DiMeo says. The student-athletes are a direct reflection of the hard-nosed, blue-collar, anything-to-win spirit that encapsulates the area. "The Ohio Valley is more or less a hard-nosed valley," DiMeo said. "You had some hard-nosed kids each season - and each generation of player - aged. Players from Martins Ferry, for example, learned how much fun it is to beat Bellaire - and vice versa - from their parents, who gleaned the rivalry from their parents. In that respect, the rivalry was passed down from generation ot generation. And DiMeo wouldn't have it any other way. "It made them better football players,"

in this area, a lot of tough kids that come from a working background. They have to battle for everything." DiMeo should know. After 47 years of officiating service to the Ohio Valley - and the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference -DiMeo is being honored during tonight's Rudy Mumley OVAC All-Star Charity Football Classic as the game's honorary official.

DiMeo - who lives in Mingo Junction - is an officiating veteran of West Virginia, Ohio and Pennsylvania footbail games. DiMeo who worked as a supervisor at Wheeling Pittsburgh Steel for 46 years before retiring in 1992 - has a son, 33-year-old Patrick, who works



DiMeo said. "Most of them played from the heart because they have it bred in them.' Опе Stuebenville Central-Indian Creek matchup in particular captured DiMeo's memory. "That game," he said, "could've turned into a riot. Indian Creek was just coming from a few bad seasons, but they had a good club," DiMeo said. "(The game) got pretty hot."

In a situation in which tempers flare and temperatures rise, a veteran official like DiMeo must step in and take charge of the game. And - this is a lesson for the young whistleblowers - it's best not to be too flag-happy, he said. "We keep talking to the ballplayers continuously," DiMeo said. "We tried to keep the coaches calm but sometimes that's im-

at the Ohio State University Hospital and recently was engaged.


Asking DiMeo to recall some of the most enjoyable rivalries he's officiated is like asking a zebra which of his stripes is his favorite: they all have a special memory. DiMeo cited rivalries such as Brooke-Wheeling Park, Steubenville-Martins Ferry, Wheeling Central-Martins Ferry and Steubenville Central-Indian Creek as most memorable.

"I did quite a few big ones," DiMeo said. The impact of those rivalries, DiMeo said, was multiplied as possible. In a game like that, many people say to go ahead and flag the coach. But when you do that, a lot of times, it's worse than when you try to talk to them, because now you've got their whole side bothered. Sure, you talk to them and calm them down. But flagging someone is the last thing you want to do."

And as one of the classiest officials the Ohio Valley has ever known, DiMeo proved during his 47 years that he certainly knows how to handle even the hottest of the Ohio Valley rivalries.

After all, they're what makes the OVAC great.

Stender, like Bruney, has established a winning program at Tyler Consolidated. The Silver Knights' staff is over seeing the Mountaineer all-stars.

Bruney's previous Ohlo all-star teams recorded wins against West Virginia. His 1979 Buckeye squad featured future Ohlo State and NFL running back Tim Spencer.

A St. Clairsville High product, Spencer returned the opening kickoff for a touchdown. It was the first of four TDs he scored for Ohio in a 47-13 victory.

Bruney was back on the island Stadium sidelines in 1983 where the Buckeye gridders produced a 26-10 triumph.

In addition to working the Mumley Classic, Bruney has twice been selected as coach for Ohio's prestigious North-South game played at Massilon. Bruney has high praise for his six-man staff of assistants. "There's no question, you're only as good as the people you surround yourself with. That more than holds true at Martins Ferry," Bruney remarked. "The men I have the pleasure of working with make it easy to come to practice each day."

Never was that fact more evident than last fall when Bruney's Purple powerhouse produced one of the most memorable seasons in Ohio Valley football history.

The '98 Riders were a relentless combination of athleticism and football knowledge. Those variables resulted in an unforgettable regular season undefeated run that culminated in Ferry's first-ever post-season appearance.

Joining Bruney on the sidelines in the OVAC Classic are these these assistants:

NICK STANKOVICH: Works primarily with offensive linemen, including guards and centers. Stankovich played collegiately at Capital University.

MIKE DELATORE: Buckeye South and West Liberty State product who coaches both offensive and defensive tackles.

GREGG STEELE: Bellaire and West Liberty product, responsible for coaching tight ends and defensive ends.

JOHN BENNETT: Ex-purple Riders' standout who went on to play at Bethany. At Ferry, works primarily with defensive backs and wide receivers.

DIRK FITCH: Ferry's offensive coordinator. in charge of running backs and outside linebackers. Bowling Green State University product. Performed for Ohio All-Stars in '79 Mumley Classic under Bruney.

BILL BRUNEY: One of the area's most experienced coaches and brother of Riders' head coach. Ferry's defensive coordinator. Works with linebackers and tight ends. Ohio University product whose coaching resume includes an 11-year stint at Steubenville High.

The only head football coach Tyler Consolidated High School has ever known will lead the West Virginia Ail-Stars in the Ohio Vailey Athletic Conference's annual ail-star game. John Stender, a head football coach in Tyler County for the past 21 years, will guide West Virginia for the second time as it meets Ohio in the Rudy Mumley Memorial OVAC All-Star Charity Football Classic. The game is scheduled for Saturday, July 31, at Wheeling Island Stadium.

Stender also coached the West Virginia stars in 1988, when Ohio won 13-7. "It's a lot of fun for me because you get to meet a lot of the kids, some of whom your team played against," Stender said. "They are some of the best kids in the Ohio Valley. The hard part is having to leave some players out."

Assisting Stender will be Rob Caldwell, Bob Jones, Rick Leach and Bob Wilt. The West Virginia trainer will be Herb Minch.

Stender has compiled a 143-85 record over the past 21 years. He coached at Tyler County High School from 1978-92. During that period, he had two undefeated seasons and made eight playoff appearances. His Tyler County team made a habit of playing cross-county rival Sistersville in the Class A state finals. Tyler beat Sistersville in 1983 for the Class A state championship but lost to the Tigers in the 1986 state finals.

Then, when Tyler County and Sistersville high schools combined to create Tyler Consolidated High School in 1993, Stender was tabbed to lead the Silver Knight program. In Tyler consolidated's six seasons, Stender has led the Silver Knights to two playoff berths and a record of 34-30.

This past season, Stender's Silver Knights finished 10-2 and advanced to the West Virginia Class AA quarter finals.

Stender earned his bachelor's degree from West Liberty State College and his master's degree at Ohio University. He lives in New Martinsville with his wife, Lori. JONES coached with Stender in the 1988 OVAC classic.

He has been an assistant coach for the past 17 seasons, at Tyler County High School (1983-88), Sistersville High (1989-92) and Tyler Consolidated (1993-present). Jones, who owns a bachelor's degree from West Liberty State College, lives in Middlebourne with his wife, Deanna, and three children: Julie, 17; Robby, 14; and Ryan, 14.

 LEACH also coached in the 1988 all-star game with the Tyler County High School staff. His coaching tenure includes stints at Tyler County High, Sistersville and Tyler Consolidated. He is also the current boys basketball coach at Tyler Consolidated. He holds a bachelor's degree from West Liberty State College



Wilt earned his bachelor's degree from Marshall University and has a master's degree from WVU. He lives in Middlebourne with his wife Rene and their two children: Erln, 16; and Lauren, 14. MINCH, West Virginia's trainer, has been affiliated with the OVAC for the past 11 years. He has been an official OVAC all-star game trainer for the past four contests. Minch has been West Liberty State College's full-time athletic trainer since 1994, and he also is the head softball coach for the Hilltoppers.

Minch, who grew up in Valley Grove and lives in West Liberty, earned his bachelor's degree from West Liberty State in 1989 and his master's degree from West Virginia University in 1990.
