

I am very proud to be the Director of the Forty-Eighth Annual OVAC Urestling Tournament. I began directing the event in 1979 when it was first conducted in the Wheeling Civic Center. Throughout the last 47 years, many memorable milestones have taken place. Allow me to share them with you.

During the spring of 1970, we lost a phenomenal wrestler. David Bierkortte, to an untimely accident. Because of his athletic prowess, the Wheeling Central Catholic High School Boosters Club initiated the "David Bierkortte Award" for the outstanding unestler in 1971.

The Wheeling Civic Center Manager in 1979 was Frank Rodriguez. Frank had a great deal of respect for the dedicated efforts of those involved with OVAC wrestling, and was instrumental in purchasing the world-class time clocks you now see by matside during the competition. Presently, we are blessed with Dennis Magruder, who has given us the same positive support, along with the entire Civic Center staff.

In 1980, OVAC wrestling initiated the first "George Kovalick Scholarship." Two years later. Bob and Dolores Burke lost their son Danny, a Wheeling Park wrestler, to a tragic traffic accident. Out of their love for him, the "Daniel M. Burke Wrestling Scholarship" was instituted in 1983. Most recently, we lost a fantastic wrestling enthusiast in 1996 from Marshall County affectionately known as "Dead Eye" Morris. His devoted family established the 'James H. Morris Sportsmanship Scholarship" in 1997 out of his love for the mat sport.

So, we now have three permanently installed scholarship funds that over the years have afforded 41 deserving OVAC corestlers an amazing \$41,000.00 in college scholarships.

In 1999 there was a unique change in the tournament formal which promotes OVAC wrestling even further throughout the Valley. The championship finals are now being televised live by WTOV-9 for all viewers in the entire area to enjoy. I want to thank everyone of the workers, coaches, officials, and wrestlers. They are the people who make the annual OVAC Wrestling Tournament a truly grand adventure for Ohio Valley athletics.

Bill grew up in Brownsville, PA where his prowess on the gridiron earned him a scholarship to West Virginia University.

His college career was interrupted when he was called to service in the U.S. Army's - 82nd Airborne Division.

After fulfilling his military commitment, he returned to college where he earned his degree in education at Morris Harvey . . . now known as The University of Charleston.

He began, at Wayne High School, what was to become a long career in education, where he taught history and physical education. Additionally, he coached football and initiated their wrestling program.

He moved on to Jackson Jr. High in Vienna, WV where he coached both football and basketball.

After taking his Masters Degree in Guidance Counseling from West Virginia University, he settled in as Guidance Counselor at John Marshall High School for the next twenty years, while also serving as an assistant football coach.

Bill handled the duties of maintaining the wrestling scorebook for John Marshall from '69 through '82. Simultaneously, he was in charge of the head table for all high school tournaments held at the Moundsville Fieldhouse. In addition to the O.V.A.C., he has served as a head table worker at high school regional qualifiers, the West Virginia State Wrestling Tournament ... when it was held at Moundsville ... and a N.A.I.A. National Tournament.

He has maintained a zealous commitment to O.V.A.C. Wrestling and its annual tournament, by working the head table consistently since '69, as it has moved progressively from Moundsville following the '75 season, on to Steubenville from '76 through '78 and finally to its present home at the Wheeling Civic Center for the past 22 years.

High praise comes from his former teaching colleague and wrestling coach at John Marshall High, Bill Hinegardner, also "Mr. Mat" of '84 and the long-time Asst. Director for O.V.A.C. Wrestling, when he said, "Bill Valko has been a giant asset to wrestling in the Ohio Valley."

O.V.A.C. Director of Wrestling, Ron Mauck, in reflecting on Bill's tenure with the tournament offers the following:

"As one scans the head table at the O.V.A.C. Wrestling Tournament you may identify many of those working as having gray hair, receding hair lines, wearing glasses and moving at a considerably slower pace up and down the steps leading to the head table.

You see, most of the folks who work at the head table ... as well as in other areas of the tournament ... have all played continuing key roles in the tremendous success of the OVAC Tournament, since its arrival at the Wheeling Civic Center in January of 1979.

One of our friends, who we fondly call "The Senator", Bill Valko, fits this description. It is in recognition of his enduring commitment that we proudly dedicate the 48th Annual Wrestling Tournament Program in his honor.

Bill does not move as fast as he did when he first arrived at the Civic Center in'79, but his contributions have been many and his unique wit has been enjoyed by all.

As Tournament Director, my greatest reward is the opportunity to meet people like Bill Valko, who are very unselfish and are willing to give of themselves to the sport of wrestling."

Although Bill now walks with a cane, he remains dedicated to physical fitness by daily swimming grater distances than many of us walk.

Bill resides in Glendale with his wife of 48 years, Fran. They are the parents of two (2) daughters, Karen Slonaker and Jennifer Valko and grandparents to three (3).

Worshrag's Nemesis

Let me tell you the story of Worshrag's nemesis.

You know what a nemesis is: an arch-enemy. In wrestling, your nemesis is the unbeatable opponent, the No. 1 seed who's always in your bracket, always paired against you in a dual, always standing confidently, tauntingly, between you and success.

In his first year of peewee wrestling, my son Worshrag (this is back when we called him "Little" Worshrag) weighed 65 pounds, which in the 6-and-under division is a heavyweight. Worsh had a terrific

rookie season, beating nearly every little heavyweight he ran into - except for one kid from East Liverpool.

The Nemesis had short, tree-trunk legs, an incredibly long torso, a big butt and long, muscular arms. These physical attributes gave him a center of gravity like the planet Jupiter and the leverage of a two-ton floor jack. On top of his physicality The Nemesis, at age six already had three years' experience. I didn't wrestle until I was a sophomore in high school. My whole wrestling career was three years.

The Nemesis seemed to be at every scrimmage and at every tournament, dooming Worshrag to a second-place season. His specialty was the cowboy, a nasty standing front headlock and throw which, if done successfully, results in both a takedown and back points, if not a fall.

"He's going to cowboy you," I'd remind Worshrag before the match. "Don't let him do it. Duck under it. Sag back and take the legs. If he does get it, roll

through."

Worsh would nod understanding and trot gamely onto the mat. Five seconds later he had been thrown and trussed like the calf in a calf-roping contest. He'd lie there stunned a couple of seconds, then struggle to his feet, shake hands and stumble back to Dad, fighting sobs and tears.

As the season progressed Worshrag lasted farther into the matches with his foe, and once even scored first on a takedown. Then he came to his senses and lost like he believed he was supposed to. By then it had become a mental thing. The Nemesis was going to win because he always won and Worshrag was going to lose because

he always lost.

I fretted about Worshrag's future in wrestling. What if his nemesis grow at the same rate and they remained in the same age and weight classes, year in and year out? I believed Worsh could beat him, but Worsh didn't. Would my son rise to the challenge or be beaten by it? Would they grow at different rates and end up in different weight classes? Would his family move away?

None of those things happened. The Nemesis

disappeared. He quit wrestling.

Over the next three years Worshrag enjoyed a measure of success on the mat, becoming a steady if not spectacular performer in the upper weight classes. He won his share of tournaments, lost some heartbreakers, and on occasion was humbled when he ran into a quality opponent. Perhaps - and this is a proud Dad talking - he even became The Nemesis to some other wrestlers.

But there was never another nemesis for him, never that one wrestler perpetually blocking his path to success.

Then one day last season I went to a coaches' meeting to pair wrestlers for a routine scrimmage. There on the East Liverpool roster was a familiar name. The Nemesis was back.

He was a few pounds lighter than Worshrag, but close enough for a scrimmage match. He couldn't be any good after a three-year layoff, could he? I am ashamed to admit how badly I wanted that match. I told myself I wanted it for Worshrag, to erase the lingering doubts, to get the monkey off his back, but truthfully I wanted it more for myself. Three years is an eternity for a kid. He barely remembered and didn't much care. The only monkey was the one chafing my butt.

I've seen other fathers behave the way I was behaving, like pit bull owners clamoring for blood sport, all the while knowing it isn't them who have to do the

fighting.

The Nemesis scratched from the East Liverpool scrimmage, but he showed up at one a few weeks later at Hopewell, and the match was made. I was practically hyperventilating as the time approached. Was the kid still a good wrestler? Was he still relying on the cowboy? Would Worshrag fall back into the "I'll never beat him" mindset? Would he be able to overcome it?

The answer to all those questions was "yes".

After a three year layoff The Nemesis wrestled remarkably well. He also still relied on the cowboy and was good at it. Worshrag was tentative. He did remember his old foe after all, and obviously was afraid of him. He wrestled without confidence. The Nemesis cowboyed him, just like old times.

Worsh managed an escape in the second period to


make the score 2-1.

In the third period Worsh was gaining confidence, but time was running out. I could see he realized he could beat this kid. They were on their feet. A couple of times Worshrag nearly got the takedown but his opponent, tiring, scooted out of bounds. Suddenly The Nemesis went back to what he knew best. Seizing an opening, he locked Worsh's head solidly and turned his body to make the cowboy throw across the hips. But this time Worsh sagged back and took the legs. The Nemesis had an armful of nuthin'. Worshrag had the takedown and the match.

The Nemesis disappeared again shortly afterwards. I heard through the grapevine something about him never making it to practice. I've seen it too many times: good wrestlers quitting for reasons that have little to do with wrestling. Sometimes it's grades, sometimes interest in other sports, sometimes family problems, sometimes who knows what.

Maybe he'll return someday, and maybe even wrestle Worshrag again. But he's not The Nemesis anymore, and I dont' think he ever will be again.

I often wonder — were the champion second team, Would he keep on trying or lose his gleam, Would he give his all if there was no fame, And not give up for the good of the game.



"Founding father of OVAC wrestling"

Teacher exceptionale . . . competitive coach . . . gracious mentor. . . visionary, endowed with boundless energy and enthusiasm.

His accomplishments are legend, his influence unparalleled.

A man whose profound influence on coaches and athletes is a legacy which will continue to have impact on generations yet to come.

Standing as tangible proof of all that he epitomized are his enshrinements in four (4) separate and distinct Athletic Halls of Fame; Kent State University, West Liberty State College, Ohio Wrestling Coaches Association, and Ohio High School Athletic Director's Association.

In 1980 a scholarship was established in Coach Kovalick's honor, by the OVAC Wrestling Coaches Association, to recognize a college-bound scholar/wrestler, in the amount of \$1,000 to be awarded annually.

During opening ceremonies of the 1985 Tournament a bronze plaque was unveiled, and now hangs in the lobby of the Wheeling Civic Center, inscribed in fitting tribute:

"THE OHIO VALLEY WRESTLING COACHES ASSOCIATION HONORS THE MEMORY OF GEORGE KOVALICK . . . A MAN MARVELOUSLY COMPETITIVE, METICULOUS IN ORGANIZATION AND ENDOWED WITH AN ENORMOUS CAPACITY FOR WORK.

THE OVAC Wrestling Tournament

Its birth . . . growth . . . and tradition

By Richard Keith Wolf

It began as all ideas . . . the dream of one man . . . the late George Kovalick.

In March of 1954, Wheeling, Bridgeport, Barnesville, and Linsley Institute competed in the inaugural OVAC Wrestling Tournament at Bridgeport.

The following year Weirton was added as the Tournament moved to Barnesville.

The tournament returned to Bridgeport in 1956, where it remained through 1958, while growing to 7 participating schools.

After 5 years as Tournament Director, Coach Kovalick relinquished the reins to John "Corky" Vrotsos when the tournament moved to Martins Ferry.

Over the next 9 years, the tournament grew to 18 teams, as schools, sometimes reluctantly, added wrestling to their inter-scholastic programs as fan interest blossomed.

There was a concern expressed by participating coaches that the OVAC had never been held in West Virginia.

A decision was made to move the tournament to Moundsville and thereafter to alternate between Ohio and West Virginia.

And so it was, that in 1968, under Co-Directors, George Walley and George Kovalick, the tournament opened with 20 participating schools.

Ironically, no significant mention of alternating tournament sites occurred for the next 8 years, as the tournament grew in both participant and fan numbers.

Several landmark events occurred during the Moundsville Era . . . With 23 schools competing in 1970, the OVAC crowned its first West Virginia team Champion, Wheeling Central Catholic . . . In 1971, following the tragic death of Dave Beirkorette, former OVAC Tournament Champion, the Wheeling Central Catholic Boosters Club established the Dave Beirkorette Wrestling Award to be presented annually to the Most Valuable Wrestler in the Tournament. The first recipient was Don Blum of Martins ferry . . . In 1974, with 32 schools competing, the OVAC became a 3 day event and 6 mats were used for the preliminary rounds . . . In 1975 with 34 schools competing, and as a result of recent large school district consolidations, it was decided that the smaller schools should be competing for team championships against schools of

equal or near equal enrollment. Therefore, classifications were established and in addition to the Overall Team Champion, three (3) Division Champions were also crowned ... Finally, little Warwood became the first school to win the Overall Team Title without an individual champion.

In 1976, the tournament moved to the Steubenville Diocesan Arena with Bob Hedmond as Director.

It was during this year that the most prestigious honor in OVAC wrestling, "MR. MAT" was established and bestowed. How fitting and appropriate that George Kovalick, affectionately known as, Coach "K", should be the initial recipient of an award earned for "a lifetime of dedication to the sport of wrestling". For this was his idea . . . his dream . . . his energy . . . and his enthusiasm that had made it a reality.

In 1977, school classifications were expanded to four (4) divisions, as paid attendance to the three day event soared to 9,465.

The OVAC Wrestling Tournament and foul weather seem to arrive as distinct, yet inseparable, entities. And so it was, that in 1978, when faced with treacherous highway conditions, resulting from an accumulation of ice and snow, it was deemed necessary to postpone the Friday session until Saturday.

In 1979, the Tournament moved to the Wheeling Civic Center with Ron Mauck as Director. Two (2) major improvements took place that year, (1) the massive floor area of the Civic Center now made it possible to wrestle on eight (8) mats, and (2) eight (8) individual and independent electronic match scoreboard/clocks were purchased.

In 1980, recognition of individual weight-class competitors was expanded to include the top eight (8) places.

That same year, the OVAC Wrestling Coaches Association created, to honor Coach "K", the George E. Kovalick Scholarship, to be presented annually to assist a college-bound scholar/wrestler.

Following the tragic 1982 death of Wheeling Park High School wrestler, Danny Burke, his parents established a living tribute to his memory. In 1983, the first annual Daniel M. Burke Memorial Wrestling Scholarship was awarded to John Witzberger of Wheeling Central.

"In 1997, following the untimely passing of James "Dead Eye" Morris, in tribute to his long and abiding love for wrestling and his devotion to the OVAC, the Morris family and sons, Jeff and Gregg (both former OVAC champions) established both an annual sportsman award and a scholarship in his memory."

The threatening flood was more a probability than a possibility when the 43rd Annual Tournament opened on Thursday, January 19, 1996. When it became evident that we had to deal with the certainty, a prudent, yet difficult and unpopular, decision was made to discontinue wrestling at 6:00 PM on Friday, January 19, 1996 and to resume at that point on Sat. January 27, 1996.

To accomplish this monumental task would require the complete cooperation of everyone involved, including, but not limited to, wrestlers, coaches, athletic directors, tournament workers, referees, and the re-scheduling or dropping of other meets and/or tournaments, and a host of individual problems faced by each and everyone associated with an undertaking of this magnitude.

An indication of the level of cooperation and commitment to the OVAC was never more evident than when the Tournament reconvened one week later, just as though it were a part of the original plan.

However, none of this could have taken place

without the cooperation, understanding, and participation of the Civic Center Staff, under the supervision of its congenial and tireless Director, Dennis Magruder.

WTOV - Channel 9 - Steubenville as a corporate sponsor, demonstrated their enthusiastic support for OVAC Wrestling when they initiated live television coverage of all weight class championship bouts in 1998.

In the spring of 1999, the dynamic force behind the growth & expansion of the OVAC, Sam Mumley, Executive Sec'y. for 32 years, succumbed to his battle with cancer. Steve Kish, Superintendent of Martins Ferry schools, willingly stepped in to fill the void and served as Interim Exec. Sec'y. until Tom Rataiczak assumed the permanent position in the fall of '99.

It is our fond wish that this tournament will continue to grow . . . if not in size, hopefully in stature . . . as a symbol of all that is good and decent. For there is no greater satisfaction than that which one receives from the investment of time and energy devoted to youth.

As you witness the pomp and pageantry, from the opening ceremonies on Thursday, through to the Parade of Champions on Saturday night, only then will you realize that this is true a labor of love and a living tribute to all those, both past and present, who have striven to make it possible and memorable.



He was crowned the 165# Champion of the OVAC Wrestling Tournament in 1970 and finished the season undefeated.

He was fatally injured in an auto accident that Spring, during his Junior year in high school.

The Wheeling Central Catholic Booster Club decided that the best way to pay tribute and honor the memory of their fallen hero was to create, in his name, a perpetual memorial, thus was established The David Bierkortte Award.

The recipient of this award is to be announced during the awards ceremony following the conclusion of the Tournament. The honoree, as selected by a panel of judges, is deemed to be the Most Valuable Wrestler in the tournament. Formal presentation of the award will take place at The OVAC Annual Spring Awards Banquet.


Each successive recipient brings greater stature and prestige to this coveted award as envisioned by the Booster Club.






To witness a son who's prepared for this day,


