The OVAC All-Star Game Salutes West Liberty State College

Organized as a land grant school in 1837, later known as West Liberty Normal School for Teachers, and currently West Liberty State College, it's easy to see that the institution is no stranger to change. In the Fall of 2008, West Liberty anticipates the opportunity to undergo yet another change that is history in the making for the 171-year-old institution as it becomes West Liberty University. This will allow its first ever stand-alone master's degree program as well as other benefits to its students and the local community. In addition, WLSC is preparing to expand into the local community with a presence at the Highlands. This venture, due in large part to the work of Ohio County leadership, Northern Panhandle Sen. Ed Bowman and Sen. Larry Ball, and the support of Brian Noland, Chancellor of the West Virginia Higher Education Policy Commission, will allow West Liberty to better meet the expanding needs for their students. The Highlands campus could be open for enrollment as early as early 2009.

West Liberty continues to make advances in providing students with a quality – valuable education experience through the provision of such programs as the Student Laptop Program, the Metro Rate, Scholarship program, and the many offerings of the Media Arts Center. The Student Laptop program, to begin Fall 2008, will provide incoming freshmen with the option of receiving a laptop as part of the college's ongoing initiative of providing students with the technology they need to be prepared to enter into the twenty-first century workforce. Only one of roughly every 20 colleges in the U.S. offering a bachelor's degree has such a program. The Metro Rate, a \$2,000 reduction of the out-of-state rate per academic year, makes West Liberty more affordable for students residing in Belmont, Jefferson, Columbiana, Monroe and Guernsey counties in Ohio; and Washington, Shenandoah, Beaver and Greene counties in Pennsylvania. The Metro Rate is available for full-time students (12 or more credit hours per semester), incoming freshmen returning and transfer students residing in the designated counties. Through this administration West Liberty will offer more scholarships to incoming freshmen in the Fall of 2009, which include a Promise Plus Scholarship and a variety of others.

The crown jewel of learning technology available to students is most evident in the Media Arts Center. Opened in 2006, this multi-million dollar facility houses state-of-the-art equipment that provides students studying graphic design, digital media, animation, video production and television communications with hands-on experience through work in the Audio Recording Studio and Video Production Studio. Through programming over the college's WLTV-14 television channel. In addition, West Liberty is adding to its Academic Center and Recreation Complex with the complete renovation of Russek Football Field. According to Jim Watson, WLSC athletic director, the new complex will be completed in phases beginning with the installation of MondoTurf Ecofill, which is synthetic turf that is environmentally friendly, engineered for maximum performance, and is on average 25 degrees cooler. In addition to the playing surface, phase one will include a three-lane training track, new fencing, and landscaping. Substantial completion is expected for mid-July. Subsequent phases are to follow over the next couple of years and include a newly-designed stadium-side seating area with plaza and media/guest boxes.

There are many words to describe the life of Rudolph Mumley, but perhaps the most appropriate would be service.

For most of his 80-plus years, Mumley, known as Rudy to his legion of friends, worked on behalf of many causes. None were more important to him than the youth of the Ohio Valley.

It is befitting that the game which fans are witnessing this evening is named in his honor. If it hadn't been for Rudy's willingness to step forward, the Ohio-West Virginia All-Star Game would not have existed the last 28 years, and it now appears to be a fixture that will carry it well into the next millennium.

The game's history goes back to the early 1940s and, for many years after that, it was sponsored by

booster club associations from Eastern Ohio and the West Virginia northern panhandle.

However, the game could not receive NCAA sanction and consequently was held during the spring to allow players who had received scholarships to NCAA schools an opportunity to participate.

When it became apparent that the booster club organizations could no longer sponsor the game, it ceased to exist. An idea was presented to Sam A. Mumley Sr. that the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference could assume sponsorship of the game and apply for NCAA sanction.

One of the requirements toward receiving NCAA sanction was that only 60 percent of game proceeds could be spent to cover expenses and the other 40 percent had to be used for charitable purposes.

Once the game received sanction, the OVAC had another problem. It was experiencing financial problems and did not have the resources to provide "seed" money that would be needed to purchase uniforms, pay for training camp and other start-up expenses such as insurance.

Sam Mumley, who was the executive secretary of the OVAC, appealed to his uncle, Rudy, to provide the financial help. The story has become legend on how Rudy, a bachelor who lived with his beloved sister, Lillian, in the Warwood area of Wheeling, mortgaged their home to receive a loan. The rest, as the saying goes, is history.

There was more adversity to overcome for this inaugural OVAC venture. The Ohio Valley experienced damaging floods during June of 1972. Wheeling Stadium sustained considerable damage and the facility would not be available for the early August game.

Sam Mumley called his longtime friend, the late Edmund Joseph, who was then athletic director at Martins Ferry High School and asked if the OVAC could use Ferry Stadium. Once Joseph took the request to school officials and received permission, the game was finally on.

However, on the day of the game, the area was hit hard by a rainstorm. More adversity. By this time, you could not fault Rudy Mumley, who agreed to serve as game director, if he was feeling a bit jinxed. Several hours before kickoff was scheduled, the rain stopped and the sun came out. It turned into a beautiful evening, and the game went off like clockwork before a capacity audience.

The OVAC was in business as far as renewal of the Ohio-West Virginia midsummer classic was concerned.

However, that's not the end of the story. Over the next two decades-plus that Rudy Mumley served as game director, he made numerous improvements to the game. He turned it from just an all-star game into an extravaganza.

He took the all-star gridders to camp at West Liberty State College, his alma mater, and a place where he had long-standing ties. Each year, Mumley added activities for the players to help them pass the time and provide some relief from the rigors of training camp.

He enlisted the help of the Osiris Shrine and this group gave the game a more meaningful purpose as it

would eventually gain the lion's share of the charity proceeds.

Through his good friend, the late George Strager, another mid-week event, "An Evening With the Stars," was initiated and handled with impeccable care by two other longtime friends, Mike Young and Pete Cuffaro.

From the time the OVAC assumed sponsorship of the game, Mumley brought back the Stone & Thomas "Queen of Queens" Pageant which had been a part of the All-Star Game series when it was sponsored by the booster club associations. Stone & Thomas continued to sponsor the event over the next two decades-plus. In recent years, the queen's pageant has continued under the sponsorship of Kaufman's of Wheeling and WTOV-9.

In the meantime, Mumley enlisted the help of Glenn Didriksen and his family, which owned and operated several McDonald's Family Restaurants in the area, to form the McDonald's All-Star Band. This has become an increasingly popular feature of the game.

Mumley's innovative mind produced a game that would help kick off the Ohio Valley football season, a classic that would involve some 60 to 70 football players annually and several hundred bandmen. Add to that some 25 to 30 queen candidates and a myriad of volunteers who helped make the 10-day to two-week experience a memorable part of their lives.

For a number of years, Rudy and his nephew Sam, along with other OVAC officials and the dedicated men from the Osiris Shrine, would hold a pep rally at Russek Field on the campus of West Liberty State College. Several thousands of people attended these events and, of course, it was Rudy who usually stole the show.

From his days at old Wheeling High to those at West Liberty State College, Rudy was always there to help. Following a stint in the military service, he spent the next three decades or so as an educator, primarily in Eastern Ohio. He was principal at Buckeye South High when he retired.

His service to the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference was ongoing for more than three decades, and he served as president on two different occasions.

Through his efforts and those of his many friends who joined with him to work on various facets of the all-star classic, more than \$600,000 has been provided to Ohio Valley charitable groups.

Several years before his death, which came in early February of 1999, Mumley relinquished directorship of the game to his longtime associate and close friend, Ron Mauck.

Nonetheless, Rudy still remained a familiar figure on the sidelines. His walk had slowed considerably although he had bounced back from a series of illnesses. But, the enthusiasm was as great as ever. He had seen the game reach new heights last year when it was televised live by WTOV-9 and the game still drew a near-capacity crowd.

It was a fitting tribute that OVAC officials several years ago renamed the contest as the Rudy Mumley OVAC Charity All-Star Game.

Rudy was to become one of the most recognizable sports figures the Ohio Valley had ever produced. He was honored as the Dapper Dan's "Man of the Year" in 1992, and earlier was inducted into the Athletic Hall of Fame at his beloved West Liberty State College, following in the footsteps of his late brother, Eli. Rudy was the first non-athlete or non-coach to earn this honor, and in recent years, he became a prominent benefactor to the school.

Educator, humanitarian and philanthropist. That's the legacy of a guy who wanted to be known simply as Rudy.

And as long as this game can survive, fans of the Ohio Valley for the coming generations will be able to look skyward and say, "Thanks, Rudy!"

For more than three decades, Samuel A. Mumley served the youth of this area as executive secretary of the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference.

Last February, "Sammy" was called home by his maker to receive his just reward for a lifetime spent in service to others.

Perhaps the greatest compliment one can pay Sam Mumley following his passing is to say that he made his world a much better place to live because he once walked among us.

Mumley devoted nearly five decades to working for the youth of our Ohio Valley. In addition to his time as executive secretary of the OVAC, which is still

believed to be the largest high school athletic conference of its kind in the United States, Mumley was an athletic trainer, coach, basketball official, teacher and a school administrator.

If that wasn't enough time to give, Mumley joined Eric Carder, an assistant principal and director of activities at Wheeling Park High School, in serving as co-director for the West Virginia Super Six state high school football championships, which they brought to Wheeling Island Stadium six years ago.

Additionally, the pair helped secure the West Virginia state soccer championships held last year at the brand new athletic facility at Wheeling Jesuit University.

Sam also played a major role in the wonderful mid-summer football spectacle you are attending tonight at Wheeling Island Stadium. Renamed several years ago to honor his uncle, who also passed away earlier this year, the Rudy Mumley Charity All-Star Football Classic was revived in 1972 under the sponsorship of the OVAC.

In those days, the NCAA made things difficult for sponsors seeking sanction to hold various all-star contest. The local Ohio-West Virginia All-Star game had been dormant for many years after having been a fixture on the Ohio Valley gridiron scene since the early 1940s.

Both Mumley's spent hundreds of hours putting together the formula for a program that the NCAA found acceptable. Today, the game is more vibrant and popular than ever among the area football fans, who nearly pack the Island Stadium each and every July to kick off a new gridiron campaign.

They also helped turn this event into more than just a football game. It has become a mid-summer spectacular complete with an All-Star Band, cheerleaders and the pageantry of a Queen of Queens contest.

It also helped raise hundreds of thousands of dollars for charitable organizations in the Ohio Valley over the past 26 years.

Much of these wonders have been achieved because Mumley refused to take "no" for an answer from anyone and because he dared to dream what many of us have considered to be impossible dreams.

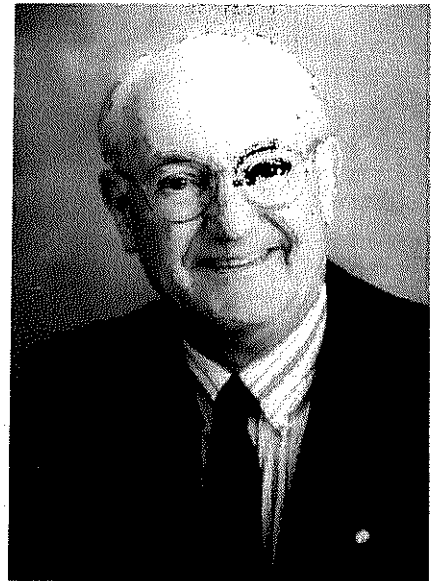
Who would have believed that the state high school football championships could ever be lured out of Charleston to the Northern Panhandle?

Sam did.

And Wheeling will host the state title games for the sixth straight year the first weekend of December.

Through his fund-raising efforts and the help of countless corporate sponsors and Super Six volunteers from up and down the Ohio Valley, the state football finals have been raised to a level that may never be matched in the Mountain State.

When Mumley came back to take over a second time as executive secretary of the OVAC, the league was in dire financial straits.

Through Mumley's efforts and the backing of other leaders in the community, an OVAC Foundation Board was formed to serve as a fund-raising arm of the bi-state league. That board is still in existence today.

The sports programs at the various schools were improved immensely. All-star games are now held each year in football, boys' and girls' basketball, baseball, softball and boys' and girls' soccer. The OVAC sponsors championship tournaments in wrestling, swimming, tennis, golf, volleyball, baseball, softball, boys' and girls' soccer, boys' and girls' cross country, boys' and girls' track, cheerleading, etc.

Girls sports have risen to equal importance because Sam had the foresight and the courage to support each and every program offered by the OVAC. His efforts with girls' sports earned Mumley a seat on the equity panels for both the Ohio High School Athletic Association and the West Virginia Secondary School Athletic Commission.

The scholarship program also has been enhanced by Sam's ability to involve the corporate sector of the various communities within the extensive OVAC map. At last May's OVAC Banquet of Champions held at the Wheeling Civic Center, more than \$15,000 in scholarship money was awarded to deserving OVAC student-athletes.

That money wasn't just found on the street corner; it was obtained largely through tireless efforts of the late executive secretary.

Sam put the OVAC's "kids" first in all his dreams and work for the conference. "What can we do for the 'kids'? How can we make things better for them?" Those were the first questions he posed whenever the OVAC or Super Six would discuss changes in their programs.

He took great pains to involve everyone in conference business. He was constantly in touch with media members, keeping them updated on matters and seeking their opinions.

When important final decisions had to be made, Sam didn't mind being the one to make them. But he did so after many discussions among his constituents and his own private soul-searching. And, of course, his main concern was making sure that the decisions were in the best interest of the OVAC student-athletes.

From a personal standpoint, if Sam became your friend, he was your friend for life. He was always there with a kind word, a bit of advice if it was asked for, and encouragement when any of his friends were in a difficult situation.

I once wrote in a column that Sam was no saint, but that he was sent to us by angels to perform good works and turn our impossible dreams into reality.

He dearly loved his wife, Nancy, who remained by his side through good times and rough times. No different from the rest of us, Nancy became part of the OVAC family as well, taking care of the conference's financial books, a role she continues to handle today.

They were married just 11 years when Sam passed away. But, as Nancy once said, they crammed 40 years of happiness into that short time.

A long bout with cancer terminated Mumley's life at the too young age of 67. But, as this writer has stated before, you won't make me believe "Sammy" lost that fight with cancer. Nothing defeated Sam Mumley in his lifetime. God, whom Sam believed in with all his heart, simply decided it was time to call him home.

Sam Mumley was one of a kind.

He will remain in our thoughts and prayers forever.

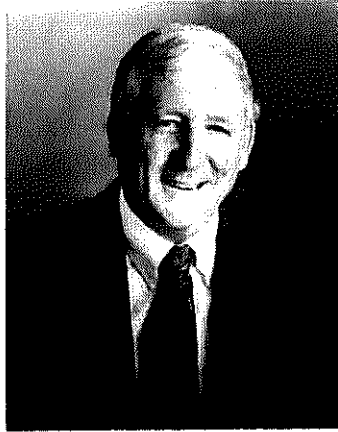

28 Years... OVAC All-Star Football Classic in Retrospect ...and The Tradition Continues

A vast majority of people said it would never happen, many felt that it was impossible and some believing that it was to no avail... "The OVAC would not gain NCAA sanction for the resurrection of the defunct Ohio-West Virginia All-Star Football Game." True, as it was, the 1960's did not allow the conference much latitude for its quest for an NCAA sanction.

As general information, at that time it was mandatory to receive NCAA sanction, otherwise those college bound grant-in-aid players would be declared ineligible for their freshman year. Therefore, during the early and middle 1960's, the Ohio-West Virginia All-Star Football Game drew those athletes of lesser athleticism or those not considering to participate on the collegiate level. Through such sanctioning, the NCAA could totally regulate any and all summer all-star contests, thus putting a "squeeze" on booster clubs and civic organizations who endeavored to work around such regulations. The Ohio-West Virginia All Star Football Game fell into this category, thus ending the game in the late 1960's and with it the once celebrated official opening of the Ohio Valley's "pigskin" season.

"We are not going to be denied," said Sam A. Mumley, Executive Secretary of the OVAC. "The rich athletic heritage of this valley as well as having one of the most prolific scholastic conferences in the country should entitle us the opportunity showcasing our student athletes." In this respect the conference executive board passed legislation which directed the executive secretary to set the course in obtaining NCAA sanctioning, all of which would cover three years of time, effort and patience.

Beginning in early 1968, and with the intent of gathering preliminary information, it readily became apparent that the deck was stacked" and those who originally commented on the impossibility of such an adventure their opinions seemed correct. However, the decision to move forward with our game remained and it was full speed ahead with enthusiasm, confidence and faith. What followed were days and months of endless phone conversations ranging from those with NCAA officials in Kansas City to those local and state political leaders as well as keeping the media constantly informed. Additionally there were endless committee and board meetings as well as dinner and luncheon engagements all designed with the purpose of seeking sanction approval.

1968 and 1969 quickly became history and among all of the other conference business, the OVAC was very busy in implementing its Title IX Program for Girls. Such female pro-

grams were introduced with the 1970 school year, two years before the federal mandatory date of September 1972. During this time period the conference was also formulating a scale scholarship program, Partners in Academic and Athletic Programs, re-designing those needed changes in many sports levels and maintaining a sound financial base for all conference operations. Regardless, the NCAA all-star sanction movement was in full swing with constant communication between the NCAA and the OVAC on target.

Late in 1971, a remarkable turn of events took place as the NCAA informed the OVAC that they reviewed one of our proposed all-star formats and found some definite interest in the overall structure. This, then, led to three continuous months of very intense correspondence and phone conversations. At this juncture it was felt that we were closing in on gaining sanction and the pendulum was swinging toward future.

Then it happened... late February 1972, a registered letter from the NCAA arrived at the conference office officially notifying the OVAC that the NCAA Review Board for all-star contests had awarded total sanction for a conference all-star game for the summer of 1972. Overwhelmed and overjoyed the conference held a monumental press meeting at the Clure Hotel in Wheeling announcing all the details related to the first OVAC All-Star Football Game. Rudy Mumley was already in the fold as our first director and remained as such for 23 years. In 1986, the game was officially re-named The Rudy Mumley OVAC Ohio-West Virginia Charity Football All-Star Classic.

Tonight's 27th Annual Extravaganza will have produced 1,500 players • 3,200 musicians and directors (since 1972) • 500 cheerleaders • 750 queen candidates • 300 coaches, trainers, doctors, and managers • 225,000 fans... and an enormous array of Shriners and volunteers, all major contributors in distributing over \$600,000.00 to local upper Ohio Valley charities.

1940" The First All-Star Game

West Virginia's senior All-Star boys today held a 13 to 17 victory over the eastern Ohio team in the first football contest played under new lighting system at the Island Stadium.

The victory of the mountain state was a surprise, who had trailed from the beginning quarter until the last seven minutes of the ball game, 7-0, came as a surprise as two well-drilled and very efficient combinations delighted the early season crowd of some 8,000.

The Ohioans drew first blood in the spectacular contest. A Mallery-Shackelton pass, late in the first period, moved the Buckeyes from mid-field to the West Virginia 25. Sadlowski, another Bellaire player, took a pass that planted the ball on the Ohio 19, from where Sadlowski scored on a play.

The remainder of the half was dominated by a distinct threat on the part of the Ohio team although the Rowe-Howell combination had advanced to the West Virginia 25 when the intermission arrived.

The mountaineer sturdy rush line dominated the equally effective Ohio forces on fairly even terms into the final minutes before Johnny August, a Shadyside youth, who shared the starting role with the Bucks, was hit hard on his own side by Joe Corba, a Follansbee back, who took the white leather for the eventual victory.

Charlie Helinski, Union product, was the ball of fire at this stage. He led off tackle to the Ohio 19 and mugged the leather to the five yard line by a too many times out penalty. Sadlowski picked up a yard and Mike "Dimitro" Dimitro punched his way to the payoff zone. Dimitro cracked the leather for the extra point and the issue was deadlocked.

Passes Decide Battle

The West Virginia stands settled back after this furious display satisfied with a 7-7 standoff, but the mountaineers were fired with the idea of victory when one of Joe Mallery's passes was intercepted near the 50 shortly after the succeeding kickoff.

Helinski nipped successive passes to Phil Saseen and after the second toss to the Central Catholic back had planted the ball on the Ohioans nine. Helinski and Dimitro required three tries before the former had found the pay dirt and the West Virginia youths had a 13-7 lead.

The remaining time allowed for another kickoff and the West Virginians successfully negotiated an onside kick, recovering the ball as the fray ended.

Coaches Bill Kerns of WVU and Don C. Pedden of Ohio University were the honorary mentors and in addition to sitting on the benches of the contesting squads, both spoke over the P.A. system at halftime. Kerns was accompanied here by Frank Kutz, one of his line mentors, and Ray Carnelly, his plebe mentor. The trio departed today for Charleston and tonight's North-South Game, although Kerns had an opportunity to talk to some local prospects.

Bill Stobbs, the Wheeling native who tutors the Wittenberg athletic teams, was one of the spectators in the stands. Another was George Roark, coach of W & J's Presidents, and probably there were others.

Carl Hamill, Weirton's cagey tutor was in the dressing room to minister to a pair of his former Red Riders. Tony Brown aggravated an old shoulder injury while Luke Tomasovich received a cracked rib.

The West Virginians showed big Sedor due respect while the prospective Ohio State youth was in the game. His Shadyside backfield mate, August

despite his costly fumble, was one of the big guns in the Bucks' effort and a Niemiec-Hartwig combination that left the West Virginia fans worried.

Lou Caffaro, recovering from a operation, held the sticks for the Virginians but felt the call of battle and played an impassive role. Paul Bricker, Wheeling, who handled the kicking for Sedor and Rowe, and did an effective job although one of his boots slipped on the side of his foot and out of bounds.

948" All-Star Game – 60 Years Ago

Ohio accentuated the positive with speed and its ability to do so brought a 20-7 victory over the West Virginians in the sixth annual Ohio Valley school-football game sweltered through by an attendance of 13,000 fans.

Starting in perfectly with Missouri Don's version of the "T" formation, the Ohio-red first, dropped behind a point at half-en added touchdowns in each of the final 10 to post their third victory against as losses in the series.

West Virginia was simply out-fought, as overwhelming advantage in statistics will show. Ohio led, 16-8, in first downs and 335 to 204 in total yards gained.

The loss was a disappointing one for West Coach Red Drew, the University of Mountaineer who last year piloted the Mounties to a last minute 14-0 victory.

Drew looked good for a repeat performance when his team suddenly came to life in the second quarter. But that score which brought West Virginia into a 7-6 lead, seemed to paralyze Mountaineers and they advanced only a few yards into anything resembling scoring territory.

Ohio's expected passing attack wasn't used to great extent and the manner in which the Ohio backfield corps cavorted called for no use of the aerial game.

Ohio scored in the first eight minutes of the game taking the ball on downs from West on its 39 and moving, thanks to the coordinated efforts of Paul Bucky of Toronto, Preston of Steubenville and Mikey Marshall of Clairsville, to the WV 15.

The drive included three first downs and on the 15, the redoubtable Bucky brought out with his left hand and passed into the arms of Albarano, who did a circus act with a WV punter before cringing the oval in the end zone.

Stol Pete Polovina, whose trick knee prevented no one but the West Virginians, missed the kick this time – although he hit two during the evening.

West Virginia received, moved to the Ohio 10, lost possession of the ball on downs. A thoughtful of the good neighbor policy, Ohio handed the oval back to WV when Bucky tried an attempt pitch out and Ron Malone of Weirton recovered.

That ended the first quarter and the second 10 minutes were the only cheerful ones for the Mountaineers.

Bob Grundy of Wheeling, who also excelled in defense, started the drive with a burst to the Ohio 43. From their Clyde Campbell of Ohio and Grundy smashed to the Ohio 26, Bob Litton of Linsly chipped in with a dash to the 8. Campbell slashed to the 14 and Litten fumbled the right end to the 10 to set up Grundy's drive for the touchdown. Bob Hudson of Weirton booted the placement in fine fashion to give Ohio a 7-6 advantage.

Ohio attempted to come back in the second quarter, but after driving from the Buckeye 32 to the West Virginia 12, suddenly ran out of gas when Polovina fumbled in an attempt to get rid of the ball. This time, Ed Gialluco of Weirton recovered.

Ohio took the second half kickoff and converted into a touchdown. From their 37, the Buckeyes moved to the 48 for a first down as Marshall and Bucey ran right and left.

Bucey, on a sweeping end play symbolic of the Ohio attack all night, lashed his way to the WV 41 for a first down and two plays later, Robertson moved from the 38 to the WV 29 on a well executed inside tackle play.

These plays are featured by the heads-up Ohio line play, a forward wall outweighed but never out fought to any great degree.

From the 29, Robinson got an assist from Joe Fortunato of Mingo, who went to the 25, on which he vaulted to the WV 13.

Robinson again took the leather, pushed forward to the WV 2, but fumbled. This time however, the alert Albarano was there and covered for the Buckeyes.

Big Hube Johnson of Wheeling broke through to drop Fortunato at the 3 but on the next play, quarterback Bill Krochta of Smithfield sneaked through center to give the Ohioans a 14-7 advantage for keeps.

The scoring thrust was only icing on a well played game for Krochta, who kept WV guessing throughout with his ball handling at quarterback for Faurot's outfit.

West Virginia's receipt of the ensuing kickoff marked the Mounties' final admirable effort with the ball, and it wasn't good enough.

1958" All-Star Game – 50 Years Ago

Ohio's streamlined Buckeyes ripped the mountain Mountaineers to shreds last night in a jam-packed throng of gridiron enthusiasts at Wheeling Stadium to capture the 16th all-football game 25-0.

Though decided underdogs and outweighed the West Virginia squad, the tremendous speed of the scarlet clad forces turned the classic rout.

The Buckeyes showed some 12,000 fans in the game that they didn't deserve the underdog rating by intercepting a West Virginia pass and scored the first touchdown with only a few minutes gone from the scoreboard clock.

It was much the same story the remainder of the night – which was exceedingly long for the Mountaineer rooters. The heavier, but slower West Virginians were unable to cope with the Ohio offense.

Tom Yakubowski, rangy Adena fullback who roamed through the Mountaineer line seemingly at will, was adjudged the most outstanding player from the Buckeyes, while Frankie Brown, diminutive Fairmont West scatback, was tapped with the same honor for the Mountaineers.

John Havlicek, Bridgeport quarterback, scored for four yards to St. John's Joie Maroon for another Ohio touchdown in the second quarter. Yakubowski plunged for another in the third quarter and Clyde Thomas, Bellaire, plunged for the last score in the final stanza.

Jim Dowdle, Cadiz, kicked off to Roger Holdinsky, Moundsville, at the goal line. He returned to the 23. Ray Kasimakis, Weirton, was held for no gain. Holdinsky picked up three but George Mancini, St. John's intercepted Holdinsky's pass on the next play on the West Virginia 45 and returned to the 19.

Tom Yakubowski, Adena fullback, lost a fumble. Joie Maroon, St. John's, picked up two yards. Kubowski gained one and West Virginia took the lead on its own 17 when John Havlicek's pass was batted down.

On a mix-up in the West Virginia backfield, Mike Jacobs, Bellaire, grabbed the ball on the West Virginia 16. George Hale, East Liverpool, gained three, Maroon skirted left end to the 12 yard line but a five yard illegal procedure penalty set Ohio back to the 12 from where Kubowski roared over left tackle for the first touchdown with the game only four minutes old. John Boseley, Greenback, led the gang that included Clyde Thomas (Bellaire) try for the conversion.

Holdinsky again brought the kickoff back to his own to the WV 23. Kasimakis picked up three yards and WV drew a five yard penalty. Eli Kasonovich, Weirton, gained one. Frank Brown, Fairmont, West, held for no gain and Dunbar's pass in Keller punted to the Ohio 40. Maroon led it in and scampered to the WV 29.

Yakubowski gained one, Havlicek kept for two, and Maroon then pitched to Hale for 13 yards to the 13. Hale picked up four more and Havlicek lofted a perfect aerial to Maroon in the

knocked down the pass from George Jenkins, Cadiz for the PAT.

Kasonovich took Dowdle's kickoff at the five and returned to the 23. Brown hit left tackle for five, and Boseley hit for a first down at the 33. Ohio drew a five yard offside penalty. Kasonovich gained one, and Brown turned left end to the 43. Before the quarter ended, Kasonovich gained four yards in two tries.

Keller pitched to Boseley for 18 yards to the Ohio 38. Keller got three at right tackle, Boseley four at center, Brown three at left end for another first down. Boseley was held for no gain. Keller's pass was incomplete and then he pitched high for another incomplete pass. On an attempted Statue of Liberty, Brown was a little slow coming around and it dropped out of Boseley's hands. Brown recovered for a three yard loss. Ohio taking over at its own 37.

Maroon got three, Hale two, and Yakubowski cracked through for 12 more to the West Virginia 46. Hale ran for 11 more. Ohio was penalized 15 yards for clipping back to the WV 37. Maroon skirted right end to the Mountaineer 26. Havlicek passed to Tom Walters, Wintersville, for 7 yards. Holdinsky batted down the next pass and then West Virginia was penalized 15 yards back to its own 19 for roughing Havlicek. The Bridgeport ace then, on a keeper, slipped through to the 6 yard line. He tried it again but lost four. George Jenkins, center, replacing Havlicek, fumbled and Red Arango, Weirton, recovered at the 16 to stop the threat.

Brown was stopped at left tackle, Jim Hawkins, Linsly fullback, picked up two, and his pass on the next play was incomplete. Keller then kicked to Hale who returned 22 yards to the WV 45, but Ohio was caught clipping and set back to the Buckeye 39. Yakubowski got a first down in two tries to the West Virginia 48. Hale added another to the 37. Mike Fulks, Weirton, broke up Havlicek's pass, and Walters dropped another aerial. Maroon trying to pass, was trapped back at midfield for a 13 yard loss.

Second Half

Hale grabbed Holdinsky's kickoff at the 20 and returned to the 36. Yakubowski gained nine, then carried for a first down at the 40, then fumbled when tackled but recovered. Havlicek lost two yards, then Hale hit left guard for four yards. Yakubowski then cracked over tackle to the 29 for another first down. A clipping penalty set Ohio back to the 45. Havlicek lateralled to Hale who carried to the 34. Maroon then broke away for seven yards. Yakubowski turned left end to the 14 yard line. Hale broke off the left side for 10 yards. Ray Church, Wintersville, got three yards in two plunges, then Maroon went wide for no gain, but Yakubowski boomed into the middle for the score and then ran for the conversion.

Ted Midkiff, Huntington Central, fumbled a short kickoff near his own 39, and Maroon recovered at the WV 48. West Virginia was given an unnecessary roughness penalty back to

penalized five yards. Hale broke away for an apparent touchdown but was ruled that he set out of bounds at the 30 yard line. Jenkins punted to the 16 but a holding penalty set them back to the WV 47. Church lost a yard and for the time Ohio punted. Hale's punt came down WV 36.

Kasimakas crashed for four, Kasonovich gained three, and after his pass failed, Keller punted to Thomas at the Ohio 33 yard line.

Yakubowski crashed for three yards. Jenkins fumbled but recovered for a two yard loss, and when Yakubowski tumbled, Camiletti, Wellsburg, recovered at the Ohio 33.

On a Brown slant, Ohio was charged with holding and setback to the 19 yard line. Kasimakas crashed for four yards but then fumbled. Kasonovich chasing it back to recover on the yard line. Kasonovich turned passer and then Jenkins for 20 yards and then Keller passed to Brown but he was short of the first down. Quarter ended.

Yakubowski hit center for three yards. Hale turned left end for six yards, and Haubert on a sneak picked up the first down. Church picked up a yard, Havlicek added six more to reach the eight yard line and another first down.

A personal foul set Ohio back to the 26. Robertson, Toronto, gained four, then Keller passed to Jacobs for an apparent touchdown but it was ruled that Jacobs was out of the end zone when he caught it. Ohio drew another penalty back to the 33 yard line. Holdinsky then intercepted a Jenkins aerial at the West Virginia yard line. However, WV fumbled and Frank Varcalle, St. John's guard, recovered.

Robertson gained three and then one to the one, and Thomas leaped over the line for the touchdown. Church's plunge was short. Ohio led 25-0.

Brown took the kickoff at the 10 and returned it to the WV 39. He then added three yards over left tackle. Keller's pass was incomplete and WV drew a five-yard delaying penalty to the 37. Keller then passed to Kasonovich for 13 yards and a first down at midfield. Haubert was hit hard and fumbled and Robertson recovered at the Ohio 46.

Robertson went for five yards but then drew a five-yard offside penalty. A fumble moved the ball back to the Ohio 41. Jenkins' pass was incomplete. John Havlicek kicked the ball and was downed at the WV 21.

Hawkins got three yards at the Ohio 41. Kasonovich got eight yards to the 33 and then Keller's pass was incomplete with less than a minute to play. A wide sweep to the left picked up six yards to the WV 39. Keller's pass and the ball was marked dead at the Ohio 11 yard line.

Ball game ended up with two time consuming line plays by Ohio.

968" All-Star Game – 40 Years Ago

Ohio made a first quarter touchdown for a 6-0 victory over West Virginia in the 25th Ohio Valley All-Star Football Game Saturday at Wheeling Stadium.

A crowd of only about 3,500, the smallest in the history of the interstate classic, saw the Buckeye strike through the air early, with a back pass from Winterville's Young to Union Local end Ron accounting for the game's only

The Ohioans coached by Winterville's Harold Mercer with assistant mentor Jake Olsavsky as his assistant, posted a decided statistical advantage but were never able to strike pay dirt after the first period foray for 14 yards in eight plays.

Ohio finished with 14 first downs, six for the underdog Mountaineers and rolled up a combined pig-passing net of 200 yards from scrimmage compared to 48 for the

Although the only touchdown was on a pass, neither side was able to move through the air, Ohio having two completions, both on passes going, in nine attempts. While the Mountaineers recorded only one completion in 10 tries and that for just one yard.

West Virginia's offense was inactive for the first half but picked up steam in the third quarter when Asbesee Coach Denny Williams, leading the Mountaineers, inserted quarterback Donahue's Bill Higgins at quarterback.

WV was not inside the OH 40 yard line in the final period when an 11 yard return by Weirton's Tom Curtis crossed the oval on the Buck 35. Paden City's Steve Billeter skirted end to the end and Higgins completed a pass to

an offside penalty which moved the pigskin back to the 30. On the next play Bill Bates, Cadiz, nailed Higgins for a seven yard loss as the Donahue QB was attempting to pass and the Mountaineer threat then died on a brief flurry of incompletions.

Ohio took over the ball at its 33 and proceeded to drive, largely on the running of the elusive Young, to the WV 25. The Buckeyes appeared headed for its second TD but a fumble by the big Barnesville fullback, Dan Hannahs, was confiscated by Union's Jerry Minor to thwart the bid.

This was the third time during the evening that the Ohioans yielded the ball on a fumble. Ted Stewart, West Virginia's captain from Magnolia, recovered the other two and subsequently was rewarded with the trophy as his team's most valuable player. The slippery Young was the choice of the press for Ohio's MVP.

Rain, which fell early in the evening, undoubtedly cut into the size of the crowd and made footing a bit precarious on some of the sweeps but the field was in good condition, generally. It's a pity that the carpet of grass will probably be gone by mid-October.

Last night's nod gave the Buck's a 15-10 edge in the series and avenged last year's 18-0 loss.

Ohio capitalized upon a break to score before the game was seven minutes old. WV received the opening kickoff, made one first down on the running of Weirton's Tom Curtis and Paden City's Steve Billeter and then was forced into a punting situation. However, Weirton's Madonna's Bill Vitar was unable to get his boot off because of a low pass from center and was tackled on his own 31 by Jim Jackson of Mingo and Bill Bates of

It took the Buckeyes eight plays to score from there. They broke Winterville speedster Don Young loose for 10 yards and Bellaire's Dan Hudson picked up 10 in three carries before the quarterback from Brilliant Bob Evans, sneaked to a first down on the seven. Young then zipped for five on a cutback but Evans lost two on keeper at end. On third down Young started right as if to circle end but threw a halfback pass which Union Local's Ron Dean snared in the end zone for the TD. A pass by Evans for the extra point try was incomplete.

Early in the second period the Mountaineers got a second break when Magnolia's Ted Stewart covered a Buckeye fumble on the Ohio 49 but Mt. Pleasant's Charles Demore dropped Warwood QB Frank Biega for a 12 yard loss and WV was stymied.

Ohio penetrated to the blue and gold 39 midway through the second frame with another Young to Dea pass picking up 15 precious yards. Wheeling Central's Dave Singer and Frank Papini dropped Bates for a seven yard loss and the Buckeye were ultimately forced to punt.

Late in the half the fans saw two interceptions on successive plays as both clubs tried to strike by air to beat the clock. West Virginia's Joe Yoho from Cameron, grabbed a toss from Winterville's Denny Montgomery but on the next play Montgomery returned the favor. After Powhatan's Bob Renolds had deflected a Biega aerie Montgomery latched onto the ball for the interception.

1978" All-Star Game – 30 Years Ago

Trailing 14-0 at halftime, a suddenly inspired Ohio team came to life after intermission to snap West Virginia's five game winning streak in the Annual Ohio Valley Athletic Conference All-Star Football Classic: Saturday night at rain-swept Wheeling Stadium.

A disappointing turnout, estimated at 1000 fans, saw the revived Buckeyes grab a 14-14 decision via their exciting comeback against the Mountaineers, who went flat after taking command in the first half as Wheeling's ark speedster Rico Cox tallied touchdowns of 47 and six yards.

The decisive Buckeye touchdown was set up by a spectacular 32 yard punt return by Buckeye North's Dennis "Boo Boo" Johnson, who was one of the heroes of the evening for a delated Ohioans.

The Bucks bounced into contention by capitalizing on two costly West Virginia fumbles in the third quarter as Greg Bonar, quarterback for Shadyside, threw passes to Johnson and Cambridge's Rich Vance following the changes of possession.

However, Marietta Coach Rich Hahn, noting the Bucks, sent his chargers after two point conversions following both third period scores. Since the two point efforts failed, West Virginia carried a 14-12 edge into the final frame.

But the elusive Johnson struck again in the fourth period when he returned a punt by Weirton's John Canei 32 yards to the Mountaineer 16. It was a beautiful broken field run, with Johnson keeping his balance though hit by three different tacklers to carry the ball deep into enemy territory.

It took Ohio six plays to cover the remaining 16 yards, with Anthony Orsini, quarterback from Steubenville Catholic, sneaking over from the one for the TD. St. Clairsville's Mike Brown made 14 yards in four carries in the foray.

The winning TD came with just 4:14 remaining in the game. Faking a kick by Wintersville's Steve Brown, the Ohioans went or two again on the conversion try, and Leavittsville's Wade Lucas the apparent holder, passed to Johnson for the final markers.

West Virginia coached by Brooke's Vincent "Sonny" Ray, battled desperately to regain control. Two pass interference calls against Ohio helped the Mountaineers penetrate to the Ohio 28 with just 1:23 to go. But the always-dangerous Cox was dropped for a six yard loss on a sweep by Meadowbrook's

Steve Miles. Two plays later, with just 44 seconds left on the clock, Weir High quarterback, Tim Lescallete looped a pass downfield, but Marietta's Joe Weber intercepted it at the 10 and returned to the 28 to pound the final nail into the Mountaineer coffin.

Ohio was hurt severely by penalties during the evening as the Buckeyes lost 114 yards on 10 violations, three of them for pass interference. The Mountaineers were penalized six times for 46 yards but lost the ball three times on fumbles and Ohio took advantage and scored on two of the bobbles.

The Mountaineers completed just two of seven passes for 18 yards and suffered one interception. Ohio made 157 yards by passing on 12 of 17 attempts. But the Buckeyes were intercepted three times by Weirton's Kevin Sikora. Neither side was particularly impressive with its ground game, though footing was surprisingly good considering the conditions. West Virginia netted 101 yards rushing compared to Ohio's 47. Each side finished with 10 first downs.

Ohio had two golden scoring opportunities in the first half but both, in the early minutes of the contest, and in the final seconds of the second period, were thwarted by alert Mountaineer defensive play.

Meantime West Virginia turned Cox loose for both their TD's.

Ohio claimed possession on the WV 38 when Lucas recovered a fumble by Mike Dawson of Magnolia, on the opening kickoff.

With the help of a 10 yard gain on a pass from Bonar to wide receiver Weber, the Bucks penetrated to the 15. However, on Bonar's next aerial effort, Sikora made a stretching interception at the two.

The Mountaineers strung together three first downs on a march that carried past midfield before running out of steam. Canei then kicked dead at the Buck 11.

On the punt exchange, River's Barry Kriechbaum booted the oval to Dawson who was downed at the Ohio 47 by Brown and Steubenville's Greg Taylor.

On the very next play, Lescallete pitched out to the fleet Cox who skirted right end on a sweep and raced down the near sideline on the west side of the stadium for a 47 yard TD run. Canei converted with 1:30 left in the initial stanza.

The Mountaineers traveled 60 yards for another TD early in the second quarter. After a 20 yard gain on a pass down the middle from Lescallete to Linsly's rangy Jim Maurer, the

blue shirted West Virginian's picked more yards the easy way as Ohio was penalized twice for unsportsmanlike conduct. Second penalty, half the distance to the 10 left the pigskin at the Buckeye 11. Cox swept the left side to the 6 and on the next he zoomed off right tackle into the end zone. Linsly's Randy Austin converted to a 14-0 with :23 left in the half.

Late in the second quarter, Ohio made a threat behind the passing of Orsini, who threw to Kriechbaum for 13 yards, Johnson for 10, and Weber for 32. The pass to Weber put Ohio on the West Virginia 20 with 1:42 left in intermission.

One thrust by Brown and two by Johnson resulted in a rushing first down at the Ohio 10. But the Ohioans were battling the clock as well as the Mountaineers. Orsini fired to Weber who was knocked out of bounds the two with :26 seconds left. G. J. Johnson, John Marshall stalwart, and Brooksville's Almasly stopped Brown for no gain on a pitchout. Orsini's next pass fell incomplete in the end zone, but West Virginia was penalized and the penalty advanced the ball to the Ohio 10.

On third down Walley's pass to Cambridge's Allen Neff cold at the scrum and time expired before the Ohio could get off a fourth down try.

Ohio found its momentum in the third quarter after Wintersville's Marvin Johnson gobbled up a West Virginia fumble by Mountaineer 19. On the very next play Johnson found Johnson open for the TD, which was converted with 7:16 left in the third frame.

On the ensuing series of plays, Steubenville Catholic's George Znyl intercepted a Mountaineer bobble at the West Virginia 18. Three plays later, Bonar ran for 10 yards and hit Vance for the score.

Thus the stage was set for Johnson's fourth quarter punt return which was his finest factor in the streak breaking game win.

988" All-Star Game – 20 Years Ago

They didn't paint quite as pretty a picture as Coach Pabolish would have liked, but Ohio's OVAC All-Stars saved their strokes of genius for the right times every evening.

After being outplayed on both sides of scrimmage in the first half, the Buckeyes pieced together two timing drives when they needed them the most and won for a 12-7 decision of West Virginia in the 17th annual Mumley Ohio Valley Athletic Conference All-Star Football Classic.

The game drew an estimated crowd of 8,500 to the Ohio Stadium. Ohio now leads the series 10-7 and has won the overall battle of the states 24-19. The Buckeyes have now won the last three summer showdowns and 11 of the past 16.

Ohio tailback Tim Boyd, one of Pabolish's owners for the last two years at Buckeye South High, scored the decisive touchdown on a one yard run with 1:15 remaining in the third quarter. The warring factions had traded short TD bursts in the first half, with West Virginia owning a 7-6 lead at intermission thanks to an Ohio conversion which went awry.

West Virginia crossed midfield twice in the second half but ran out of downs on the Ohio 45 early in the third quarter and later saw a pass intercepted by Dave Mason at his own 20 with just over three minutes to go.

After a near flawless first half, the two teams committed all five of the game's turnovers and all seven of the game's penalties into the final two periods.

"Winning ugly, huh?" was the first thing a smiling Pabolish offered following the spirited struggle.

"Actually I was scared to death right until the end," Pabolish explained. "They had some great athletes."

Pabolish and his staff talked about gaining control in the battle up front when they met with the Ohio coaches at halftime. In the first half the Mountaineers outplayed the Buckeyes to a net of 14 rushing yards on 12 attempts; meanwhile, West Virginia had a net of 58 yards on 11 attempts, which included a loss of 21 yards on a punt snap.

"We felt our strength was our defensive line," Pabolish allowed, "but to win, our offensive line had to be dominant. We wanted to control both sides (of

scrimmage). But they (West Virginia) controlled the first and second quarters.

"In the second half, we wanted to get the feel of the things and we kept it on the ground a little more than expected we would."

Ohio's first possession of the second half would be its best of the night. The Buckeyes drove 63 yards in 10 plays and even overcame a 10 yard holding penalty.

There were three key plays in the march: the first was a roughing the kicker penalty on an Ohio punt attempt giving the Buckeyes the ball and a first down at midfield. The second was a 16 yard ramble off tackle by Woodsfield tailback Greg Schumaker on a third and one call from the West Virginia 41. Another 12 yards were tacked on for a face mask penalty on the tackle. Then, the Ohio coaching staff took a timeout on fourth and two call from the WV 5. It came up with a sprint draw to Boyd, who advanced the ball to the Ohio 10. He then carried it over the goal on the next play.

Boyd, barely 165 pounds soaking wet, would finish with 36 yards on 14 tough carries. Twice he picked up key first downs for his side, with his ducking, diving, and twisting style.

"He proved that he could play tonight, didn't he?" Pabolish beamed.

"It was a change coming up here and playing against these guys...they were pretty big." Boyd admitted. "But I got used to it in practice the last couple of weeks with our own team."

West Virginia would have a pair of promising drives following Ohio's second half TD.

The first came when the Mountaineers took over their own 29 after an interception by Weir's Joe Batten. One of his two thefts for the night. After three running plays gained 12 yards, quarterback Stu James hit tight end Pat Mirandy with a pop pass across the middle for a 13 yard pickup to the Ohio 46. But they would gain just one more yard on a Raleigh Mason run before their straight passes fell incomplete. On fourth down, blitzing George Terry batted away a James pass at the line of scrimmage.

What proved to be the Mountaineer's last chance came with 6:19 remaining in the game when they took over at their own 45 following a punt. Mason got

ards on a pair of toss sweeps before James moved the all 11 yards on a keeper. But on third and nine at the Ohio 32, James watched intended receiver Brian Burke go long and DeBiase stepped in front of the West Virginia fullback, to intercept the ball at his own 20. He brought it back 14 yards and Ohio took over.

If the Buckeyes were going to hold on, they had to fill the remaining time off the clock with run-oriented drive. They were going to have to reassert their superiority of the scrimmage line. They did.

On successive fourth and one calls, Ohio went to fullback Bill Kidd with the game on the line. Kidd ran behind Hans Yett for three yards on the first occasion and, four downs later, salted away the decision by leaping over a stack of players for a first down at the West Virginia 45 with :34 left in the game.

Kidd had only seven carries in the game; but was ready when they called his number. "I'm glad they did," he smiled through a mixture of sweat and dirt. "I knew we could do it. I knew we could get it across."

Ohio gained a net of just 80 yards on 28 plays in the second half. But when it was vital, the Buckeyes moved the ball. When combined, the initial drive of the second half (which scored the TD) and their final clock killer produced 82 yards and all five of their second half first downs. Their other three drives resulted in a minus yards.

"We were kind of shaky in the first half," Kidd assessed. "They (Ohio's coaches) told us just to put it out of our minds in the second half."

Yetts, one of Ohio's fiercest tacklers, was glad his side got a reprieve following the intermission.

"In the first half they were double teaming me," he pointed out. "Hey they had some big guys up front and couldn't get through. They were controlling it on us in the first half, but it wasn't with the center and guards," Yetts offered. "It was the tackles coming down on me and (Steve) Gretchen. In the second half, we got a little better feel for what they were doing and we got in a little more."

"It feels great to win," he beamed. "It feels great to be over."

West Virginia's Burke emerged as the games leading rusher, with 59 yards in 14 carries. Mason added 43

in nine attempts. Schumaker led Ohio with 40 yards and seven totes.

Burke, a John Marshall graduate, scored West Virginia's only TD on a three yard run with 8:31 left in the second quarter, capping a 66-yard drive. Soliday's extra point permitted the Mountaineers to take a halftime advantage.

Ohio had hit the board first on a seven yard scramble run by Union Local's Terry George at the 5:27 mark in the first quarter. The Buckeyes had taken over at the West Virginia 10 following a bad snap to Soliday's punt formation, with Kidd falling on the ball at the Ohio 10. It took two plays, both runs, for a 6-0 lead.

The expected aerial show between the team's top 1,000 yard passers did not materialize, but not because neither tried. West Virginia attempted 19 passes in the Ohio 16.

The biggest culprit was probably the defensive line pass rush from both defensive lines. Ohio quarterback Todd Antill and West Virginia's Stu James were scrambling for their health several occasions.

Several passes were flat out dropped, especially on the West Virginia side. Wheeling Park's Steve Donaldson had a frustrating night, failing to hold onto three balls which might have resulted in big plays.

"He caught every ball we threw to him for the last few weeks," West Virginia's coach John Stender sighed. "It was just one of those things."

The Mountaineer signal callers were a combination of 13 through the air for 19 yards. Ohio was 6-16 yards. Each team threw two interceptions.

"I was afraid to get into a skill battle with Clay and Donaldson," Pobolish confessed. "Our secondary took that away. Our coaching staff did a great job. We had a total team defense."

But those offensive shortcomings didn't stop the teams from hitting hard and playing hard.

"You find out," Pobolish began, "that no matter what you're playing – tiddlywinks, ping-pong, checkers – ever – you want to win. You do what it takes."

998" All-Star Game – 10 Years Ago

The 27th Annual Rudy Ryley OVAC All-Star Football Classic at Wheeling and Stadium featured a high-scoring game by both teams. The Ohio squad racked up 16 yards on the ground to 16 by West Virginia.

Ohio tacked on 98 yards through the air on six completions, including one touchdown, and while West Virginia had six completions the game was but 37.

The game featured two high-profile running backs: Ohio's Chad Brinker, the hard-setting Martins Ferry back, and Linsly's Eddie Drummond, a Parade All-American, and with these two efforts a high-scoring affair was anticipated, and those hopes the Buckeye State didn't disappoint as they racked up 28 points, 28 of which came in the first half.

The final score was 41-16. The first score of the game came on a three-run by Joey Luckino of Indian Creek, with Luckino adding a second TD in the initial period when Jake

Kasper of Meadowbrook went in from the two.

Although rushing for 154 yards on 16 carries, all in the first half, Brinker scored his only touchdown in the second period on a 23 run. The final TD of the first half came when Bellaire's Clint Lekanudos tallied from 26 yards out with 33 seconds in the second period.

West Virginia got on the scoreboard before intermission when Drummond raced 62 yards to paydirt on the first play following the ensuing kickoff.

The game got a little closer in the third period as West Virginia was the only one to tally any points, the TD coming on a five yard run by Chad Pratz.

The fourth quarter was all Ohio, scoring twice on touchdowns, an eight-yard run by Luckino and on a 26 yard pass from Ty Masciarelli to Collin Hardwick. The Ohio squad was coached by East Liverpool's Bob Thayer, while Wayne Neely of Weir directed the West Virginia squad.

According to a newspaper

account, the game drew a "huge throng" to the Islip facility.

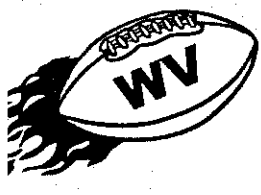

~ A Tribute to George Strager ~

(A column by Nick Bedway that originally appeared in the Wheeling News-Register on August 18, 2003)

With another high school football season set to get underway, I thought this might be a good time to reflect on the career of the late George Strager.

The Ohio Valley's winningest schoolboy football coach, Strager was truly a legend in his own time, having amassed a total of 246 victories during a career that spanned nearly four decades.

Perhaps, I should point out that there's no telling how many more games Strager's teams would have won had the current tiebreaker rules been in effect while he was stalking Ohio Valley sidelines.

During his entire coaching career, if the score was tied at the end of the fourth quarter everybody was home, satisfied or not.

Strager's offensive genius was considered ahead of his era and he certainly could have figured out a way for his teams to win at least half of those stalemated contests in overtime. His overall record stands at 246 wins, 115 losses and 16 ties.

I picked Coach Strager as the subject for this column not just because of the success he experienced in coaching. The love and dedication that he gave the couple of thousand kids he coached affected most of their lives in a positive way.

Yes, George was hard to play for and tough as nails on the field. His pre-game and halftime talks were filled with fire, especially when he didn't think his team was performing up to his expectations. But he was hilariously funny at times with his jokes and players.

Today's younger coaches could have learned a lot about football and how to get the maximum out of their players had they had the opportunity to learn from this coaching giant.

This past week I asked a couple of long-time Strager friends and associates - Doug Huff, the former Sports Editor of The Intelligencer and Wheeling Central Catholic assistant coach Mike Young - to share some of their reflections on Ol' George.

Doug Huff spent nearly three decades covering Strager's teams. Young played for Strager at Central. He was also his long-time assistant coach at Wheeling Central Catholic and he has handled perhaps the toughest task of all when he was asked to succeed the long-time mentor at the Red Devil. "It wasn't as difficult as people said it would be because George Strager prepared me to be a head coach by giving me responsibility and my confidence. When the time came, I felt like I was ready for it," Young explained. Mike had spent 17 years on Strager's staff at St. Clairsville.

"He was like a second father to me in terms of our friendship and the way our families got along. I don't think a lot of people realize that George was a great family man." He and his wife had four kids and two of them were still in junior high when Lounelle passed away. George did a wonderful job of raising them almost on his own. All of his children have been successful in their lives as well," Young added. "One of the things I always admired was Strager's football brain that put him ahead of the other coaches during his long career. He was a master-mind of the offense. He talked about how Strager could look at a team's defense and quickly find a way to attack it and pick it apart. "We were very fortunate to have had many quality athletes at St. Clairsville," Young also said.

The most famous of the Strager proteges, of course, was Tim Spencer, who went on from the Saints to star at Ohio State, play in the NFL and return to Buckeye Local as an assistant coach. The unfortunate part of Strager's Red Devil days were they came at a time when the Ohio High School Athletic Association was taking just one or two teams from each region for post-season play. "We had some great teams but we never got a chance to play in the post-season," Young said. Three of Strager's undefeated teams at St. Clairsville never made it into the playoffs.

St. Clairsville did make it twice under Strager, qualifying in 1983 and in 1986. The 1986 squad won two playoff contests and went to the state final when it lost a controversial decision to Chagrin Falls Kenston at the Rubber Bowl in Akron. It was Huff that pointed out that Strager is probably the only person to have coached three different Ohio Valley teams to unbeaten seasons. His 1953 Sistersville Tigercats won the state championship with a 27-12 victory over Romney.

In 1963, Strager guided the Maroon Knights to a 10-0-1 season, ending with a 40-6 dismantling of highly-regarded Charleston Catholic "backfield" in the WV Catholic title game. He also had three undefeated teams at St. Clairsville, posting records of 9-0 in 1969, 10-0-0 in 1985.

Certainly, this feat of having unbeaten clubs in four different decades is another unmatched area achievement. "I always considered Coach Strager's Coach because he was so well respected among his peers," Huff said, "mention his name in a conversation with fellow coaches and you always had something positive to say about his coaching philosophy, techniques, etc." Huff also talked about how Strager's teams were always prepared and covered. They never seemed out of a game because of his offense's ability to strike from any place on the field. "Some people thought of Coach Strager as a high school football coach. And he was one of the best," Huff added.

Doug certainly told it the way it was where our mutual friend was concerned. George had opportunities to go into the college ranks and turned down a couple of big-time offers as I recall. But his fun and his life was in taking a group of young high school kids and molding them into something special.

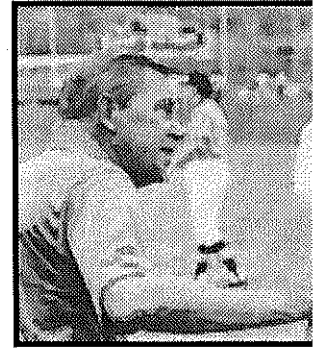
Bob Kettlewell, the late successful coach at Wintersville (now Indian Creek High School) regarded Strager as being as good a quarterback as he ever saw. The triggerman at QB was definitely the key in Strager's multiple offense, more as a ball handler than a thrower. I remember someone who could run his offense with a sleight-of-hand, good things were going to happen for his team that season.

My relationship with George was more than just between a journalist and a coach. When he came to coach at Wheeling Central Catholic, I was a young writer and both Strager and the late Bob Roe, then the head coach at Wheeling High School, took me under their wing. Strager was never known for paying much attention to the defensive side of the football, although I'm sure that was exaggerated.

I do recall one time, however, when I went out to do a "Strager & Son" piece for the newspaper the week of the Red Devil's opening game at Wheeling High School. On George's staff and his defensive coordinator at the time was his son, "Duke." After talking with the head coach I decided to talk to Duke for a few minutes. "How's the defense going," I asked. "I don't know. Dad's spending so much time with the offense that it isn't let me work with the defense yet," Duke said as I could see the twinkle in his eye.

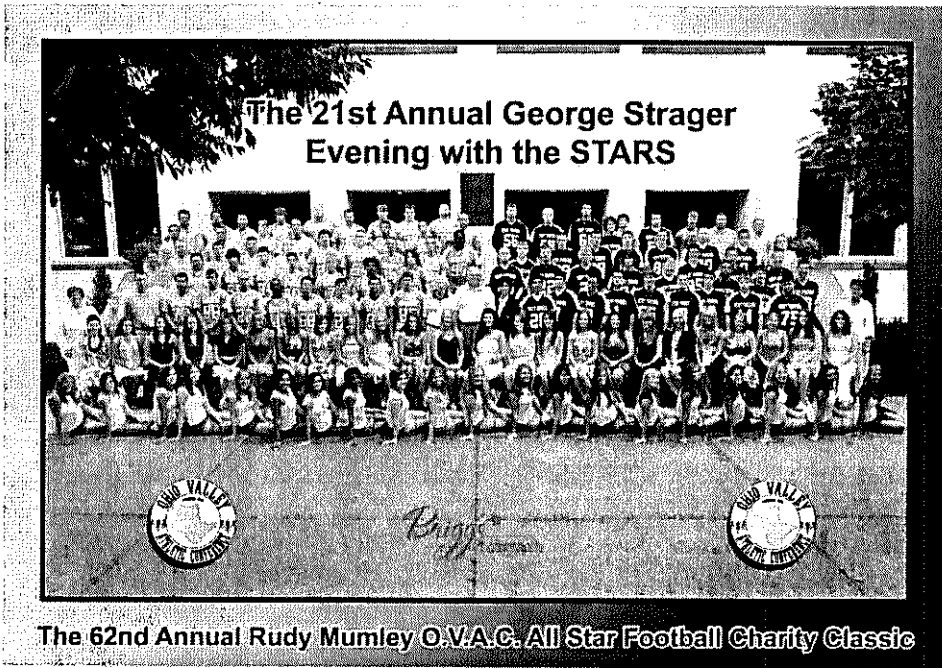
Either the son was kidding me, or the defense made some remarkable strides in the three days prior to the game as St. Clairsville came out and beat the Wildcats 44-14. Strager's impact on the Ohio Valley coaching scene and even some of the today's athletes will continue to be felt. Mike Young pointed out that he and Kelly Rine continue to be directors for the George Strager Football camp every summer. Players who participate in the Rudy Mumley OVAC All-Star Football Game are feted four nights before the contest each year at George Strager Evening with the Stars.

Ol' George may be gone from our midst physically, but he will always remain in the thoughts of coaches, players and writers whose lives he touched.



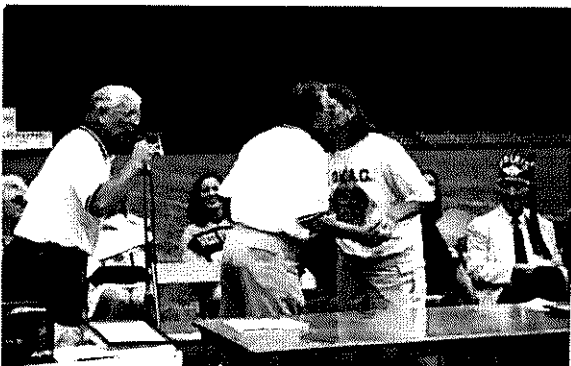

GEORGE STRAGER "EVENING WITH THE STARS"



Robert Jones, the team doctor for the West Virginia All-Stars in tonight's Rudy Ray OVAC All-Star Charity Football Classic, has a simple self-diagnosis to explain his passion for football. The game, he says, is in his blood. And no antibiotic, no pill can get the sport out of his system. "I got involved because of the game of life," he said. (The appeal) is the game itself... it doesn't matter what aspect it

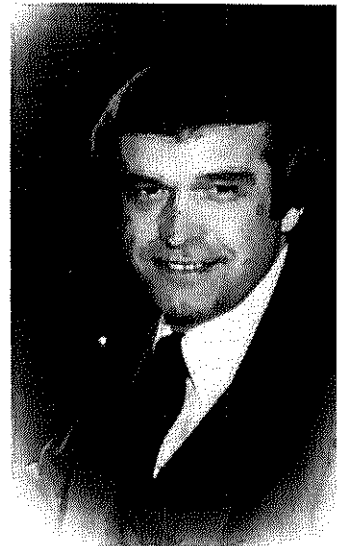
football found its way into the heart of Dr. Jones in the mid-1960s, when he played on the legendary Wheeling Ironmen. Jones played defensive end, linebacker, offensive line and punter. "Back then, you had to do it all," he said. — and remembers cross-state clashes with Charleston fondly. Even if memories of the game's details remain cloudy, the atmosphere of Wheeling Island Stadium will always remain indelibly etched in Jones' memory. "I remember my first game... we played Charleston," Jones said. "It was the only time I've ever seen the island (stadium) completely packed. We had a rivalry with them." And he still gets the same chills up his spine every time he visits the stadium, which was remodeled in the 1980s. "It's still the same place," Jones said. "Even if it is a different stadium. It's still a great place to play football."

Of course, the main purpose of football and other sports is to teach the participants qualities they can take with them throughout their lives. Football was no different for Jones. Currently a general surgeon who also performs orthopedic and vascular work at Wheeling Hospital, Jones says he learned self-discipline — a necessary component in a surgeon's mental makeup — by playing football all his life. "The discipline of football pushed me to be a surgeon in a medical field," Jones said.

Jones has been involved with the OVAC Football Classic for the past 15 years, getting his first taste of the game when team doctor — Luis Vazquez — invited him to the 1984 game.

Many of the games that he's seen and worked were good. But one — the 1987 classic — stands out as great; because of the luminous stars who played in the contest. Ohio — featuring St. Clairsville's duo of Shawn Vincent and John S. — defeated the Alex Shook-led West Virginia team 13-11 in the all-star game, played at Steubenville because of renovations to Wheeling Island Stadium. "That was the best year, as far as players go," Jones said.

Jones earned his bachelor's degree from the University of Nebraska and graduated from the West Virginia University School of Medicine. Jones lives in Wheeling with his wife, Rita and has three children — Patricia and Pamela, both 7.

Herb is married to the former Ashlea Bland. He's got a daughter Kailey (3).



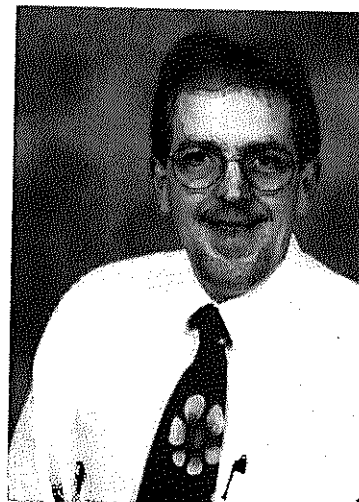

There's a lot more to playing an all-star football than X's and O's. For proof, just ask Todd Fullerton, who will coordinate all the medical services for tonight's Rudy Mumley OVAC All-Star Charity Football Classic.

"Basically, my job is to make sure all the i's are dotted and the t's are crossed," Fullerton said, laughing.

Among Fullerton's i's and t's are:

- Making sure enough trainers, doctors and emergency technicians are present, in case of injury.
- Ensuring that the teams have plenty of supplies, from medical tape to ice packs.
- Telling coaches if players injured during the game are healthy enough to return to action.
- Deciding whether or not to play, delay or cancel a game because of weather conditions. Last year, for example, the game was delayed 55 minutes because of oppressive humidity.

From a medical standpoint, the key to keeping a game running smoothly is communication, Fullerton said.

"Basically, we try to work with each other and communicate with the coaches," Fullerton said. "There's a lot of communication between everyone involved."

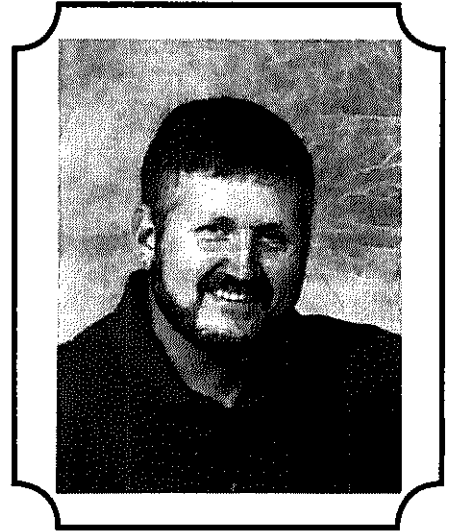
Fullerton should know. After all, he's been seriously involved with the OVAC for the past 15 years, and he's been working in sports medicine for the past 30 years.

His athletic training career started in the late 1960s when, as a student-athlete at Martins Ferry High School, Art Simpson befriended Fullerton and gave him his first chance at being a trainer. And Fullerton's stepfather, Bill Van Horne, the sports editor of the Wheeling News-Register until his death in 1995, took him around to sporting events, which fueled his desire to remain involved in sports.

Fullerton holds a Bachelor's degree in physical education from The Ohio State University and a Master's degree in exercise physiology from the University of Arizona. Along the way, he's worked with several notable organizations, including the following:

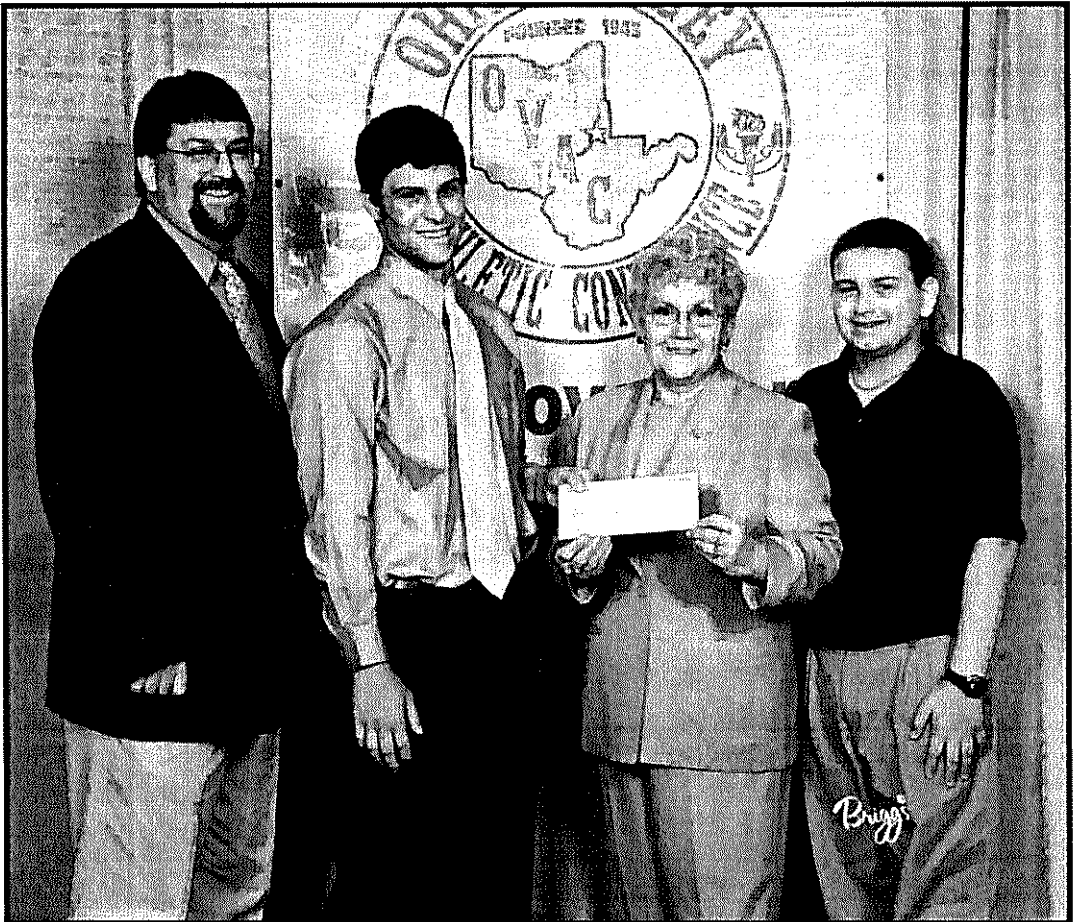
- While at Ohio State, he was an athletic trainer for the Buckeye football team, a position that allowed him to work with Woody Hayes and attend the Rose Bowl.
- Fullerton worked the summers of 1972 and 1973 in Bradenton, Fla. with the Pittsburgh Pirates organization.
- While a graduate student at Arizona in 1977-1979, he was an athletic trainer with the Association of Tennis Professionals, and worked with such tennis luminaries as Jimmy Connors and Bjorn Borg.

But, Fullerton said, "There's nothing quite as special as the OVAC. That's why he returned to the Ohio Valley in 1985. Currently, he works as a registered nurse in the emergency room at Wheeling Hospital. "People like (Van Horne, Simpson and the late Sam Mumley) were very instrumental and influential in high school sports," Fullerton said. "There's great camaraderie, great fellowship...sometimes the kids don't realize what they have until they are out of it." Fullerton lives in Wheeling with his wife, Susie, and his two children – Jaclyn, who will turn 10 in August, and Jake, 8.

COACH SAYS HIS ASSISTANTS LOVE WHAT THEY DO.

B. J. Depew has been around the Rudy Mumley OVAC All-Star Charity Football Classic before. He worked under his father, Terry, as a member of the Mountaineers staff in 2005.

However, when the Mountaineers take the field Sunday, July 27, it'll be a different role for B. J. as he and his coaching staff will be calling the shots.

And outside of Depew, there are no holdovers from the previous administration at Linsly School. However, that fact alone made the desire for the Cadets to seize the opportunity to coach this game even stronger.

"This group of coaches loves what they do," Depew said. "An opportunity to work with a different group of kids and experience memories with them is exciting." While everyone wants to win the game, Depew is looking at the bigger picture when it comes to the week he'll spend with players from all over the Ohio Valley. Depew will be joined by James Cowart, Gene Lofstead, Steve Ochap, Ray Smith and Josh Whetstone. "Steve was with us, but basically I am the last man standing from my dad's coaching staff," Depew said. "We're all basically fairly young guys who have been getting together as a staff for two or three years."

Here is the capsule look at the West Virginia coaches:

B. J. DEPEW just completed his second season as the Linsly School head coach after taking over his father's successful career. Depew owns a 9-11 mark on his career. While he's only been the head coach for two seasons, he's been a football coach for nine years total. Along with football, Depew has also coached baseball and track and currently serves as a member of the staff. Depew is a 1994 Linsly graduate and went on to earn his degree from The Ohio State University in Columbus, Ohio. Depew and his wife, Tracy, are the parents of Isaac (13 months) and they reside in Wheeling.

JAMES COWART has been a member of the Cadets staff for four seasons and has been involved in the athletics program as a member of the staff for five years. Cowart is a 1998 Linsly School graduate and went on to play college football at Edinboro University. Cowart earned his bachelor's degree in 2003. STEVE OCHAP is another member of the Linsly staff who is once again getting the opportunity to coach in a game he played in during his senior year of high school. Ochap represented Wheeling Park High School in the game before going on to Ball State University to earn his degree in English Literature. He was a four-year starter for the Bison and three times earned first-team all-conference honors. Steve arrived at Linsly four years ago and has been on the Cadets staff since. Along with football, Steve has coached fifth and sixth grade youth basketball. Steve and his wife, Sarah, reside in Wheeling.

RAY SMITH has spent 27 years working at the Linsly School in a variety of coaching positions. He's been a varsity football coach for two years, but has been around the Cadets grid program for all 27 of his years at the school. Smith is a graduate of Wheeling Park High School and went on to earn his degree from Bethany College in 1981. Along with football, Smith has served as the Linsly freshmen basketball coach and has previously been the head boys and girls hoop coaches. He's been named Intelligencer/Wheeling News-Register Coach of the Year in 1997-98 and has coached in the OVAC Hoop Classic several times and currently serves on the committee for the game. Smith is the father of two children: Jordan (21) and Jerred (17).

JOSH WHETSTONE — is a recent addition to the Linsly School staff. As a graduate of West Liberty State College in Martinsburg, West Virginia, Josh and his wife, Lynda, are living in Wheeling. He attended Millersport High School where he participated in football and basketball.

DAVIS has been a member of the Warriors' staff for two seasons after serving two seasons as a graduate assistant at Kent State University. A 1992 Meadowbrook graduate where he lettered in football, basketball and track. He earned his degree from Kent State in 1998 in exercise science.
