The OVAC All-Star Game Salutes West Liberty State College

ganized as a land grant school in 1837, later know as West Liberty Normal School for Teachers, and currently We ty State College, it's easy to see that the institution is no stranger to change. In the Fall of 2008, West Liberty anticipat portunity to undergo yet another change that is history in the making for the 171 year-old institution as it becomes We ty University. This will allow its first ever stand-alone master's degree program as well as other benefits to its students a scal community. In addition, WLSC is preparing to expand into the local community with a presence at the Highlands. The venture, due in large part to the work of Ohio County leadership, Northern Panhandle Sen. Ed Bowman and Sen. Laill, and the support of Brian Noland, Chancellor of the West Virginia Higher Education Policy Commission, will allow We ty to better meet the expanding needs for their students. The Highlands campus could be open for enrollment as early ary 2009.

est Liberty continues to make advances in providing students with a quality – valuable education experience through t sion of such programs as the Student Laptop Program, the Metro Rate, Scholarship program, and the many offerings of t a Arts Center. The Student Laptop program, to begin Fall 2008, will provide incoming freshmen with the option of receiving laptop as part of the college's ongoing initiative of providing students with the technology they need to be prepared into the twenty-first century workforce. Only one of roughly every 20 colleges in the U.S. offering a bachelor's degresuch a program. The Metro Rate, a \$2,000 reduction of the out-of-state rate per academic year, makes West Liberty modable for students residing in Belmont, Jefferson, Columbiana, Monroe and Guernsey counties in Ohio; and Washington heny, Beaver and Greene counties in Pennsylvania. The Metro Rate is available for full-time students (12 or modate) in the designated counties. Throu inistration West Liberty will offer more scholarships to incoming freshman in the Fall of 2009, which include a Promise Plarship and a variety of others.

ne crown jewel of learning technology available to students is most evident in the Media Arts Center. Opened in 200 multi-million dollar facility houses state-of-the-art equipment that provides students studying graphic design, digital med jn, video production and television communications with hands-on experience through work in the Audio Recording Students, and Recreation Complex with the complete renovation channel. In addition, West Liberty is adding to its Academ ts, and Recreation Complex with the complete renovation of Russek Football Field. According to Jim Watson, WLSC athlestor, the new complex will be completed in phases beginning with the installation of MondoTurf Ecofill, which is synthetic t is environmentally friendly, engineered for maximum performance, and is on average 25 degrees cooler. In addition to the playing surface, phase one will include a three-lane training track, new fencing, and landscaping. Substantial completing to mid-July. There are many words to describe the life of tudolph Mumley, but perhaps the most appropriate rould be service.

For most of his 80-plus years, Mumley, known as Rudy" to his legion of friends, worked on behalf of nany causes. None were more important to him than ne youth of the Ohio Valley.

It is befitting that the game which fans are witessing this evening is named in his honor. If it hadn't een for Rudy's willingness to step forward, the Ohio-Vest Virginia All-Star Game would not have existed ne last 28 years, and it now appears to be a fixture nat will carry it well into the next millennium.

The game's history goes back to the early 1940s and, for many years after that, it was sponsored by

nooster club associations from Eastern Ohio and the West Virginia northern panhandle.

However, the game could not receive NCAA sanction and consequently was held during the spring to illow players who had received scholarships to NCAA schools an opportunity to participate.

When it became apparent that the booster club organizations could no longer sponsor the game, it eased to exist. An idea was presented to Sam A. Mumley Sr. that the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference coulc issume sponsorship of the game and apply for NCAA sanction.

One of the requirements toward receiving NCAA sanction was that only 60 percent of game proceeds could be spent to cover expenses and the other 40 percent had to be used for charitable purposes.

Once the game received sanction, the OVAC had another problem. It was experiencing financial probems and did not have the resources to provide "seed" money that would be needed to purchase uniforms, any for training camp and other start-up expenses such as insurance.

Sam Mumley, who was the executive secretary of the OVAC, appealed to his uncle, Rudy, to provide he financial help. The story has become legend on how Rudy, a bachelor who lived with his beloved sister, illian, in the Warwood area of Wheeling, mortgaged their home to receive a loan. The rest, as the saying joes, is history.

There was more adversity to overcome for this inaugural OVAC venture. The Ohio Valley experienced lamaging floods during June of 1972. Wheeling Stadium sustained considerable damage and the facility vould not be available for the early August game.

Sam Mumley called his longtime friend, the late Edmund Joseph, who was then athletic director at Marins Ferry High School and asked if the OVAC could use Ferry Stadium. Once Joseph took the request to school officials and received permission, the game was finally on.

However, on the day of the game, the area was hit hard by a rainstorm. More adversity. By this time, rou could not fault Rudy Mumley, who agreed to serve as game director, if he was feeling a bit jinxed. Several hours before kickoff was scheduled, the rain stopped and the sun came out. It turned into a beautiful evening, and the game went off like clockwork before a capacity audience.

The OVAC was in business as far as renewal of the Ohio-West Virginia midsummer classic was concerned.

However, that's not the end of the story. Over the next two decades-plus that Rudy Mumley served as jame director, he made numerous improvements to the game. He turned it from just an all-star game into an extravaganza.

He took the all-star gridders to camp at West Liberty State College, his alma mater, and a place where ne had long-standing ties. Each year, Mumley added activities for the players to help them pass the time and provide some relief from the rigors of training camp.

He enlisted the help of the Osiris Shrine and this group gave the game a more meaningful purpose as it

vould eventually gain the lion's share of the charity proceeds.

Through his good friend, the late George Strager, another mid-week event, "An Evening With the Stars," was initiated and handled with impeccable care by two other longtime friends, Mike Young and Pete Cuffaro.

From the time the OVAC assumed sponsorship of the game, Mumley brought back the Stone & Fhomas "Queen of Queens" Pageant which had been a part of the All-Star Game series when it was sponsored by the booster club associations. Stone & Thomas continued to sponsor the event over the text two decades-plus. In recent years, the queen's pageant has continued under the sponsorship of Caufman's of Wheeling and WTOV-9.

In the meantime, Mumley enlisted the help of Glenn Didriksen and his family, which owned and perated several McDonald's Family Restaurants in the area, to form the McDonald's All-Star Band. This has become an increasingly popular feature of the game.

Mumley's innovative mind produced a game that would help kick off the Ohio Valley football season, a classic that would involve some 60 to 70 football players annually and several hundred bandsmen. Add that some 25 to 30 queen candidates and a myriad of volunteers who helped make the 10-day to two-veek experience a memorable part of their lives.

For a number of years, Rudy and his nephew Sam, along with other OVAC officials and the dedicated nen from the Osiris Shrine, would hold a pep rally at Russek Field on the campus of West Liberty State College. Several thousands of people attended these events and, of course, it was Rudy who usually stole the show.

From his days at old Wheeling High to those at West Liberty State College, Rudy was always there o help. Following a stint in the military service, he spent the next three decades or so as an educator, primarily in Eastern Ohio. He was principal at Buckeye South High when he retired.

His service to the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference was ongoing for more than three decades, and he served as president on two different occasions.

Through his efforts and those of his many friends who joined with him to work on various facets of the ill-star classic, more than \$600,000 has been provided to Ohio Valley charitable groups.

Several years before his death, which came in early February of 1999, Mumley relinquished direcorship of the game to his longtime associate and close friend, Ron Mauck.

Nonetheless, Rudy still remained a familiar figure on the sidelines. His walk had slowed considerably although he had bounced back from a series of illnesses. But, the enthusiasm was as great as ever. He had seen the game reach new heights last year when it was televised live by WTOV-9 and the game still lrew a near-capacity crowd.

It was a fitting tribute that OVAC officials several years ago renamed the contest as the Rudy Mumley DVAC Charity All-Star Game.

Rudy was to become one of the most recognizable sports figures the Ohio Valley had ever produced. le was honored as the Dapper Dan's "Man of the Year" in 1992, and earlier was inducted into the Athletic lall of Fame at his beloved West Liberty State College, following in the footsteps of his late brother, Eli, Rudy was the first non-athlete or non-coach to earn this honor, and in recent years, he became a promnent benefactor to the school.

Educator, humanitarian and philanthropist. That's the legacy of a guy who wanted to be known simply is Rudy.

And as long as this game can survive, fans of the Ohio Valley for the coming generations will be able o look skyward and say, "Thanks, Rudy!"





For more than three decades, Samuel A. Mumley served the youth of this area as executive secretary of the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference.

Last February, "Sammy" was called home by his maker to receive his just reward for a lifetime spent in service to others.

Perhaps the greatest compliment one can pay Sam Mumley following his passing is to say that he made his world a much better place to live because he once walked among us.

Mumley devoted nearly five decades to working for the youth of our Ohio Valley. In addition to his time as executive secretary of the OVAC, which is still

believed to be the largest high school athletic conference of its kind in the United States, Mumley was an athletic trainer, coach, basketball official, teacher and a school administrator.

If that wasn't enough time to give, Mumley joined Eric Carder, an assistant principal and director of activities at Wheeling Park High School, in serving as co-director for the West Virginia Super Six state high school football championships, which they brought to Wheeling Island Stadium six years ago.

Additionally, the pair helped secure the West virginia state soccer championships held last year at the brand new athletic facility at Wheeling Jesuit University.

Sam also played a major role in the wonderful mid-summer football spectacle you are attending tonight at Wheeling Island Stadium. Renamed several years ago to honor his uncle, who also passed away earlier this year, the Rudy Mumley Charity All-Star Football Classic was revived in 1972 under the sponsorship of the OVAC.

In those days, the NCAA made things difficult for sponsors seeking sanction to hold various all-star contest. The local Ohio-West Virginia All-Star game had been dormant for many eyars after having been a fixture on the Ohio Valley gridiron scene since the early 1940s.

Both Mumley's spent hundreds of hours putting together the formula for a program that the NCAA found acceptable. Today, the game is more vibrant and popular than ever among the area football fans, who nearly pack the Island Stadium each and every July to kick off a new gridiron campaign.

They also helped turn this event into more than just a football game. It has become a mid-summer spectacular complete with an All-Star Band, cheerleaders and the pageantry of a Queen of Queens contest.

It also helped raise hundreds of thousands of dollars for charitable organizations in the Ohio Valley over the past 26 years.

Much of these wonders have been achieved because Mumley refused to take "no" for an answer from anyone and because he dared to dream what many of us have considered to be impossible dreams.

Who would have believed that the state high school football championships could ever be lured out of Charleston to the Northern Panhandle?

Sam did.

And Wheeling will host the state title games for the sixth straight year the first weekend of December.

Through his fund-raising efforts and the help of countless corporate sponsors and Super Six volun-

teers from up and down the Ohio Valley, the state football finals have been raised to a level that may never be matched in the Mountain State.

When Mumley came back to take over a second time as executive secretary of the OVAC, the league was in dire financial straits.

Through Mumley's efforts and the backing of other leaders in the community, an OVAC Foundation 3 oard was formed to serve as a fund-raising arm of the bi-state league. That board is still in existence oday.

The sports programs at the various schools were improved immensely. All-star games are now held each year in football, boys' and girls' basketball, baseball, softball and boys' and girls' soccer. The OVAC sponsors championship tournaments in wrestling, swimming, tennis, golf, volleyball, baseball, softball, poys' and girls' soccer, boys' and girls' cross country, boys' and girls' track, cheerleading, etc.

Girls sports have risen to equal importance because Sam had the foresight and the courage to support each and every program offered by the OVAC. His efforts with girls' sports earned Mumley a seat on the equity panels for both the Ohio High School Athletic Association and the West virginia Secondary School Athletic Commission.

The scholarship program also has been enhanced by Sam's ability to involve the corporate sector of the various communities within the extensive OVAC map. At last May's OVAC Banquet of Champions held at the Wheeling Civic Center, more than \$15,000 in scholarship money was awarded to deserving DVAC student-athletes.

That money wasn't just found on the street corner; it was obtained largely through tireless efforts of he late executive secretary.

Sam put the OVAC's "kids" first in all his dreams and work for the conference. "What can we do for he 'kids'? How can we make things better for them?" Those were the first questions he posed whenever he OVAC or Super Six would discuss changes in their programs.

He took great pains to involve everyone in conference business. He was constantly in touch with nedia members, keeping them updated on matters and seeking their opinions.

When important final decisions had to be made, Sam didn't mind being the one to make them. But he lid so after many discussions among his constituents and his own private soul-searching. And, of course, is main concern was making sure that the decisions were in the best interest of the OVAC student-athates.

From a personal standpoint, if Sam became your friend, he was your friend for life. He was always nere with a kind word, a bit of advice if it was asked for, and encouragement when any of his friends were a difficult situation.

I once wrote in a column that Sam was no saint, but that he was sent to us by angels to perform good /orks and turn our impossible dreams into reality.

He dearly loved his wife, Nancy, who remained by his side through good times and rough times. No ifferent from the rest of us, Nancy became part of the OVAC family as well, taking care of the confernce's financial books, a role she continues to handle today.

They were married just 11 years when Sam passed away. But, as Nancy once said, they crammed 40 ears of happiness into that short time.

A long bout with cancer terminated Mumley's life at the too young age of 67. But, as this writer has tated before, you won't make me believe "Sammy" lost that fight with cancer. Nothing defeated Sam lumley in his lifetime. God, whom Sam believed in with all his heart, simply decided it was time to call im home.

am Mumley was one of a kind,



28 Years... OVAC All-Star Football Classic in Retrospect ...and The Tradition Continues

vast majority of people said it would never happen, many felt that it was impossible and some believing that it was to no avail... "The OVAC would not gain AA sanction for the resurrection of the defunct Ohio-West ginia All-Star Football Game." True, as it was, the 1960's I not allow the conference much latitude for its quest for an AA sanction.

As general information, at that time it was mandatory to ve NCAA sanction, otherwise those college bound grant-in-I players would be declared ineligible for their freshman year. erefore, during the early and middle 1960's, the Ohio-West ginia All-Star Football Game drew those athletes of lesser leticism or those not considering to participate on the colliate level. Through such sanctioning, the NCAA could totally gulate any and all summer all-star contests, thus putting "squeeze" on booster clubs and civic organizations who deavored to work around such regulations. The Ohio-West ginia All Star Football Game fell into this category, thus endithed game in the late 1960's and with it the once celebrated icial opening of the Ohio Valley's "pigskin" season.

"We are not going to be denied," said Sam A. Mumley, ecutive Secretary of the OVAC, "The rich athletic heritage of s valley as well as having one of the most prolific scholastic nferences in the country should entitle us the opportunity showcasing our student athletes." In this respect the contence executive board passed legislation which directed executive secretary to set the course in obtaining NCAA nctioning, all of which would cover three years of time, effort id patience.

Beginning in early 1968, and with the intent of gathering eliminary information, it readily became apparent that the eck was stacked" and those who originally commented on a impossibility of such an adventure their opinions seemed meet. However, the decision to move forward with our game an remained and it was full speed ahead with enthusiasm, infidence and faith. What followed were days and months of idless phone conversations ranging from those with NCAA ficials in Kansas City to those local and state political leaders well as keeping the media constantly informed. Additionally ere were endless committee and board meetings as well idinner and luncheon engagements all designed with the irpose of seeking sanction approval.

1968 and 1969 quickly became history and among all of e other conference business, the OVAC was very busy in plementing its Title IX Program for Girls. Such female programs were introduced with the 1970 school year, two ye before the federal mandatory date of September 1972. Dur this time period the conference was also formulating a scale scholarship program, Partners in Academic and Athle Programs, re-designing those needed changes in many st levels and maintaining a sound financial base for all conferer operations. Regardless, the NCAA all-star sanction movem was in full swing with constant communication between NCAA and the OVAC on target.

Late in 1971, a remarkable turn of events took place as NCAA informed the OVAC that they reviewed one of our meroposed all-star formats and found some definite interes in the overall structure. This, then, lead to three continumenths of very intense correspondence and phone compations. At this juncture it was felt that we were closing in gaining sanction and the pendulum was swinging toward future.

Then it happened... late February 1972, a registered ter from the NCAA arrived at the conference office offici notifying the OVAC that the NCAA Review Board for all-contests had awarded total sanction for a conference all-game for the summer of 1972. Overwhelmed and overjoy the conference held a monumental press meeting at the Clure Hotel in Wheeling announcing all the details relate to the first OVAC All-Star Football Game. Rudy Mumley already in the fold as our first director and remained as s for 23 years. In 1986, the game was officially re-named The Rudy Mumley OVAC Ohio-West Virginia Charity Foot All-Star Classic.

Tonight's 27th Annual Extravaganza will have produce 1,500 players • 3,200 musicians and directors (since 19 • 500 cheerleaders • 750 queen candidates • 300 coach trainers, doctors, and managers • 225,000 fans... and an elemous array of Shriners and volunteers, all major contribuin distributing over \$600,000.00 to local upper Ohio Vacharities.

The remaining time allowed for another kickoff and the West Virginians successfully negotiated an onside kick, recovering the ball as the fray ended.

Pedden of Ohio University were the honorary mentors and in addition to sitting on the benches of the contesting squads, both spoke over the P.A. system at halftime. 1958" All-Star Game – 50 Years Ago

Ohio's streamlined Buckeyes ripped the 1-mountain Mountaineers to shreds last night ore a jam-packed throng of gridiron enthusiat Wheeling Stadium to capture the 16th all-football game 25-0.

Though decided underdogs and outweighed the West Virginia squad, the tremendous ed of the scarlet clad forces turned the classic a rout.

The Buckeyes showed some 12,000 fans y in the game that they didn't deserve the erdog rating by intercepting a West Virginia s and scored the first touchdown with only r minutes gone from the scoreboard clock.

It was much the same story the remainder ne night – which was exceedingly long for the untaineer rooters. The heavier, but slower st Virginians were unable to cope with the io offense.

Tom Yakubowski, rangy Adena fullback oroamed through the Mountaineer line seemly at will, was adjudged the most outstanding yer from the Buckeyes, while Frankie Brown, inutive Fairmont West scatback, was tapped h the same honor for the Mountaineers.

John Havlicek, Bridgeport quarterback, sed for four yards to St. John's Joie Maroon another Ohio touchdown in the second quar-Yakubowski plunged for another in the third arter and Clyde Thomas, Bellaire, plunged for last score in the final stanza.

Jim Dowdle, Cadiz, kicked off to Roger Idinsky, Moundsville, at the goal line. He irned to the 23. Ray Kasimakis, Weirton, was d for no gain. Holdinsky picked up three but ger Mancini, St. John's intercepted Holdinsky's son the next play on the West Virginia 45 and ed to the 19.

Tom Yakubowski, Adena fullback, lost a d. Joie Maroon, St. John's, picked up two. kubowski gained one and West Virginia took or on its own 17 when John Havlicek's pass s batted down.

On a mix-up in the West Virginia backfield, ik Jacobs, Bellaire, grabbed the ball on the st Virginia 16. George Hale, East Liverpool, ned three, Maroon skirted left end to the en yard line but a five yard illegal procedure alty set Ohio back to the 12 from where kubowski roared over left tackle for the first chdown with the game only four minutes old. John Boseley, Greenback, led the gang that cked Clyde Thomas (Bellaire) try for the iversion.

Holdinsky again brought the kickoff back mhis own to the WV 23. Kasimaksi picked up e yards and WV drew a five yard penalty. Eli sonovich, Weirton, gained one. Frank Brown, irmont, West, held for no gain and Dunbar's in Keller punted to the Ohio 40. Maroon iled it in and scampered to the WV 29.

Yakubowski gained one, Havlicek kept for o, and Maroon then pitched to Hale for 13 ds to the 13. Hale picked up four more and vlicek lofted a perfect aerial to Maroon in the knocked down the pass from George Jenkins, Cadiz for the PAT.

Kasonvich took Dowdle's kickoff at the five and returned to the 23. Brown hit left tackle for five, and Boseley hit for a first down at the 33. Ohio drew a five yard offside penalty. Kosonovick gained one, and Brown turned left end to the 43. Before the quarter ended, Kosonovick gained four yards in two tries.

Keller pitched to Boseley for 18 yards to the Ohio 38. Keller got three at right tackle, Boseley four at center, Brown three at left end for another first down. Boseley was held for no gain. Keller's pass was incomplete and then he pitched high for another incomplete pass. On an attempted Statue of Liberty, Brown was a little slow coming around and it dropped out of Bosley's hands. Brown recovered for a three yard loss. Ohio taking over at its own 37.

Maroon got three, Hale two, and Yakubowski cracked through for 12 more to the West Virginia 46. Hale ran for 11 more. Ohio was penalized 15 yards for clipping back to the WV 37. Maroon skirted right end to the Mountaineer 26. Havlicek passed to Tom Walters, Wintersville, for 7 yards. Holdinsky batted down the next pass and then West Virginia was penalized 15 yards back to its own 19 for roughing Havlicek. The Bridgeport ace then, on a keeper, slipped through to the 6 yard line. He tried it again but lost four. George Jenkins, center, replacing Havlicek, fumbled and Red Arango, Weirton, recovered at the 16 to stop the threat.

Brown was stopped at left tackle, Jim Hawkins, Linsly fullback, picked up two, and his pass on the next play was incomplete. Keller then kicked to Hale who returned 22 yards to the WV 45, but Ohio was caught clipping and set back to the Buckeye 39. Yakubowski got a first down in two tries to the West Virginia 48. Hale added another to the 37. Mike Fulks, Weirton, broke up Havlicek's pass, and Walters dropped another aerial. Maroon trying to pass, was trapped back at midfield for a 13 yard loss.

Second Half

Hale grabbed Holdinsky's kickoff at the 20 and returned to the 36. Yakubowsky gained nine, then carried for a first down at the 40, then fumbled when tackled but recovered. Havlicek lost two yards, then Hale hit left guard for four yards. Yakubowsky then cracked over tackle to the 29 for another first down. A clipping penalty set Ohio back to the 45. Havlicek lateralled to Hale who carried to the 34. Maroon then broke away for seven yards. Yakubowsky turned left end to the 14 yard line. Hale broke off the left side for 10 yards. Ray Church, Wintersville, got three yards in two plunges, then Maroon went wide for no gain, but Yakubowsky boomed into the middle for the score and then ran for the conversion.

Ted Midkiff, Huntington Central, fumbled a short kickoff near his own 39, and Maroon recovered at the WV 48. West Virginia was given an unnecessary roughness penalty back to

Rain, which fell early in the evening, undoubtedly cut into the size of the crowd and made footing a bit precarious on some of the sweeps but the field was in good condition, generally. It's a pity that the carpet of grass will probably be gone by mid-October.

Last night's nod gave the Buck's a 15-10 edge in the series and avenged last year's 18-0 loss.

Ohio capitalized upon a break to score before the game was seven minutes old. WV received the opening kickoff, made one first down on the running of Weirton's Tom Curtis and Paden City's Steve Billeter and then was forced into a punting situation. However, Weirton Madonna's Bill Vitar was unable to get his boot off because of a low pass from center and was tackled on his own 31 by Jim Jackson of Mingo and Bill Bates of

It took the Buckeyes eight pla to score from there. They broked to score from there. Trailing 14-0 at halftime, a suddenly spired Ohio team came to life after interission to snap West Virginia's five game nning streak in the Annual Ohio Valley hletic Conference All-Star Football Class Saturday night at rain-swept Wheeling adium.

A disappointing turnout, estimated at 000 fans, saw the revived Buckeyes grab a 1-14 decision via their exciting comeback ainst the Mountaineers, who went flat after king command in the first half as Wheeling irk speedster Rico Cox tallied touchdowns 1 runs of 47 and six yards.

The decisive Buckeye touchdown was tup by a spectacular 32 yard punt return by uckeye North's Dennis "Boo Boo" Johnson, ho was one of the heroes of the evening for e elated Ohioans.

The Bucks bounced into contention by pitalizing on two costly West Virginia mbles in the third quarter as Greg Bonar, larterback for Shadyside, threw passes to hason and Cambridge's Rich Vance folwing the changes of possession.

However, Marietta Coach Rich Hahn, loting the Bucks, sent his chargers after two pint conversions following both third period cores. Since the two point efforts failed, lest Virginia carried a 14-12 edge into the nal frame.

But the elusive Johnson struck again in the fourth period when he returned a punt by /eirton's John Canei 32 yards to the Mountineer 16. It was a beautiful broken field run, ith Johnson keeping his balance though hit y three different tacklers to carry the ball eep into enemy territory.

It took Ohio six plays to cover the renaining 16 yards, with Anthony Orsini, quarerback from Steubenville Catholic, sneaking ver from the one for the TD. St. Clairsville's like Brown made 14 yards in four carries in ne foray.

The winning TD came with just 4:14 emaining in the game. Faking a kick by Vintersville's Steve Brown, the Ohioans went or two again on the conversion try, and leallsville's Wade Lucas the apparent holder, assed to Johnson for the final markers.

West Virginia coached by Brooke's /incent "Sonny" Ray, battled desperately to egain control. Two pass interference calls gainst Ohio helped the Mountaineers pentrate to the Ohio 28 with just 1:23 to go. But he always-dangerous Cox was dropped for a ix yard loss on a sweep by Meadowbrook's

Steve Miles. Two plays later, with just 44 seconds left on the clock, Weir High quarter-back, Tim Lescallette looped a pass downfield, but Marietta's Joe Weber intercepted it at the 10 and returned to the 28 to pound the final nail into the Mountaineer coffin.

Ohio was hurt severely by penalties during the evening as the Buckeyes lost 114 yards on 10 violations, three of them for pass interference. The Mountaineers were penalized six times times for 46 yards but lost the ball three times on fumbles and Ohio took advantage and scored on two of the bobbles.

The Mountaineers completed just two of seven passes for 18 yards and suffered one interception. Ohio made 157 yards by passing on 12 of 17 attempts. But the Buckeyes were intercepted three times by Weirton's Kevin Sikora. Neither side was particularly impressive with its ground game, though footing was surprisingly good considering the conditions. West Virginia netted 101 yards rushing compared to Ohio's 47. Each side finished with 10 first downs.

Ohio had two golden scoring opportunities in the first half but both, in the early minutes of the contest, and in the final seconds of the second period, were thwarted by alert Mountaineer defensive play.

Meantime West Virginia turned Cox loose for both their TD's.



~ A Tribute to George Strager ~

(A column by Nick Bedway that originally appeared in the Wheeling News-Register on August 18, 2003)

With another high school football season set to get underway, I thought this might be a good time ect on the career of the late George Strager.

The Ohio Valley's winningest schoolboy football coach, Strager was truly a legend in his own time amassed a total of 246 victories during a career that spanned nearly four decades.

'erhaps, I should point out that there's no telling how many more games Strager's teams would won had the current tiebreaker rules been in effect while he was stalking Ohio Valley sidelines. During his entire coaching career, if the score was tied at the end of the fourth quarter everybody home, satisfied or not.

Strager's offensive genius was considered ahead of his era and he certainly could have figured out r for his teams to win at least half of those stalemated contests in overtime. His overall record 246 wins, 115 losses and 16 ties.

picked Coach Strager as the subject for this column not just because of the success he experienced ching. The love and dedication that he gave the couple of thousand kids he coached affected most ir lives in a positive way.

Yes, George was hard to play for and tough as nails on the field. His pre-game and halftime talks

filled with fire, especially when he didn't think his team was performing up to his expectations. But he was hilariously funny at times aches and players.

Today's younger coaches could have learned a lot about football and how to get the maximum out of their players had they had the opp rn from this coaching giant.

This past week I asked a couple of long-time Strager friends and associates - Doug Huff, the former Sports Editor of The Intelligen ling Central Catholic assistant coach Mike Young - to share some of their reflections on Ol' George.

Huff spent nearly three decades covering Strager's teams. Young played for Strager at Central. He was also his long-time assistant coa sville High and he has handled perhaps the toughest task of all when he was asked to succeed the long-time mentor at the Red Devil 'It wasn't as difficult as people said it would be because George Strager prepared me to be a head coach by giving me responsibilied my confidence. When the time came, I felt like I was ready for it," Young explained. Mike had spent 17 years on Strager's stasville.

'He was like a second father to me in terms of our friendship and the way our families got along. I don't think a lot of people realing was a great family man." He and his wife had four kids and two of them were still in junior high when Lounelle passed away reged id a wonderful job of raising them almost on his own. All of his children have been successful in their lives as well," Young admittely was Strager's football brain that put him ahead of the other coaches during his long career. He was a master-mind of the offensive gtalked about how Strager could look at a team's defense and quickly find a way to attack it and pick it apart. "We were very fortunat ime to have had many quality athletes at St. Clairsville," Young also said.

The most famous of the Strager proteges, of course, was Tim Spencer, who went on from the Saints to star at Ohio State, play in the loal League and return to Buckeye Local as an assistant coach. The unfortunate part of Strager's Red Devil days were they came at a tire hio High School Athletic Association was taking just one or two teams from each region for post-season play. "We had some great to get a chance to play in the post-season," Young said. Three of Strager's undefeated teams Red Devil squads never made it into to the straightful process."

St. Clairsville did make it twice under Strager, qualifying in 1983 and in 1986. The 1986 squad won two playoff contests and were the state final when it lost a controversial decision to Chagrin Falls Kenston at the Rubber Bowl in Akron. It was Huff that pointed o strager is probably the only person to have coached three different Ohio Valley teams to unbeaten seasons. His 1953 Sistersville Tig 1 and won the state championship with a 27-12 victory over Romney.

In 1963, Strager guided the Maroon Knights to a 10-0-1 season, ending with a 40-6 dismantling of highly-regarded Charleston Catholic backfield" in the WV Catholic title game. He also had three undefeated teams at St. Clairsville, posting records of 9-0 in 1969, 10-0 in 1985.

Certainly, this feat of having unbeaten clubs in four different decades is another unmatched area achievement. "I always considered to ch's Coach' because he was so well respected among his peers," Huff said, "mention his name in a conversation with fellow coaches ys had something positive to say about his coaching philosophy, techniques, etc." Huff also talked about how Strager's teams were alwered and cover. They never seemed out of a game because of his offense's ability to strike form any place on the field. "Some people certain jobs. George was born to be a high school football coach. And he was one of the best," Huff added.

Doug certainly told it the way it was where our mutual friend was concerned. George had opportunities to go into the college ranks an irned down a couple of big-time offers as I recall. But his fun and his life was in taking a group of young high school kids and mold something special.

Bob Kettlewell, the late successful coach at Wintersville (now Indian Creek High School) regarded Strager as being as good a quantum has he ever saw. The triggerman at QB was definitely the key in Strager's multiple offense, more as a ball handler than a thrower. I omeone who could run his offense with a sleight-of-hand, good things were going to happen for his team that season.

My relationship with George was more than just between a journalist and a coach. When he came to coach at Wheeling Central Ca, I was a young writer and both Strager and the late Bob Roe, then the head coach at Wheeling High School, took me under their wi Strager was never known for paying much attention to the defensive side of the football, although I'm sure that was exaggerated. I do recall one time, however, when I went out to do a "Strager & Son" piece for the newspaper the week of the Red Devil's opene

There's a lot more to playing an all-star football than X's and O's. For proof, just ask Todd Fullerton, who will coordinate all the medical services for tonight's Rudy Mumley OVAC All-Star Charity Football Classic.

"Basically, my job is to make sure all the i's are dotted and the t's are crossed," Fullerton said, laughing.

Among Fullerton's i's and t's are:

- Making sure enough trainers, doctors and emergency technicians are present, in case of injury.
- Ensuring that the teams have plenty of supplies, from medical tape to ice packs.
- Telling coaches if players injured during the game are healthy enough to return to action.
- Deciding whether or not to play, delay or cancel a game because of weather conditions. Last year, for example, the game was delayed 55 minutes because of oppressive humidity.



From a medical standpoint, the key to keeping a game running smoothly is communication, Fullerton said.

"Basically, we try to work with each other and communicate with the coaches," Fullerton said. "There's a lot of communication between everyone involved."

Fullerton should know. After all, he's been seriously involved with the OVAC for the past 15 years, and he's been working in sports medicine for the past 30 years.


His athletic training career started in the late 1960s when, as a student-athlete at Martins Ferry High School, Art Simpson befriended Fullerton and gave him his first chance at being a trainer. And Fullerton's stepfather, Bill Van Horne, the sports editor of the Wheeling News-Register until his death in 1995, took him around to sporting events, which fueled his desire to remain involved in sports.

Fullerton holds a Bachelor's degree in physical education from The Ohio State University and a Master's degree in exercise physiology from the University of Arizona. Along the way, he's worked with several notable organizations, including the following:

- While at Ohio State, he was an athletic trainer for the Buckeye football team, a position that allowed him to work with Woody Hayes and attend the Rose Bowl.
- Fullerton worked the summers of 1972 and 1973 in Bradenton, Fla. with the Pittsburgh Pirates organization.
- While a graduate student at Arizona in 1977-1979, he was an athletic trainer with the Association of Tennis Professionals, and worked with such tennis luminaries as Jimmy Connors and Bjorn Borg.

But, Fullerton said, ""There's nothing quite as special as the OVAC. That's why he returned to the Ohio Valley in 1985. Currently, he works as a registered nurse in the emergency room at Wheeling Hospital. "People like (Van Horne, Simpson and the late Sam Mumley) were very instrumental and influential in high school sports," Fullerton said. "There's great camaraderie, great fellowship...sometimes the kids don't realize what they have until they are out of it." Fullerton lives in Wheeling with his wife, Susie, and his two children – Jaclyn, who will turn 10 in August, and Jake. 8.


