I am proud to be the director of the Fifty-Fifth Annual Ron Mauck OVAC Wrestling Tournament. I began directing the event in 1979, when it was first conducted at the Wheeling Civic Center. Throughout the last 54 years, many memorable milestones have taken place. Allow me to share them with you.

During the spring of 1970, we lost a phenomenal wrestler, David Bierkortte, to an untimely accident. Because of his athletic prowess, the Wheeling Central High School Booster's Club initiated, the "David Bierkortte Award" for the outstanding wrestler in 1971.

The Wheeling Civic Center Manager in 1979 was Frank Rodriguez. He had a great deal of respect for those involved with OVAC wrestling, and was instrumental in purchasing the world-class time clocks you now see by mat side during the competition. Presently, we are blessed with Dennis Magruder, who has given us the same positive support, along with the entire WesBanco Arena Staff.

In 1980, OVAC wrestling initiated the first "George Kovalick Scholarship". Two years later Bob and Dolores Burke lost their son, Danny, a Wheeling Park wrestler, in a tragic accident. Out of their love for him, the "Daniel M. Burke Wrestling Scholarship" was initiated in 1983. Recently, we lost a fantastic wrestling enthusiast in 1996 from Marshall County affectionately named "Dead Eye". His devoted family established the "James H. Morris Sportsmanship Scholarship" in 1997, out of his love for the mat sport. In 1999, East Liverpool's 2-time OVAC Champ and Hercules Award winner, Matt Salsberry, was lost in a tragic auto accident. In 2003, "Friends in Memory of Matt Salsberry" established an annual academic/wrestling scholarship. In 2003, Lucas "Luke" Sedgmer, a two-time OVAC Wrestling Champion from Cadiz High School, tragically lost his life in an auto accident. In 2005, a committee in his community established The Lucas D. Sedgmer Memorial Scholarship.

So, we now have five (5) permanently installed scholarship funds that over the years have afforded 62 deserving OVAC wrestlers an amazing \$76,500 in college scholarships.

In 1999, there was a unique change in the tournament format, which promotes OVAC wrestling even further throughout the Valley. The championship finals are now being televised live by WTO-9 for all viewers in the entire area to enjoy. This year we proudly celebrate the 55th anniversary of the tournament and 30 years of a mutually beneficial relationship with the City of Wheeling and welcome the corporate sponsorship of the WesBanCo Arena. I want to thank every one of the workers, coaches, officials and wrestlers. They are the people who make the Annual OVAC Wrestling Tournament a truly grand adventure for Ohio Valley athletics.

WesBanCo Arena & OVAC Wrestling A 30 Year Partnership



Another significant milestone has been reached this year. It marks the 30th anniversary of the WesBanCo Arena serving as host to the 55th Annual Ron Mauck OVAC Wrestling Tournament.

Prior to moving to the former Wheeling Civic Center in 1979, the OVAC Wrestling Tournament had been held in five (5) different locations.

Beginning with Arena Manager, Frank Rodriguez, cooperation was soon evident. He had such faith in OVAC Wrestling leadership, that he demonstrated it by his influence in purchasing the (8) world-class time clocks seen at mat side during competition.

The Arena Management has been more than our congenial hosts; they have been like a partner.

You can tell it is time for the OVAC Wrestling Tournament by the weather. It arrives as expected in the Upper Ohio River Valley, in wintry abundance and unpredictable. Arena management has the awesome responsibility of seeing that whatever is scheduled proceeds without the influence or affect of Old Man Winter.

The Flood of '96 became an imminent threat, and the staff and management of the Arena set about the monumental task of securing the facility, in light of its elevation and proximity to the flood waters. Consequently, wrestling was halted at 6:00 PM on Friday and rescheduled for the following Saturday.

Mark George, an inspirational and motivational leader, and his crew did a remarkable job of keeping the damages of the invasive waters to a minimum.

One week later on Saturday the 27th, the tournament resumed as if it were originally scheduled as such.

Mark is often viewed as the "true operations director". He began working at the Arena in '78 as a part-time concession worker. Since that time he has worked as an usher, door guard, setup/tear down crew and even as a cook. Demonstrating exceptional skills, conscientious workmanship and leadership ability has led to him being in charge of building maintenance. His knowledge of ice making has earned him the respect of Operations Directors around the country.

A Wheeling native, he is a graduate of West Virginia Northern Community College. Mark and his wife, Candy, have three teenage children.

Again in 2005, the National Weather Service called for "freezing rain turning to snow early Saturday morning". Wrestling was wisely halted and the Saturday sessions were rescheduled for Monday. Once again, with the complete cooperation of Arena management and OVAC wrestling, the resumption of the tournament occurred without visible disruption.

This can only happen with the complete and total commitment of a management staff, dedicated to serving and satisfying.

A tournament of this magnitude has much equipment that requires storing. The sheer volume has continued to grow over the years. We would be hard pressed to imagine where we could find such available space and logistically ideal without the sincere consideration of arena management

These are but a few of the obvious examples of the type of cooperation that we have received from Rodriguez and his successor, Executive Director, Dennis Magruder, currently serving in his 23rd year, and his loyal, devoted and efficient staff.

Denny is a graduate of West Liberty State College and a Certified Facilities Executive. A Wheeling native, he resides here with his wife Barbara, three children and six grandchildren.

Denny is humble and friendly, yet a tireless task master, who goes about his job seeing not problems to be solved, but challenges to be met in the most unobtrusive ways possible.

Doug Campbell is in his 14th year as Assistant Director. He is a '97 graduate of the IAAM Public Assembly Facility Managers School and serves as box office director, personnel/payroll manager, inhouse advertising agency and maintains computer operations and the building's web site. He resides in Shadyside where he is a member of the Board of Education and serves as an assistant football coach.

Sonya Fedorko began as a temporary hire, but quickly impressed and was hired as a full-time secretary. She has become an integral and indispensable part of day-to-day operation of the building. She handles much of the bookkeeping and publishes the monthly newsletter. Sonya is coordinator of the very successful and long-running "Christmas in November" craft show.

Sonya coaches in the East Ohio Girls Softball League and plays in the Wheeling Recreational League. She also coaches basketball at Buckeye Local. Sonya resides in Yorkville with her two children.

Like many of her co-workers, Melody Reynolds started at WesBanCo Arena as a part-time worker. Bringing her many years of experience and talent in cooking and planning, gained in the area's Elby's Big Boy restaurants, Melody has become an invaluable asset as she prepares for intimate parties or 1,000 person banquets. She has prepared meals for such entertainers as Elton John, Kenny Rogers, Neal McCoy and Larry the cable Guy. Mel is very active in her church and with her family.

Leo Shrader is a certified electrician having served the Arena for the past 25 years. He began his full-time duties upon retirement as Asst. Fire Chief with the City of Wheeling in '96 after 30 years of service.

Everything from ticket sales and food service to restroom maintenance functions with an efficiency that is worthy of much praise.

It is because of this unbelievable cooperation on behalf of management that we feel that we have found a permanent home where we are welcome and appreciate the Arena staff's efforts to make us feel so.

To the staff and management of WesBanCo Arena, we extend our collective and heartfelt appreciation for all of your many considerations and cooperation today and throughout the years.



Its birth...growth....and tradition

It began as all ideas...the dream of one man...the late George Kovalick.

In March of 1954, Wheeling, Bridgeport, Barnesville and Linsley Institute competed in the inaugural OVAC Wrestling Tournament.

The following year Weirton was added as the tournament moved to Barnesville.

The tournament returned to Bridgeport in 1956, where it remained through 1958, while growing to 7 participating schools.

After 5 years as Tournament Director, Coach Kovalick relinquished the reins to John "Corky" Vrotsos when the tournament moved to Martins Ferry.

Over the next 9 years, the tournament grew to 18 teams, as schools, sometimes reluctantly added wrestling to their inter-scholastic programs as fan interest blossomed.

There was a concern expressed by participating coaches that the OVAC had never been held in West Virginia.

A decision was made to move the tournament to Moundsville and thereafter to alternate between West Virginia and Ohio.

And so it was, that in 1968 under Co-Directors George Walley and George Kovalick, the tournament opened with 20 participating schools.

Ironically, no significant mention of alternating tournament sites occurred during the next 8 years, as the tournament grew in both participant and fan numbers.

Several landmark events occurred during the Moundsville Era...With 23 schools competing in 1970, the OVAC crowned its first West Virginia Over-All Team Champion, Wheeling Central Catholic...in 1971, following the tragic death of David Beirkortte, former OVAC Tournament

Champion, the Wheeling Central Catholic Boosters Club established the Most Valuable Wrestler Award to be presented annually to a wrestler of merit in the tournament... the firstv recipient was Don Blum of Martins Ferry...In 1974, with 32 schools competing, the OVAC became a 3 day event and 6 mats were used for the preliminary rounds...In 1975, with 34 schools competing and as a result of recent school district consolidations, it was decided that the smaller schools should be competing for team championships against equal or near equal enrollment. Therefore, classifications were established for 3 Division Champions plus an Over-All Tournament title...Finally, little Warwood became the first school to win the Over-All Team Championship without an individual champion.

In 1976, the tournament moved to the Steubenville Diocesan Arena with Bob Hedmond as Director.

It was during this year that the most prestigious honor in OVAC Wrestling, "MR. MAT" was established as an annual award. How fitting and appropriate that George Kovalick, affectionately known as Coach "K", should be the initial recipient of an award earned for "a lifetime of dedication to the sport of wrestling"...for it was his idea...his dream...his energy...and his enthusiasm that had made it a reality.

In 1977, school classifications were expanded to 4 divisions, as paid attendance to the three day event soared to 9,465.

The OVAC Wrestling Tournament and foul weather seem to arrive as distinct, yet inseparable entities. And so it was, that in 1978, when faced with treacherous highway conditions from an accumulation of ice and snow, it was deemed necessary to postpone the Friday session until Saturday.

In 1979, the Tournament moved to the Wheeling Civic Center with Ron Mauck as Director. Two

major improvements took place that year, (1) the massive floor area of the Civic Center now made it possible to wrestle on 8 mats, and (2) 8 individual and independent electronic match scoreboard/clocks were purchased.

In 1980, recognition of individual weight-class competitors was expanded to include the top 8 finishers.

That same year, the OVAC Wrestling Coaches Association created, to honor Coach "K", the George E. Kovalick Scholarship to be presented annually to assist a college-bound scholar wrestler.

Following the tragic 1982 death of Wheeling Park High School wrestler, Danny Burke, his parents established a living tribute to his memory. In 1983, the first annual Danny Burke Memorial Wrestling Scholarship was awarded to John Witzberger of Wheeling Central.

In 1997, following the untimely passing of James "Dead Eye" Morris, sons Jeff and Gregg (both former OVAC Champions), and the Morris family, established an annual sportsmanship award and a scholarship to honor his memory, in tribute to his long abiding love for wrestling and devotion to the OVAC.

The threatening flood was more a probability than a possibility when the 43rd Annual Tournament opened on Thurs. Jan. 19, 1996. When it became evident that we were faced with the certainty, a prudent, yet difficult and unpopular decision was made to discontinue wrestling at 6:00 PM on Friday, Jan. 20, and resume at that point on Sat. Jan. 27.

To accomplish this monumental task required the complete cooperation of everyone involved, including, but not limited to wrestlers, coaches, athletic directors, tournament workers, referees and the rescheduling or dropping of other meets or tournaments, plus a host of individual problems faced by everyone associated with an undertaking of this magnitude. An indication of the level of cooperation and commitment to the OVAC was never more evident than when the tournament reconvened one week later, just as though it were a part of the original plan.

None of this could have taken place without the cooperation, understanding and participation of the Civic Center staff, under the supervision its

congenial and tireless Director, Dennis Magruder.

WTOV-9, as a corporate sponsor, demonstrated their enthusiastic support for OVAC wrestling when they initiated live television coverage of all championship bouts in 1998.

In the spring of 1999, the dynamic force behind the growth and expansion of the OVAC, Sam Mumley, Executive Secretary for 32 years, succumbed to his battle with cancer.

Steve Kish, Superintendent of Martins Ferry Schools, willingly stepped in to fill the void, serving as interim, until Tom Rataiczak assumed the permanent position in the fall of 1999.

In November of 2002, we mourned the passing of Bob Hedmond, MR. MAT of '81. He had served as football coach at East Liverpool, Brooke and Steubenville High Schools as well as OVAC Wrestling Tournament Director during its 3 years at the Diocesan Arena ('76-'78).

In 2003, "Friends in Memory of Matt Salsberry" established an athletic/academic scholarship "with a desire to honor and perpetuate his memory". He was a two-time OVAC Champion in '98-'99 and Mr. Hercules Award winner from East Liverpool. He lost his life in a tragic auto accident in '99.

The year 2003 marked three significant mile stones: (1) the OVAC celebrated the 50th annual tournament, (2) the OVAC commemorated 25 years of a cooperative relationship with the Wheeling Civic Center and (3) we recognized, honored and applauded Ron Mauck for 25 years of dynamic leadership as the Director of OVAC Wrestling. More than 250 former OVAC wrestling tournament champions were introduced and applauded as they paraded before a packed house.

The tragic death of Lucas "Luke" Sedgmer, twotime OVAC champion from Cadiz, on May 9, 2003 brought about the establishment of the Lucas D. Sedgmer scholarship.

OVAC Wrestling now provides 5 permanent scholarships annually to deserving wrestlers. To date we have presented 62 scholarships in the amount of \$76,500.

With student and spectator safety always the primary concern, the Sat. Jan. 22, 2005, sessions of the tournament were wisely postponed, when it was learned that the National Weather Service prediction of "freezing rain turning to snow early Saturday morning" would be a reality. The tournament resumed on Mon. Jan. 24, without a hitch, thanks to the outstanding cooperation of schools, coaches, WesBanCo Arena management, tournament officials and staff.

In 2006, the OVAC Executive Committee unanimously voted to rename the wrestling tournament the RON MAUCK OVAC WRESTLING TOURNAMENT in honor of his dedication, enthusiasm and leadership as Director of Wrestling for 28 years.

2008 marked another milestone. It marked the 30th year of Ron Mauck's dynamic and tireless leadership. He has fostered the growth and stability of what many consider the signature event in the OVAC.

Giving selflessly of his time, energy and talent, He has engendered much goodwill and cooperation among both those involved and those attending this spectacular event. His warmth and camaraderie has created what has become a family of wrestling enthusiasts and supporters. Rare are these character traits embodied in one so humble, yet so capable. His legacy of leaderships shall serve to inspire and motivate, much like his mentor, the late venerable George Kovalick.

Retiring as OVAC Director of Wrestling does not mean that Ron will no longer be a part of that which he has so zealously created and perpetuated. He will continue to be involved and provide wise counsel to his successor.

It is our fond wish that this tournament will continue to grow...if not in size, hopefully in stature...as a symbol of all that is good a decent. There is no greater satisfaction than that which one receives from the investment of time and energy devoted to youth.

As you witness the pomp and pageantry, from opening ceremonies on Thursday...through the Parade of Champions on Saturday...only then will you realize that this is a true labor of love...and a living tribute to all those, both past and present, who have strived to make it possible and memorable.


DANIEL M. BURKE MEMORIAL WRESTLING SCHOLARSHIP






Excuses for losing they will never endure, "Don't blame the ref, son, because of the score, The coach, he will show you the best way to move. Keep working in practice if you want to improve."

Worshrag's Last Season

I write this after Worshrag's first practice of the last season of his scholastic wrestling career.

Our son has been wrestling since preschool. Thirteen winters of practice, making weight, waking up at 5 a.m. to drive to a tournament two hours away. Thirteen springs of hanging on, fighting through fatigue and injuries, getting pumped for league and conference tournaments. For him and for us the years have been divided into three seasons: wrestling season, after wrestling season and before wrestling season.

Suddenly it's here. Three months from now it will all be over - win or lose, triumph or tragedy. Our son's wrestling career will be cardboard boxes of pictures, trophies and tournament programs. . . not to mention dresser drawers stuffed with tournament T-shirts.

It's no secret that more than anything else, Worshrag wants to win the OVAC. He wants his name beside mine on the wrestling room wall in our high school. He has trained incredibly hard, developed a spartan discipline in diet and lifestyle, denied himself leisure in the off-season, and focused his life on what he needs to do to reach his goal. I badly want it for him, too, but the fact he wants it so much honors me more than whether or not he actually gets it.

The truth is, a long time ago I got lucky in a 16-bracket tournament. My entire wrestling career lested all of three years, and winning the OVAC was my only memorable accomplishment. I tell Worshrag he is 10 times the wrestler I ever was, and has given me 100 times more pride, excitement and memories than I had any right to expect.

When he was six and won a rookle tournament at Burgettstown, he slept with the trophy. He won four youth league championships, and BMAC and Ohio Valley championships in middle school. He started on the varsity as a freshman in high school, has a couple of team records in the book, got his 100th win as a junior, has been a member of three state championship teams and two OVAC championship teams, was

individual runner-up at state last year, and cocaptains his team for the second year. Worshrag has had a wonderful wrestling career, though individual state and OVAC titles have eluded him

This season hasn't started and my wife Honey already is a basket case.

"I wish it was over. I wish this was March and it was all over," Honey said.

"Don't wish our lives away," I replied, "This is the good stuff."

I mean it. I wouldn't have missed a match of our son's wrestling career for anything, the thrilling victories and the bitter losses both. The difference now is, if he's injured, if he loses in the semi's or finals of a tournament, there is no next year.

It's hard for my wife to think of the OVAC tournament as anything but a three-day gut-churning torment. Worshrag himself admits he doesn't enjoy wrestling like he once did because of the expectations on him to win, including the pressure he puts on himself. I want him to enjoy his senior year, but his duty to his team and himself is more important than finding enjoyment. This is about honor, about self-sacrifice and dedication in pursuit of a dream. If he wins, we all will be beyond joyous. If he gives his best yet falls short, he can be satisfied it was not for lack of effort or commitment.

Worsh started training for this season two days after last season ended. Running and lifting every day; grilled skinless chicken breast and egg whites for protein; gigantic tossed salads instead of what everyone else was eating; cleaning carrots and celery sticks every morning for school lunch. His self-discipline and work ethic have been exemplary. He has fashioned himself into the model of what a senior wrestler should be.


There have been times over the years, especially after injuries, when he was sorely tempted to quit wrestling, as so many of his former teammates have done. Two things held him back: his own competitive drive, and his desire not to disappoint me.

For those first seven years and hundreds of matches I was on the corner of his met as my son's youth wrestling coach. For the last six I've been a proud dad on the sidelines. He has given me such joy I could have jumped through the rathers, and I have hurt so bad for him I ached to the depths of my being, but I have never, ever been disappointed in him, not once.

I won't lie; an OVAC championship for my son would be icing on the cake. But the cake is already made, and a fine one it is.

Matthew Salsberry 1980-1999



Within minutes after leaving for home from Ohio Northern University, where they had all just undergone freshmen orientation, Matt Salsberry; his girlfriend, Emily Bickerton; and his best friend, Dan Aldrich, fell victims to tragedy. An inattentive and irresponsible teenage driver, in a moment of senseless exhilaration took the lives of all three and brought emotional devastation to the families and school community.

Matt Salsberry had a lust for life that dictated success. The commitment and enthusiasm which he brought to the wrestling mat, the playing field, the stage and the classroom, motivated and inspired teammates, classmates and fans. He was a humble winner and a gracious loser, who gained the respect of all who came to know him.

If any single incident defined his commitment and enthusiasm for whatever the project might be, surely it had to be his humorous showstealing portrayal of "Earthquake" McGoon in the school musical "Lil Abner".

Matt was a two-time OVAC champion and winner of the "Mr. Hercules Award" in '99, by pinning his way to the 215# championship in a cumulative time of less that a single match. He was 4th in the State of Ohio while compiling 124 wins. He was All-State in football for three years and started in 32 consecutive games. He earned 11 varsity letters, was River Valley League discus champion, served as Junior Class President and Senior Class Vice President, while maintaining a 3.5 GPA as a member of NHS.



Luke was an avid outdoorsman, possessed of a love and respect for all things living.

Tragically, he lost his life on Friday, May 9, 2003, in a head-on auto collision.

He had worked as a summer employee with the Harrison County Highway Department and served as an assistant wrestling coach at Wheeling Park High School.

He had finished school that very day and was to have graduated from West Liberty State College shortly thereafter.

The fulfillment of his dream would have been to teach and coach wrestling.

He was a member of the New Athens Volunteer Fire Department and attended the United Methodist Church in New Athens.

A committee was established to provide two scholarships to perpetuate and honor Luke in memoriam. One scholarship is presented to a graduate of Harrison Central High School and the other to an OVAC member school wrestler.

The criteria for selection as a recipient are the qualities exhibited by Luke during his brief but dynamic existence. They are scholarship, athletic accomplishments and character.

Luke was greatly admired, widely respected and dearly loved by all who came to know him. It is our fond hope that by honoring him in this fashion we will not only be perpetuating his memory, but aiding others in pursuit of their dream.
