

We became involved in the OVAC® All-Star Football Game in the late 70's when Rudy was working to build the game. I later drafted him to help with the OVAC® Wrestling Tournament and we have worked together ever since. Tom and Sandy help make the OVAC® a great organization."

Current Game Director Bob Koch adds, "It's people like Tom Milliken that make all the hours and all the work seem small compared to the many benefits that the athletes and community receive. He is bedrock for a whole lot of good. I always look forward to working with Tom."

Tom enjoys softball and was a fast-pitch softball pitcher for over twenty-five years. He had the pleasure of coaching both of his daughters in the sport. Tom also enjoys playing cards with his poker group at their Saturday night get-togethers.



There are many words to describe the life of Rudolph Mumley, but perhaps the most appropriate would be service.

For most of his 80-plus years, Mumley, known as "Rudy" to his legion of friends, worked on behalf of many causes. None were more important to him than the youth of the Ohio Valley.

It is befitting that the game which fans are witnessing this evening is named in his honor. If it hadn't been for Rudy's willingness to step forward, the Ohio-West Virginia All-Star Game would not have existed the last 28 years, and it now appears to be a fixture that will carry it well into the next millennium.

The game's history goes back to the early 1940s and, for many years after that, it was sponsored by booster club associations from Eastern Ohio and the West Virginia northern panhandle.

However, the game could not receive NCAA sanction and consequently was held during the spring to allow players who had received scholarships to NCAA schools an opportunity to participate.

When it became apparent that the booster club organizations could no longer sponsor the game, it ceased to exist. An idea was presented to Sam A. Mumley Sr. that the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference® could assume sponsorship of the game and apply for NCAA sanction.

One of the requirements toward receiving NCAA sanction was that only 60 percent of game proceeds could be spent to cover expenses and the other 40 percent had to be used for charitable purposes.

Once the game received sanction, the OVAC® had another problem. It was experiencing financial problems and did not have the resources to provide "seed" money that would be needed to purchase uniforms, pay for training camp and other start-up expenses such as insurance.

Sam Mumley, who was the executive secretary of the OVAC®, appealed to his uncle, Rudy, to provide the financial help. The story has become legend on how Rudy, a bachelor who lived with his beloved sister, Lillian, in the Warwood area of Wheeling, mortgaged their home to receive a loan. The rest, as the saying goes, is history.

There was more adversity to overcome for this inaugural OVAC® venture. The Ohio Valley experienced damaging floods during June of 1972. Wheeling Stadium sustained considerable damage and the facility would not be available for the early August game.

Sam Mumley called his longtime friend, the late Edmund Joseph, who was then athletic director at Martins Ferry High School and asked if the OVAC® could use Ferry Stadium. Once Joseph took the request to school officials and received permission, the game was finally on.

However, on the day of the game, the area was hit hard by a rainstorm. More adversity. By this time, you could not fault Rudy Mumley, who agreed to serve as game director, if he was feeling a bit jinxed. Several hours before kickoff was scheduled, the rain stopped and the sun came out. It turned into a beautiful evening, and the game went off like clockwork before a capacity audience.

The OVAC® was in business as far as renewal of the Ohio-West Virginia midsummer classic was

However, that's not the end of the story. Over the next two decades-plus that Rudy Mumley served as game director, he made numerous improvements to the game. He turned it from just an all-star game into an extravaganza.

He took the all-star gridders to camp at West Liberty State College, his alma mater, and a place where he had long-standing ties. Each year, Mumley added activities for the players to help them pass the time and provide some relief from the rigors of training camp.

He enlisted the help of the Osiris Shrine and this group gave the game a more meaningful

purpose as it would eventually gain the lion's share of the charity proceeds.

Through his good friend, the late George Strager, another mid-week event, "An Evening With the Stars," was initiated and handled with impeccable care by two other longtime friends, Mike Young and Pete Cuffaro.

From the time the OVAC® assumed sponsorship of the game, Mumley brought back the Stone & Thomas "Queen of Queens" Pageant which had been a part of the All-Star Game series when it was sponsored by the booster club associations. Stone & Thomas continued to sponsor the event over the next two decades-plus. In recent years, the queen's pageant has continued under the sponsorship of Kaufman's of Wheeling and WTOV-9.

In the meantime, Mumley enlisted the help of Glenn Didriksen and his family, which owned and operated several McDonald's Family Restaurants in the area, to form the McDonald's All-Star Band.

This has become an increasingly popular feature of the game.

Mumley's innovative mind produced a game that would help kick off the Ohio Valley football season, a classic that would involve some 60 to 70 football players annually and several hundred bandsmen. Add to that some 25 to 30 queen candidates and a myriad of volunteers who helped make the 10-day to two week experience a memorable part of their lives.

For a number of years, Rudy and his nephew Sam, along with other OVAC® officials and the dedicated men from the Osiris Shrine, would hold a pep rally at Russek Field on the campus of West Liberty State College. Several thousands of people attended these events and, of course, it was Rudy who usually stole the show.

From his days at old Wheeling High to those at West Liberty State College, Rudy was always there to help. Following a stint in the military service, he spent the next three decades or so as an educator, primarily in Eastern Ohio. He was principal at Buckeye South High when he retired.

His service to the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference® was ongoing for more than three decades, and he served as president on two different occasions.

Through his efforts and those of his many friends who joined with him to work on various facets of the all-star classic, more than \$600,000 has been provided to Ohio Valley charitable groups.

Several years before his death, which came in early February of 1999, Mumley relinquished directorship of the game to his longtime associate and close friend, Ron Mauck.

Nonetheless, Rudy still remained a familiar figure on the sidelines. His walk had slowed considerably although he had bounced back from a series of illnesses. But, the enthusiasm was as great as ever. He had seen the game reach new heights last year when it was televised live by WTOV-9 and the game still drew a near-capacity crowd.

It was a fitting tribute that OVAC® officials several years ago renamed the contest as the Rudy Mumley OVAC® Charity All-Star Game.

Rudy was to become one of the most recognizable sports figures the Ohio Valley had ever produced. He was honored as the Dapper Dan's "Man of the Year" in 1992, and earlier was inducted into the Athletic Hall of Fame at his beloved West Liberty State College, following in the footsteps of his late brother, Eli, Rudy was the first non-athlete or non-coach to earn this honor, and in recent years, he became a prominent benefactor to the school.

Educator, humanitarian and philanthropist. That's the legacy of a guy who wanted to be known simply as Rudy. And as long as this game can survive, fans of the Ohio Valley for the coming generations will be able to look skyward and say, "Thanks, Rudy!"





For more than three decades, Samuel A. Mumley served the youth of this area as executive secretary of the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference.

Last February, "Sammy" was called home by his maker to receive his just reward for a lifetime spent in service to others.

Perhaps the greatest compliment one can pay Sam Mumley following his passing is to say that he made his world a much better place to live because he once walked among us.

Mumley devoted nearly five decades to working for the youth of our Ohio Valley. In addition to his time as executive secretary of the OVAC®, which is still believed to be the largest high school athletic conference of its kind in the United States, Mumley was an athletic trainer, coach, basketball official, teacher and a school administrator.

If that wasn't enough time to give, Mumley joined Eric Carder, an assistant principal and director of activities at Wheeling Park High School, in serving as co-director for the West Virginia Super Six state high school football championships, which they brought to Wheeling Island Stadium six years ago.

Additionally, the pair helped secure the West Virginia state soccer championships held last year at the brand new athletic facility at Wheeling Jesuit University.

Sam also played a major role in the wonderful mid-summer football spectacle you are attending tonight at Wheeling Island Stadium. Renamed several years ago to honor his uncle, who also passed away earlier this year, the Rudy Mumley Charity All-Star Football Classic was revived in 1972 under the sponsorship of the OVAC\*.

In those days, the NCAA made things difficult for sponsors seeking sanction to hold various all-star contest. The local Ohio-West Virginia All-Star game had been dormant for many years after having been a fixture on the Ohio Valley gridiron scene since the early 1940s. Both Mumley's spent hundreds of hours putting together the formula for a program that the NCAA found acceptable. Today, the game is more vibrant and popular than ever among the area football fans, who nearly pack the Island Stadium each and every July to kick off a new gridiron campaign.

They also helped turn this event into more than just a football game. It has become a mid-summer spectacular complete with an All-Star Band, cheerleaders and the pageantry of a Queen of Queens contest.

It also helped raise hundreds of thousands of dollars for charitable organizations in the Ohio Valley over the past 26 years.

Much of these wonders have been achieved because Mumley refused to take "no" for an answer from anyone and because he dared to dream what many of us have considered to be impossible dreams

Who would have believed that the state high school football championships could ever be lured out of Charleston to the Northern Panhandle?

Sam did.

And Wheeling will host the state title games for the sixth straight year the first weekend of December.

Through his fund-raising efforts and the help of countless corporate sponsors and Super Six volunteers from up and down the Ohio Valley, the state football finals have been raised to a level that may never be matched in the Mountain State.

When Mumley came back to take over a second time as executive secretary of the OVAC®, the league was in dire financial straits.

Through Mumley's efforts and the backing of other leaders in the community, an OVAC® Foundation Board was formed to serve as a fund-raising arm of the bi-state league. That board is still in existence today.

The sports programs at the various schools were improved immensely. All-star games are now held each year in football, boys' and girls' basketball, baseball, softball and boys' and girls' soccer. The OVAC® sponsors championship tournaments in wrestling, swimming, tennis, golf, volleyball, baseball, softball, boys' and girls' soccer, boys' and girls' cross country, boys' and girls' track, cheerleading, etc.

Girls sports have risen to equal importance because Sam had the foresight and the courage to support each and every program offered by the OVAC. His efforts with girls' sports earned Mumley a seat on the equity panels for both the Ohio High School Athletic Association and the West Virginia Secondary School Athletic Commission.

The scholarship program also has been enhanced by Sam's ability to involve the corporate sector of the various communities within the extensive OVAC® map. At last May's OVAC® Banquet of Champions held at the Wheeling Civic Center, more than \$15,000 in scholarship money was awarded to deserving OVAC® student-athletes.

That money wasn't just found on the street corner; it was obtained largely through tireless efforts of the late executive secretary.

Sam put the OVAC®'s "kids" first in all his dreams and work for the conference. "What can we do for the 'kids'? How can we make things better for them?" Those were the first questions he posed whenever the OVAC® or Super Six would discuss changes in their programs.

He took great pains to involve everyone in conference business. He was constantly in touch with media members, keeping them updated on matters and seeking their opinions.

When important final decisions had to be made, Sam didn't mind being the one to make them. But he did so after many discussions among his constituents and his own private soul-searching. And, of course, his main concern was making sure that the decisions were in the best interest of the OVAC® student-athletes.

From a personal standpoint, if Sam became your friend, he was your friend for life. He was always there with a kind word, a bit of advice if it was asked for, and encouragement when any of his friends were in a difficult situation.

I once wrote in a column that Sam was no saint, but that he was sent to us by angels to perform good works and turn our impossible dreams into reality.

He dearly loved his wife, Nancy, who remained by his side through good times and rough times. No different from the rest of us, Nancy became part of the OVAC® family as well, taking care of the conference's financial books, a role she continues to handle today.

They were married just 11 years when Sam passed away. But, as Nancy once said, they crammed 40 years of happiness into that short time.

A long bout with cancer terminated Mumley's life at the too young age of 67. But, as this writer has stated before, you won't make me believe "Sammy" lost that fight with cancer. Nothing defeated Sam Mumley in his lifetime. God, whom Sam believed in with all his heart, simply decided it was time to call him home.

Sam Mumley was one of a kind.

He will remain in our thoughts and prayers forever.

# 28 Years... OVAC® All-Star Football Classic in Retrospect

...and The Tradition Continues

\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*

vast majority of people said it would never happen, many felt that it was impossible and some believing that it was to no avail ... "The OVAC® would not gain NCAA sanction for the resurrection of the defunct Ohio-West Virginia All-Star Football Game." True, as it was, the 1960's did not allow the conference much latitude for its quest for an NCAA sanction.

As general information, at that time it was mandatory to have NCAA sanction, otherwise those college bound grant-in-aid players would be declared ineligible for their freshman year. Therefore, during the early and middle 1960's, the Ohio-West Virginia All-Star Football Game drew those athletes of lesser athleticism or those not considering to participate on the collegiate level. Through such sanctioning, the NCAA could totally regulate any and all summer all-star contests, thus putting the "squeeze" on booster clubs and civic organizations who endeavored to work around such regulations. The Ohio-West Virginia All Star Football Game fell into this category, thus ending the game in the late 1960's and with it the once celebrated Official opening of the Ohio Valley's "pigskin" season.

"We are not going to be denied," said Sam A. Mumley, Executive Secretary of the OVAC®. "The rich athletic heritage of this valley as well as having one of the most prolific scholastic conferences in the country should entitle us the opportunity of showcasing our student athletes." In this respect the conference executive board passed legislation which directed the executive secretary to set the course in obtaining NCAA sanctioning, all of which would cover three years of time, effort and patience.

Beginning in early 1968, and with the intent of gathering preliminary information, it readily became apparent that the "deck was stacked" and those who originally commented on the impossibility of such an adventure their opinions seemed correct. However, the decision to move forward with our game plan remained and it was full speed ahead with enthusiasm, confidence and faith. What followed were days and months of endless phone conversations ranging from those with NCAA officials in Kansas City to those local and state political leaders as well as keeping the media constantly informed. Additionally there were endless committee and board meetings as well as dinner and luncheon engagements all designed with the purpose of seeking sanction approval.

1968 and 1969 quickly became history and among all of the other conference business, the OVAC® was very busy in implementing its Title IX Program for Girls.

Such female programs were introduced with the 1970 school year, two years before the federal mandatory date of September 1972. During this time period the conference was also formulating a full scale scholarship program, Partners in Academic and Athletic Programs, re-designing those needed changes in many sport levels and maintaining a sound financial base for all conference operations. Regardless, the NCAA all-star sanction movement was in full swing with constant communication between the NCAA and the OVAC® on target.

Late in 1971, a remarkable turn of events took place as the NCAA informed the OVAC® that they reviewed one of our many proposed all-star formats and found some definite interests in the overall structure. This, then, lead to three continuous months of very intense correspondence and phone conversations. At this juncture it was felt that we were closing in on gaining sanction and the pendulum was swinging toward our future

Then it happened .... late February 1972, a registered letter from the NCAA arrived at the conference office officially notifying the OVAC® that the NCAA Review Board for all-star contests had awarded total sanction for a conference all-star game for the summer of 1972. Overwhelmed and overjoyed, the conference held a monumental press meeting at the McClure Hotel in Wheeling announcing all the details relative to the first OVAC® All-Star Football Game. Rudy Mumley was already in the fold as our first director and remained as such for 23 years. In 1986, the game was officially re-named as The Rudy Mumley OVAC® Ohio-West Virginia Charity Football game All-Star Classic.

Tonight's 27th Annual Extravaganza will have produced .... 1,500 players • 3,200 musicians and directors (since 1982) • 500 cheerleaders • 750 queen candidates • 300 coaches, trainers, doctors, and managers • 225,000 fans .... and an enormous array of Shriners and volunteers, all major contributors in distributing over \$600,000.00 to local upper Ohio Valley charities.

So we (the football committee) thought it might be worth the time to show the general public what it costs to produce the OVAC/Rudy Mumley All-Star Football Classic. These figures are based on the 2009 game.

So doing the math, this means that the game "killer profits" would be **-\$13,661.00!** 

To be honest, we need to factor in the advertising revenue/television production.

Another item that is not understood is that the OVAC is its own production company. We hire and pay to have the game produced, then buy air time to televise the game. We are therefore responsible to sell the advertising and pay production costs. As our marketing program is tied in to the entire year, it is difficult to break out strictly the revenue generated for the game. However, in earlier years, that figure was usually around \$20,000. So if you factor that in, it would produce a \$6,339.00 profit.

These are real figures and can be verified by one look at the checkbook or one trip to the auditors. The obvious would be to raise prices, but that just can't be done. Next would be to cut things out. The committee met after last year's game and figured out how to eliminate or raise \$5,000 for this year. We also created a new event this year to help defray the cost of the band so we wouldn't have to cut musicians. But both of those added together will be more than consumed by the increase in room and board.

After this game is over, the OVAC football committee will have to look long and hard at changes for next year's game. But two things are certain:

- 1. We aren't making a killing; and
- 2. We are going to cheat our students/ athletes out of an experience of a lifetime.

# In the beginning... "1940" The First All★Star Game

West Virginia's senior All-Star schoolboys today held a 13 to 17 victory as the aftermath of their first meeting with the eastern Ohio team in the maiden football contest played under the new lighting system at the Island Stadium.

The victory of the mountain state youths, who had trailed from the opening quarter until the last seven minutes of the ball game, 7-0, came as a mild surprise as two well-drilled and highly efficient combinations delighted an early season crowd of some 8,000 fans.

The Ohioans drew first blood in the spectacular contest. A Mallery-Shackleford pass, late in the first period, moved the Buckeyes from midfield to the West Virginia 25. Sadlowski, another Bellaire back, took a pass that planted the ball on the nine, from where Sadlowski scored in two plays.

The remainder of the half was devoid of a distinct threat on the part of either team although the Rowe-Howell coached combine had advanced to the Ohio 25 when the intermission arrived.

The mountaineer sturdy rush line battled the equally effective Ohio forwards on fairly even terms into the final period before Johnny August, a Shadyside youth, who shared the starting role for the Bucks, was hit hard on his own 30 and Joe Corba, a Follansbee back, seized the white leather for the eventual winners.

Charlie Helinski, Union product, became a ball of fire at this stage. He wheeled off tackle to the Ohio 19 and then lugged the leather to the five aided by a too many times out penalty. Helinski picked up a yard and Mike "Punchy" Dimitro punched his way into the payoff zone. Dimitro cracked the line for the extra point and the issue was deadlocked.

#### **Passes Decide Battle**

The West Virginia stands settled back after this furious display satisfied with a 7-7 standoff, but the mountaineers were fired with the idea of victory when one of Joe Mallery's passes was intercepted near the 50 shortly after the succeeding kickoff.

Helinski niched successive passes to Phil Saseen and after the second toss to the Central Catholic back had planted the ball on the Ohioans nine. Helinski and Dimitro required three tries before the former had found the pay dirt and the West Virginia youths had a 13-7 lead.

The remaining time allowed for another kickoff and the West Virginians successfully negotiated an onside kick, recovering the ball as the fray ended.

Coaches Bill Kerns of WVU and Don C. Pedden of Ohio University were the honorary mentors and in addition to sitting on the benches of the contesting squads, both spoke over the P.A. system at halftime. Kerns was accompanied here by Frank Kutz, one of his line mentors, and Ray Carnelly, his plebe mentor. The trio departed today for Charleston and tonight's North-South Game, although Kerns had an opportunity to talk to some local prospects.

Bill Stobbs, the Wheeling native who tutors the Wittenberg athletic teams, was one of the spectators in the stands. Another was George Roark, coach of W & J's Presidents, and probably there were others.

Carl Hamill, Weirton's cagey tutor was in the dressing room to minister to a pair of his former Red Riders. Tony Brown aggravated an old should injury while Luke Tomasovich received a cracked rib.

The West Virginians showed big Sedor due respect while the prospective Ohio State youth was in the game. His Shadyside backfield mate, August despite his costly fumble, was one of the big guns in the Bucks' effort and the Niemiec-Hartwig combinations thrusts left the West Virginia fans worried.

Lou Caffaro; recovering from a nasal operation, held the sticks for the West Virginians but felt the call of battle in his impassive role. Paul Bricker, Weirton end who handled the kicking for Howell and Rowe, and did an effective job although one of his boots slipped off the side of his foot and out of bounds.

### "1950" All-Star Game - 60 Years Ago

An unheralded band of Ohio football luminaries capitalized on fumbles in the first and third periods to score a 14-0 victory over a favored West Virginia eleven in the eighth annual Ohio Valley All-Star game on a rain soaked Wheeling Island stadium turf last night.

The Buckeyes, spearheaded by captain Jimmy George of Smithfield, completely dominated the game as they ended West Virginia's winning streak at two games, and evened the record at four-four in the series before 9,000 fans.

Linemen John Kornetti of Smithfield and Dick Davidson of Steubenville pounced on a Mountaineer fumble in the end zone for the first score after the game was eight minutes old. Frankie Branson, fleet Martins Ferry halfback, slipped through the West Virginia line from the one-yard stripe to culminate a drive that started with a Mountaineer fumble in the third period.

Ohio Coaches Jack LaBay and Frank Lollini, who masterminded the buckeye strategy, gave full credit for the victory to the players. West Virginia Coach Mac Bowles lauded the Ohioans for the determined way in which they out-played his team.

The Ohioans operating out of the LaBay-Lollini version of the T-Formation, rang up 12 first downs to five for the Mountaineers. The Buckeyes gained 185 yards from scrimmage compared to 88 for the Mountaineers.

A Coffin Corner punt by Tiltonsville's little Jimmy Richie set the stage for the Buckeyes first counter. Ohio won the opening toss and elected to receive. Stan Chlon of Union kicked off, and after an exchange of fumbles in Ohio territory the Buckeyes drove to the West Virginia 44.

Richie, who engineered the Buckeyes' T-attack, angled a punt out of bounds at the West Virginia two yard line in the northeast corner of the field. Davidson and Kornetti recovered a loose ball in the Mountaineer backfield, and again the Ohioans were on their way to pay dirt.

Yorkville's Vince Orban and George

hit the Mountaineer line for no gain. Then Richie uncorked the Ohioans' first pass of the game, George grabbing it at the 15 on the east side of the field and driving to the six.

Orban and Branson alternated on lunges through the center of the line with Branson going into the end zone standing up on the fourth try. George again added the extra point by placement.

A West Virginia fumble on the following kickoff was covered by Bellaire's Harold Yates at the Mountaineer 35. The Buckeyes, however, were forced to punt from the 33 and West Virginia took over at its own 39. West Virginia then marched 30 yards before Unions' Bob Barker punted to Branson at the Ohio 20.

On a sustained drive that carried into the fourth period, the Buckeyes piled up five first downs and sent Mingo's Duck Marshall into the West Virginia end zone from the six yard line on a play that was called back on a holding penalty against Ohio. The thrust ended up at the Mountaineer 22-yard stripe.

Weirton's Bob Pulice reeled off a 22- yard gain to the Mountaineer 44 on a reverse around left end, but it was offset by a 17-yard loss by Weirton's Ralph Patrick. Wheeling's Dino Hadjis punted to Branson at the Ohio 31, and seconds later the Mountaineers had the ball in Buckeye territory for the first time in the second half.

W.Va. captain Stan Tsapis recovered a loose ball at the Ohio 29, but a lateral fumble by Pulis Coleman at the Buckeye 37, setting the stage for the final drive of the game. Ohio picked up two first downs in driving to the West Virginia 31, where the game ended.

Bellaire's Anello Liberatti, Smithfield's Kornetti, and Toronto's Vern McConnell stood out on Ohio's line, while Tsapis, Union's Stan Chlon and Moundsville's Louis Adkins were outstanding for West Virginia.

### "1960" All-Star Game - 50 Years Ago

George Fisher, 200 pound fullback from Toronto High, last night turned defeat into victory for the Ohio All-Stars in the 18th of the Ohio Valley "Dream" football games by breaking through the line and romping 76 yards for a final period touchdown that nullified a first half touchdown for their West Virginia opponents.

And then Johnny Bellopatrick, former Mingo athlete, calmly dropped kicked the extra point to haul the Buckeyes to victory, 7-6 over the West Virginia who had scored early in the first period.

Although the Ohio attack had been bottled up for more than three-quarters, the dramatic touchdown came with 5:26 in the fourth quarter after the West Virginians had been threatening to pad their lead.

Steve Jackson had punted to Ohio's 25 Tomach lost a yard on the next play, but the Buckeyes sprang the ex-Torontoan through the left side and, aided by a key block thrown by Lou Thomas at the West Virginia 25, dashed to a score.

Leon Jeter fumbled the opening kick-off at the goal line, dribbled it, pick it up and evading three tacklers got to his own 38. Steve Jackson, Larry Holman, and Jeter got a first down at the 48. Holman fumbled and Dave Hunter recovered it at the West Virginia 45.

West Virginia ground out a touchdown in 10 plays, picking up four first downs enroute. Mike Hayden and Ace Lyle got seven between them Jackson then added seven and Lyle raced for 15 to the Ohio 26. Hayden passed to Jim Jarrett who got to the 14. Lyle hit right tackle to the one-foot line, and Hayden sneaked for the TD with 4-1/2 minutes gone.

W.Va. had two chances for the PAT. An offside penalty saved Hayden in a run from a fake placement try but on the second try, Nardo, an Ohio lineman, blocked the kick.

W.Va. dominated the first quarter play. Ohio, who had gained only one yard previously, took the second kickoff at its own 29, but after a net loss of three in two plays, sent Larry Sizemore back to kick

although the Big Red lineman had never punted before. He booted a 66-yard kick that came to rest at the W.Va. 8.

Jackson's boot gong to his own 41, Jim Pyle returned to the 35. Ohio made its deepest penetration at this point with Bobby Edwards getting 11 and George Fisher adding three to the West Virginia 21. Here Haden cut short the threat by intercepting a Jackson pass at the 10 and ripping up to his own 48 where Jackson caught him.

West Virginia's Steve Jackson punted out of bounds on the W.Va. 43 on the second play of the second quarter as W.Va. stalled. Then after Bob Edwards got a yard, Larry Marmie raced 18 yards on a keeper but a later fumble ended the drive at the W.Va. 26.

West Virginia dominated the rest of the prior to Fisher's explosive scamper. George second period, penetrating to the Buckeye 45 early in the period, on Steve Jackson's 11-yard dash. Later in the period, the Mountaineers had advanced from their own 21 to the Ohio 40. In that series, controlling the ball for the last nine plays of the half, the big gain was another 18 yard run by Jackson,

former Parkersburg half-back.

Ohio took the opening kickoff of the second half. Running plays by Eddie The West Virginians punted in return. Jackson, George Tomach, and Bobby Edwards moved the ball to the Ohio 47yard line.

> Tomach lost 6 yards and then the Buckeyes had an incomplete pass.

> Steubenville's Larry Sizemore dropped back to punt and kicked to Mike Hayden at the West Virginia 20 and he returned it to the 30.

> Steve Jackson picked up 5. Leon Jeter added another yard and then a backfield in motion penalty put the Mountaineers back to the 31. Jeter picked up 4 yards and then Moundsville's John Zwolensky picked up 8 yards to the West Virginia 43.

> Ohio was able to move the ball only to the W.Va. 40 and then Cadiz's Jim Pyles dropped back and booted to the West Virginia 23. West Virginia picked up two first downs in 5 plays before Jackson punted out of bounds at the W.Va. 49.

> Eddie Jackson gained 5 yards in two tries for Ohio and then lost 3 as the quarter ended.

### "1980" All-Star Game - 30 Years Ago

A severe summer storm with strong wind and fierce lightning cut short Saturday night's Game at Wheeling Island Stadium, resulting in confusion, a mad dash for the exits, and a 10-7 victory for Ohio.

At 9:05 p.m. with 5:11 remaining in the game, heavy winds swept across the stadium and a bolt of lightning knocked out the lights on the west side of the stadium.

Officials then signaled an end to the contest, and the fans, approximately 8,500 of them, took off on a frantic dash toward the exits. Moments later, the game was declared official, and the stadium was soon empty.

Ohio was not only ahead 10-7 at the time, but was driving toward the West Virginia end zone. Quarterback Jeff Smith of Buckeye Local had just completed a 19-yard pass to Bridgeport's Rich Goodrich for a first down at the Mountaineer 18 when Mother Nature Intervened.

What proved to be the winning touchdown came at the 4:46 mark of the third quarter when Smith hit Goodrich on a 13-yard scoring strike. The TD capped a 13 play 74-yard drive, which featured the dazzling running of Martins Ferry back Jimmy Johnson. He gained 30 of the 74 yards, including an 11-yarder on a third and three from the West Virginia 32.

Johnson's eight yard scamper gave the Buckeyes a first down at the nine, but Ohio was pushed back to the 13 as St. Clairsville's Mike Morris was dropped by Brooke's Steve DePasquale. But on the next play Smith hit Goodrich in the left flat for the touchdown.

Goodrich caught five passes for 66 yards, and he also intercepted two passes off West Virginia quarterback Tommy Thomas of Wheeling Central, the first of which set up a first quarter field goal by Shadyside's Manny Matsakis.

Smith completed eight of 13 passes for 93 yards, and he was also the game's leading

rusher with 71 yards on 14 carries.

Johnson finished with 57 yards on 13 carries, which Buckeye North's Bart Brown added 21 yards on the ground.

Thomas completed only three passes in 10 tries for 44 yards, and he was victimized twice by Goodrich.

Central's Rich Kelly paced the West Virginia ball carriers with 36 yards on 10 carries.

Ohio led in first downs, 14-6, and in overall rushing yardage, 144-31. The Buckeyes were penalized five times for 49 yards, while the Mountaineers were set back twice for 20 yards. Each team lost a fumble.

Thomas came out throwing on the very first play from scrimmage, but the intended pass for teammate Matt Hamm was broken up by Jefferson Union's Steve Swinehart near mid-field. Another incomplete aerial and a three-yard loss pinned against Weirton Madonna's Vic Ceglie forced the Mountaineers to punt.

Ohio could do no better on its first possession. Brown and Johnson were dropped for losses, and Smith's pass intended for Shadyside's Todd Snedeker fell incomplete.

The Buckeyes got the game's first break on the West Virginia's next series. On third and 10 from the 18, Goodrich stepped in front of Magnolia's Rick Dove at the 30, intercepted Thomas' pass and returned the oval to the Mountaineer 14.

Ohio, however, could manage only a net of five yards on the ensuring three plays, and on fourth down from the nine, Matsakis came on and booted a 27-yard field goal to give the Buckeyes a 3-0 lead with 5:09 left in the first quarter.

Just moments later, Ohio was back in business again as a Thomas pass went off the fingers of Central's Eric Osterman, and into the hands of Goodrich at the West Virginia 35. A pass from Smith to Goodrich was good for 17-yards and a first down at the Mountaineer seven, and another aerial to Snedeker to put the ball at the three.

But that's as close as the Buckeyes got. West Virginia's go ahead touchdown was the result of 10 play, 64-yard drive. The big plays were a 24-yard pass from Thomas to Hamm on third and six from the Mountaineer 40, and a 16-yard Thomas aerial to Linsly's Mike Felton which was good for a first down at the Ohio 19.

Three plays later, Kelly bolted up the middle for 11 yards, making it first and goal from the one. Thomas snuck over two plays later, and the extra point was added by Central's Greg Kloeppner put the Mountaineers on top 7-3, with 1:14 left in the first half.

Ohio had one last chance just before the half, compliments of passes of 10 and 16 yards from Smith to Goodrich and Snedeker, respectively, and a 10 yard keeper by Smith.

The storm-shortened victory gives Ohio an 18-17 lead in the all time series. It was also Ohio's third straight win.

The Pentagon staff should get their hands on the weapons that Ohio featured in the 19th Rudy Mumley OVAC® Charity All-Star Football Classic on Sunday night at Wheeling Island Stadium.

The Ohio stars used the air, the ground and defense to march to a 42-0 victory over West Virginia in the annual football matchup.

In fact, Ohio's margin of victory was the most lopsided in the history of the series. Before that, the biggest victory was Ohio's 47-13 win in 1979.

The Buckeye State now leads the series by a 25-20 count.

"Our kids came to play," Ohio coach Bob Morris said. "I can't say enough about them. Our defense came up and hit them. The players just responded very well."

In the first quarter, both teams were stopped on their first offensive series. On their second series, Ohio gave up a chance when quarterback Kevin Smith fumbled in enemy territory. John Litman recovered for the Mountaineers at the 33-yard line.







## ~A Tribute to George Strager ~

(A column by Nick Bedway that originally appeared in the Wheeling News-Register on August 18, 2003)

With another high school football season set to get underway, I thought this might be a good time to reflect on the career of the late George Strager.

The Ohio Valley's winningest schoolboy football coach, Strager was truly a legend in his own time as he amassed a total of 246 victories during a career that spanned nearly four decades.

Perhaps, I should point out that there's no telling how many more games Strager's teams would have won had the current tiebreaker rules been in effect while he was stalking Ohio Valley sidelines.

During his entire coaching career, if the score was tied at the end of the fourth quarter everybody went home, satisfied or not.

Strager's offensive genius was considered ahead of his era and he certainly could have figured out a way for his teams to win at least half of those stalemated contests in overtime. His overall record shows 246 wins, 115 losses and 16 ties.

I picked Coach Strager as the subject for this column not just because of the success he experienced in coaching. The love and dedication that he gave the couple of thousand kids he coached affected most of their lives in a positive way.

Yes, George was hard to play for and tough as nails on the field. His pre-game and half-time talks were filled with fire, especially when he didn't think his team was performing up to his expectations. But he was hilariously funny at times around his coaches and players.

Today's younger coaches could have learned a lot about football and how to get the maximum out of their players had they had the opportunity to learn from this coaching giant.

This past week I asked a couple of long-time Strager friends and associates - Doug Huff, the former Sports Editor of The Intelligencer, and Wheeling Central Catholic assistant coach Mike Young - to share some of their reflections on Ol' George.

Huff spent nearly three decades covering Strager's teams. Young played for Strager at Central. He was also his long-time assistant coach at St. Clairsville High and he has handled perhaps the toughest task of all when he was asked to succeed the long-time mentor at the Red Devil helm.

"It wasn't as difficult as people said it would be because George Strager prepared me to be a head coach by giving me responsibilities that boosted my confidence. When the time came, I felt like I was ready for it," Young explained. Mike had spent 17 years on Strager's staff at St. Clairsville.

"He was like a second father to me in terms of our friendship and the way our families got along. I don't think a lot of people realized that George was a great family man." He and his wife had four kids and two of them were still in junior high when Lounelle passed away in 1976. "George did a wonderful job of raising them almost on his own. All of his children have been successful in their lives as well." Young added. But it definitely was Strager's football brain that put him ahead of the other coaches during his long career. He was a master-mind of the offensive game. Young talked about how Strager could look at a team's defense and quickly find a way to attack it and pick it apart. "We were very fortunate during that time to have had many quality athletes at St. Clairsville," Young also said.

The most famous of the Strager proteges, of course, was Tim Spencer, who went on from the Saints to star at Ohio State, play in the National Football League and return to Buckeye Local as an assistant coach. The unfortunate part of Strager's Red Devil days were they came at a time when the Ohio High School Athletic Association was taking just one or two teams from each region for post-season play. "We had some great teams that did not get a chance to play in the post-season," Young said. Three of Strager's undefeated teams Red Devil squads never made it into the post-season.

St. Clairsville did make it twice under Strager, qualifying in 1983 and in 1986. The 1986 squad won two playoff contests and were one step from the state final when it lost a controversial decision to Chagrin Falls Kenston at the Rubber Bowl in Akron. It was Huff that pointed out to me that Strager is probably the only person to have coached three different Ohio Valley teams to undefeated seasons. His 1953 Sisterville Tigers went 10-0-1 and won the state championship with a 27-12 victory over Romney.

In 1963, Strager guided the Maroon Knights to a 10-0-1 season, ending with a 40-6 dismantling of highly-regarded Charleston Catholic and its "pony backfield" in the WV Catholic title game. He also had three undefeated teams at St. Clairsville, posting records of 9-0 in 1969, 10-0 in 1978 and 10-0 in 1985.

Certainly, this feat of having unbeaten clubs in four different decades is another unmatched area achievement. "I always considered George a "Coach's Coach" because he was so well respected among his peers," Huff said, "mention his name in a conversation with fellow coaches and they always had something positive to say about his coaching philosophy, techniques, etc." Huff also talked about how Strager's teams were always fun to watch and cover. They never seemed out of a game because of his offense's ability to strike from any place on the field. "Some people are born to do certain jobs. George was born to be a high school football coach. And he was one of the best," Huff added.

Doug certainly told it the way it was where our mutual friend was concerned. George had opportunities to go into the college ranks and coach. He turned down a couple of big-time offers as I recall. But his fun and his life was in taking a group of young high school kids and molding them into something special.

Bob Kettlewell, the late successful coach in Wintersville (now Indian Creek High School) regarded Strager as being a good a quarterback coach as he ever saw. The triggerman at QB was definitely the key in Strager's multiple offense, more as a ball handler than a thrower. If George has someone who could run his offense with a sleight-of-hand, good things were going to happen for his team that season.

My relationship with George was more than just between a journalist and a coach. When he came to coach at Wheeling Central Catholic in 1961, I was a young writer and both Strager and the late Bob Roe, then the head coach of Wheeling High School, took me under their wing.

Strager was never known for paying much attention to the defensive side of football, although I'm sure that was exaggerated.

I do recall one time, however, when I went out to do a "Strager & Son" piece for the newspaper the week of the Red Devil's opener against Wheeling High School. On George's staff and his defensive coordinator at the time was his son, "Duke." After talking with the head coach, I wandered over to talk to Duke for a few minutes. "How's the defense going," I asked. "I don't know. Dad's spending so much time with the offense, he hasn't let me work with the defense yet," Duke said as I could see the twinkle in his eye.

Either the son was kidding me, or the defense made some remarkable strides in the three days prior to the game as St. Clairsville came out and blitzed the Wildcats 44-14. Strager's impact on the Ohio Valley coaching scene and even some of today's athletes will continue to be noticeable.



Ol' George may be gone from our midst physically, but he will always remain in the thoughts of the coaches, players and writers whose path he crossed during his storied career.





# MEMORIAL CAMP SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS



Dr. Robert Jones, the team doctor for the West Virginia All-Stars in tonight's Rudy Mumley OVAC® All-Star Charity Football Classic, has a simple self-diagnosis to explain his affection for football. The game, he says, is in his blood. And no antiblotic, no pill or shot can get the sport out of his system. "I got involved because of the game of football," he said. (The appeal) is the game itself...it doesn't matter what aspect it is."

Football found its way into the heart of Dr. Jones in the mid-1960's, when he played for the legendary Wheeling Ironmen. Jones played defensive end, linebacker, offensive line - - "Back then, you had to do it all," he said - - and remembers cross-state clashes with Charleston fondly. Even if memories of the game's details remain cloudy, the atmosphere of Wheeling Island Stadium will always remain indelibly etched in Jones' heart and mind. "I remember my first game...we played Charleston," Jones said. It was the only time I've ever seen the island (stadium) completely packed. We had a little bit of rivalry with them." And he still gets the same chills up his spine every time he visits the stadium, which

was remodeled in the 1980's. "It's still the same place," Jones said. "Even if it is a different stadium. It's still a great place to play football."

Of course, the main purpose of football and other sports is to teach the participants qualities they can take with themselves throughout their lives. Football was no different for Jones. Currently a general surgeon who also performs thoracic and vascular work at Wheeling Hospital, Jones says he learned self-discipline - - a necessary component in any surgeon's mental makeup - - by playing football all his life. "The discipline of football pushed me to be a surgeon and in the medical field," Jones said.

Jones has been involved with the OVAC® Football Classic for the past 15 years, getting his first taste of the game when Ohio team doctor - - Luis Vazquez - - invited him to the 1984 game.

Many of the games that he's seen and worked were good. But one - - the 1987 classic - - stands out as great; because of the luminous stars who played in the contest. Ohio - featuring St. Clairsville's duo of Shawn Vincent and John Spencer - defeated the Alex Shookled West Virginia team 13-11 in the all-star game, played at Steubenville because of the renovations to Wheeling Island Stadium. "That was the best year, as far as players go," Jones said.





Herb is married to the former Ashlea Bland. He's got a daughter Kailey (3).


## **TRAINER - RANDY ELLIOTT**




"Basically, my job is to make sure all the i's are dotted and the t's are crossed," Fullerton said, laughing.

Fullerton should know. After all, he's been seriously involved with the OVAC® for the past 15 years, and he's been working in sports medicine for the past 30 years.


His athletic training career started in the late 1960's when, as a student-athlete at Martins Ferry High School, Art Simpson befriended Fullerton and gave him his first chance at being a trainer. And Fullerton's stepfather, Bill Van Horne, the sports editor of the Wheeling News-Register until his death in 1995, took him around to sporting events, which fueled his desire to remain involved in sports.

Fullerton holds a Bachelors Degree in physical education from The Ohio State University and a Masters Degree in exercise physiology from the University of Arizona. Along the way, he's worked with several notable organizations, including the following:

- While at Ohio State, he was an athletic trainer for the Buckeye football team, a position that allowed him to work with Woody Hayes and attend the Rose Bowl.



Fullerton lives in Wheeling with his two children - Jaclyn, at WVU - Nursing, and Jake, at Wheeling Central.





West Virginia head coach Tom Bruney knew what he was looking for when he picked his roster for the July 25th Rudy Mumley OVAC\* All-Star Football Charity Classic. He also knew what he was looking for when he was picking a coaching staff for the Mountaineers to take on Ohio.

"We had quite the experience at Brooke last year," Bruney said. "We're coming down to the all-star game with some coaches who've been with us, some new coaches who we've recently hired and some holdovers from last year."

Joining Bruney on the West Virginia sideline at Wheeling Island Stadium and during camp at West Liberty University are Paul Julio, Frank Sisinni, Troy Fetty, Scott Joseph and Stuart Goldstein.

Here's a capsule look at the West Virginia coaching staff:

TOM BRUNEY — The Bruins head coach played for the Buckeye State in 1981, but now he's going to try to do all he can to knock off the Ohio squad. Bruney's been a football coach for 25 years, but it took only one year to recreate the magic of Brooke football after he guided the Bruins to a 10-0 regular season and an eventual spot in the West Virginia Class AAA title game where they fell to South Charleston. Prior to arriving at Brooke, Bruney has made several coaching stops. He was an assistant at his alma mater, Martins Ferry, for five years. He's also coached at the University of Toledo, West Liberty State College and Maryvale High School in Arizona. He later became the head coach of Maryvale, which is located near Phoenix, for 12 years. He was the head coach for one season at both Astabula Lakeside and Maple Heights in Ohio. He was named WTOV-9 Coach of the Year and Ohio Valley Coach of the Year this past season and was a finalist for OVAC® Coach of the Year. Other accolades on Bruney's resume include 6-time regional coach of the year in Arizona and five-time regional champions in Arizona. Bruney — who earned his bachelor's degree from Ohio University and M.A. from Ohio Wesleyan — owns a career record of 114-51. Tom and his wife Shannon have four children, Samantha (17), Zack (16), Niko (11) and Rocco (7).

PAUL JULIO — This veteran Bruins' coach has been on the staff at his alma mater for 16 years. Julio was a member of the 1985 state champion Bruins' squad and also their 1986 team, which finished as state runnerup. Paul then played four years of football at West Liberty State College where he eventually earned his degree. Along with football, Julio also serves on the Bruins' track coaching staff. Paul has three children, Carli Julio (9), Jackson Julio (4) and Alex Martin (19).

FRANK SISINNI – This former Bruin played on the Brooke squad which won the 1987 Class AAA state championship and finished ranked in the top 25 of the USA Today poll. He began coaching shortly after finishing his degree at Fairmont

State University. He's been a coach for 13 years, including the last four back at his alma mater. He's also coached at Steubenville High. Sisinni — who is currently the Brooke baseball coach — has also coached basketball during his career.

TROY FETTY – This former Buckeye Local Panther is about to embark on his first football season working under Bruney at Brooke. He's spent six years coaching football with a stint as defensive coordinator at Weir and has worked with ironically Ohlo head coach Ron Pobolish at Buckeye Local. Along with his football duties, Fetty also coaches wrestling at Indian Creek and was named 2006 OVAC® Junior High Coach of the Year. Fetty attended Ohio University and currently resides in Tiltonsville.

SCOTT JOSEPH – This former Purple Rider worked under Bruney this past season and will return to embark on another year. Joseph graduated from Martins Ferry in 1990 and then went on to play four years at Ashland where he earned his degree. Along with football, Joseph has also coached track and field.

STUART GOLDSTEIN – This long-time Bruney friend is about to embark on his first season as a Bruins' assistant. Goldstein moved to the area from Arizona where he and Bruney became close. He was a head coach for nine years in Arizona. He worked for three years each at Phoenix North, Phoenix Carl Hayden and Scottsdale Saguaro. All told, Goldstein's got 23 years in the sport of football. He's also coached track and wrestling. Goldstein owns a bachelor's degree from Arizona State University.

MIKE WAGNER — has been at Brooke High School for twelve years and has helped coach football for the past two years. He is also involved with the Bruin Softball program. Mike is a graduate of Wheeling Central Catholic High School and attended Marietta College and West Liberty State College. He holds a Masters Degree from West Virginia University. Mike currently lives in Wheeling with his wife, Jennifer.




Ohio head coach Ron Pobolish announced his coaching staff, which will be implementing the game plan for the Buckeyes.

Many of his former Panthers' assistants are on board. He also hired former Bellaire High head coach Gregg Bonar and one of his chief assistants, Mark Spigarelli, as well.

"I admire what Gregg and Mark can do and what they've done," Pobolish said. "Gregg runs a good offense and likes to throw the bail.

The complete Ohio coaching staff consists of: Phil Pest, George Laase, Blair Closser, Nate Skrzypek, Andy Weiss, Bonar and Spigarelli.

Here's a capsule look at the coaches:

RON POBOLISH – This veteran mentor was a standout player at West Virginia University and then returned to his roots in the Ohio Valley to become one of the area's top coaches. Pobolish coached football for 32 years before calling it quits after last season in which he led the Panthers to the Division III playoffs, a first-round home playoff game and also the OVAC® Class 4-A title. All told, Pobolish has made coaching stops at Cadiz, John Marshall, Buckeye South, Buckeye Southwest, Buckeye Local and Harrison Central. He's compiled a 144-102-1 record and owns a state runnerup finish on his resume in 1994. Pobolish has been inducted to the Ohio Valley Football Coaches Hall of Fame. Ron and his wife Laura reside in Moundsville. The couple has three children, Ashley, Lucey and Chet.

PHIL PEST - This former Wheeling Central standout has been a mainstay on Pobolish's coaching staffs at Buckeye Local.

Pest, who owns a bachelor's from Bethany and a M.A. from West Virginia, has been an assistant football coach at Buckeye Local for 18 years. All told, he's got 30 years of experience on his resume. Along with football, Pest has also coached track and field for the Panthers. Along with Buckeye, Pest's made stops at St. Clairsville, Wheeling Park and Wheeling Central. Phil and his wife Jan have three children, Megan, Trevor and Shannon.

GREGG BONAR – This long-time football coach will direct the Buckeyes' offense during the OVAC® All-Star Game. Bonar – a Shadyside High and West Liberty State College graduate – spent 25 years as a football coach at Bellaire. He was the head coach for two seasons. He also coached girls' basketball for 17 years. NATE SKRZYPEK – This current Panthers' assistant coach was a football and wrestling standout at Wheeling Central during his prep days. Skrzypek, who graduated from Bethany College, has been coaching football for seven seasons, including four at Buckeye Local. He also serves as the Panthers' head wrestling coach. Nate and his wife Melanie reside in Wheeling.

BLAIR CLOSSER — This veteran worked for 35 years at Buckeye Local before his retirement in January of 2009. During his career, he spent 27 years as a football coach. 
Department. He enjoys golf and shooting.
