Ron once said his job was to give music and teach the value of doing things right. His hope---he said---was to leave behind a spirit of music.


When the All Star Marching Band---once again takes the field on Sunday--in Ron's memory--we say job well done---in his words--keep swinging.



There are many words to describe the life of Rudolph Mumley, but perhaps the most appropriate would be service.

For most of his 80-plus years, Mumley, known as "Rudy" to his legion of friends, worked on behalf of many causes. None were more important to him than the youth of the Ohio Valley.

It is befitting that the game which fans are witnessing this evening is named in his honor. If it hadn't been for Rudy's willingness to step forward, the Ohio-West Virginia All-Star Game would not have existed the last 28 years, and it now appears to be a fixture that will carry it well into the next millennium.

The game's history goes back to the early 1940s and, for many years after that, it was sponsored by booster club associations from Eastern Ohio and the West Virginia northern panhandle.

However, the game could not receive NCAA sanction and consequently was held during the spring to allow players who had received scholarships to NCAA schools an opportunity to participate.

When it became apparent that the booster club organizations could no longer sponsor the game, it ceased to exist. An idea was presented to Sam A. Mumley Sr. that the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference® could assume sponsorship of the game and apply for NCAA sanction.

One of the requirements toward receiving NCAA sanction was that only 60 percent of game proceeds could be spent to cover expenses and the other 40 percent had to be used for charitable purposes.

Once the game received sanction, the OVAC[®] had another problem. It was experiencing financial problems and did not have the resources to provide "seed" money that would be needed to purchase uniforms, pay for training camp and other start-up expenses such as insurance.

Sam Mumley, who was the executive secretary of the OVAC[®], appealed to his uncle, Rudy, to provide the financial help. The story has become legend on how Rudy, a bachelor who lived with his beloved sister, Lillian, in the Warwood area of Wheeling, mortgaged their home to receive a loan. The rest, as the saying goes, is history.

There was more adversity to overcome for this inaugural OVAC[®] venture. The Ohio Valley experienced damaging floods during June of 1972. Wheeling Stadium sustained considerable damage and the facility would not be available for the early August game.

Sam Mumley called his longtime friend, the late Edmund Joseph, who was then athletic director at Martins Ferry High School and asked if the OVAC[®] could use Ferry Stadium. Once Joseph took the request to school officials and received permission, the game was finally on.

However, on the day of the game, the area was hit hard by a rainstorm. More adversity. By this time, you could not fault Rudy Mumley, who agreed to serve as game director, if he was feeling a bit jinxed. Several hours before kickoff was scheduled, the rain stopped and the sun came out. It turned into a beautiful evening, and the game went off like clockwork before a capacity audience.

The OVAC[®] was in business as far as renewal of the Ohio-West Virginia midsummer classic was concerned.

However, that's not the end of the story. Over the next two decades-plus that Rudy Mumley served as game director, he made numerous improvements to the game. He turned it from just an all-star game into an extravaganza.

He took the all-star gridders to camp at West Liberty State College, his alma mater, and a place where he had long-standing ties. Each year, Mumley added activities for the players to help them pass the time and provide some relief from the rigors of training camp.

He enlisted the help of the Osiris Shrine and this group gave the game a more meaningful

purpose as it would eventually gain the lion's share of the charity proceeds.

Through his good friend, the late George Strager, another mid-week event, "An Evening With the Stars," was initiated and handled with impeccable care by two other longtime friends, Mike Young and Pete Cuffaro.

From the time the OVAC[®] assumed sponsorship of the game, Mumley brought back the Stone & Thomas "Queen of Queens" Pageant which had been a part of the All-Star Game series when it was sponsored by the booster club associations. Stone & Thomas continued to sponsor the event over the next two decades-plus. In recent years, the queen's pageant has continued under the sponsorship of Kaufman's of Wheeling and WTOV-9.

In the meantime, Mumley enlisted the help of Glenn Didriksen and his family, which owned and operated several McDonald's Family Restaurants in the area, to form the McDonald's All-Star Band. This has become an increasingly popular feature of the game.

Mumley's innovative mind produced a game that would help kick off the Ohio Valley football season, a classic that would involve some 60 to 70 football players annually and several hundred bandsmen. Add to that some 25 to 30 queen candidates and a myriad of volunteers who helped make the 10-day to two week experience a memorable part of their lives.

For a number of years, Rudy and his nephew Sam, along with other OVAC[®] officials and the dedicated men from the Osiris Shrine, would hold a pep rally at Russek Field on the campus of West Liberty State College. Several thousands of people attended these events and, of course, it was Rudy who usually stole the show.

From his days at old Wheeling High to those at West Liberty State College, Rudy was always there to help. Following a stint in the military service, he spent the next three decades or so as an educator, primarily in Eastern Ohio. He was principal at Buckeye South High when he retired.

His service to the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference[®] was ongoing for more than three decades, and he served as president on two different occasions.

Through his efforts and those of his many friends who joined with him to work on various facets of the all-star classic, more than \$600,000 has been provided to Ohio Valley charitable groups.

Several years before his death, which came in early February of 1999, Mumley relinquished directorship of the game to his longtime associate and close friend, Ron Mauck.

Nonetheless, Rudy still remained a familiar figure on the sidelines. His walk had slowed considerably although he had bounced back from a series of illnesses. But, the enthusiasm was as great as ever. He had seen the game reach new heights last year when it was televised live by WTOV-9 and the game still drew a near-capacity crowd.

It was a fitting tribute that OVAC[®] officials several years ago renamed the contest as the Rudy Mumley OVAC[®] Charity All-Star Game.

Rudy was to become one of the most recognizable sports figures the Ohio Valley had ever produced. He was honored as the Dapper Dan's "Man of the Year" in 1992, and earlier was inducted into the Athletic Hall of Fame at his beloved West Liberty State College, following in the footsteps of his late brother, Eli, Rudy was the first non-athlete or non-coach to earn this honor, and in recent years, he became a prominent benefactor to the school.

Educator, humanitarian and philanthropist. That's the legacy of a guy who wanted to be known simply as Rudy. And as long as this game can survive, fans of the Ohio Valley for the coming generations will be able to look skyward and say, "Thanks, Rudy!"





For more than three decades, Samuel A. Mumley served the youth of this area as executive secretary of the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference[®].

Last February, "Sammy" was called home by his maker to receive his just reward for a lifetime spent in service to others.

Perhaps the greatest compliment one can pay Sam Mumley following his passing is to say that he made his world a much better place to live because he once walked among us.

Mumley devoted nearly five decades to working for the youth of our Ohio Valley. In addition to his time as executive secretary of the OVAC[®], which is still believed to be the largest high school athletic conference of its kind in the United States, Mumley was an athletic trainer, coach, basketball official, teacher and a school administrator.

If that wasn't enough time to give, Mumley joined Eric Carder, an assistant principal and director of activities at Wheeling Park High School, in serving as co-director for the West Virginia Super Six state high school football championships, which they brought to Wheeling Island Stadium six years ago.

Additionally, the pair helped secure the West Virginia state soccer championships held last year at the brand new athletic facility at Wheeling Jesuit University.

Sam also played a major role in the wonderful mid-summer football spectacle you are attending tonight at Wheeling Island Stadium. Renamed several years ago to honor his uncle, who also passed away earlier this year, the Rudy Mumley Charity All-Star Football Classic was revived in 1972 under the sponsorship of the OVAC[®].

In those days, the NCAA made things difficult for sponsors seeking sanction to hold various allstar contest. The local Ohio-West Virginia All-Star game had been dormant for many years after having been a fixture on the Ohio Valley gridiron scene since the early 1940s. Both Mumley's spent hundreds of hours putting together the formula for a program that the NCAA found acceptable. Today, the game is more vibrant and popular than ever among the area football fans, who nearly pack the Island Stadium each and every July to kick off a new gridiron campaign.

They also helped turn this event into more than just a football game. It has become a mid-summer spectacular complete with an All-Star Band, cheerleaders and the pageantry of a Queen of Queens contest.

It also helped raise hundreds of thousands of dollars for charitable organizations in the Ohio Valley over the past 26 years.

Much of these wonders have been achieved because Mumley refused to take "no" for an answer from anyone and because he dared to dream what many of us have considered to be impossible dreams.

Who would have believed that the state high school football championships could ever be lured out of Charleston to the Northern Panhandle?

Sam did.

And Wheeling will host the state title games for the sixth straight year the first weekend of December.

Through his fund-raising efforts and the help of countless corporate sponsors and Super Six volunteers from up and down the Ohio Valley, the state football finals have been raised to a level that may never be matched in the Mountain State.

When Mumley came back to take over a second time as executive secretary of the OVAC[®], the league was in dire financial straits.

Through Mumley's efforts and the backing of other leaders in the community, an OVAC[®] Foundation Board was formed to serve as a fund-raising arm of the bi-state league. That board is still in existence today.

The sports programs at the various schools were improved immensely. All-star games are now held each year in football, boys' and girls' basketball, baseball, softball and boys' and girls' soccer. The OVAC® sponsors championship tournaments in wrestling, swimming, tennis, golf, volleyball, baseball, softball, boys' and girls' soccer, boys' and girls' cross country, boys' and girls' track, cheerleading, etc.

Girls sports have risen to equal importance because Sam had the foresight and the courage to support each and every program offered by the OVAC[®]. His efforts with girls' sports earned Mumley a seat on the equity panels for both the Ohio High School Athletic Association and the West Virginia Secondary School Athletic Commission.

The scholarship program also has been enhanced by Sam's ability to involve the corporate sector of the various communities within the extensive OVAC[®] map. At last May's OVAC[®] Banquet of Champions held at the Wheeling Civic Center, more than \$15,000 in scholarship money was awarded to deserving OVAC[®] student-athletes.

That money wasn't just found on the street corner; it was obtained largely through tireless efforts of the late executive secretary.

Sam put the OVAC[®]'s "kids" first in all his dreams and work for the conference. "What can we do for the 'kids'? How can we make things better for them?" Those were the first questions he posed whenever the OVAC[®] or Super Six would discuss changes in their programs.

He took great pains to involve everyone in conference business. He was constantly in touch with media members, keeping them updated on matters and seeking their opinions.

When important final decisions had to be made, Sam didn't mind being the one to make them. But he did so after many discussions among his constituents and his own private soul-searching. And, of course, his main concern was making sure that the decisions were in the best interest of the OVAC[®] student-athletes.

From a personal standpoint, if Sam became your friend, he was your friend for life. He was always there with a kind word, a bit of advice if it was asked for, and encouragement when any of his friends were in a difficult situation.

I once wrote in a column that Sam was no saint, but that he was sent to us by angels to perform good works and turn our impossible dreams into reality.

He dearly loved his wife, Nancy, who remained by his side through good times and rough times. No different from the rest of us, Nancy became part of the OVAC[®] family as well, taking care of the conference's financial books, a role she continues to handle today.

They were married just 11 years when Sam passed away. But, as Nancy once said, they crammed 40 years of happiness into that short time.

A long bout with cancer terminated Mumley's life at the too young age of 67. But, as this writer has stated before, you won't make me believe "Sammy" lost that fight with cancer. Nothing defeated Sam Mumley in his lifetime. God, whom Sam believed in with all his heart, simply decided it was time to call him home.

Sam Mumley was one of a kind.

He will remain in our thoughts and prayers forever.





In the beginning... Compiled by Babe Schmitt "1940" The First All ★ Star Game

West Virginia's senior All-Star schoolboys today held a 13 to 17 victory as the aftermath of their first meeting with the eastern Ohio team in the maiden football contest played under the new lighting system at the Island Stadium.

The victory of the mountain state youths, who had trailed from the opening quarter until the last seven minutes of the ball game, 7-0, came as a mild surprise as two well-drilled and highly efficient combinations delighted an early season crowd of some 8,000 fans.

The Ohioans drew first blood in the spectacular contest. A Mallery-Shackleford pass, late in the first period, moved the Buckeyes from midfield to the West Virginia 25, Sadlowski, another Bellaire back, took a pass that planted the ball on the nine, from where Sadlowski scored in two plays.

The remainder of the half was devoid of a distinct threat on the part of either team although the Rowe-Howell coached combine had advanced to the Ohio 25 when the intermission arrived.

The mountaineer sturdy rush line battled the equally effective Ohio forwards on fairly even terms into the final period before Johnny August, a Shadyside youth, who shared the starting role for the Bucks, was hit hard on his own 30 and Joe Corba, a Follansbee back, seized the white leather for the eventual winners.

Charlie Helinski, Union product, became a ball of fire at this stage. He wheeled off tackle to the Ohio 19 and then lugged the leather to the five aided by a too many times out penalty. Helinski picked up a yard and Mike "Punchy" Dimitro punched his way into the payoff zone. Dimitro cracked the line for the extra point and the issue was deadlocked.

Passes Decide Battle

The West Virginia stands settled back after this furious display satisfied with a 7-7 standoff, but the mountaineers were fired with the idea of victory when one of Joe Mallery's passes was intercepted near the 50 shortly after the succeeding kickoff.

Helinski niched successive passes to Phil Saseen and after the second toss to the Central Catholic back had planted the ball on the Ohioans nine. Helinski and Dimitro required three tries before the former had found the pay dirt and the West Virginia youths had a 13-7 lead.

The remaining time allowed for another kickoff and the West Virginians successfully negotiated an onside kick, recovering the ball as the fray ended.

Coaches Bill Kerns of WVU and Don C. Pedden of Ohio University were the honorary mentors and in addition to sitting on the benches of the contesting squads, both spoke over the P.A. system at halftime. Kerns was accompanied here by Frank Kutz, one of his line mentors, and Ray Carnelly, his plebe mentor. The trio departed today for Charleston and tonight's North-South Game, although Kerns had an opportunity to talk to some local prospects.

Bill Stobbs, the Wheeling native who tutors the Wittenberg athletic teams, was one of the spectators in the stands. Another was George Roark, coach of W & J's Presidents, and probably there were others.

Carl Hamill, Weirton's cagey tutor was in the dressing room to minister to a pair of his former Red Riders. Tony Brown aggravated an old should injury while Luke Tomasovich received a cracked rib.

The West Virginians showed big Sedor due respect while the prospective Ohio State youth was in the game. His Shadyside backfield mate, August despite his costly fumble, was one of the big guns in the Bucks' effort and the Niemiec-Hartwig combinations thrusts left the West Virginia fans worried.

Lou Caffaro; recovering from a nasal operation, held the sticks for the West Virginians but felt the call of battle in his impassive role. Paul Bricker, Weirton end who handled the kicking for Howell and Rowe, and did an effective job although one of his boots slipped off the side of his foot and out of bounds.

"1951" All-Star Game - 60 Years Ago

Led by a trio of slippery-hipped backs, Ohio's All-Stars put on a last half uprising to upset the West Virginians for the second year in a row, 13-6, in the ninth annual battle of the stars at the Island Stadium before a throng of 9,000.

Bob Shertzer's Buckeye line kept all-West Virginia Paul 'Whitey' Mikanik bottled up during the greater part of the battle but the Follansbee fullback unfurled a pass to Moundsville's Bob Leadbeter in the endzone to put the Mountaineers out front 6-0 with a little less than four minutes remaining in the first period. But in the second half, Perry Jeter of Steubenville, 145 pound Johnny Holmes of Tiltonsville and Bellaire's John Brinker, began picking holes opened in the West Virginia forward and romping through for big gains.

An 80-yard drive, climaxed by Holmes dash around the right end from the two, was staged by Ohio in the later part of the third period. Bill Toth of Bellaire St. Johns hit Chuck Eliopulos of Adena to advance the ball from the 22 to the 2 to set up Holmes' carry. Yorkville's Ray Pontia split the uprights, putting Ohio ahead 7-6.

West Virginia stalled on two drives in the fourth quarter, advancing the Buckeye 33 and 44. Deep in it's own territory, a desperation pass play on fourth down proved unsuccessful and Ohio took over with less than a minute remaining.

With six seconds remaining, Perry Jeter scored the final TD but the kick was no good and the game ended 13-6.

West Virginia led in rushing 187 to 168, but completed only one of 11 pass attempts. Ohio added 49 yards through the air, completing 5 of 8.

"1961" All-Star Game - 50 Years Ago

Pre-game fears of Ohio All-Star coach Don Ault were realized Saturday night at the Island Stadium but the feared Bob Kelley, Weirton's speedboy, had to share game honors, as 10,000 looked on, with a little known quarterback from Cameron High.

Kelley scored second and fourth period touchdowns that brought West Virginia its eighth in the long 19-game rivalry, 13-0, but the punting of Nelson Whipkey, the Cameron QB, was a vital factor in the second win for the Mountaineers in three years. They made coach Charley Helinski a happy, three time winner.

Whipkey kicked five times for an average of 44.2 yards, his longest boot traveling 68 yards, with the roll, into the Ohio end zone. From the point of the kick, it was an 80 yarder. He also drove 54and 48-yard punts, completed three of six passes for 53 yards and inserted two into the scoring drives.

Statistically, in all but punting and passing, the Buckeyes emerged with an edge but kelley's TD slashes of 28 and 49 yards broke up the otherwise scoreless draw. Kelley averaged just short 8 yards for 15 carries as the 175-pounder rushed for 118 of West Virginia's 128 yards.

Ohio's field general, Paul Kenney of Steubenville Catholic, who engineered Ohio's sharp bid for a touchdown during the closing minutes, got the Buckeyes to the Mountaineer 10 by eating up 41 yards in two sweeps.

Kelley's fumble of an Ohio punt to start the fourth period and Ohio's recovery at the W. Va 32 caused some concern as the score was but 6-0. A few plays later, Weirton's Harry Burns recovered an Ohio fumble which led to a Whipkey 54 yard punt. After stopping Ohio, Whipkey pass to Wheeling's Ed Raper went for 30 yards to the Ohio 49. Kelley, on a trap play, squirted into the secondary and put the final tally on the board.

Ohio had 224 yards rushing and 17 passing on a 3 for 10 effort. W.Va. rushed 128 yards on 17 carries and added 53 yards on a 3 for 6 passing effort.

"1981" All-Star Game - 30 Years Ago

Ohio's Tom Bruney put the finishing touches on what perhaps was the most dramatic football contest in the long history of the Ohio-West Virginia All-Star football series Saturday night.

The 5-9 slotback and placekicker from Martins Ferry High School, drilled a 33-yard field goal down the middle with only four seconds remaining to give the Buckeyes a thrill packed 17-14 triumph before a crowd in excess of 8,000 at Wheeling Stadium on a sultry August evening.

The winning boot came just a few plays after Bruney had watched two of his injured Buckeye comrades taken from the field by ambulance to the hospital.

Bellaire product Terry Duffy, a night-long standout on defense, sustained a severe shoulder injury midway through the last chapter.

More serious was injury sustained by Woodsfield's rushing ace Darryl Shipp, who lead the OVAC last season with more than 1,800 yards from scrimmage.

Shipp was knocked out cold after connecting on a 28-yard halfback pass to Shenandoah's Doug Mitchell, giving the Buckeyes a first down at the West Virginia 17 with only 19 seconds to go. Play was held up for more than ten minutes while Shipp was attended to along the sideline in front of the Buckeye bench.

The over-anxious Ohioans were penalized for encroachment on the first play as action resumed. Steubenville Catholic's Anthony Pierro picked up six yards to the sixteen, moving the ball into the middle and giving Bruney a better target for his heroics, which gave Ohio it's fourth straight victory in the interstate series.

The Buckeyes, who presented Coach Jay Circosta of Woodsfield his first all-star coaching victory after two defeats.

Both teams scored in the second quarter, Ohio getting on the board first when QB Dan Graham passed 15-yards to River's Don Wright. A swing pass from QB Rich Irvin set-up a half-back pass from Brooke's Mike Copenhaver to John Marshall's Mike Castilow covered 65 yards and evened the count.

Both teams tallied in the third quarter. West Virginia moved ahead, 14-7, with a 42-yard drive following a recovery of a Pierro fumble by Wheeling Park defender Chris Frum.

Todd Robson carried in four straight plays to get the tally. Robson, who had 64 yards on 11 carries, slashed between right tackle and guard, cutting to the outside and going 20-yards to paydirt. Erik Soliday of Sistersville was perfect on the PAT with 3:58 on the clock.

Shipp had been stopped cold in the first half, but began moving

On second and ten from the West Virginia 35, Graham unfurled his second TD strike of the night, this one for 35 yards to Springfield product, Brett Elliott. He was hit by Wheeling park's Mark Nardone near the goal line, but fell across for the score. Bruney's placement tied it at 14-all at the 2:08 mark of the third quarter.

It looked as if the teams were going to play for a tie, as neither were moving the ball, before Shipp hit Mitchell with a perfect pass. Shipp never saw the completion, however as he was leveled just after letting the ball go.

Ohio held a slight edge in total yardage, 195 to 190. The Buckeyes had ten first downs and were penalized 5 times for 47 yards. Penalties hurt the Mountaineers as they were set back 90 yards for eight infractions and had eight first downs in the game.



"1991" All-Star Game - 20 Years Ago

In the twentieth annual Rudy Mumley OVAC Football Clasic, Ohio rolled to a 30-6 victory on Sunday evening. Ohio scored twice in a thirty second span early in the first quarter and the stunned Mountaineers never recovered as the Buckeyes rolled to a surprisingly easy victory before well over 7,000 fans at the Island facility.

After the opening kickoff rolled dead in the end zone for a touchback, Mike Young's Buckeyes, who were expected to have trouble moving the ball against a staunch West Virginia defensive front featuring four first-team allstaters, embarked on an impressive, seven-play, 80-yard march for the game's first score.

Bean finished the drive with a toss to St. Clairsville fullback Phil Kirksey who juggled the ball momentarily inside the five but dove into the corner of the endzone before West Virginia could recover.

That stopped the clock with 8:46 remaining in the first quarter and gave Ohio a 6-0 lead. The Buckeyes failed to convert on a two-point conversion try - they were 0-5 on two-pointers Sunday - but it didn't take them long to get the scoreboard operator moving again.

Kirksey's ensuing kickoff was fumbled by West Virginia and recovered by Cambridge's Leonardo Crawford who knifed through the defenders to recover the ball at the Mountaineer 28.

Bean went for the jugular immediately, sending tight end Darren Dombroski out on the same play that had broken for 46 yards in the previous drive. This time Dombroski grabbed the ball inside the five and dove into the end zone for another six-pointer.

There was still 8:16 remaining on the first quarter clock but the Mountaineers had certainly dug themselves a very deep hole.

After picking up a couple of first downs, Toronto's Adam Rex picked off West Virginia Quarterback Kevin Heller's toss intended for fellow Park standout Brian Dickman on the Ohio 13 yard line.

West virginia forced an Ohio punt, but the West Virginia possession ended with a fake punt as Ohio stopped Paden City's Mike Bosley short of the line.

Bean called ten straight running plays in a march that ate nearly six minutes off the clock and culminated iwht Kirksey bulling in from three yards out at the 4:49 mark of the second quarter.

West Virginia, trailing 18-0, came out throwing at the start of the third quarter. Adam Rex picked up his second interception and ohio responded with a 14-play, 64-yard drive that consumed nearly ten minutes. Only 1:52 remained in the third quarter when Kirksey muscled his way to paydirt from a yard out, uping the score to 24-0.

Rex picked off another Heller aerial two plays later, but fumbled it back to West Virginia at the Ohio 37 when he came in at quarterback on the first play of the fourth quarter.

That set up West Virginia's only score, a one yard plung by park's Joe Jerome that capped a seven play march with 9:08 left in the game. St. Clairsville's Jeff Mowery picked off the attempted two point conversion, keeping the score at 24-6.

Bishop Donahue's Tim Klug recovered the onside kick at the Ohio 44 and West Virginia moved down to the 31 before disaster struck in the form of a clipping penalty.

Forced to pass on a third and 30, Shadyside's Curt Wach intercepted the ball and was hauled down at the two yard line by Wheeling Central's Eric McGhee. Cambridge's Crawford went in on the next snap, however, ending the scoring with 6:04 to play.

West irginia turned the ball over six times with five interceptions and a botched kick-off return, while Ohio lost its only two fumbles.

"2001" All-Star Game - 10 Years Ago

Ohio scored in every period in defeating West Virginia, 36-0, in the 2001 Rudy Mumley OVAC[®] Charity Football game at Wheeling Island Stadium. It was Ohio's seventh straight victory.

The Ohio squad was coached by Dave Caldwell of Beallsvile, while Jim Rogers of Cameron was the Mountaineers coach.

The Buckeye offense was led by quarterback Chris Caldwell from Beallsville and quarterback-turned receiver Matt Materkoski of Bellaire.

Caldwell passed for 210 yards, completed 10 of 14 passed (1 touchdown) and rushed for 51 yards, and two TDs, while Materkoski caught five passes for 159 yards, and also was two-for-two passing for 37 years.

While the Ohio offense racked up 401 yards, the defense was shutting down the West Virginia offense which was able to move the sticks only five times. The W.Va. offense was able to gain 101 passing on seven-of-22, however, while the ground game had a minus four yards, as quarterback Tyler Fike ended the night with minus 44 yards

It didn't take long for the Caldwell-Materkoski to hook-up as on the fourth play of the game they connected on a 34 yard gainer which placed the ball on the West Virginia 1 yard line. Two plays later Buckeye Trail's scored from the one with 8:10 remaining in the first quarter. Marik Hughes' placement made it 7-0.

After a three-and-out by the West Virginia offense, the Buckeyes were back on offense, and on the second play of this possession the Caldwell-Materkoski combination resulted in a 3 3 yard pass completion which again placed the ball at the W.Va. 1. On the next play Caldwell went into the end zone on a QB sneak.

The pair also hooked up on a 3 5 yard aerialen route to Ohio's third touchdown. The score came on an 18-yard pass from Caldwell to Brad Wink thus making it 20-0 prior at halftime.

Ohio extended its lead to 23-0 on its second possession of the second. Four plays after Tyler Hill recovered a fumble which would later turn into a 25 yard field goal by Hughes. In the fourth quarter Ohio marched 98 yards in 11 plays for the touchdown, the key play being a 28 -yard pass from Materkoski to Trevor Schaffer. Materkoski would score from the 1.

The final Ohio score came when Caldwell scored on a 2-yard run with 4:12 to play.

West Virginia's only threat to score in the game came in the third period, however, on a fourth-and-one at the Ohio 2 a pass fell incomplete when the ball ricocheted off tight end Joe Wallace's hand as he was leveled by Buckeye defender Justin Jefferis.

Stephanie Jingle of Bellaire St. John was crowded as Queen during halftime festivities.







~A Tribute to George Strager ~

(A column by Nick Bedway that originally appeared in the Wheeling News-Register on August 18, 2003)

With another high school football season set to get underway, I thought this might be a good time to reflect on the career of the late George Strager.

The Ohio Valley's winningest schoolboy football coach, Strager was truly a legend in his own time as he amassed a total of 246 victories during a career that spanned nearly four decades.

Perhaps, I should point out that there's no telling how many more games Strager's teams would have won had the current tiebreaker rules been in effect while he was stalking Ohio Valley sidelines.

During his entire coaching career, if the score was tied at the end of the fourth quarter everybody went home, satisfied or not.

Strager's offensive genius was considered ahead of his era and he certainly could have figured out a way for his teams to win at least half of those stalemated contests in overtime. His overall record shows 246 wins, 115 losses and 16 ties.

I picked Coach Strager as the subject for this column not just because of the success he experienced in coaching. The love and dedication that he gave the couple of thousand kids he coached affected most of their lives in a positive way.

Yes, George was hard to play for and tough as nails on the field. His pre-game and half-time talks were filled with fire, especially when he didn't think his team was performing up to his expectations. But he was hilariously funny at times around his coaches and players.

Today's younger coaches could have learned a lot about football and how to get the maximum out of their players had they had the opportunity to learn from this coaching giant.

This past week I asked a couple of long-time Strager friends and associates - Doug Huff, the former Sports Editor of The Intelligencer, and Wheeling Central Catholic assistant coach Mike Young - to share some of their reflections on Ol' George.

Huff spent nearly three decades covering Strager's teams. Young played for Strager at Central. He was also his long-time assistant coach at St. Clairsville High and he has handled perhaps the toughest task of all when he was asked to succeed the long-time mentor at the Red Devil helm.

"It wasn't as difficult as people said it would be because George Strager prepared me to be a head coach by giving me responsibilities that boosted my confidence. When the time came, I felt like I was ready for it," Young explained. Mike had spent 17 years on Strager's staff at St. Clairsville.

"He was like a second father to me in terms of our friendship and the way our families got along. I don't think a lot of people realized that George was a great family man." He and his wife had four kids and two of them were still in junior high when Lounelle passed away in 1976. "George did a wonderful job of raising them almost on his own. All of his children have been successful in their lives as well." Young added. But it definitely was Strager's football brain that put him ahead of the other coaches during his long career. He was a master-mind of the offensive game. Young talked about how Strager could look at a team's defense and quickly find a way to attack it and pick it apart. "We were very fortunate during that time to have had many quality athletes at St. Clairsville," Young also said.

The most famous of the Strager proteges, of course, was Tim Spencer, who went on from the Saints to star at Ohio State, play in the National Football League and return to Buckeye Local as an assistant coach. The unfortunate part of Strager's Red Devil days were they came at a time when the Ohio High School Athletic Association was taking just one or two teams from each region for post-season play. "We had some great teams that did not get a chance to play in the post-season," Young said. Three of Strager's undefeated teams Red Devil squads never made it into the post-season.

St. Clairsville did make it twice under Strager, qualifying in 1983 and in 1986. The 1986 squad won two playoff contests and were one step from the state final when it lost a controversial decision to Chagrin Falls Kenston at the Rubber Bowl in Akron. It was Huff that pointed out to me that Strager is probably the only person to have coached three different Ohio Valley teams to undefeated seasons. His 1953 Sisterville Tigers went 10-0-1 and won the state championship with a 27-12 victory over Romney.

In 1963, Strager guided the Maroon Knights to a 10-0-1 season, ending with a 40-6 dismantling of highly-regarded Charleston Catholic and its "pony backfield" in the WV Catholic title game. He also had three undefeated teams at St. Clairsville, posting records of 9-0 in 1969, 10-0 in 1978 and 10-0 in 1985.

Certainly, this feat of having unbeaten clubs in four different decades is another unmatched area achievement. "I always considered George a "Coach's Coach" because he was so well respected among his peers," Huff said, "mention his name in a conversation with fellow coaches and they always had something positive to say about his coaching philosophy, techniques, etc." Huff also talked about how Strager's teams were always fun to watch and cover. They never seemed out of a game because of his offense's ability to strike from any place on the field. "Some people are born to do certain jobs. George was born to be a high school football coach. And he was one of the best," Huff added.

Doug certainly told it the way it was where our mutual friend was concerned. George had opportunities to go into the college ranks and coach. He turned down a couple of big-time offers as I recall. But his fun and his life was in taking a group of young high school kids and mold-ing them into something special.

Bob Kettlewell, the late successful coach in Wintersville (now Indian Creek High School) regarded Strager as being a good a quarterback coach as he ever saw. The triggerman at QB was definitely the key in Strager's multiple offense, more as a ball handler than a thrower. If George has someone who could run his offense with a sleight-of-hand, good things were going to happen for his team that season.

My relationship with George was more than just between a journalist and a coach. When he came to coach at Wheeling Central Catholic in 1961, I was a young writer and both Strager and the late Bob Roe, then the head coach of Wheeling High School, took me under their wing. Strager was never known for paying much attention to the defensive side of football, although I'm sure that was exaggerated.

I do recall one time, however, when I went out to do a "Strager & Son" piece for the newspaper the week of the Red Devil's opener against Wheeling High School. On George's staff and his defensive coordinator at the time was his son, "Duke." After talking with the head coach, I wandered over to talk to Duke for a few minutes. "How's the defense going," I asked. "I don't know. Dad's spending so much time with the offense, he hasn't let me work with the defense yet," Duke said as I could see the twinkle in his eye.


Either the son was kidding me, or the defense made some remarkable strides in the three days prior to the game as St. Clairsville came out and blitzed the Wildcats 44-14. Strager's impact on the Ohio Valley coaching scene and even some of today's athletes will continue to be noticeable.

Mike Young pointed out that he and Kelly Rine continue to be directors for the George Strager Football camp every summer. Players competing in the Rudy Mumley OVAC All-Star Football Game are feted four nights before the contest each year at George Strager Evening with the Stars Dinner.

Ol' George may be gone from our midst physically, but he will always remain in the thoughts of the coaches, players and writers whose path he crossed during his storied career.





Dr. Robert Jones, the team doctor for the West Virginia All-Stars in tonight's Rudy Mumley OVAC® All-Star Charity Football Classic, has a simple self-diagnosis to explain his affection for football. The game, he says, is in his blood. And no antibiotic, no pill or shot can get the sport out of his system. "I got involved because of the game of football," he said. (The appeal) is the game itself...it doesn't matter what aspect it is."

Football found its way into the heart of Dr. Jones in the mid-1960's, when he played for the legendary Wheeling Ironmen. Jones played defensive end, linebacker, offensive line - - "Back then, you had to do it all," he said - - and remembers cross-state clashes with Charleston fondly. Even if memories of the game's details remain cloudy, the atmosphere of Wheeling Island Stadium will always remain indelibly etched in Jones' heart and mind. "I remember my first game...we played Charleston," Jones said. It was the only time I've ever seen the island (stadium) completely packed. We had a little bit of rivalry with them." And he still gets the same chills up his spine every time he visits the stadium, which

was remodeled in the 1980's. "It's still the same place," Jones said. "Even if it is a different stadium. It's still a great place to play football."

Of course, the main purpose of football and other sports is to teach the participants qualities they can take with themselves throughout their lives. Football was no different for Jones. Currently a general surgeon who also performs thoracic and vascular work at Wheeling Hospital, Jones says he learned self-discipline - a necessary component in any surgeon's mental makeup - by playing football all his life. "The discipline of football pushed me to be a surgeon and in the medical field," Jones said.

Jones has been involved with the OVAC[®] Football Classic for the past 15 years, getting his first taste of the game when Ohio team doctor - - Luis Vazquez - - invited him to the 1984 game.

Many of the games that he's seen and worked were good. But one - - the 1987 classic - - stands out as great; because of the luminous stars who played in the contest. Ohio - featuring St. Clairsville's duo of Shawn Vincent and John Spencer - defeated the Alex Shookled West Virginia team 13-11 in the all-star game, played at Steubenville because of the renovations to Wheeling Island Stadium. "That was the best year, as far as players go," Jones said.


Jones earned his bachelor's degree from the University of Nebraska and graduated from the West Virginia University School of Medicine. Jones lives in Wheeling with his wife, Rita and has three children - Patricia and Pamela, both 31, and Robert 7.

After high school, he attended West Virginia University and graduated from the WVU School of Medicine of Neurology. He has a general adult neurology practice at Wheeling Hospital at Medical Park. Dr. Sonnefeld lives in Wheeling with his wife, Maryanne. He enjoys golfing and likes to cook.



Herb is married to the former Ashlea Bland. He's got a daughter Kailey (3).


TRAINER - RANDY ELLIOTT

"Basically, my job is to make sure all the i's are dotted and the t's are crossed," Fullerton said, laughing.

Among Fullerton's i's and t's are:

• Making sure enough trainers, doctors and emergency technicians are present, in case of injury.

• Ensuring that the teams have plenty of supplies, from medical tape to ice packs.

• Telling coaches if players injured during the game are healthy enough to return to action.

because of weather conditions. Last year, for example, the game was delayed 55 minutes because of oppressive humidity.

From a medical standpoint, the key to keeping a game running smoothly is communication, Fullerton said. "Basically, we try to work with each other and communicate with the coaches," Fullerton said. "There's a lot of communication between everyone involved."

Fullerton should know. After all, he's been seriously involved with the OVAC[®] for the past 15 years, and he's been working in sports medicine for the past 30 years.

His athletic training career started in the late 1960's when, as a student-athlete at Martins Ferry High School, Art Simpson befriended Fullerton and gave him his first chance at being a trainer. And Fullerton's stepfather, Bill Van Horne, the sports editor of the Wheeling News-Register until his death in 1995, took him around to sporting events, which fueled his desire to remain involved in sports.

Fullerton holds a Bachelors Degree in physical education from The Ohio State University and a Masters Degree in exercise physiology from the University of Arizona. Along the way, he's worked with several notable organizations, including the following:

• While at Ohio State, he was an athletic trainer for the Buckeye football team, a position that allowed him to work with Woody Hayes and attend the Rose Bowl.

• Fullerton worked the summers of 1972 and 1973 in Bradenton, Florida with the Pittsburgh Pirates organization.


• While a graduate student at Arizona in 1977-1979, he was an athletic trainer with the Association of Tennis Professionals, and worked with such tennis luminaries as Jimmy Connors and Bjorn Borg.

But, Fullerton said, "There's nothing quite as special as the OVAC[®]." That's why he returned to the Ohio Valley in 1985. Currently he works as a registered nurse in the emergency room at OVMC. "People like (Van Horne, Simpson and the late Sam Mumley) were very instrumental and influential in high school sports," Fullerton said. 

Throw in the fact that his entire coaching staff at Martins Ferry had a desire to give it another goaround.


"We're looking forward to it," Bruney said.


CHARLES TASKALINES
