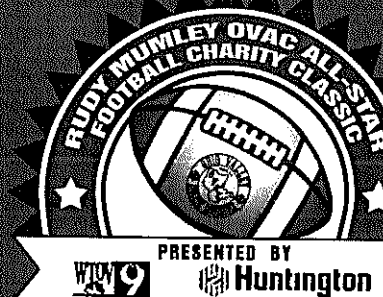

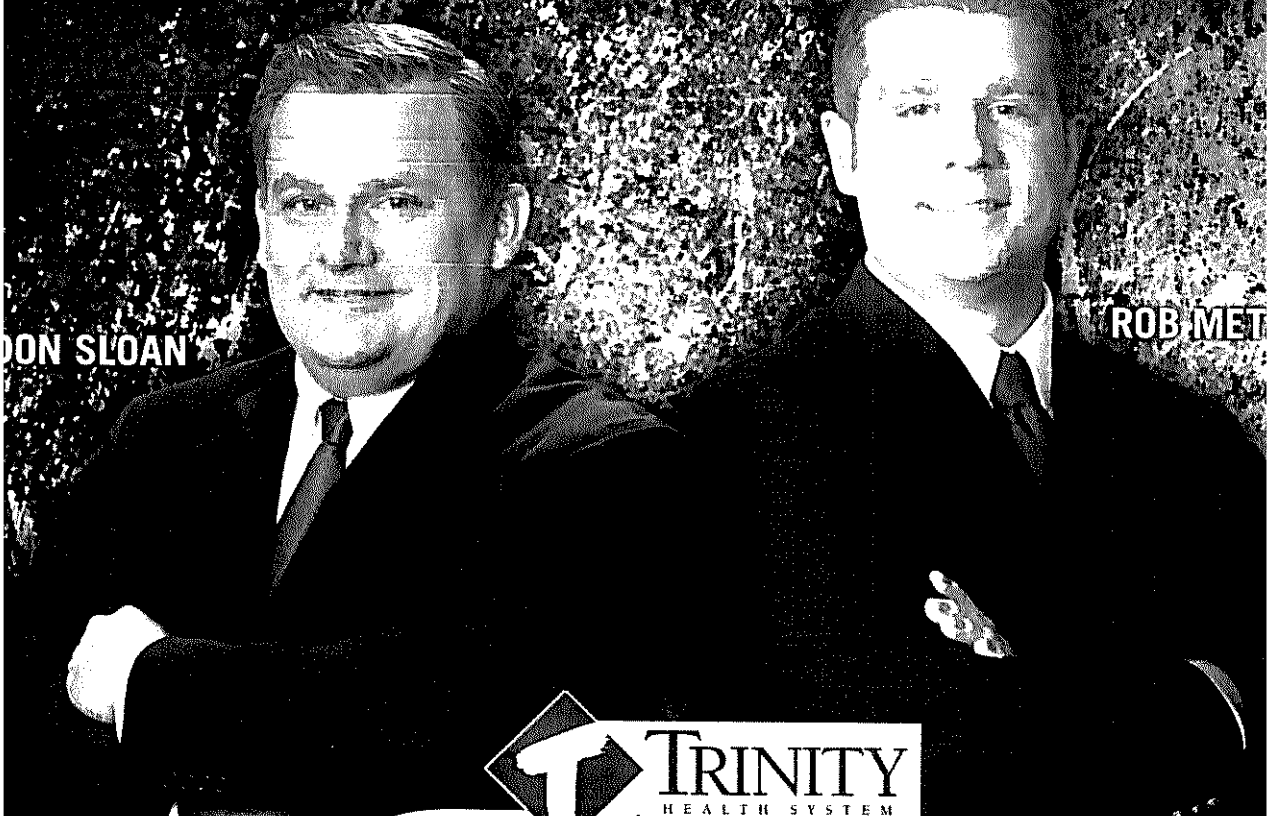

Mumley, was executive secretary of the OVAC® and together, they worked to spread the word of will concerning the large athletic conference during its major growth period. She was OVAC® treasurer for 20 years, and this work was not just the responsibility of keeping books in a meticulous manner. Attendance at day and night athletic events sometimes was necessary, and without question, Nancy was there, sometimes selling OVAC® tickets. She also was a conscientious worker in fund-raising efforts for the OVAC® and its Booster Club. It was not always easy, but she enjoyed it, and she retired because of a greater love – that, for her family. Her daughter became ill while Nancy was serving as treasurer, but that didn't stop her from being a major caregiver for her as well as caring for her grandson while continuing her duties as OVAC® treasurer. However, when her daughter's condition worsened, Nancy didn't hesitate – she retired as treasurer so she could devote her time and efforts to her grandson, who moved into her home. He continues to live with her to this day. In addition to the OVAC®, the St. Clairsville High School graduate had served as treasurer of the Rudy Mumley Football Classic and the All-Star Band. She also is a member of the OVAC® Foundation and OVAC® Boosters. A member of St. Mary's Catholic Church in St. Clairsville, Nancy did not confine her efforts to the OVAC® and the church. She continues her work with the Cancer Research Associates and has helped that group for nearly two decades. She also was a Super Six committee member and was on a welcoming team of two hostesses to the media during Super Six games. As a former committee member of the Samuel A. Mumley Memorial Classic, she is a former member of the Sunrise Club, St. Clairsville. The lifelong Belmont County resident currently is vice president of the Lily Twig, which is the Ohio Valley Medical Center. Her three children are John David Adams, Nancy Lee (Cliff) Elliott and Heather (Heather) Adams, and she is grandmother to Evan Elliott, T.J. Adams, Taylor R. Adams and Brooke Adams. The difficulties that she has faced have not dimmed Nancy's effervescent personality and optimistic attitude. She is a person that others enjoy being around. She shows compassion and regard for others, not just the major things but also in the little things so other people feel comfortable. There are many words to describe the life of Rudolph Mumley, but perhaps the most appropriate would be service.

For most of his 80-plus years, Mumley, known as "Rudy" to his legion of friends, worked on behalf of many causes. None were more important to him than the youth of the Ohio Valley.

It is befitting that the game which fans are witnessing this evening is named in his honor. If it hadn't been for Rudy's willingness to step forward, the Ohio-West Virginia All-Star Game would not have existed the last 28 years, and it now appears to be a fixture that will carry it well into the next millennium.

The game's history goes back to the early 1940s and, for many years after that, it was sponsored by booster club associations from Eastern Ohio and the West Virginia northern panhandle.

However, the game could not receive NCAA sanction and consequently was held during the spring to allow players who had received scholarships to NCAA schools an opportunity to participate.

When it became apparent that the booster club organizations could no longer sponsor the game, it ceased to exist. An idea was presented to Sam A. Mumley Sr. that the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference® could assume sponsorship of the game and apply for NCAA sanction.

One of the requirements toward receiving NCAA sanction was that only 60 percent of game proceeds could be spent to cover expenses and the other 40 percent had to be used for charitable purposes.

Once the game received sanction, the OVAC® had another problem. It was experiencing financial problems and did not have the resources to provide "seed" money that would be needed to purchase uniforms, pay for training camp and other start-up expenses such as insurance.

Sam Mumley, who was the executive secretary of the OVAC®, appealed to his uncle, Rudy, to provide the financial help. The story has become legend on how Rudy, a bachelor who lived with his beloved sister, Lillian, in the Warwood area of Wheeling, mortgaged their home to receive a loan. That, as the saying goes, is history.

There was more adversity to overcome for this inaugural OVAC® venture. The Ohio Valley experienced damaging floods during June of 1972. Wheeling Stadium sustained considerable damage and the facility would not be available for the early August game.

Sam Mumley called his longtime friend, the late Edmund Joseph, who was then athletic director at Martins Ferry High School and asked if the OVAC® could use Ferry Stadium. Once Joseph took request to school officials and received permission, the game was finally on.

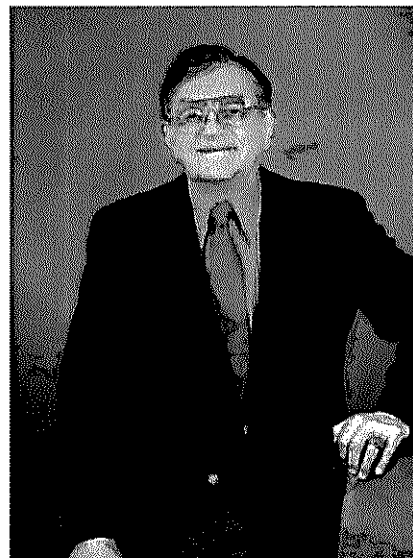
However, on the day of the game, the area was hit hard by a rainstorm. More adversity. By this time, you could not fault Rudy Mumley, who agreed to serve as game director, if he was feeling a bit boxed. Several hours before kickoff was scheduled, the rain stopped and the sun came out. It turned into a beautiful evening, and the game went off like clockwork before a capacity audience.

The OVAC® was in business as far as renewal of the Ohio-West Virginia midsummer classic was concerned.

However, that's not the end of the story. Over the next two decades-plus that Rudy Mumley served as game director, he made numerous improvements to the game. He turned it from just an all-star game into an extravaganza.

He took the all-star gridders to camp at West Liberty State College, his alma mater, and a place where he had long-standing ties. Each year, Mumley added activities for the players to help them pass the time and provide some relief from the rigors of training camp.

He enlisted the help of the Osiris Shrine and this group gave the game a more meaningful

use as it would eventually gain the lion's share of the charity proceeds.

Through his good friend, the late George Strager, another mid-week event, "An Evening With Stars," was initiated and handled with impeccable care by two other longtime friends, Mike G and Pete Cuffaro.

From the time the OVAC® assumed sponsorship of the game, Mumley brought back the Stone Thomas "Queen of Queens" Pageant which had been a part of the All-Star Game series when it was sponsored by the booster club associations. Stone & Thomas continued to sponsor the event for the next two decades-plus. In recent years, the queen's pageant has continued under the sponsorship of Kaufman's of Wheeling and WTOV-9.

In the meantime, Mumley enlisted the help of Glenn Didriksen and his family, which owned and operated several McDonald's Family Restaurants in the area, to form the McDonald's All-Star Band. This has become an increasingly popular feature of the game.

Mumley's innovative mind produced a game that would help kick off the Ohio Valley football season, a classic that would involve some 60 to 70 football players annually and several hundred cheerleaders. Add to that some 25 to 30 queen candidates and a myriad of volunteers who helped make the 10-day to two week experience a memorable part of their lives.

For a number of years, Rudy and his nephew Sam, along with other OVAC® officials and the dedicated men from the Osiris Shrine, would hold a pep rally at Russek Field on the campus of West Liberty State College. Several thousands of people attended these events and, of course, it was Rudy who usually stole the show.

From his days at old Wheeling High to those at West Liberty State College, Rudy was always ready to help. Following a stint in the military service, he spent the next three decades or so as an educator, primarily in Eastern Ohio. He was principal at Buckeye South High when he retired. His service to the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference® was ongoing for more than three decades, and he served as president on two different occasions.

Through his efforts and those of his many friends who joined with him to work on various facets of the all-star classic, more than \$600,000 has been provided to Ohio Valley charitable groups. Several years before his death, which came in early February of 1999, Mumley relinquished his sponsorship of the game to his longtime associate and close friend, Ron Mauck.

Nonetheless, Rudy still remained a familiar figure on the sidelines. His walk had slowed considerably although he had bounced back from a series of illnesses. But, the enthusiasm was as great as ever. He had seen the game reach new heights last year when it was televised live by WV-9 and the game still drew a near-capacity crowd.

It was a fitting tribute that OVAC® officials several years ago renamed the contest as the Rudy Mumley OVAC® Charity All-Star Game.

Rudy was to become one of the most recognizable sports figures the Ohio Valley had ever produced. He was honored as the Dapper Dan's "Man of the Year" in 1992, and earlier was inducted into the Athletic Hall of Fame at his beloved West Liberty State College, following in the footsteps of his late brother, Eli. Rudy was the first non-athlete or non-coach to earn this honor, and in recent years, he became a prominent benefactor to the school.

Teacher, educator, humanitarian and philanthropist. That's the legacy of a guy who wanted to be known simply as Rudy. And as long as this game can survive, fans of the Ohio Valley for the coming generations will be able to look skyward and say, "Thanks, Rudy!"

For more than three decades, Samuel A. Mumley served the youth of this area as executive secretary of the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference®.

Last February, "Sammy" was called home by his maker to receive his just reward for a lifetime spent in service to others.

Perhaps the greatest compliment one can pay Sam Mumley following his passing is to say that he made his world a much better place to live because he once walked among us.

Mumley devoted nearly five decades to working for the youth of our Ohio Valley. In addition to his role as executive secretary of the OVAC®, which is still believed to be the largest high school athletic conference of its kind in the United States, Mumley served as an athletic trainer, coach, basketball official, teacher and a school administrator.

If that wasn't enough time to give, Mumley joined Eric Carder, an assistant principal and director of activities at Wheeling Park High School, in serving as co-director for the West Virginia Super Six state high school football championships, which they brought to Wheeling Island Stadium six years ago.

Additionally, the pair helped secure the West Virginia state soccer championships held last year at the brand new athletic facility at Wheeling Jesuit University.

Sam also played a major role in the wonderful mid-summer football spectacle you are attending tonight at Wheeling Island Stadium. Renamed several years ago to honor his uncle, who also passed away earlier this year, the Rudy Mumley Charity All-Star Football Classic was revived in 1972 under the sponsorship of the OVAC®.

In those days, the NCAA made things difficult for sponsors seeking sanction to hold various all-star contests. The local Ohio-West Virginia All-Star game had been dormant for many years after having been a fixture on the Ohio Valley gridiron scene since the early 1940s. Both Mumley's spent hundreds of hours putting together the formula for a program that the NCAA found acceptable. Today the game is more vibrant and popular than ever among the area football fans, who nearly pack the Island Stadium each and every July to kick off a new gridiron campaign.

They also helped turn this event into more than just a football game. It has become a mid-summer spectacular complete with an All-Star Band, cheerleaders and the pageantry of a Queen of Queens contest.

It also helped raise hundreds of thousands of dollars for charitable organizations in the Ohio Valley over the past 26 years.

Much of these wonders have been achieved because Mumley refused to take "no" for an answer from anyone and because he dared to dream what many of us have considered to be impossible dreams.

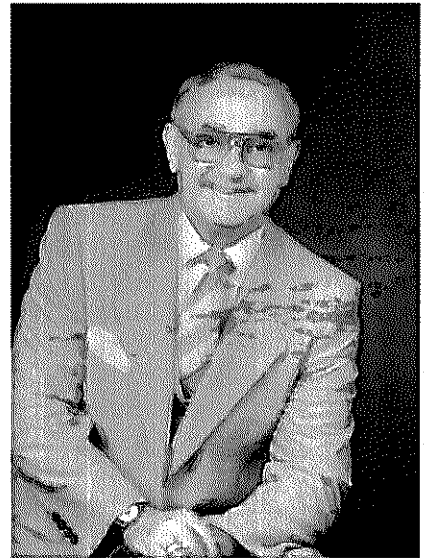
Who would have believed that the state high school football championships could ever be lured out of Charleston to the Northern Panhandle?

Sam did.

And Wheeling will host the state title games for the sixth straight year the first weekend of December.

Through his fund-raising efforts and the help of countless corporate sponsors and Super Six volunteers from up and down the Ohio Valley, the state football finals have been raised to a level that may never be matched in the Mountain State.

When Mumley came back to take over a second time as executive secretary of the OVAC®, the league was in dire financial straits.

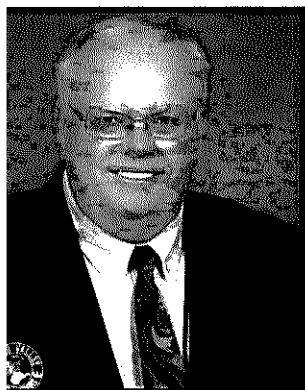

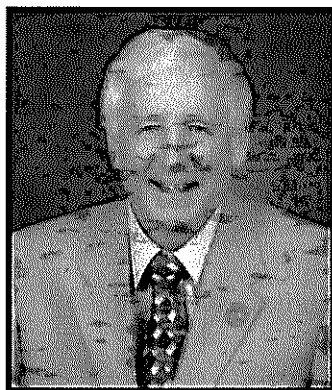

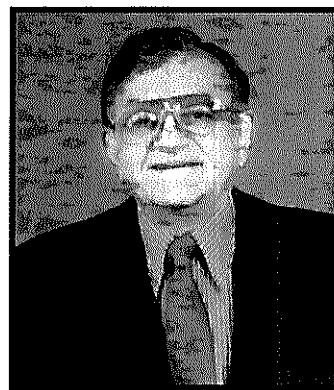

Football Classic in Retrospect

...and The Tradition Continues

A vast majority of people said it would never happen, many felt that it was impossible and some believing that it was to no avail ... "The AC® would not gain NCAA sanction for the correction of the defunct Ohio-West Virginia All-Star Football Game." True, as it was, the 1960's did not have the conference much latitude for its quest for an AA sanction.

As general information, at that time it was mandatory to have NCAA sanction, otherwise those college bound grant-in-aid players would be declared ineligible for their freshman year. Therefore, during the early and middle 1960's, the Ohio-West Virginia All-Star Football Game drew those athletes of lesser athleticism or those not considering to participate on the collegiate level. Through such sanctioning, the AA could totally regulate any and all summer all-star contests, thus putting the "squeeze" on booster clubs and civic organizations who endeavored to work around such regulations. The Ohio-West Virginia All-Star Football Game fell into this category, thus ending the game in the late 1960's and with it the once celebrated Official opening of the Ohio Valley's "skin" season.

"We are not going to be denied," said Sam A. Mumley, Executive Secretary of the OVAC®. "The athletic heritage of this valley as well as having one of the most prolific scholastic conferences in the country should entitle us the opportunity of showcasing our student athletes." In this respect the conference executive board passed legislation which directed the executive secretary to set the course in obtaining AA sanctioning, all of which would cover three years of time, effort and patience.

Beginning in early 1968, and with the intent of gathering preliminary information, it readily became apparent that the "deck was stacked" and those who initially commented on the impossibility of such an venture their opinions seemed correct. However, the decision to move forward with our game plan remained and it was full speed ahead with enthusiasm, confidence and faith. What followed were days and months of endless phone conversations ranging from those with NCAA officials in Kansas City to those local state political leaders as well as keeping the media constantly informed. Additionally there were endless committee and board meetings as well as dinner and reception engagements all designed with the purpose of seeking sanction approval.

1968 and 1969 quickly became history and among the other conference business, the OVAC® was

very busy in implementing its Title IX Program for Girls. Such female programs were introduced with the 1970 school year, two years before the federal mandatory date of September 1972. During this time period the conference was also formulating a full scale scholarship program, Partners in Academic and Athletic Programs, re-designing those needed changes in many sport levels and maintaining a sound financial base for all conference operations. Regardless, the NCAA all-star sanction movement was in full swing with constant communication between the NCAA and the OVAC® on target.

Late in 1971, a remarkable turn of events took place as the NCAA informed the OVAC® that they reviewed one of our many proposed all-star formats and found some definite interests in the overall structure. This, then, led to three continuous months of very intense correspondence and phone conversations. At this juncture it was felt that we were closing in on gaining sanction and the pendulum was swinging toward our future.

Then it happened ... late February 1972, a registered letter from the NCAA arrived at the conference office officially notifying the OVAC® that the NCAA Review Board for all-star contests had awarded total sanction for a conference all-star game for the summer of 1972. Overwhelmed and overjoyed, the conference held a monumental press meeting at the McClure Hotel in Wheeling announcing all the details relative to the first OVAC® All-Star Football Game. Rudy Mumley was already in the fold as our first director and remained as such for 23 years. In 1986, the game was officially re-named as The Rudy Mumley OVAC® Ohio-West Virginia Charity Football game All-Star Classic.

Tonight's 27th Annual Extravaganza will have produced 1,500 players • 3,200 musicians and directors (since 1982) • 500 cheerleaders • 750 queen candidates • 300 coaches, trainers, doctors, and managers • 225,000 fans and an enormous array of Shriners and volunteers, all major contributors in distributing over \$600,000.00 to local upper Ohio Valley charities.

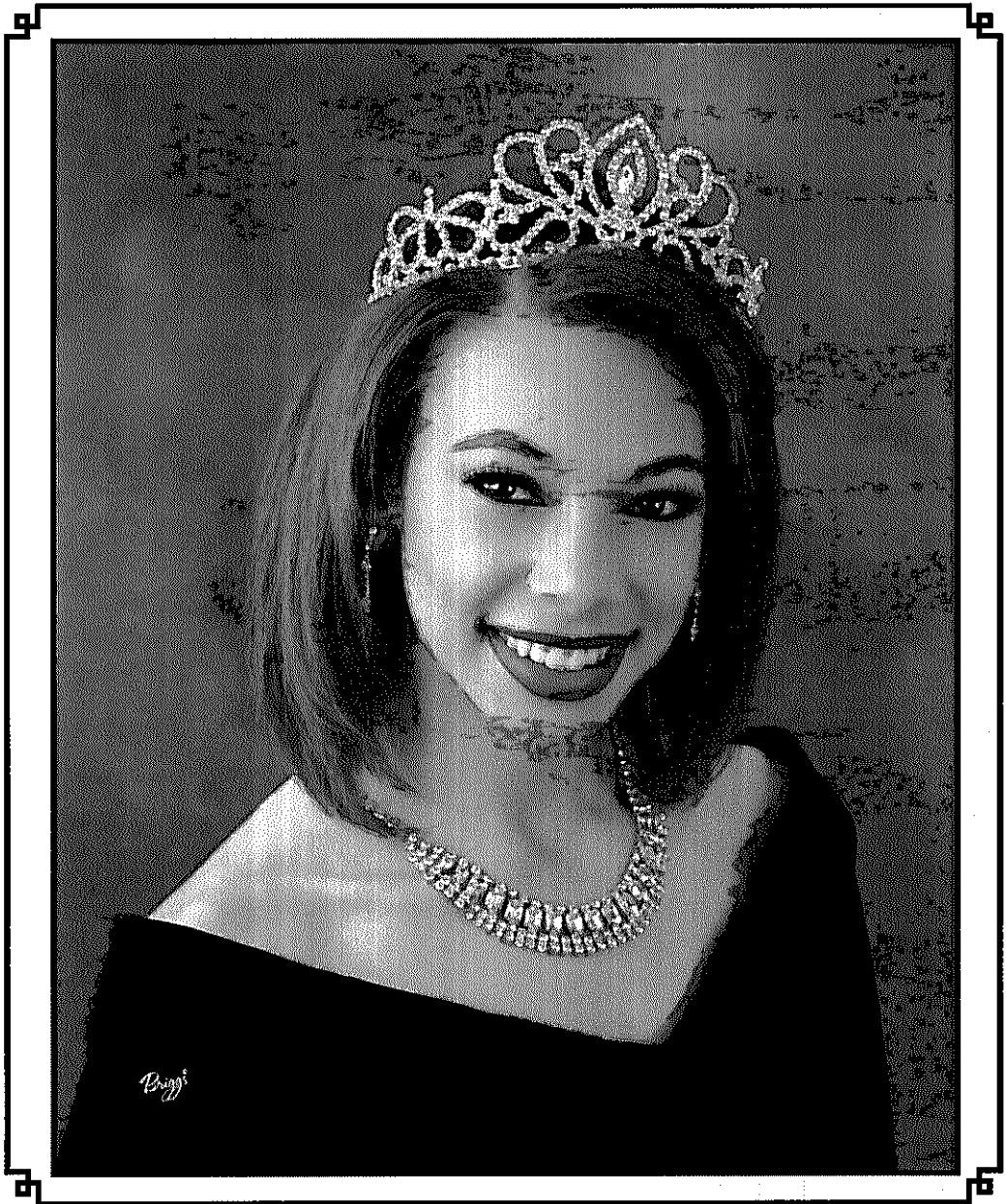
The girls will make a grand appearance at the Stadium at 8: 15 p.m. The crowning of the High School Queens will be crowned at colorful half-time ceremonies.

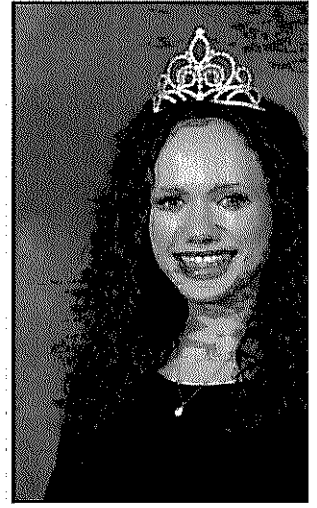

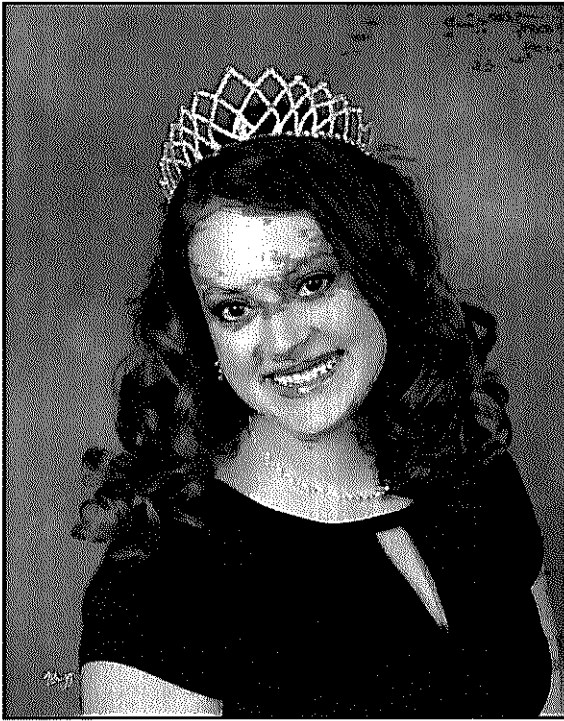

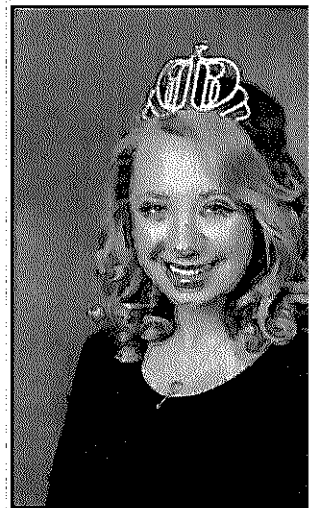

West Virginia's senior All-Star football players today held a 13 to 17 victory over the aftermath of their first meeting with the eastern Ohio team in the maiden football contest played under the new kicking system at the Island Stadium.

The victory of the mountain state football team, who had trailed from the open-quarter until the last seven minutes of the ball game, 7-0, came as a mild surprise as two well-drilled and highly efficient combinations delighted an early season crowd of some 8,000 fans.

The Ohioans drew first blood in a spectacular contest. A Mallery-Backleford pass, late in the first period, moved the Buckeyes from midfield to West Virginia 25. Sadlowski, another offensive back, took a pass that planted the ball on the nine, from where Sadlowski scored in two plays.

The remainder of the half was devoid of a distinct threat on the part of either team although the Rowe-Howell combination had advanced to the Ohio 25 when the intermission arrived.

The mountaineer sturdy rush line moved the equally effective Ohio forwards on fairly even terms into the final period before Johnny August, a Shadyside youth, who shared the starting role for the Bucks, was hit hard on his own and Joe Corba, a Follansbee back, cracked the white leather for the eventual winners.

Charlie Helinski, Union product, came a ball of fire at this stage. He peeled off tackle to the Ohio 19 and nudged the leather to the five yard line by a too many times out penalty. Helinski picked up a yard and Mike "Munchy" Dimitro punched his way into the payoff zone. Dimitro cracked the leather for the extra point and the issue was unlocked.

Passes Decide Battle

The West Virginia stands settled back after this furious display satisfied with a 7-7 standoff, but the mountaineers were fired with the idea of victory when one of Joe Mallery's passes was intercepted near the 50 shortly after the succeeding kickoff.

Helinski nipped successive passes to Phil Saseen and after the second toss to the Central Catholic back had planted the ball on the Ohioans nine. Helinski and Dimitro required three tries before the former had found the pay dirt and the West Virginia youths had a 13-7 lead.

The remaining time allowed for another kickoff and the West Virginians successfully negotiated an onside kick, recovering the ball as the fray ended.

Coaches Bill Kerns of WVU and Don C. Pedden of Ohio University were the honorary mentors and in addition to sitting on the benches of the contesting squads, both spoke over the P.A. system at halftime. Kerns was accompanied here by Frank Kutz, one of his line mentors, and Ray Carnelly, his plebe mentor. The trio departed today for Charleston and tonight's North-South Game, although Kerns had an opportunity to talk to some local prospects.

Bill Stobbs, the Wheeling native who tutors the Wittenberg athletic teams, was one of the spectators in the stands. Another was George Roark, coach of W & J's Presidents, and probably there were others.

Carl Hamill, Weirton's cagey tutor was in the dressing room to minister to a pair of his former Red Riders. Tony Brown aggravated an old shoulder injury while Luke Tomasovich received a cracked rib.

The West Virginians showed big respect for Sedor due respect while the prospective

Ohio State youth was in the His Shadyside backfield mate, despite his costly fumble, was the big guns in the Bucks' effort: Niemiec-Hartwig combinations left the West Virginia fans worried.

After making seven yards in two plays with Charlie Clark, from Wintersville, and husky Henry Marko of Warren Consolidated carting the oval, the Bucks gambled on a pass which fell incomplete.

Then Ohio had to kick and Martins Ferry's Bill Almashy booted the oval out to the 40, where it was taken by Jones who returned it to the 37. Dick Lash, Warwood streak, made eight yards and Gongola picked up a first down on the Buck 26, but Dave Schramm, Bellaire High linesman, who was one of the outstanding performers on the field for Ohio, recovered a fumble at the 24.

From there, Ohio went on the prowl. Sbrissa and Clark alternated on three straight possessions before Powhatan's powerful Mike Kernik went to the 31. A penalty nullified the gain.

After Bob Seyler, of Wheeling Central, intercepted a pass by

Quarterback Brian Book electrified a crowd of more than 9,000 swelling fans at Wheeling Island Stadium Saturday night by hurling for 247 yards and four touchdowns, three of which were snagged by his former Magnolia High School teammate John "Fuzzy" Filliez, as the underdog West Virginia All-stars rose up to smack down a favored Ohio team 38-24, in a wild-and-wooly 28th renewal of the interstate gridiron series.

It was a thrilling struggle from start to finish as the Buckeyes battled back from a 17-0 deficit and pulled within six points at 30-24 midway through the third quarter.

Ohio had a chance to tie the score and go ahead early in the fourth quarter before ex-Linsly Cadet Andy Vrotsos and Magnolia's Steve Dills sparked a defensive surge which ended the Buckeyes' hopes.

Book had scoring passes of 21 yards to Dills and bombs of 40 and 52 yards to Filliez. The Book-to-Filliez combination clicked again from nine yards out late in the game to wrap up the scoring.

The Mountaineers had 390 yards of total offense, with their top ground runners being Brooke's Emmanuel Kohelis, with 67 yards in 19 carries, and Wheeling scat back Jim Tully, who had 47 in seven carries and made TD.

Filliez made four catches for 118 yards while Dillis caught four for 62 yards.

W. Va. held a 17-9 edge in first downs. Two of the pick-offs were by Filliez, playing at defensive halfback, and the other was by Brooke's Rick Fankhouser, who also blocked a punt to give the Mountaineers a safety in the first half.

After intermission, West Virginia pomed 63 yards in three plays, after the placement went wide, the winners held a 30-16 advantage.

Ohio had a chance wiped out on the next series when River QB Mike Flannery's deep pass was wrestled away

from Fankhouser at the Mountaineer one.

However, W. Va. was forced to kick and Barnesville's Kevin Welsh returned the punt 14 yards from the 40 to the W. Va. 26. On the next play, River's stumpy Dan McGuire hit off left tackle on a trap play and zipped to the end zone. Flannery added to the two points on a keep and Ohio trailed just 30-24 with 6:3 left in the third quarter.

W. Va. got its final score after a 46 yd. punt by Kohelis pinned the Bucks deep in their own territory at the five. Filliez picked off Flannery's desperation pass at the 30 and was knocked out of bounds at the 22. Three runs by Kohelis put the ball at the nine and Book found Filliez all alone in the left corner for the TD.

Filliez then ran right-end for the two pointer.

The victory for Coach Lou Nocida's charges was the twelfth scored by W. Va. in the long series. Ohio has won 16 times. The contest also marked the end of a coaching era as Ohio mentor Marty Flannery concluded his 24 yr. coaching career.

In the first quarter, Book found Wheeling Central tight end Phil Pest free down the middle for a 23 yd. gainer, which moved the ball to the Buckeye 28. Book fired to Magnolia buddy Steve Dills in the end zone with 8:50 left in the opening frame. Dave Forbes, also of Magnolia, came on to kick the extra point.

W. Va.'s defense provided the next two points as Brooke's Rick Fankhouser cracked through to block a punt by Alexander and covered the ball in the end zone for a safety.

Book engineered another beautifully-executed TD drive. Wheeling's Jim Tully had a key third-down six yard scamper, with a fifteen yard piling on penalty to advance the ball to the Ohio 46.

Buckeye West middle guard Doug Finney broke through and slammed

Book for a nine-yard loss. On the play, Filliez uncorked a fifty-yard heave to Filliez. On the PAT holder Filliez picked up the ball, to the right and threw a strike to B. Ramon Bowen for the two-point 17-0 lead, with more than nine minutes left in the half.

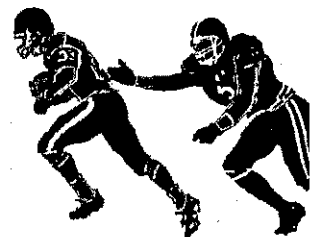
Ohio bounced right back after the passing of its talented QB, Flannery, of River, to go 60 yards. Forbes kick-off went out of bounds. Cadiz great Cal Gregory was down for a five yard loss by Madonna DeSantis on the next play, but Filliez then threw a 41-yard strike down center to fleet Beallsville back Welsh, putting the pigskin at 24-0 W. Va. 24.

The Bucks then dipped into a bag of tricks and tackle eligible Martins Ferry's Mike Greenwell went to the four. Dan McGuire, River scored two plays later off left end from the two. Flannery passed to Bellaire's Terry Brinker off a fake for the two-point conversion to tie the W. Va. lead to 17-8 with 6:05 left on the clock in the second frame.

On the following Mountaineer possession, Tully sparked a surge with three runs for 34 yards, the last on from the eight on a sweep of left when he battled his way through the defenders and fell into the end zone. The kick by Forbes made it 24-8 Ohio 4:40 left in the half.

After trading possessions, Ohio responded when a pass by Book for his own 14 was picked off by Starstar Mike Rotilio, a defensive star all night. Flannery took it over as a keeper with two minutes to go. Flannery then hit Ferry's Tom Suriano for a two-pointer and it was 24-16 Ohio 2:00 mission.

'1993' All-Star Game - 20 Years Ago

Much of the largest crowd in the history of the Rudy Mumley OVAC All-Star football Charity Classic finally began filling out of Wheeling Island Stadium with only six minutes left in Sunday night's 20th annual Ohio-West Virginia scrap.

The much anticipated battle between West of Buckeye Local and Curtis McGhee of Wheeling Central took a back seat to Bishop Donahue quarterback Mark Gordon, who passed for nearly two hundred yards in the second half.

Who could blame the fans for trying to get a head start on the island traffic bottleneck? The Mountain States who trailed 14-0, had just given the ball back to the Buckeyes by having too many men on the field following an Ohio punt.

With a weapon like Buckeye Local's Curtis McGhee in the Ohio backfield and time winding off the stadium clock, the show was obviously over for a gallant West Virginia squad.

In one of the most incredible turnarounds in all-star grid annals, the Mountain States scored three touchdowns in the final 2:53 and stuffed West on a two-point conversion with less than a minute to go to tie off a 34-32 shocker.

Determination helped West Virginia hold Ohio to minus four yards on three plays following the late penalty to force another punt.

A pass from Donahue's Mark Gordon - who took every snap at QB for Buckeye's squad - to Weir's Marcus Clausell gave West Virginia a first down at the four yard line. The second of two sweeps by Wheeling Central's Curtis McGhee cut the lead to 26-0 following Matt DiLorenzo's PAT.

There was just 2:53 showing on the stadium clock but the Mountaineers seemed animated on the sidelines as a team arising a one point lead in the waning moments of a state championship game.

DiLorenzo, an all-state soccer player

at Wheeling Park ripped a hard, low roller perfectly toward the right sideline.

An Ohio player stepped just inside the ten-yard buffer zone in an attempt to field the ball but the bounding oval bounced off his helmet as he was crunched by the West Virginia pursuit. When the pile unfolded, West Virginia had the ball.

Shadyside's Chad Wiley on the very snap following the recovery, blew through the line to sack Gordon back at the West Virginia 42.

John Marshall's J. B. Burge steeped in front of the pass at the Ohio 45 and found nothing but green and white stripes between himself and a Mountain State TD.

Burge's six pointer and the DiLorenzo PAT appeared to have put Ohio down for the count with less than a minute to play but, like West Virginia a few minutes earlier, the Buckeyes proved that they too were made of sterner stuff.

After the kick-off, Wellsville's Andy Martin found a seam in the middle of the West Virginia coverage team and broke it all the way for an all-star game record 99-yard TD return as the Ohio stands erupted.

With 43 seconds remaining, the Buckeyes now trailed 34-32 and everybody in the stadium knew who was going to get the ball on the two-point conversion try.

West had been held to just 16 yards on six totes after intermission. Ohio lined up in a strong-right information for the critical two-pointer with West taking the toss and rolling toward the right sideline, looking to cut back behind a wall of blockers.

The seam never opened and West had to sprint for the corner where Brooke's Buck Neel was waiting. West tried to power through Neel inside the five but the Bruin star held his ground and tumbled the play out of bounds at the two.

In the opening frame, Ohio stayed on the ground with West scoring first at the 3:58 mark of the first quarter. Just as they

were plagued throughout the contest were shut out of the PAT.

West Virginia bounced back the frame that highlighted the run McGhee and was keyed by a 28-yard don-to-McGhee pass. On the first of the second frame, McGhee carried 67 yards and the score, followed by DiLorenzo boot to give the Mountaineers a 7-6 upper hand.

After trading possessions, the Mountaineers took control on the West Virginia drive. West ran for 7 yards, Schehl for 10. West ran for two more before West took the lead with 5:42 on the clock. Ohio led 14-7. Once again the PAT was unsuccessful.

Two plays later, Ohio again got on the board as River's Don Hendershot scored the W. Va. runner of the ball and ran it 30 yards for a score at 4:51. Calcutt scored a two-pointer for a 20-7 Ohio lead.

In the third quarter, West Virginia narrowed the gap to 20-14 as Gordon connected with Bishop Donahue's Artie for 40 yards then McGhee scored five at 3:45. DiLorenzo added the PAT.

Ohio retaliated in the third quarter with Beallsville's passing combo of Dan and Ron Street combined for three touchdowns and 27 yards and the run Schehl and West added 26 more yards with Schehl getting the final two-point conversion at 1:16 to push the Buckeye lead to 26-14.

With the Ohioans leading 26-14, the third quarter closed with a spirited drive for-all in front of the Mountaineers that resulted in five player ejections.

The two teams combined for 400 yards of total offense. West had 12 carries to lead all rushers. Moore had five catches for 133 yards in the second half pace the receiver Gordon completed 14 of 26 passes for 200 yards.

West Virginia scored first, a 16-yard pass from Matt Wharton to Kyle Wharton with 6:16 expired in the first period. John Kusich's placement was good to give the Mountaineers a 7-0 lead. Ohio turned the ball over on their first possession of the game, opening the door for West Virginia to score on the board first. Magnolia's

Ohio answered right back, with 2:48 remaining in the contest the Buckeye's embarked on a abbreviated four-play 67 yard drive that culminated with the scoring strike of Schafer to Antonucci.

The winning score was set when Buckeye defensive end Michael Edwards stepped in front of a Wharton screen pass and raced 29 yards before being brought down. Williams then found the end zone for the deciding TD.

In the statistics "battle" Ohio won in rushing 213-162 and in passing 129-119. The winners led in first downs 15-15.

Dave Bruney of Martins Ferry was the head coach for Ohio, while Osgood Glen's Tom Taylor was head coach for West Virginia.

~ A Tribute to George Strager ~

Column by Nick Bedway that originally appeared in the Wheeling News-Register on August 18, 2003)

another high school football season set to get underway, I thought this might be a good time in the career of the late George Strager.

Ohio Valley's winningest schoolboy football coach, Strager was truly a legend in his own right. He amassed a total of 246 victories during a career that spanned nearly four decades.

As I should point out that there's no telling how many more games Strager's teams would have had if the current tiebreaker rules had been in effect while he was stalking Ohio Valley sidelines. During his entire coaching career, if the score was tied at the end of the fourth quarter everybody was satisfied or not.

Strager's offensive genius was considered ahead of his era and he certainly could have figured out ways for his teams to win at least half of those stalemated contests in overtime. His overall record stands at 115 wins, 115 losses and 16 ties.

I selected Coach Strager as the subject for this column not just because of the success he experienced in coaching. The love and dedication that he gave the couple of thousand kids he coached affected their lives in a positive way.

George was hard to play for and tough as nails on the field. His pre-game and half-time talks were delivered with fire, especially when he didn't think his team was performing up to his expectations. His sense of humor was hilariously funny at times around his coaches and players.

Strager's younger coaches could have learned a lot about football and how to get the maximum out of their players had they had the opportunity to learn from this coaching giant.

Last week I asked a couple of long-time Strager friends and associates - Doug Huff, the former Sports Editor of The Intelligencer, and Central Catholic assistant coach Mike Young - to share some of their reflections on Ol' George.

Doug spent nearly three decades covering Strager's teams. Young played for Strager at Central. He was also his long-time assistant coach at St. Clairsville High and he has handled perhaps the toughest task of all when he was asked to succeed the long-time mentor at the Red Devil.

It wasn't as difficult as people said it would be because George Strager prepared me to be a head coach by giving me responsibilities that instilled my confidence. When the time came, I felt like I was ready for it," Young explained. Mike had spent 17 years on Strager's staff at St. Clairsville.

George was like a second father to me in terms of our friendship and the way our families got along. I don't think a lot of people realized that he was as great a family man." He and his wife had four kids and two of them were still in junior high when Lounelle passed away in 1971. He did a wonderful job of raising them almost on his own. All of his children have been successful in their lives as well." Young added that one of the reasons why Strager was so successful was his football brain that put him ahead of the other coaches during his long career. He was a master-mind of the offense. Young talked about how Strager could look at a team's defense and quickly find a way to attack it and pick it apart. "We were very fortunate during that time to have had many quality athletes at St. Clairsville," Young also said.

Strager's most famous of the Strager proteges, of course, was Tim Spencer, who went on from the Saints to star at Ohio State, play in the NFL, and return to Buckeye Local as an assistant coach. The unfortunate part of Strager's Red Devil days were they came when the Ohio High School Athletic Association was taking just one or two teams from each region for post-season play. "We had sons on those teams that did not get a chance to play in the post-season," Young said. Three of Strager's undefeated teams Red Devil squads never made it to the post-season.

St. Clairsville did make it twice under Strager, qualifying in 1983 and in 1986. The 1986 squad won two playoff contests and were one step away from the state final when it lost a controversial decision to Chagrin Falls Kenston at the Rubber Bowl in Akron. It was Huff that pointed out that Strager is probably the only person to have coached three different Ohio Valley teams to undefeated seasons. His 1953 Sisterville Tigercats went 11-0 and won the state championship with a 27-12 victory over Romney.

In 1963, Strager guided the Maroon Knights to a 10-0-1 season, ending with a 40-6 dismantling of highly-regarded Charleston Catholic at Parkersburg in the WV Catholic title game. He also had three undefeated teams at St. Clairsville, posting records of 9-0 in 1969, 10-0 in 1970, and 10-0 in 1985.

Strager's ability to win in four different decades is another unmatched area achievement. "I always considered George as 'The Coach'" because he was so well respected among his peers," Huff said, "to mention his name in a conversation with fellow coaches always had something positive to say about his coaching philosophy, techniques, etc." Huff also talked about how Strager's teams were easy to watch and cover. They never seemed out of a game because of his offense's ability to strike from any place on the field. "Sorry, I was born to do certain jobs. George was born to be a high school football coach. And he was one of the best," Huff added.

George certainly told it the way it was where our mutual friend was concerned. George had opportunities to go into the college ranks and he turned down a couple of big-time offers as I recall. But his fun and his life was in taking a group of young high school kids and molding them into something special.

At St. Clairsville, the late successful coach in Wintersville (now Indian Creek High School) regarded Strager as being a good a quarterback as he ever saw. The triggerman at QB was definitely the key in Strager's multiple offense, more as a ball handler than a thrower. If George had a player who could run his offense with a sleight-of-hand, good things were going to happen for his team that season.

Strager's relationship with George was more than just between a journalist and a coach. When he came to coach at Wheeling Central Catholic in 1971, he was a young writer and both Strager and the late Bob Roe, then the head coach of Wheeling High School, took me under their wing. Strager was never known for paying much attention to the defensive side of football, although I'm sure that was exaggerated.

I recall one time, however, when I went out to do a "Strager & Son" piece for the newspaper the week of the Red Devil's opener again at St. Clairsville High School. On George's staff and his defensive coordinator at the time was his son, "Duke." After talking with the head coach, I went over to talk to Duke for a few minutes. "How's the defense going," I asked. "I don't know. Dad's spending so much time with the offense he hasn't let me work with the defense yet," Duke said as I could see the twinkle in his eye.

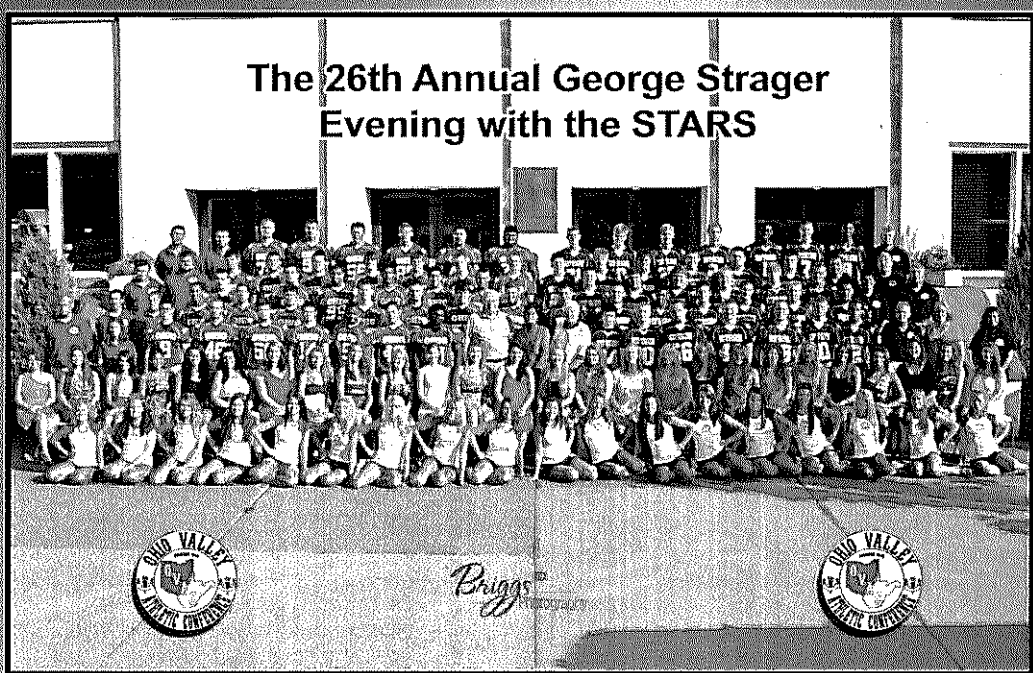
Strager's son was kidding me, or the defense made some remarkable strides in the three days prior to the game as St. Clairsville came off a 44-14 win over the Wildcats. Strager's impact on the Ohio Valley coaching scene and even some of today's athletes will continue to be noticed.

Young pointed out that he and Kelly Rine continue to be directors for the George Strager Football camp every summer. Players can see the Rudy Mumley OVAC All-Star Football Game are feted four nights before the contest each year at George Strager Evening with the Red Devil.

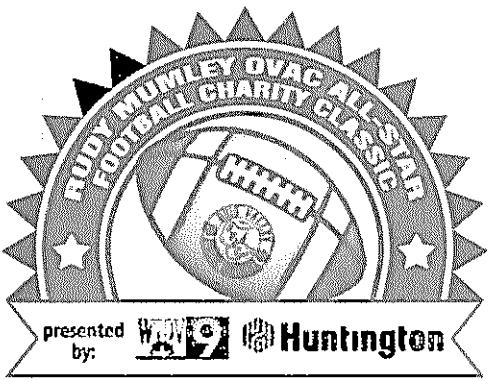

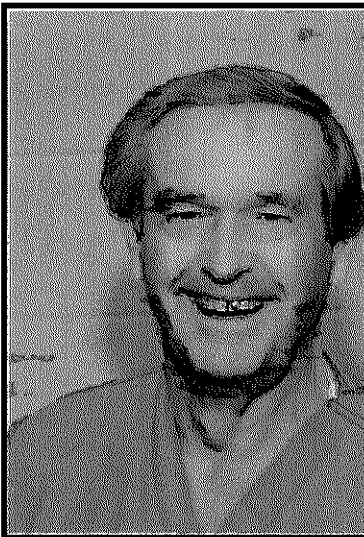

GEORGE STRAGER "EVENING WITH THE STARS"



Dr. Robert Jones, the team doctor for the West Virginia All-Stars tonight's Rudy Mumley OVAC® All-Star Charity Football Classic, is a simple self-diagnosis to explain his affection for football. The time, he says, is in his blood. And no antibiotic, no pill or shot can get the sport out of his system. "I got involved because of the game of football," he said. (The appeal) is the game itself...it doesn't matter what aspect it is."

Football found its way into the heart of Dr. Jones in the mid-1960's, when he played for the legendary Wheeling Ironmen. Jones played defensive end, linebacker, offensive line - - "Back in the day, you had to do it all," he said - - and remembers cross-state clashes with Charleston fondly. Even if memories of the game's details remain cloudy, the atmosphere of Wheeling Island Stadium will always remain indelibly etched in Jones' heart and mind. "I remember my first game...we played Charleston," Jones said. It was the only time I've ever seen the island (stadium) completely packed. We had a little bit of rivalry with them." And he still gets the same chills up his spine every time he visits the stadium, which was remodeled in the 1980's. "It's still the same place," Jones said. "Even if it is a different stadium. It's a great place to play football."

Of course, the main purpose of football and other sports is to teach the participants qualities to take with themselves throughout their lives. Football was no different for Jones. Currently a general surgeon who also performs thoracic and vascular work at Wheeling Hospital, Jones says he learned a discipline - - a necessary component in any surgeon's mental makeup - - by playing football all his life. "The discipline of football pushed me to be a surgeon and in the medical field," Jones said.

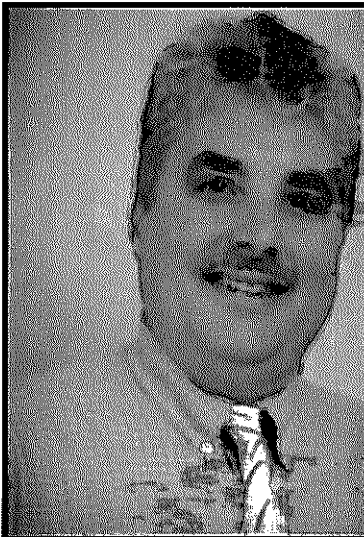
Jones has been involved with the OVAC® Football Classic for the past 15 years, getting his first team game when Ohio team doctor - - Luis Vazquez - - invited him to the 1984 game.

Many of the games that he's seen and worked were good. But one - - the 1987 classic - - stands out as great; because of the luminous stars who played in the contest. Ohio - featuring St. Clairsville's Shawn Vincent and John Spencer - defeated the Alex Shookled West Virginia team 13-11 in the game, played at Steubenville because of the renovations to Wheeling Island Stadium. 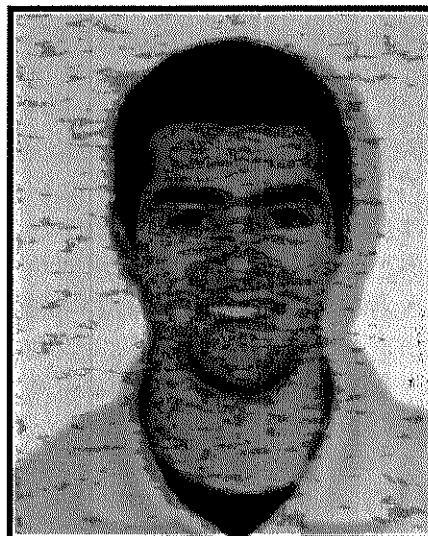

Jason also currently volunteers at the Healthworks Rehab and Fitness Center in Morgantown. He received his certification as Athletic Trainer in July 2010.

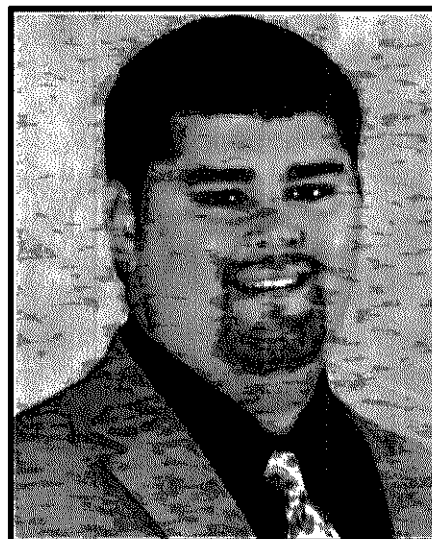
TRAINER - ZACH MOODY

There's a lot more to playing an all-star football game than X's and O's. For proof, just ask Todd Fullerton, who will coordinate all the medical services for tonight's Rudy Mumley VAC® All-Star Charity Football Classic.

"Basically, my job is to make sure all the i's are dotted and the t's are crossed," Fullerton said, laughing.

Among Fullerton's i's and t's are:

- Making sure enough trainers, doctors and emergency technicians are present, in case of injury.
- Ensuring that the teams have plenty of supplies, from medical tape to ice packs.
- Telling coaches if players injured during the game are healthy enough to return to action.
- Deciding whether or not to play, delay or cancel a game because of weather conditions.

From a medical standpoint, the key to keeping a game running smoothly is communication, Fullerton said. "Basically, we try to work with each other and communicate with the coaches," Fullerton said. "There's a lot of communication between everyone involved."

Fullerton should know. After all, he's been seriously involved with the OVAC® for the past 20 years, and he's been working in sports medicine for the past 45 years.

His athletic training career started in the late 1960's when, as a student-athlete at Martinsburg High School, Art Simpson befriended Fullerton and gave him his first chance at being a trainer. Fullerton's stepfather, Bill Van Horne, the sports editor of the Wheeling News-Register's death in 1995, took him around to sporting events, which fueled his desire to remain involved in sports.

Fullerton holds a Bachelors Degree in physical education from The Ohio State University and a Masters Degree in exercise physiology from the University of Arizona. Along the way, he's worked with several notable organizations, including the following:

While at Ohio State, he was an athletic trainer for the Buckeye football team, a position that allowed him to work with Woody Hayes and attend the Rose Bowl.

Fullerton worked the summers of 1972 and 1973 in Bradenton, Florida with the Pittsburgh Pirates organization.

While a graduate student at Arizona in 1977-1979, he was an athletic trainer with the Association of Tennis Professionals, and worked with such tennis luminaries as Jimmy Connors and Andre Agassi.

But, Fullerton said, "There's nothing quite as special as the OVAC®." That's why he returned to the Ohio Valley in 1984. He currently works as a registered nurse at MedExpress in Elm Grove. "People like (Van Horne, Simpson and the late Sam Mumley) were very instrumental and influential in my high school sports," Fullerton said. "There's great camaraderie, great fellowship...some of the kids don't realize what they have until they are out of it."

Fullerton lives in Triadelphia and is the proud father of two adult children - Jaclyn, who graduated from WVU this August and Jake, who will be entering his junior year at WVU.



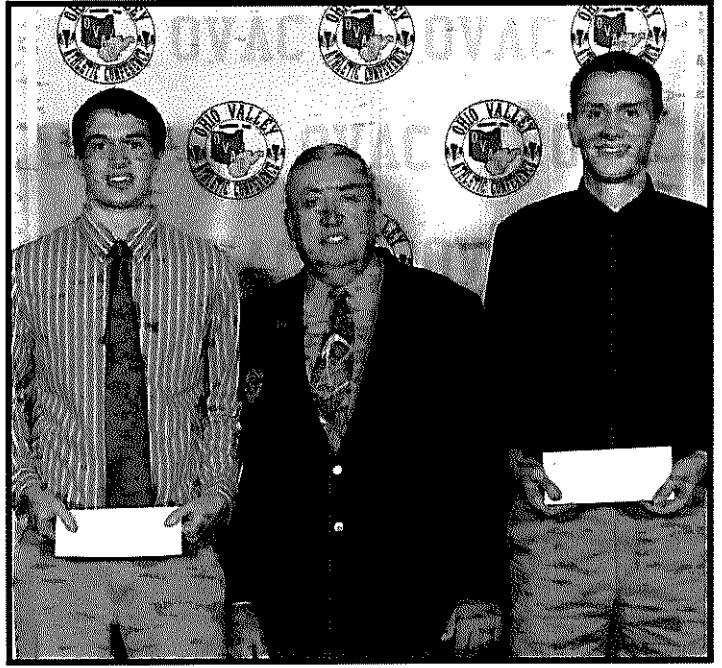

West Virginia head coach Mike Young named his coaching staff for tonight's game earlier this month.

"We've got a quality group of coaches and even better people," Young said. "They're a very loyal group of guys. There are times when we have our differences, but when we come out of the coaches' room, we're all on the same page. We're fortunate to have a veteran staff that believes in what we're doing."

Here's a capsule look at the West Virginia staff:

MIKE YOUNG, Head Coach — This veteran head coach has been strolling the sidelines for 41 years, including the past 16 at his alma mater.

As the Maroon Knights' head coach, Young has guided the program to Class A state championships Class A state championships in 2005, 06, 07, 2010 and 2011. All told, he owns a 139-61 record.

Prior to serving as head coach at Central, Young served as head coach at St. Clairsville. He guided the Red Devils to a state championship during his tenure, including a trip to the playoffs in 1989 and a pair of OVAC® titles.

Young was named Dapper Dan Man of the Year in 2007, Big 22 Coach of the Year twice, received the prestigious Coach of the Year honor in 2012 and has been a finalist three other times.

Mike, who also serves as the Central athletic director, and his wife Carol have three sons, John, Jason, Justin and a daughter, Whitney. The couple also has two grandchildren.

JAMIE BORDAS, defensive coordinator — This long-time assistant has become a key cog on the Maroon Knights' staff during 11 years ago. Prior to arriving at Central, Bordas served as the head coach at Bishop Donahue for one season. He earned a master's degree in education and a law degree from Notre Dame University, was also featured in an NFL Films segment about college football at N.D. 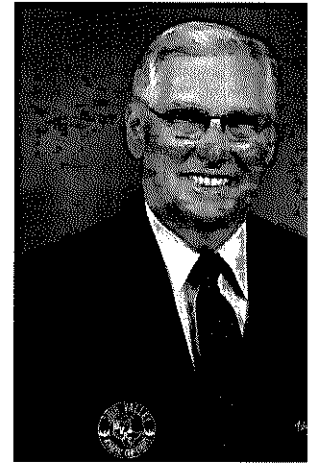
★ HONORARY OFFICIALS
