



There are many words to describe the life of Rudolph Mumley, but perhaps the most appropriate would be service.

For most of his 80-plus years, Mumley, known as "Rudy" to his legion of friends, worked on behalf of many causes. None were more important to him than the youth of the Ohio Valley.

It is befitting that the game which fans are witnessing this evening is named in his honor. If it hadn't been for Rudy's willingness to step forward, the Ohio-West Virginia All-Star Game would not have existed the last 28 years, and it now appears to be a fixture that will carry it well into the next millennium.

The game's history goes back to the early 1940s and, for many years after that, it was sponsored by booster club associations from Eastern Ohio and the West Virginia northern panhandle.

However, the game could not receive NCAA sanction and consequently was held during the spring to allow players who had received scholarships to NCAA schools an opportunity to participa

When it became apparent that the booster club organizations could no longer sponsor the game, it ceased to exist. An idea was presented to Sam A. Mumley Sr. that the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference® could assume sponsorship of the game and apply for NCAA sanction.

One of the requirements toward receiving NCAA sanction was that only 60 percent of game proceeds could be spent to cover expenses and the other 40 percent had to be used for charitable purposes.

Once the game received sanction, the OVAC® had another problem. It was experiencing finance problems and did not have the resources to provide "seed" money that would be needed to purchas uniforms, pay for training camp and other start-up expenses such as insurance.

Sam Mumley, who was the executive secretary of the OVAC®, appealed to his uncle, Rudy, to provide the financial help. The story has become legend on how Rudy, a bachelor who lived with beloved sister, Lillian, in the Warwood area of Wheeling, mortgaged their home to receive a loan. rest, as the saying goes, is history.

There was more adversity to overcome for this inaugural OVAC® venture. The Ohio Valley experienced damaging floods during June of 1972. Wheeling Stadium sustained considerable damage and the facility would not be available for the early August game.

Sam Mumley called his longtime friend, the late Edmund Joseph, who was then athletic direct at Martins Ferry High School and asked if the OVAC® could use Ferry Stadium. Once Joseph took request to school officials and received permission, the game was finally on.

However, on the day of the game, the area was hit hard by a rainstorm. More adversity. By this time, you could not fault Rudy Mumley, who agreed to serve as game director, if he was feeling a I jinxed. Several hours before kickoff was scheduled, the rain stopped and the sun came out. It turn into a beautiful evening, and the game went off like clockwork before a capacity audience.

The OVAC® was in business as far as renewal of the Ohio-West Virginia midsummer classic w concerned.

However, that's not the end of the story. Over the next two decades-plus that Rudy Mumley served as game director, he made numerous improvements to the game. He turned it from just an star game into an extravaganza.

He took the all-star gridders to camp at West Liberty State College, his alma mater, and a plac where he had long-standing ties. Each year, Mumley added activities for the players to help them pass the time and provide some relief from the rigors of training camp.

He enlisted the help of the Osiris Shrine and this group gave the game a more meaningful

pose as it would eventually gain the lion's share of the charity proceeds.

Through his good friend, the late George Strager, another mid-week event, "An Evening With Stars," was initiated and handled with impeccable care by two other longtime friends, Mike and Pete Cuffaro.

From the time the OVAC® assumed sponsorship of the game, Mumley brought back the Stone homas "Queen of Queens" Pageant which had been a part of the All-Star Game series when it sponsored by the booster club associations. Stone & Thomas continued to sponsor the event of the next two decades-plus. In recent years, the queen's pageant has continued under the prescribe of Kaufman's of Wheeling and WTOV-9.

In the meantime, Mumley enlisted the help of Glenn Didriksen and his family, which owned and erated several McDonald's Family Restaurants in the area, to form the McDonald's All-Star Band, is has become an increasingly popular feature of the game.

Mumley's innovative mind produced a game that would help kick off the Ohio Valley football ison, a classic that would involve some 60 to 70 football players annually and several hundred idsmen. Add to that some 25 to 30 queen candidates and a myriad of volunteers who helped ke the 10-day to two week experience a memorable part of their lives.

For a number of years, Rudy and his nephew Sam, along with other OVAC® officials and the licated men from the Osiris Shrine, would hold a pep rally at Russek Field on the campus of West erty State College. Several thousands of people attended these events and, of course, it was Rudo usually stole the show.

From his days at old Wheeling High to those at West Liberty State College, Rudy was always re to help. Following a stint in the military service, he spent the next three decades or so as an actor, primarily in Eastern Ohio. He was principal at Buckeye South High when he retired. His service to the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference® was ongoing for more than three decades, I he served as president on two different occasions.

Through his efforts and those of his many friends who joined with him to work on various facets he all-star classic, more than \$600,000 has been provided to Ohio Valley charitable groups. Several years before his death, which came in early February of 1999, Mumley relinquished actorship of the game to his longtime associate and close friend, Ron Mauck.

Nonetheless, Rudy still remained a familiar figure on the sidelines. His walk had slowed siderably although he had bounced back from a series of illnesses. But, the enthusiasm was great as ever. He had seen the game reach new heights last year when it was televised live by OV-9 and the game still drew a near-capacity crowd.

It was a fitting tribute that OVAC® officials several years ago renamed the contest as the Rudy mley OVAC® Charity All-Star Game.

Rudy was to become one of the most recognizable sports figures the Ohio Valley had ever duced. He was honored as the Dapper Dan's "Man of the Year" in 1992, and earlier was inducted the Athletic Hall of Fame at his beloved West Liberty State College, following in the footsteps is late brother, Eli, Rudy was the first non-athlete or non-coach to earn this honor, and in recent irs, he became a prominent benefactor to the school.

Educator, humanitarian and philanthropist. That's the legacy of a guy who wanted to be known ply as Rudy. And as long as this game can survive, fans of the Ohio Valley for the coming perations will be able to look skyward and say, "Thanks, Rudy!"





For more than three decades, Samuel A. Mumley served the youth of this area as executive secretary of the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference®.

Last February, "Sammy" was called home by his maker to receive his just reward for a lifetime spent in service to others.

Perhaps the greatest compliment one can pay Sam Mumley following his passing is to say that he made his world a much better place to live because he once walked among us.

Mumley devoted nearly five decades to working for the youth of our Ohio Valley. In addition to his time as executive secretary of the OVAC®, which is still believed to be the largest high school athletic conference of its kind in the United States, Mumley was an athletic trainer, coach, basketball official, teacher and a school administrator.

If that wasn't enough time to give, Mumley joined Eric Carder, an assistant principal and direct of activities at Wheeling Park High School, in serving as co-director for the West Virginia Super Si state high school football championships, which they brought to Wheeling Island Stadium six year ago.

Additionally, the pair helped secure the West Virginia state soccer championships held last year the brand new athletic facility at Wheeling Jesuit University.

Sam also played a major role in the wonderful mid-summer football spectacle you are attendin tonight at Wheeling Island Stadium. Renamed several years ago to honor his uncle, who also pas away earlier this year, the Rudy Mumley Charity All-Star Football Classic was revived in 1972 und the sponsorship of the OVAC®.

In those days, the NCAA made things difficult for sponsors seeking sanction to hold various all star contest. The local Ohio-West Virginia All-Star game had been dormant for many years after having been a fixture on the Ohio Valley gridiron scene since the early 1940s. Both Mumley's spei hundreds of hours putting together the formula for a program that the NCAA found acceptable. To the game is more vibrant and popular than ever among the area football fans, who nearly pack the Island Stadium each and every July to kick off a new gridiron campaign.

They also helped turn this event into more than just a football game. It has become a mid-sum spectacular complete with an All-Star Band, cheerleaders and the pageantry of a Queen of Queer contest.

It also helped raise hundreds of thousands of dollars for charitable organizations in the Ohio Valley over the past 26 years.

Much of these wonders have been achieved because Mumley refused to take "no" for an answ from anyone and because he dared to dream what many of us have considered to be impossible dreams.

Who would have believed that the state high school football championships could ever be lure out of Charleston to the Northern Panhandle?

Sam did.

And Wheeling will host the state title games for the sixth straight year the first weekend of December.

Through his fund-raising efforts and the help of countless corporate sponsors and Super Six volunteers from up and down the Ohio Valley, the state football finals have been raised to a level t may never be matched in the Mountain State.

When Mumley came back to take over a second time as executive secretary of the OVAC®, the league was in dire financial straits.

Through Mumley's efforts and the backing of other leaders in the community, an OVAC® indation Board was formed to serve as a fund-raising arm of the bi-state league. That board is in existence today.

The sports programs at the various schools were improved immensely. All-star games are now 1 each year in football, boys' and girls' basketball, baseball, softball and boys' and girls' soccer. OVAC® sponsors championship tournaments in wrestling, swimming, tennis, golf, volleyball, eball, softball, boys' and girls' soccer, boys' and girls' cross country, boys' and girls' track, erleading, etc.

Girls sports have risen to equal importance because Sam had the foresight and the courage to port each and every program offered by the OVAC®. His efforts with girls' sports earned Mumley eat on the equity panels for both the Ohio High School Athletic Association and the West Virginia condary School Athletic Commission.

The scholarship program also has been enhanced by Sam's ability to involve the corporate tor of the various communities within the extensive OVAC® map. At last May's OVAC® Banquet hampions held at the Wheeling Civic Center, more than \$15,000 in scholarship money was arded to deserving OVAC® student-athletes.

That money wasn't just found on the street corner; it was obtained largely through tireless rts of the late executive secretary.

Sam put the OVAC®'s "kids" first in all his dreams and work for the conference, "What can we do the 'kids'? How can we make things better for them?" Those were the first questions he posed enever the OVAC® or Super Six would discuss changes in their programs.

He took great pains to involve everyone in conference business. He was constantly in touch media members, keeping them updated on matters and seeking their opinions.

When important final decisions had to be made, Sam didn't mind being the one to make them. he did so after many discussions among his constituents and his own private soul-searching. I, of course, his main concern was making sure that the decisions were in the best interest of the AC® student-athletes.

From a personal standpoint, if Sam became your friend, he was your friend for life. He was always to with a kind word, a bit of advice if it was asked for, and encouragement when any of his friends to in a difficult situation.

I once wrote in a column that Sam was no saint, but that he was sent to us by angels to perform d works and turn our impossible dreams into reality.

He dearly loved his wife, Nancy, who remained by his side through good times and rough times. different from the rest of us, Nancy became part of the OVAC® family as well, taking care of the ference's financial books, a role she continues to handle today.

They were married just 11 years when Sam passed away. But, as Nancy once said, they med 40 years of happiness into that short time.

A long bout with cancer terminated Mumley's life at the too young age of 67. But, as this writer stated before, you won't make me believe "Sammy" lost that fight with cancer. Nothing defeated n Mumley in his lifetime. God, whom Sam believed in with all his heart, simply decided it was time all him home.

Sam Mumley was one of a kind.


He will remain in our thoughts and prayers forever.

28 Years... OVAC® All-Star Football Classic in Retrospect

...and The Tradition Continues

vast majority of people said it would never happen, many felt that it was impossible and some believing that it was to no avail ... "The VAC® would not gain NCAA sanction for the surrection of the defunct Ohio-West Virginia All-Star potball Game." True, as it was, the 1960's did not low the conference much latitude for its quest for an CAA sanction.

As general information, at that time it was andatory to have NCAA sanction, otherwise those allege bound grant-in-aid players would be declared eligible for their freshman year. Therefore, during e early and middle 1960's, the Ohio-West Virginia I-Star Football Game drew those athletes of lesser hleticism or those not considering to participate on e collegiate level. Through such sanctioning, the CAA could totally regulate any and all summer allar contests, thus putting the "squeeze" on booster ubs and civic organizations who endeavored to work ound such regulations. The Ohio-West Virginia All ar Football Game fell into this category, thus endg the game in the late 1960's and with it the once elebrated Official opening of the Ohio Valley's iaskin" season.

"We are not going to be denied," said Sam A. umley, Executive Secretary of the OVAC*. "The ch athletic heritage of this valley as well as having ne of the most prolific scholastic conferences in the nuntry should entitle us the opportunity of showcasing or student athletes." In this respect the conference eccutive board passed legislation which directed e executive secretary to set the course in obtaining CAA sanctioning, all of which would cover three ears of time, effort and patience.

Beginning in early 1968, and with the intent of athering preliminary information, it readily became oparent that the "deck was stacked" and those who iginally commented on the impossibility of such an atventure their opinions seemed correct. However, e decision to move forward with our game plan mained and it was full speed ahead with enthusiasm, infidence and faith. What followed were days and onths of endless phone conversations ranging from ose with NCAA officials in Kansas City to those local ad state political leaders as well as keeping the media instantly informed. Additionally there were endless immittee and board meetings as well as dinner and nicheon engagements all designed with the purpose seeking sanction approval.

1968 and 1969 quickly became history and among of the other conference business, the OVAC® was

very busy in implementing its Title IX Program for Girls. Such female programs were introduced with the 1970 school year, two years before the federal mandatory date of September 1972. During this time period the conference was also formulating a full scale scholarship program, Partners in Academic and Athletic Programs, re-designing those needed changes in many sport levels and maintaining a sound financial base for all conference operations. Regardless, the NCAA all-star sanction movement was in full swing with constant communication between the NCAA and the OVAC® on target.

Late in 1971, a remarkable turn of events took place as the NCAA informed the OVAC® that they reviewed one of our many proposed all-star formats and found some definite interests in the overall structure. This, then, lead to three continuous months of very intense correspondence and phone conversations. At this juncture it was felt that we were closing in on gaining sanction and the pendulum was swinging toward our future.

Then it happened late February 1972, a registered letter from the NCAA arrived at the conference office officially notifying the OVAC® that the NCAA Review Board for all-star contests had awarded total sanction for a conference all-star game for the summer of 1972. Overwhelmed and overjoyed, the conference held a monumental press meeting at the McClure Hotel in Wheeling announcing all the details relative to the first OVAC® All-Star Football Game. Rudy Mumley was already in the fold as our first director and remained as such for 23 years. In 1986, the game was officially re-named as The Rudy Mumley OVAC® Ohio-West Virginia Charity Football game All-Star Classic.

Tonight's 27th Annual Extravaganza will have produced 1,500 players • 3,200 musicians and directors (since 1982) • 500 cheerleaders • 750 queen candidates • 300 coaches, trainers, doctors, and managers • 225,000 fans and an enormous array of Shriners and volunteers, all major contributors in distributing over \$600,000.00 to local upper Ohio Valley charities.

Much of the largest crowd in the hisy of the Rudy Mumley OVAC All-Star otball Charity Classic finally began fill-3 out of Wheeling Island Stadium with out six minutes left in Sunday night's and annual Ohio-West Virginia scrap.

The much anticipated battle between lly West of Buckeye Local and Curtis :Ghee of Wheeling Central took a back it to Bishop Donahue quarterback Mark ordon, who passed for nearly two hundy yards in the second half.

Who could blame the fans for trying to a head start on the island traffic bottlek? The Mountain States who trailed -14, had just given the ball back to the ckeyes by having too many men on the ld following an Ohio punt.

With a weapon like Buckeye Local's ly West in the Ohio backfield and time irling off the stadium clock, the show s obviously over for a gallant West ginia squad.

In one of the most incredible turnunds in all-star grid annals, the Moun-1 Staters scored three touchdowns in the al 2:53 and stuffed West on a two-point 1 version with less than a minute to go to 1 off a 34-32 shocker.

Determination helped West Virginia d Ohio to minus four yards on three ps following the late penalty to force other punt.

A pass from Donauhue's Mark Gor1 - who took every snap at QB for the's squad - to Weir's Marcus Clausell re West Virginia a first down at the four Ithe second of two sweeps by Wheeling atral's Curtis McGhee cut the lead to 26following Matt DiLorenzo's PAT.

There was just 2:53 showing on the lium clock but the Mountaineers seemed animated on the sidelines as a team sing a one point lead in the waning ments of a state championship game.

DiLorenzo, an all-state soccer player

at Wheeling Park ripped a hard, low roller perfectly toward the right sideline.

An Ohio player stepped just inside the ten-yard buffer zone in an attempt to field the ball but the bounding oval bounced off his helmet as he was crunched by the West Virginia pursuit. When the pile unfolded, West Virginia had the ball.

Shadyside's Chad Wiley on the very snap following the recovery, blew through the line to sack Gordon back at the West Virginia 42.

John Marshall's J. B. Burge steeped in front of the pass at the Ohio 45 and found nothing but green and white stripes between himself and a Mountain State TD.

Burge's six pointer and the DiLorenzo PAT appeared to have put Ohio down for the count with less than a minute to play but, like West Virginia a few minutes carlier, the Buckeyes proved that they too were made of sterner stuff.

After the kick-off, Wellsville's Andy Martin found a seam in the middle of the West Virginia coverage team and broke it all the way for an all-star game record 99yard TD return as the Ohio stands erupted.

With 43 seconds remaining, the Buckeyes now trailed 34-32 and everybody in the stadium knew who was going to get the ball on the two-point conversion try.

West had been held to just 16 yards on six totes after intermission. Ohio lined up in a strong-right information for the critical two-pointer with west taking the toss and rolling toward the right sideline, looking to cut back behind a wall of blockers.

The seam never opened and West had to sprint for the corner where Brooke's Buck Neel was waiting. West tried to power through Neel inside the five but the Bruin star held his ground and tumbled the play out of bounds at the two.

While Ohio compiled a definite statisal edge, it took a break to put the Buckes in the scoring column and gave them !-0 verdict over underdog West Virginia turday night in the valley all-star game, 1yed before some 8,000 fans at Wheel-2 Stadium.

After Ohio coach Dan McGrew's squad d driven within two yards of paydirt, in a fourth quarter before relinquishing the ll on downs, West Virginia attempted to a k out of danger but a high pass from nter sailed away over the head of punter m Connell of Warwood, and bounced to f the end zone for an automatic safety, is score came with only 3:49 left in the counter.

The safety was all that kept the game om ending up as the first in the history of a interstate scuffle, originated back in 40. It also enabled Ohio to claim its first ctory in the series since 1960 and thus to in a 12-9 edge in the series.

Saturday night's affair may not rank as the of the artistic triumphs in the all-star nals but the customers saw two well-inditioned teams give it a hard try as they uded tackles, blocks and mistakes under e Island lights.

Ohio lined up 14 first downs to nine r West Virginia. The Buckeyes gained 3 yards rushing and 116 passing for a net 198, compared to 49 rushing and 49 issing for WV Coach George Strager's larges, whose total offensive net was thus 3 yards.

The winners completed 14 of 26 passes hile West Virginia made good on only 5 id had 3 intercepted. But, as McGrew id after the game, "We just couldn't punch over." Ohio missed a touchdown in the 1st half by three yards and in the second 1 only two while WV's deepest penetration was to the Buckeye 23 early in the ime.

Most Valuable Player awards went to Doug DuBois, Union Local halfback who was a mainstay of the Ohio team on both offense and defense, and Wheeling Central's Jay Duffy, two-way standout for the Mountaineers.

DuBois caught four passes for 48 yards and his two interceptions paved the way for Ohio's two most serious TD bids. He also gained 39 yards in six carries and joined a dandy pair of safeties, Brilliant's Frank Popp and Mt. Pleasant's Jim Thompson, to do some rock 'em, sock 'em work in the Buckeye secondary.

McGrewalso got fine linebacking from Shadyside's John Livorno and Bellaire's Wayne Peters but the youngster who almost stole the show was a fiery middle guard from Powhatan, John Yarbrough, who was all over the field defensively.

Early in the game a halfback pass by Duffy to Central teammate Denny Deegan was good for 23 yards to the Ohio 23 but the half-pint QB from Warwood, Vince DiBias, was collared for a 15-yard loss by Adena's Jack Bernosky, another Buck defensive standout, and WV eventually relinquished the oval on downs at the 29.

On the running of DuBois and Steubenville's Rick Terry, and a 19-yard gain on a pass from Shadyside's Ed Roman to Powhatan's Andy Wiley, Ohio then marched to the WV 35 before Strager's kids stiffened to take the ball away. The Mountaineers came right back to penetrate to the Buck 36 in the second period and then Connell punted to Terry, who caught the ball at the sidelines and stepped out of bounds at the seven.



h another high school football season set to get underway, I thought this might be a good time on the career of the late George Strager.

Ohio Valley's winningest schoolboy football coach, Strager was truly a legend in his own e amassed a total of 246 victories during a career that spanned nearly four decades.

raps, I should point out that there's no telling how many more games Strager's teams would a had the current tiebreaker rules been in effect while he was stalking Ohio Valley sidelines, ing his entire coaching career, if the score was tied at the end of the fourth quarter everybody ne, satisfied or not.

ger's offensive genius was considered ahead of his era and he certainly could have figured f for his teams to win at least half of those stalemated contests in overtime. His overall record 16 wins, 115 losses and 16 ties.


cked Coach Strager as the subject for this column not just because of the success he expericoaching. The love and dedication that he gave the couple of thousand kids he coached afost of their lives in a positive way.

, George was hard to play for and tough as nails on the field. His pre-game and half-time talks 2d with fire, especially when he didn't think his team was performing up to his expectations, as hilariously funny at times around his coaches and players.

ay's younger coaches could have learned a lot about football and how to get the maximum out players had they had the opportunity to learn from this coaching giant.

s past week I asked a couple of long-time Strager friends and associates - Doug Huff, the former Sports Editor of The Intelligencer, a g Central Catholic assistant coach Mike Young - to share some of their reflections on Ol' George.

f spent nearly three decades covering Strager's teams. Young played for Strager at Central. He was also his long-time assistant coa airsville High and he has handled perhaps the toughest task of all when he was asked to succeed the long-time mentor at the Red De



: was like a second father to me in terms of our friendship and the way our families got along. I don't think a lot of people realized the vas a great family man." He and his wife had four kids and two of them were still in junior high when Lounelle passed away in 19% did a wonderful job of raising them almost on his own. All of his children have been successful in their lives as well." Young addefinitely was Strager's football brain that put him ahead of the other coaches during his long career. He was a master-mind of the officie. Young talked about how Strager could look at a team's defense and quickly find a way to attack it and pick it apart. "We were voor the during that time to have had many quality athletes at St. Clairsville," Young also said.

most famous of the Strager proteges, of course, was Tim Spencer, who went on from the Saints to star at Ohio State, play in the Notball League and return to Buckeye Local as an assistant coach. The unfortunate part of Strager's Red Devil days were they came hen the Ohio High School Athletic Association was taking just one or two teams from each region for post-season play. "We had so ms that did not get a chance to play in the post-season," Young said. Three of Strager's undefeated teams Red Devil squads never ma e post-season.

Clairsville did make it twice under Strager, qualifying in 1983 and in 1986. The 1986 squad won two playoff contests and were one st state final when it lost a controversial decision to Chagrin Falls Kenston at the Rubber Bowl in Akron. It was Huff that pointed out strager is probably the only person to have coached three different Ohio Valley teams to undefeated seasons. His 1953 Sisterville Tigi 0-1 and won the state championship with a 27-12 victory over Romney.

963, Strager guided the Maroon Knights to a 10-0-1 season, ending with a 40-6 dismantling of highly-regarded Charleston Catholic a backfield" in the WV Catholic title game. He also had three undefeated teams at St. Clairsville, posting records of 9-0 in 1969, 10-0 in 1985.

tainly, this feat of having unbeaten clubs in four different decades is another unmatched area achievement. "I always considered Geor 1's Coach" because he was so well respected among his peers," Huff said, "mention his name in a conversation with fellow coaches a ays had something positive to say about his coaching philosophy, techniques, etc." Huff also talked about how Strager's teams we un to watch and cover. They never seemed out of a game because of his offense's ability to strike from any place on the field. "Soi re born to do certain jobs. George was born to be a high school football coach. And he was one of the best," Huff added.

ig certainly told it the way it was where our mutual friend was concerned. George had opportunities to go into the college ranks a le turned down a couple of big-time offers as I recall. But his fun and his life was in taking a group of young high school kids and mo into something special.

> Kettlewell, the late successful coach in Wintersville (now Indian Creek High School) regarded Strager as being a good a quarterbal he ever saw. The triggerman at QB was definitely the key in Strager's multiple offense, more as a ball handler than a thrower. If Georgeone who could run his offense with a sleight-of-hand, good things were going to happen for his team that season.

relationship with George was more than just between a journalist and a coach. When he came to coach at Wheeling Central Catholic vas a young writer and both Strager and the late Bob Roe, then the head coach of Wheeling High School, took me under their wing, iger was never known for paying much attention to the defensive side of football, although I'm sure that was exaggerated.

recall one time, however, when I went out to do a "Strager & Son" piece for the newspaper the week of the Red Devil's opener againg High School. On George's staff and his defensive coordinator at the time was his son, "Duke." After talking with the head coach dover to talk to Duke for a few minutes. "How's the defense going," I asked. "I don't know. Dad's spending so much time with the hasn't let me work with the defense yet," Duke said as I could see the twinkle in his eye.



He and his wife Rita live in Wheeling and have six children.


