





Welcome to All

On behalf of the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference it is my privilege to welcome you to the 66th Annual OVAC "Ron Mauck" Wrestling Championships. This year it is with great privilege we dedicate our program to the thousands of workers over the decades that have given their time, dedication and commitment to the success of our great tournament!

Over these next three days of competitions let's not lose sight that one of the missions of interscholastic athletics is to provide opportunities for young people that will enhance their educational experience. We hope our student-athletes are competing because they are having fun but there are lifelong lessons to be learned in athletic participation such as sportsmanship, citizenship, hard work, dedication, leadership and teamwork.

The past 65 years have brought many memorable milestones to OVAC Wrestling. Allow me to mention a few:

During the spring of 1970, we lost a phenomenal wrestler, David Bierkortte, to an untimely accident. Because of his athletic prowess, the Wheeling Central High School Booster's Club initiated the "David Bierkortte Award" for the outstanding wrestler in 1971.


In 1979 Frank Rodriguez the Wheeling Civic Center Manager, had a great deal of respect for those involved with OVAC wrestling, and was instrumental in OVAC wrestling finding a home at WesBanco Arena. Currently we are blessed with Dennis Magruder, who has given us the same positive support, along with the entire WesBanco Arena staff.

In 1980, OVAC wrestling initiated the first "George Kovalick Scholarship". Two years later Bob and Dolores Burke lost their son Danny, a Wheeling Park wrestler, in a tragic accident. Out of their love for him the "Daniel M. Burke Wrestling Scholarship" was initiated in 1983. In 1996 we lost a fantastic wrestling enthusiast from Marshall County affectionately named "Dead Eye". His devoted family established the "James H. Morris Sportsmanship Scholarship" in 1997, out of his love for the mat sport. In 1999, East Liverpool's two-time OVAC Champ and Hercules Award winner, Matt Salsberry, was lost in a tragic auto accident. In 2003, "Friends in Memory of Matt Salsberry" established an annual academic/wrestling scholarship. In 2003, Lucas "Luke" Sedgmer, a two-time OVAC Wrestling Champion from Cadiz High School tragically lost his life in an auto accident. In 2005, a committee in his community established The Lucas D. Sedgmer Memorial Scholarship. Currently \$5000.00 annually is awarded to five (5) deserving wrestlers to continue their educations. These five (5) permanently installed scholarship funds over the years have afforded deserving OVAC wrestlers over \$132,000 in college scholarships.

Without the efforts and dedication of the workers, coaches, officials and wrestlers, the tournament would not be the outstanding event it is! These are the people who make the OVAC "Ron Mauck" Wrestling Tournament the best in the nation. A special "Thank You" to all these individuals!

So let's make our focus -- win or lose -- to recognize and applaud the commitment, dedication and determination of the wrestlers competing this weekend. I wish everyone the best of luck and let's extend a special welcome to the Wheeling Central wrestlers and their coaches on their return to the OVAC "Ron Mauck" Wrestling Championships!

THE RON MAUCK OVAC WRESTLING CHAMPIONSHIPS "His Story"

Educator, coach, administrator, and community leader – Ron Mauck has been the tournament director of the OVAC Wrestling Championships since 1979. Due to his total devotion to the event, it was renamed the Ron Mauck OVAC Wrestling Championships in 2006.

A protégé of the late, legendary George Kovalick, Ron Mauck also established conference's dual meet championship standings in 1971 and directed five WV State Tournaments at theWheeling Civic Center (now WesBanco Arena). On three separate occasions, he served as a volunteer onthe staff for NAIA and NCAA Division II championships (hosted by West Liberty State College) held in Wheeling.

In addition to his mat sport duties for the conference, Mauck was a long-time member of the Rudy Mumley OVAC All-Star Football Classic. He was assistant game director and later served as game director from 1993 through 1998.

A Bridgeport High School and West Liberty State College (WLSC), who earned his master's in safety education, Ron Mauck began his teaching and coaching career in 1965 at Follansbee High School where he started the school's varsity wrestling program and coached the school's only individual state champion (Lou Daly). While at Follansbee, Mauck coached John Craig, a first-time wrestler as a senior in 1965, who later became an AllAmerican at WLSC and developed into one of the most successful mat mentors in the Ohio Valley.

When the consolidated Brooke High School opened in 1968, Ron Mauck was named to coach the wrestling team where he tutored the Bruin's first WV Wrestling State Champion – Jim Suddoth. Before retiring after a 34-year career in education, Mauck served as Brooke's Director of Driver Education Department. He also served as the school's Physical Plant Director, Assistant Athletic Director and Athletic Director. In fact, he was named the WV Athletic Director of the Year (1995) and was a past president of the WV Safety Association. He also served as the president of the Bridgeport High School Alumni Association. Promoting education in Ohio County, Mauck later served as president of the Warwood Junior High School Athletic Association.

Over the years, Ron Mauck received many, many accolades. In 1986, he received the prestigious OVAC Mr. Mat Award. He was also named the WV Wrestling Coaches Man of the Year in 1987 and Wrestling USA

Magazine's WV State Man of the Year in 2013. Mauck also received recognition awards from the Upper Ohio Valley Dapper Dan Club (1985 and 1997). He was twice named the Warwood Lions' Club Citizen of the Year, winner of the H.V. Corcoran, Sr. Award (2001) and was inducted into the Brooke County Wall of Fame (2006).

The OVAC Conference cannot thank Mr. Ron Mauck enough for his decades of dedication to the athletes and students of the Ohio Valley.

Now you know Ron Mauck's story – a humble man who has lived a "life of service" to his community, family, and God.

Any one, who has never been involved in setting up a wrestling tournament of any size, would have no idea how much time it takes these people to prepare for such wrestling extravaganzas to promote Ohio Valley wrestling.

Every wrestler competing Ron Mauck OVAC Wrestling Tournament, their parents and fans, should realize and remember to thank the adults and student athletes who make the tournament run so smoothly.


DANIEL M. BURKE MEMORIAL WRESTLING SCHOLARSHIP





An inattentive and irresponsible teenage driver, in a moment of senseless exhilaration took the lives of all three and brought emotional devastation to the families, school and community of a magnitude which can only be described as traumatizing and from which we are still laboring to recover.

Matt Salsberry had a lust for life that dictated success. The commitment and enthusiasm which he brought to the wrestling mat, the playing field, the stage and classroom, motivated and inspired teammates, classmates and fans. He was a humble winner and a gracious loser, who gained the respect of all who came to know him.

If any single incident defined his commitment and enthusiasm for whatever the project might be, surely it had to be his humorous show stealing portrayal of "Earthquake" McGoon in the school musical "Lil Abner".


Matt was a two-time OVAC champion and winner of the "Mr. Hercules Award" in '99, by pinning his way to the 215# championship in a cumulative time of less than a single match. He was 4th in the State of Ohio while compiling 124 wins. He was All-State in football for three years and started in 32 consecutive games. He earned 11 varsity letters, was River Valley League discus champion, served as Junior Class President and Senior Class Vice President, while maintaining a 3.5 GPA as a member of National Honors Society.

Lucas "Luke" Sedgmer, the son of Kay Keyser-Sedgmer and William Sedgmer, was a 1999 graduate of Cadiz High School, where he excelled in wrestling as a two-time OVAC Champion and a three-time 3rd place finisher in the Ohio State Division III Wrestling Tournament.


The criteria for selection as a recipient are the qualities exhibited by Luke during his brief, but dynamic existence. They are academic achievement, athletic accomplishments and character.

DAVID BIERKORTTE AWARD



APRIL 8, 1923 – APRIL 8, 1984 "FOUNDING FATHER OF OVAC WRESTLING"

Teacher exceptional...competitive coach...gracious mentor...visionary, endowed with boundless energy and enthusiasm.

His accomplishments are legendary...his influence unparalleled.

A man whose profound influence on coaches and athletes is a legacy which will continue to have an impact on generations yet to come.

Standing as tangible proof of all that he epitomized is his enshrinement in four separate and distinct Athletic Halls of Fame; Kent State University, West Liberty State College, Ohio Wrestling Coaches Association and Ohio High School Athletic Directors Association.

In 1980, a scholarship was established to honor Coach Kovalick by the OVAC Wrestling Coaches Association. It is presented annually to a college-bound scholar/wrestler.

During opening ceremonies of the 1985 OVAC Wrestling Tournament, a bronze plaque was unveiled and now hangs in the lobby of the WesBanco Arena, inscribed in fitting tribute it reads;

"The Ohio Valley Wrestling Coaches Association honors the memory of George Kovalick...a man marvelously competitive, meticulous in organization and endowed with an enormous capacity for work. He produced an unparalleled record, with more championship teams in more sports than any other man who ever coached in this valley. He was responsible for tremendous progress in the development and expansion of our wrestling program. Teacher, strategist and fundamentalist, he was an inspiration and a friend."







BILL WELKER TO HAVE OVAC WRESTLERS OF THE YEAR AWARD NAMED IN HIS HONOR

By proclamation of OVAC Executive Board, Dr. Bill Welker learned that the OVAC Wrestlers of the Year Award will now be named in his honor.

Welker has been writing about the sport of wrestling since 1974. He was the *Mat Talk* columnist in the Times-Leader and News-Register from 1978 until 2010, where he wrote over 600 articles.

During that tenure, Welker awarded "Mat Talk" All-State certificates to all OVAC Ohio and West Virginia wrestlers who placed in their respective state tournaments.

Welker initiated the OVAC Wrestlers of the Year Award in 1988. His selection committee consists of Ron Mauck, Dr. Dan Doyle, legendary John Marshall coach, Bill Hinegardner, and wrestling afficionado, Dick Wolf.

Over the years, Welker received numerous writing awards. He was selected an unprecedented seven times as the "West Virginia Wrestling Sportswriter of the Year." Wrestling USA Magazine named him the "National Wrestling Sportswriter of the Year" in 1987 and in 2013, with his son Rick, where Welker is also contributing editor for the national periodical.

He is the editor and chapter author of two editions of *The Wrestling Drill Book*, published by Human Kinetics Publishers, which has sold over 30,500 copies nationwide.

Most recently, Welker published his memoirs, *The Sparrow's Spirit*, which was declared the winner in the sports category by the Beverly Hills Book Awards in 1917.

Welker is now in the midst of writing his first wrestling novel, A Wrestler's Curse, which will hit the bookstores in early 2020.

LIFETIME SERICE TO WRESTLING

A 1978 Red Rider graduate of Weir High School in Weirton. Ray Pernell compiled an outstanding career on the wrestling mat. Under the tutelage of Charles "Skip" Murray, Mike Mousadis and Bob Orlando, Ray completed his career at 43-3. In 1977 and 1978, he earned Class AAA WV State Championship Titles, Class AAA WV Regional Titles and OVAC Wrestling Championships at 138 pounds and 145 pounds.

During the 1978 state tournament, no opponent scored any points against Ray. He also recorded the fastest pin (:14 seconds) in the history of the state wrestling tournament.

Ray was selected to attend the 1978 Olympic Training Camp for the 1980 and 1984 USA Olympic Team. He took first place at the AAU Freestyle Championship and qualify for the National AAU Tournament in Chicago for Freestyle and Grece Roman. In addition to winning the Pittsburgh, PA Newsboy Classic for the WVV All-Stars, Ray Traveled to West Germany with the All-Star Team for Freestyle and Greco Roman.

Ray was offered six wrestling scholarships. Due to personal reasons, he chose to begin his professional occupation with the International Operating Engineers. In 1981, he married his high-school sweetheart, Debbie, and in that same year began his 32 years of coaching in wrestling, as well as football and baseball. He also volunteered countless hours to the Weirton Pee-Wee Football program and the Termite Baseball Association. During his last 3 years as head wrestling coach at Madonna, Ray was instrumental in the development of elementary school wrestling program, where his team volunteered their time after practice to introduce the sport of wrestling to the young in the community.

During his years as head wrestling coach, Ray produced the first three-time state champion in Madonna High School's history. He coached 4 additional state champions, 63 state qualifiers, 15 regional champions, 37 state place winners, three OAC champs, 4 OVAC runners-up, and 35 OVC place winners, including 22 at Madonna and 13 at Weir High School. In 1986, he led his team to 11-1 OVAC Dual Meet Championship and in 2016 his team placed fourth in the OVAC tournament, which is the highest finish in the school's history.

Ray and Debbie still reside in Weirton and are the proud parents of two children: Jamie and Dustin, In addition to their grandson, Aaron, they are looking forward to maintaining the title of grandparents in 2019, with the arrival of two grandchildren.

LIFETIME SERVICE TO WRESTLING

Gary Porter started his wrestling career at the early age of five years old. Gary was a graduate of Parkersburg South High School in 1985. While wrestling for the legendary Coach Rod Oldham, he was the West Virginia State Champion at the 119-pound weight class his senior year, and a member of three West Virginia State Championship Teams.

After graduation from West Liberty University, Gary became the coach of the Junior Patriot Wrestling Club from 1993 to 2012, and an assistant coach at Blennerhassett Middle School from 1999-2002 with brother Steve Porter. From 2004 to 2013, he became the assistant coach at Parkersburg South High School under both Paul Jackson and Tim McCartney. During this time, PSHS Wrestling Team won five state championships, and were two-time runners-up. In 2013, Gary was awarded the National Wrestling Association Assistant Coach of the Year for West Virginia.

Gary and his wife, Tammy, live in Washington, West Virginia. They are the proud parents of Dr. Chad Porter, four-time Division I wrestling qualifier for Liberty University, and daughter Katelyn Rogers (Chris), four-year starter for the Glenville State Softball Team.

RAY MARLING



A 1972 graduate of John Marshall High School, Ray Marling wrestled for hall-of-fame coaches Bill Hinegardner and Ed Dugas from 1970-72. Throughout the years, Marling has credited these two gentlemen for nurturing his love for wrestling.

In 1982 with the blessing of Coach Hinegardner and the guidance of Coach West, Ray, his high school best friend and teammate Rick Kittle and other former JM wrestlers started a middle school wrestling program in Marshall County. A self-supporting venture, it was there that Ray got his initiation into officiating."

As a member of the Ohio Valley Wrestling Officials Association (OVWOA), Marling started officiating in 1985. He took on a leadership role of the Association in 1988 as the board secretary, a position he held for 14 years. He also served as its Vice President for the last 5 years and was instrumental in starting an official's scholarship for an area wrestler every year.

During those years, Marling served on the Ohio High School East District Association Appeal & Review Board, as well as the Assignor for Sectionals and District Tournaments for 12 years. He retired from officiating in March of 2017.

As an arbiter of the mats for over 30 years, Marling worked 28 West Virginia State Tournaments, 30 OVAC Tournaments, 14 West Virginia AAA Regional Tournaments, 15 WV A/AA Regional Tournaments, 19 Ohio Division II & III District Tournaments, and 15 Ohio Division II & III Sectional Tournaments. In fact, he is one of only two wrestling officials to be invited to referee the West Virginia State Championships in his first year of eligibility.

Over the years, Marling has received numerous accolades for his mat officiating mechanics. In 1994, he was selected as the West Virginia Wrestling Official of the Year. Marling was also named the 1998 Ohio Wrestling Official of the Year. But most rewarding to Ray Marling is being selected three times as the Larry Deaton Official of the Year (1996-1998-2005) by the OVAC wrestling coaches. In fact, he was not only the first recipient of the award, but the only Valley official to be selected three times.

A retired underground coalminer for CONSOL ENERGY, Ray and his lovely wife Jackie reside in Bridgeport, Ohio. They have four children – Jack, Jason, Heather and Rob – and are now enjoying their five grandchildren: Drew, Derion, Zane, Maddie and Tori.

A former high school wrestler, Kim North has been covering scholastic and college wrestling since 1983 in the upper Ohio Valley for numerous papers: Weirton (WV) Daily News, Steubenville (Ohio) Herald-Star, Wheeling (WV) News-Register, and Martins Ferry (Ohio) Times-Leader.

North is also a professional photographer and has been praised for his superb action shots at dual meets and tournaments over the years.

He has covered the prestigious Ron Mauck Ohio Valley Athletic Conference Wrestling Tournament for 20+ years. It is the biggest conference mat sport competition in the country.

In 1985, North covered the Ron Mauck OVAC Tournament, the West Virginia state tournament and the NAIA National Tournament, all of which were held inside the Wheeling WesBanco Arena.

He has also covered various West Virginia state tournaments and Ohio state tournaments. Last year, North covered the Ohio Team Duals in Columbus and has covered various sectional and district tournaments in the Buckeye State, as well as sectional and regional events in the Mountain State.

As a sports columnist, Kim North spotlighted many area wrestlers and schools with story lines that have promoted wrestling throughout the entire Ohio Valley for decades. In recent years, North has been instrumental in publishing a special wrestling preview issue featuring over 30 area wrestling teams for the Martins Ferry Time-Leader.

For his efforts highlighting wrestling in the Mountain State, Kim North was named twice as the "Snyder-Miller West Virginia Media Person of the Year" in 1990 and 2017. This distinguished award is especially gratifying to Kim North who stated:



North also promotes wrestling as a regular on a weekly area wrestling radio show, spotlighting local wrestlers' successes on the mats.

In his first high school match, he suffered a broken left arm, which was not all that bad because it led to Kim North's extended and award-winning career in journalism.

A 1977 graduate of Troy High School in Troy, Ohio, North also received his Bachelor of Science in Physical Education at Salem College, West Virginia. Kim North is a widowed father of three: daughter, Meika; and sons Skyler and Tyler. He has five grand-daughters: MaeLynn, Sydney, Lyndsay, Aria and Kaia. He resides in Bridgeport, Ohio.

As a sophomore at Canton McKinley High School, Ken Robison had a tremendous desire to compete athletically. His opportunity came when saw a sign on the library door that read: "WRESTLING SIGN-UPS AFTER SCHOOL."

He knew had arrived at the Hiram College Invitational. Hitting a reverse switch, he defeated a senior wrestler who had beaten him in his first high

school wrestling match. He went on to win the tournament with a standing switch in overtime against another senior wrestler.

He qualified for the Ohio State Championships both his junior and senior years. The highlight of his wrestling career was 16 straight pins in the first period as a senior and had an unblemished record of 26-0 during the regular season. Ken Robison's most memorable victory was a 9 to 0 over a two-time OVAC champion at the state tournament.

Ken's coaching career in 1970 when he joined the coaching staff with the small-school powerhouse – Warwood High School. He learned much about coaching under the tutelage of legendary Coach Dick Edge.

In 1980, he was asked to start a pee-wee wrestling program at Woodsfield, and was instrumental in initiating the first wrestling program at Woodsfield High School. Ken became the head coach of Woodsfield High School in 2004.

Ken and his wife, Maryrose, have three sons: Dino, Paul, and Dustin. Dino did not have the opportunity to wrestle since Woodsfield did not have a wrestling program at the time. But Paul and Dustin had the privilege to wrestle for their dad.

IN MEMORY OF DARRELL DAVIS

Barnesville High School



Coach Darrell Davis graduated from Dover High School in 1968 where he excelled in track, wrestling and football. His senior season in football the Dover Tornadoes went undefeated with Darrell starting at tackle. He matriculated to Dakota State College in Madison, SD. He was a 4-year starter at offensive tackle and his team won the Boot Hill Bowl in 1971.

He graduated in 1972 with a degree in education. In August of that year he accepted a position at Barnesville High School where he taught and coached for 35 years retiring in June of 2008.

Darrell enjoyed tremendous success as Barnesville High School girls' track coach and the offensive line coach of the football program. He served two separate stints as assistant wrestling coach and 9 years as head coach of the Shamrocks.

As a mat mentor, Davis coached no less than 42 OVAC place winners including 9 champions. He also produced 53 district place winners, 20 district champs, 13 state place winners, and two state titlists. His teams were OVAC division champions or runners-up in 6 of his 9 seasons as head coach.

The pinnacle of his coaching career came during the 1984 and 1985 wrestling seasons. Coach Davis' 1984 team won the Ohio AA State Title and he was named the Ohio State AA Coach of the Year. In 1985 his Shamrock team won the "overall" title at the Ron Mauck OVAC Wrestling Tournament. He was also honored that same year by the Upper Ohio Valley Dapper Dan Club for his coaching achievements in wrestling and track.

Three of Darrell's wrestlers went on to excel at the college level. Alan Logan_(current head football coach at Muskingum University) placed 6th at the NCAA Division 3 National Wrestling Tournament. Don Moxley went on to wrestle at Ohio State University and won the Big 10 heavyweight championship his senior season.

Tim Moxley, two-time State Wrestling Champion, went on to play football at Ohio State where he was a starting offensive tackle for 3 years, including 2 Bowl teams.

Darrell Davis was also the tournament director for the Barnesville Invitational Tournament and the Eastern District - Sectional Tournament for 25 years.

His family includes: son Bryce, daughter in-law Angie, grandchildren: Brooke and Kirkland of Cambridge. Daughter Ammie, son in-law Darrin and grandson Jacob live in Barnesville.

For his contributions to Ohio Valley Wrestling and its student-athletes, the 2014 Mr. Mat, Coach Darrell Davis, will be deeply missed.


