





Welcome!

On behalf of the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference it is my privilege to welcome you to the 67th Annual OVAC "Ron Mauck" Wrestling Championships. This year it is with great privilege we dedicate our program to Bob Koch and Jim Rogers who over several decades have given their time, dedication and commitment to the success of our great tournament!

Over these next three days of competitions let's not lose sight that one of the missions of interscholastic athletics is to provide opportunities for young people that enhance their educational experience. We hope our student-athletes are competing because they are having fun but there are lifelong lessons to be learned in athletic participation such as sportsmanship, citizenship, hard work, dedication, leadership and teamwork.

The past 66 years have brought many memorable milestones to OVAC Wrestling. Allow me to mention a few:

During the spring of 1970, we lost a phenomenal wrestler, David Bierkortte, to an untimely accident. Because of his athletic prowess, the Wheeling Central High School Booster's Club initiated the "David Bierkortte Award" for the outstanding wrestler in 1971.

In 1979 Frank Rodriguez the Wheeling Civic Center Manager, had a great deal of respect for those involved with OVAC wrestling, and was instrumental in OVAC wrestling finding a home at WesBanco Arena. Currently we are blessed with Dennis Magruder, who has given us the same positive support, along with the entire WesBanco Arena staff.


In 1980, OVAC wrestling initiated the first "George Kovalick Scholarship". Two years later Bob and Dolores Burke lost their son Danny, a Wheeling Park wrestler, in a tragic accident. Out of their love for him the "Daniel M. Burke Wrestling Scholarship" was initiated in 1983. In 1996 we lost a fantastic wrestling enthusiast from Marshall County affectionately named "Dead Eye". His devoted family established the "James H. Morris Sportsmanship Scholarship" in 1997, out of his love for the mat sport. In 1999, East Liverpool's two-time OVAC Champ and Hercules Award winner, Matt Salsberry, was lost in a tragic auto accident. In 2003, "Friends in Memory of Matt Salsberry" established an annual academic/wrestling scholarship. In 2003, Lucas "Luke" Sedgmer, a two-time OVAC Wrestling Champion from Cadiz High School tragically lost his life in an auto accident. In 2005, a committee in his community established The Lucas D. Sedgmer Memorial Scholarship. Currently \$5000.00 annually is awarded to five (5) deserving wrestlers to continue their educations. These five (5) permanently installed scholarship funds over the years have afforded deserving OVAC wrestlers over \$142,000 in college scholarships.

Let's welcome to this year's tournament the "Tornadoes" from Dover High School, the "Quakers" from New Philadelphia High School, the "Warriors" from Warren High School and the new start up program, the "Hornets" from Hundred High School. These four schools will undoubtedly increase the competition on the mats!

Without the efforts and dedication of the workers, coaches, officials and wrestlers, the tournament would not be the outstanding event it is! These are the people who make the OVAC "Ron Mauck" Wrestling Tournament the best in the nation. A special "Thank You" to all these individuals!

So let's make our focus – win or lose –to recognize and applaud the commitment, dedication and determination of the wrestlers competing this weekend. I wish everyone the best of luck in this year's championships.

THE RON MAUCK OVAC WRESTLING CHAMPIONSHIPS "His Story"

Educator, coach, administrator, and community leader – Ron Mauck has been the tournament director of the OVAC Wrestling Championships since 1979. Due to his total devotion to the event, it was renamed the Ron Mauck OVAC Wrestling Championships in 2006.

A protégé of the late, legendary George Kovalick, Ron Mauck also established conference's dual meet championship standings in 1971 and directed five WV State Tournaments at theWheeling Civic Center (now WesBanco Arena). On three separate occasions, he served as a volunteer onthe staff for NAIA and NCAA Division II championships (hosted by West Liberty State College) held in Wheeling.

In addition to his mat sport duties for the conference, Mauck was a long-time member of the Rudy Mumley OVAC All-Star Football Classic. He was assistant game director and later served as game director from 1993 through 1998.

A Bridgeport High School and West Liberty State College (WLSC), who earned his master's in safety education, Ron Mauck began his teaching and coaching career in 1965 at Follansbee High School where he started the school's varsity wrestling program and coached the school's only individual state champion (Lou Daly). While at Follansbee, Mauck coached John Craig, a first-time wrestler as a senior in 1965, who later became an AllAmerican at WLSC and developed into one of the most successful mat mentors in the Ohio Valley.

When the consolidated Brooke High School opened in 1968, Ron Mauck was named to coach the wrestling team where he tutored the Bruin's first WV Wrestling State Champion – Jim Suddoth. Before retiring after a 34-year career in education, Mauck served as Brooke's Director of Driver Education Department. He also served as the school's Physical Plant Director, Assistant Athletic Director and Athletic Director. In fact, he was named the WV Athletic Director of the Year (1995) and was a past president of the WV Safety Association. He also served as the president of the Bridgeport High School Alumni Association. Promoting education in Ohio County, Mauck later served as president of the Warwood Junior High School Athletic Association.

Over the years, Ron Mauck received many, many accolades. In 1986, he received the prestigious OVAC Mr. Mat Award. He was also named the WV Wrestling Coaches Man of the Year in 1987 and Wrestling USA Magazine's WV State Man of the Year in 2013. Mauck also received recognition awards from the Upper Ohio

Valley Dapper Dan Club (1985 and 1997). He was twice named the Warwood Lions' Club Citizen of the Year, winner of the H.V. Corcoran, Sr. Award (2001) and was inducted into the Brooke County Wall of Fame (2006).

The OVAC Conference cannot thank Mr. Ron Mauck enough for his decades of dedication to the athletes and students of the Ohio Valley.

Now you know Ron Mauck's story – a humble man who has lived a "life of service" to his community, family, and God.

A TRIBUTE TO JIM ROGERS AND BOB KOCH

On the cover of this year's program are two gentlemen who have been involved with this tournament for a combined sixty-six years. The past eight years, they have worked the bullpen area, a largely unseen — but vital - part of the tournament. The wrestlers report here, warm-up and are paired-up before they go onto the mats to wrestle.

<u>Jim Rogers</u> has been involved with wrestling his entire life. He graduated from Fairmont Senior High School in 1965 having wrestled for the Polar Bears in the heavyweight division. He attended Fairmont State University and graduated in 1969.

Jim worked in private industry until 1983 when he began teaching at Cameron High School. He soon became the Junior High wrestling coach, a position he held for seven years. He was very successful, producing many excellent wrestlers for a strong Cameron High varsity wrestling program. During this time, he was a recipient of the OVAC Junior High Wrestling Coach of the Year award. He then became an assistant varsity wrestling coach at Cameron for three years.

After being named the head football coach at Cameron, Jim gave up his wrestling coaching duties and started working with the OVAC Ron Mauck Wrestling Tournament. He has been associated with this tournament for the past twenty-five years. Jim started out helping with the team scores, which at that time were kept with paper and pencil. The past eight years he has worked in the bullpen, one of the many unseen, but vital aspects of this tournament. He was a recipient of the Director's Award in 2015.

Bob Koch has been coming to this tournament for forty-one years. He started as a spectator, then served as an assistant wrestling coach for three years at Cameron High School. When he became Athletic Director at Cameron High School, he started helping with the team scores working with Nolan Van Guilder of Brooke High School. He continued in that capacity until the tournament went to computerized scoring. The past eight years he has worked in the bull-pen area. He has received the Director's Award on two occasions. Once when Ron Mauck was the Director, and most recently, while Dan Doyle has been the Director. Bob is also a member of the OVAC Hall of Fame having served on the OVAC Executive Board and several committees for many years and was the Game Director for the Rudy Mumley All-Star Football Game for nineteen years.

The OVAC Ron Mauck Wrestling Tournament is pleased to be able to honor these two gentlemen for all their work over the years by placing them on the cover of this year's program.


DANIEL M. BURKE MEMORIAL WRESTLING SCHOLARSHIP

The qualifying criteria require that the recipient be a senior with outstanding records in both wrestling and academic performance. The original award was in the amount of \$1,000. However in 2006, was increased to \$2,500 and is to be applied to college expenses. As each recipient is added to the list, it reads like a veritable "Who's Who Among Outstanding Young Men in the Upper Ohio Valley". It is our fond hope that the accomplishments of each successive recipient serves to honor and perpetuate Danny's memory in a manner fulfilling the wishes of his parents.



Within minutes after leaving for home from Ohio Northern University, where they had all just undergone freshman orientation, Matt Salsberry, his girlfriend, Emily Bickerton, and his best friend, Dan Aldrich, fell victim to tragedy. An inattentive and irresponsible teenage driver, in a moment of senseless exhilaration took the lives of all three and brought emotional devastation to the families, school and community of a magnitude which can only be described as traumatizing and from which we are still laboring to recover.

Matt Salsberry had a lust for life that dictated success. The commitment and enthusiasm which he brought to the wrestling mat, the playing field, the stage and classroom, motivated and inspired teammates, classmates and fans. He was a humble winner and a gracious loser, who gained the respect of all who came to know him.

If any single incident defined his commitment and enthusiasm for whatever the project might be, surely it had to be his humorous show stealing portrayal of "Earthquake" McGoon in the school musical "Lil Abner".

Matt was a two-time OVAC champion and winner of the "Mr. Hercules Award" in '99, by pinning his way to the 215# championship in a cumulative time of less than a single match. He was 4th in the State of Ohio while compiling 124 wins. He was All-State in football for three years and started in 32 consecutive games. He earned 11 varsity letters, was River Valley League discus champion, served as Junior Class President and Senior Class Vice President, while maintaining a 3.5 GPA as a member of National Honors Society.

"Friends in Memory of Matts Salsberry," having a desire to perpetuate the positive impact of his young life, have deemed it a fitting and proper tribute to establish a \$1,000 scholarship to be annually awarded to an OVAC wrestler who earned a varsity letter in one additional sport while likewise maintaining a 3.5 GPA.

He was a member of New Athens Volunteer Fire Department and attended the United Methodist Church in New Athens.

A committee was established to provide two scholarships to perpetuate and honor Luke's memory. One scholarship is presented to a graduate of Harrison Central High School and the other to an OVAC member school wrestler.

The criteria for selection as a recipient are the qualities exhibited by Luke during his brief, but dynamic existence. They are academic achievement, athletic accomplishments and character.

Luke was greatly admired, widely respected and dearly loved by all who came to know him. It is our fond hope that by honoring him in this fashion, we will not only be perpetuating his memory, but moreover, aiding others in pursuit of their dreams.



DAVID BIERKORTTE AWARD



APRIL 8, 1923 – APRIL 8, 1984 "FOUNDING FATHER OF OVAC WRESTLING"

Teacher exceptional...competitive coach...gracious mentor...visionary, endowed with boundless energy and enthusiasm.

His accomplishments are legendary...his influence unparalleled.

A man whose profound influence on coaches and athletes is a legacy which will continue to have an impact on generations yet to come.

Standing as tangible proof of all that he epitomized is his enshrinement in four separate and distinct Athletic Halls of Fame; Kent State University, West Liberty State College, Ohio Wrestling Coaches Association and Ohio High School Athletic Directors Association.

In 1980, a scholarship was established to honor Coach Kovalick by the OVAC Wrestling Coaches Association. It is presented annually to a college-bound scholar/wrestler.

During opening ceremonies of the 1985 OVAC Wrestling Tournament, a bronze plaque was unveiled and now hangs in the lobby of the WesBanco Arena, inscribed in fitting tribute it reads;

"The Ohio Valley Wrestling Coaches Association honors the memory of George Kovalick...a man marvelously competitive, meticulous in organization and endowed with an enormous capacity for work. He produced an unparalleled record, with more championship teams in more sports than any other man who ever coached in this valley. He was responsible for tremendous progress in the development and expansion of our wrestling program. Teacher, strategist and fundamentalist, he was an inspiration and a friend."



"Lifetime Service to Wrestling"

JERRY "WOODY" BURNS was a 1976 graduate of Parkersburg South High School. He began his wrestling career at the age of 6 with South Parkersburg PeeWee Team. He was a member of the first Parkersburg South High School State Championship Team in 1975 where he finished 5th in 1976 as a senior, Woody finished State Runner-up wrestling under the legendary Coach Rod Oldham.

After high school graduation, he coaches the Mineral Wells PeeWee program from 1977-1980. He was a referee for 30 years, referring many Regional Tournaments and worked the West Virginia State Wrestling Tournament for 13 years. In 2003, he received the Outstanding Referee Award of the year. Woody was the President of the Ohio-West Virginia Wrestling Board for 5 years and was the Rule Interpreter for 5 years.

After 39 years of service, he has retired from the IBEW. Woody and his wife Carol reside in Elizabeth, WV. He was a daughter Tessa (Chad) Walters.

He assisted hall-of-famer Coach Edward Evans (2010) in wrestling for nine years and also served as assistant football coach for six years.


In 1996, Coach Monteleone took over the helm of Park's wrestling program for one year. RICHARD A. WELKER has been involved in wrestling for nearly four decades as a wrestler, coach, official, writer and radio broadcaster in the Upper Ohio Valley.

An OVAC freshman tournament champion, Welker was a varsity member of the 1990 Ron Mauck OVAC Championship Team at Wheeling Park High School.

Welker coached wrestling at Triadelphia Middle School for four years, where his teams posted a 72-4 dual meet record, won four PAC-8 Championships. He was names as the 2010 OVAC Middle Coach of the Year.

He is also an accomplished scholastic wrestling official who has arbitrated numerous OVAC and West Virginia Regional Tournament Championships. Rick is a past President of the Wheeling Youth League and the Wheeling Wrestling Club. He is also the co-founder of the WV Youth Wrestling League. Currently, Rick Welker is a committee member of the West Virginia State Freestyle Wrestling Association. He continued to lead a traditionally strong program at John Marshall leading his team to 2 OVAC Dual Meet Championships. His final season saw the Monarch's finish 5th in the state tournament with Anthony Carman becoming a state champ and also being names as co-outstanding wrestler. Anthony also became an All-American with his 3th place finish at the High School Nationals at Virginia Beach.


Two of Coach Zervos's



"Life Time Service Award"

JOHN CRAIG wrestled at West Liberty State College for three years, finishing as a 1972 NAIA National Tournament All-American Runner-Up, winning three championships and being named conference most valuable wrestler twice. He was named to the West Liberty Athletic Hall of Fame in 1992. Craig then served as a head coach at four different high schools, with stints at Hillsboro High School (1972-1974), Oregon Clay High School (1974-1975), Steubenville High School (1975-1993) and Indian Creek High School (1993-1998). Craig guided 42 tournament championship teams, nine district championship teams, six conference championship teams and seven division winners. He mentored five individual Ohio State champions, 87 state tournament qualifiers, 23 state tournament placers and 31 individual conference champions. A five-time conference coach of the year and 1989 Ohio Division II Wrestling Coach of the Year. Craig was named to the Ohio Wrestling Coaches Hall of Fame in 1999. John was named OVAC Wrestling Coach of the Year on five occasions and was presented the Prestigious "Mr. Mat Award" in 2002 from the OVAC. In addition to coaching Craig spent 21 years as wrestling official at the youth, junior high school, high school, open and collegiate levels. John was one of the founders of the Buckeye 8 Athletic Conference.
