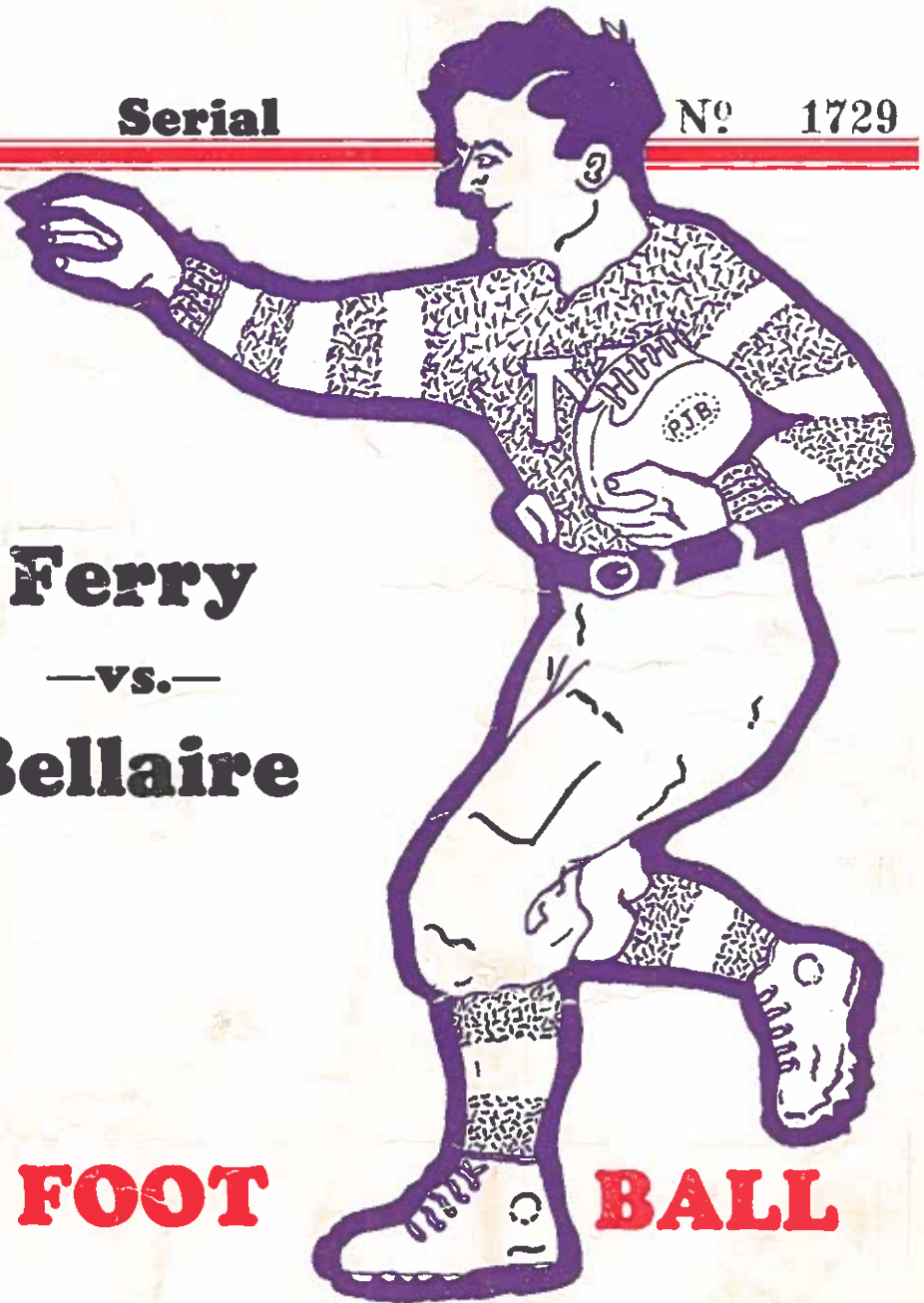

A QUARTER OF A CENTURY

For nearly a quarter of a century, Ferry and Bellaire have met in friendly competition on the gridiron. While our records go back only as far as 1910, we know they met several times before, as Ferry was first represented on the gridiron by an organized and coached team in 1902. "Doc" Johns was the first coach.

Competition at regular intervals is noted with the exception of one year, 1915, in which no game was scheduled.

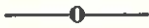
The margin of victory now stands in favor of Bellaire, but it is notable that there are very few lop-sided scores and also several ties.

Bellaire comes to Ferry today with an excellent array of football talent, so you can expect to see a high type of fighting, skillful football.

Changes in Football Rules for 1928

PROTECTED BACKWARD PASSES

Rules governing incompleting backward passes have been modified so that only those passes which have been thrown approximately two yards or more through the air before striking the ground are now dead at the point of recovery. Such passes are defined as "Protected Backward Passes." On a Protected backward pass, if the ball strikes the ground, it is a free ball but is dead at the point of recovery.

FUMBLED PUNTS

There is no longer any distinction between a muffed punt and a fumble. On a fumbled punt, the kicking side may recover the ball but may not advance it beyond the point of recovery. The receiving side may recover and advance the ball.

INTERFERENCE

On forward pass plays, no interference is permitted whatsoever by players of the passer's side who have crossed the line of scrimmage. Heretofore, the words after the pass has been made" have been confusing.

- Two Consecutive incomplete forward passes—
Five Yards
- Running into Kicker—Five Yards
- Unfair play—Five Yards
- Holding—15 Yards
- Interfering with player—15 Yards
- Interfering with fair catch—15 Yards
- Pushing—15 Yards
- Roughing a kicker—15 Yards
- Piling on after ball is dead—15 Yards
- Hurdling—15 Yards
- Tripping—15 Yards front spot of foul
- Unsportsmanlike conduct—15 Yards
- Coaching from sidelines—15 Yards
- Going on field without permission—15 Yards
- Substitute talking—15 Yards
- Clipping—25 Yards
- Removal from Game for unsportsmanlike conduct—One
Half Distance to Goal.
