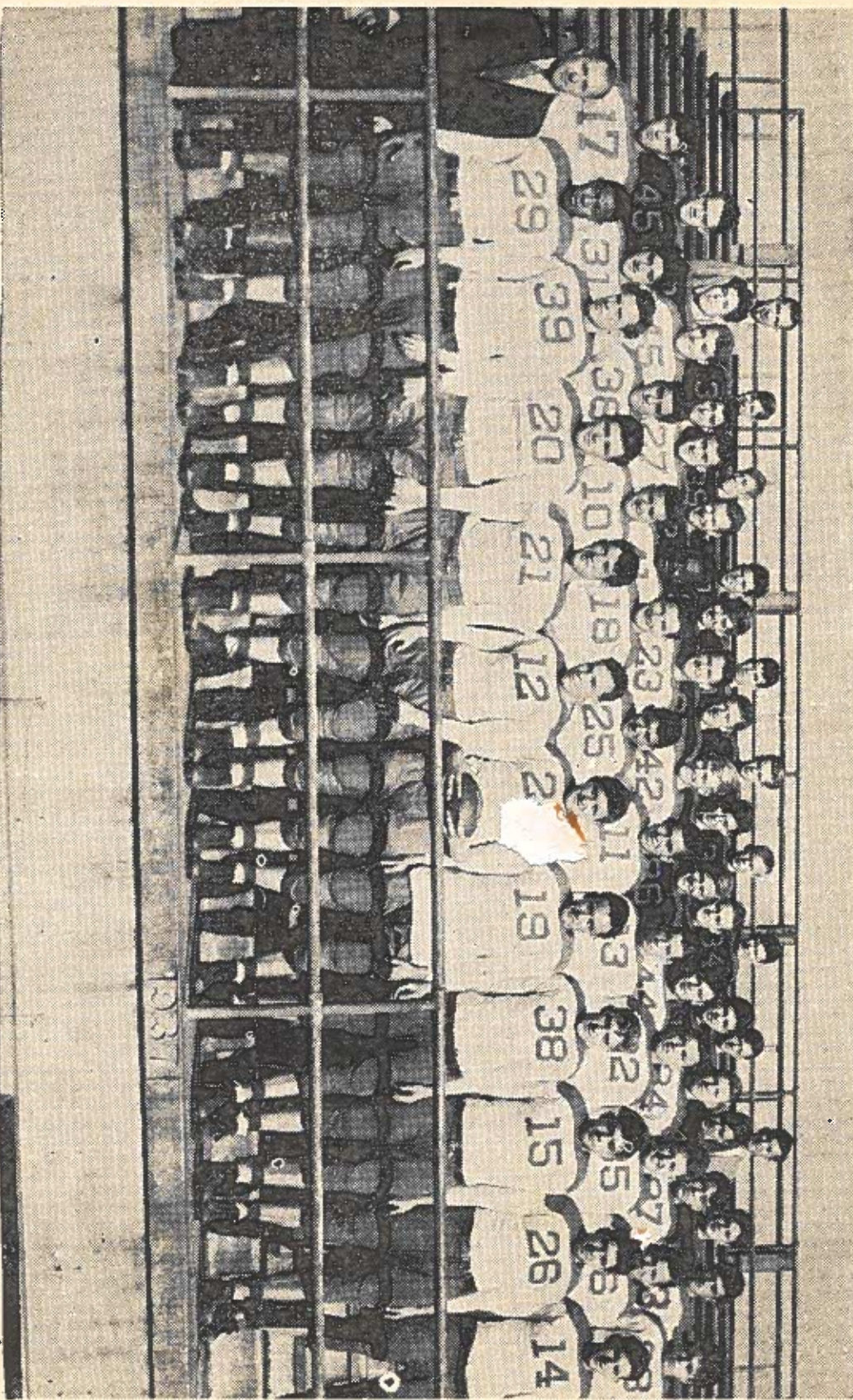

JOHN V. NELSON

Superintendent of Bellaire Schools Since 1918

October 24, 1939

John V. Nelson was born in the country in Monroe County, about a mile from Jerusalem. He is of a family consisting of three boys and three girls. After completing his education in the country schools he came to school in Jerusalem at about the age of fifteen. There he became acquainted with Miss Bonar, whom he married in 1908.

For about ten years, after completing his elementary education, he taught in schools at Pipe Creek, Jacobsburg, Jerusalem and Sardis. During this period he also earned his way through Ohio Northern University and graduated in 1907 with the degree of B. S. In 1922 he received his degree of Master of Arts at Columbia University, New York City.

He first became associated with the Bellaire schools in 1911 as teacher of Latin in the High School and remained here for three years. In 1914 he returned to Monroe County as County Superintendent of Schools, until 1916. In 1916 he was elected Principal of Bellaire High School. On May 27, 1918, on his birthday, he became Superintendent of Schools of Bellaire and has been continuously re-elected as such. His most recent contract is for the period of five years, commencing August 1, 1939. Mr. Nelson has been a teacher and Superintendent for forty years.

Throughout all of the years he has kept a careful watch on educational matters throughout the State of Ohio and has been especially interested in the financing of the public schools from a State standpoint. He has kept in constant touch with State Officials and Organizations, having charge of education and has been a great assistance in securing for the Bellaire Schools their just proportion of assistance from State Agencies. In fact, he has been responsible solely for keeping the Bellaire Schools on a solid financial basis.

Mr. Nelson has served on many committees having to do with educational matters, and has been the spokesman for the educational interests throughout the State before Committees of the General Assembly of Ohio on many different occasions. His knowledge of trends in education has been invaluable, not only to the State at large, but particularly to the Bellaire School System.

During his residence in Bellaire he has always taken an active part in community affairs and has accepted the leadership in many community campaigns. He maintains today as active an interest in school affairs and in community welfare as he did at the time he first came to Bellaire.

Mr. Nelson is a member of the Presbyterian Church, has been an Elder since 1918 and has been for many years Superintendent of the Adult Department and teacher of the Men's Bible Class of the Sabbath School of that Church. He is now the President of Wheeling District Elders Association. During his entire life he has been a consistent and active member of the Church.

Mr. Nelson has witnessed athletics in Bellaire High School develop from the sandlot to the Stadia stage. He was one of the early members of the Ohio Valley Athletic Association. He has greatly assisted in setting up rules and regulations for that Association, which have been a stabilizing influence on athletic relations in the Ohio Valley. Mr. Nelson was largely instrumental in securing the present Athletic Field. For many months he planned for this Field and contacted numerous State and Federal Agencies.

With such a record of its Superintendent, Bellaire looks forward to continued progress in its school system.

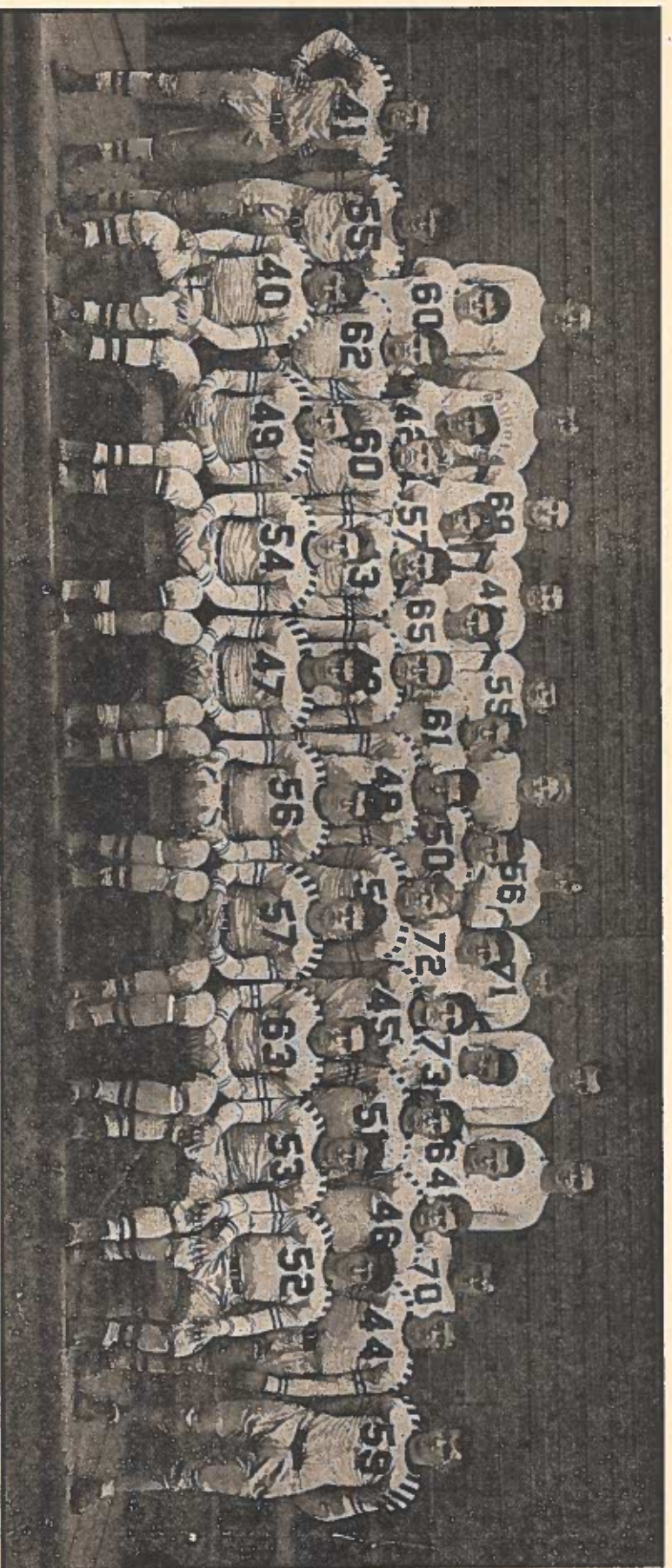

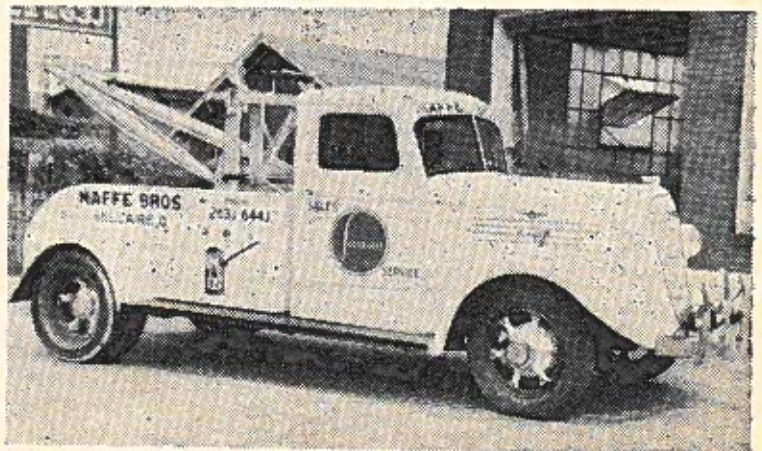

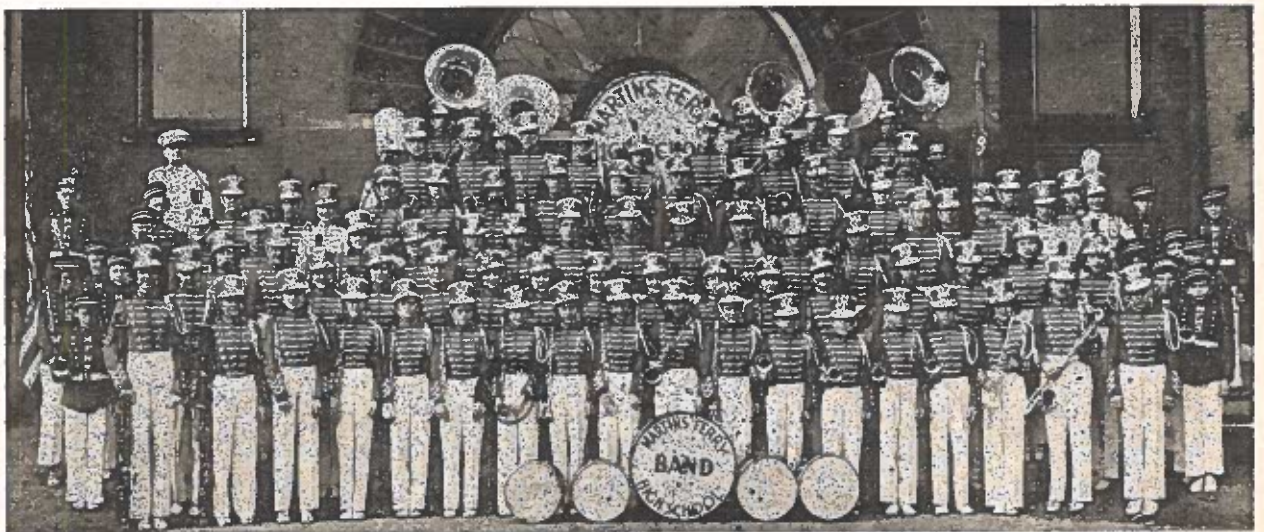

TO THE VOTERS

The voters on Election Day will be asked to approve a two mill levy for current expense of the Bellaire public schools. For fifteen years the levy for schools voted outside the limitation has been three mills. Therefore the passing of this two mill levy does not increase the present tax rate but decreases it by one mill.

It is necessary to pass this levy in order to secure state funds for the support of our schools. More than fifty per cent of the money now spent for the current cost of education comes from the state treasury. If schools are to be kept open it is necessary for the voters to approve this two mill levy on November 7th.

LOSS OF 5 YARDS

1. Taking more than three times out during either half.
2. Illegal delay of game.
3. Failure of substitute to report to umpire.
4. Violation of kick-off formation.
5. Failure to maintain proper alignment of offensive team before ball is snapped. Also, backfield man illegally in motion.
6. Offside by either team, or encroachment on neutral zone.
7. Attempt to draw opponents offside.
8. Taking more than two steps with ball after signalling for fair catch.
9. Illegal use of hands and arms by defensive players.
10. Flying block or flying tackle.
11. Running into kicker.
12. Crawling by the runner.

LOSS OF 15 YARDS

13. Team not ready to play at scheduled time.
14. Substitute communicating with teammates before ball is put in play.
16. Failure to stop at least one second on shift play.
17. Forward pass by member of team which did not put ball in play.
18. Forward pass touched by ineligible player.
19. Intentional grounding of forward pass.
20. Interference by member of passing team with defensive player eligible for pass.
21. Interference with fair-catch or tackling player before ball is caught.
22. Illegal use of hands and arms by offensive players.

23. Defensive player striking opponent above shoulders.
24. Roughing the kicker.
25. Piling up, hurdling, clipping.
26. Tackling player out of bounds.
27. Coaching from the sidelines.
