EXCEPTIONS AND ADDITIONS TO RULES

For OHIO High School Games Only

- A forward pass can be made anywhere back of line of scrimmage. (General rules require 5 yds. back.)
- 2. Penalty 5 to 15 yards if forward passer is run into or roughed when it is clearly indicated by his actions that he is going to pass.
- On all outbound plays, ball is brought in 15 yards instead of the usual 10 yards
 Head gears must be worn by all players of both teams—player has two minutes to obtain head gear and his team is charged with time out or player disqualified.
- 5. A kicked ball not having crossed line of scrimmage can be downed or advanced by either team. A lateral pass is permissable by the team recovering ball.

INTERPRETING THE DECISIONS

Almost everything that happens is communicated to the spectators by signs from the officials:

SAFETY: One hand raised above the head, with two fingers extended.

TOUCHDOWN, POINT AFTER TOUCHDOWN, FIELD GOAL: Both hands raised high over head.

TOUCHBACK: Arms crossed over head.

DEAD BALL: One hand raised above head.

OFF-SIDE: One hand extended in direction of penalty. CLIPPING, ROUGHING KICKER PILING UP: Shaking of fist.

INCOMPLETE FORWARD PASS, MISSED GOAL: Arms crossed in front of body.

HOLDING: Grasping of wrist.

INTERFERENCE: Pushing motion with hands

FOUL BY BOTH TEAMS: Arms form a zero, finger tips touching above head. PENALTY DECLINED: Military salute.

SPORTSMANSHIP

Football, of all sports, is a man's game. Every player stepping into uniform knows full well the rocky road of hard, bruising jolts awaiting him. The game itself calls for skill, intelligence and courage, and by its very nature has developed to a high plane of sportsmanship little appreciated by the spectator. Not long ago Knute Rockne was called upon, at a banquet, to define sportsmanship; he replied by stating this was a difficult thing to do, but that he could illustrate the meaning of its code by quoting an incident occurring in a game last vear between Notre Dame and Northwestern. Notre Dame arrived for this important gridiron

epic with one of her best linemen handicapped by a painful side injury. Just before the game began, Coach Dick Hanley of Northwestern appeared in Notre Dame's dressing rooms bearing a specially constructed contrivance to protect the injury of this injured player, and while this same player was hit hard and often during the bruising game which lowed, not once during the four hard quarters of that afternoon, was this injured player hit or tackled on his bruised side. This was a typical instance of the term "sportsmanship"—so hard to define, but so often illustrated on a thousand gridirons in every section of the land from September to December.

SUMMARY OF THE MOST COMMON PENALTIES

LOSS OF DOWN

Second forward pass during same play. Intentionally grounding pass (also 15 yds.) Incomplete forward pass.

LOSS OF FIVE YARDS

More than three time outs during a half.

Illegal delay of game by either team.

Failure of substitute to report. Offside play.

Player in motion less than five yards back.

Player out of bounds when scrimmage begins.

Attempts to draw opponents off-side.

Illegal use of hands and arms by players on the defensive team.

Using flying block or flying tackle.

Running into the kicker. ("If contact is slight, or is caused by the kicker's own motion, this shall not be interpreted as 'running into the kicker.' ")

Crawling by the runner.

Unfair play not provided for in rules.

LOSS OF FIFTEEN YARDS

Substitute communicating before ball is put in play. Failure to come to a stop on a shift play.

Interference with opportunity to make a fair catch.

Throwing to the ground the player who has made the fair catch. Helping the runner or interlocking interference.

Illegal use of the hands and arms by offensive team. Roughing the kicker. Piling up, hurdling, clipping.

Unsportsmanlike conduct by players.

Team not ready to play at scheduled time.

Illegal return to game (also suspensions).

LOSS OF HALF DISTANCE TO GOAL LINE

Striking, kneeing, kicking, etc. Foul within 1 yard line.

LOSS OF BALL

Second kick out of bounds at kick-off. Forward pass touched by ineligible player. Interference by team which did not make pass. Kicking team illegally touching ball.
