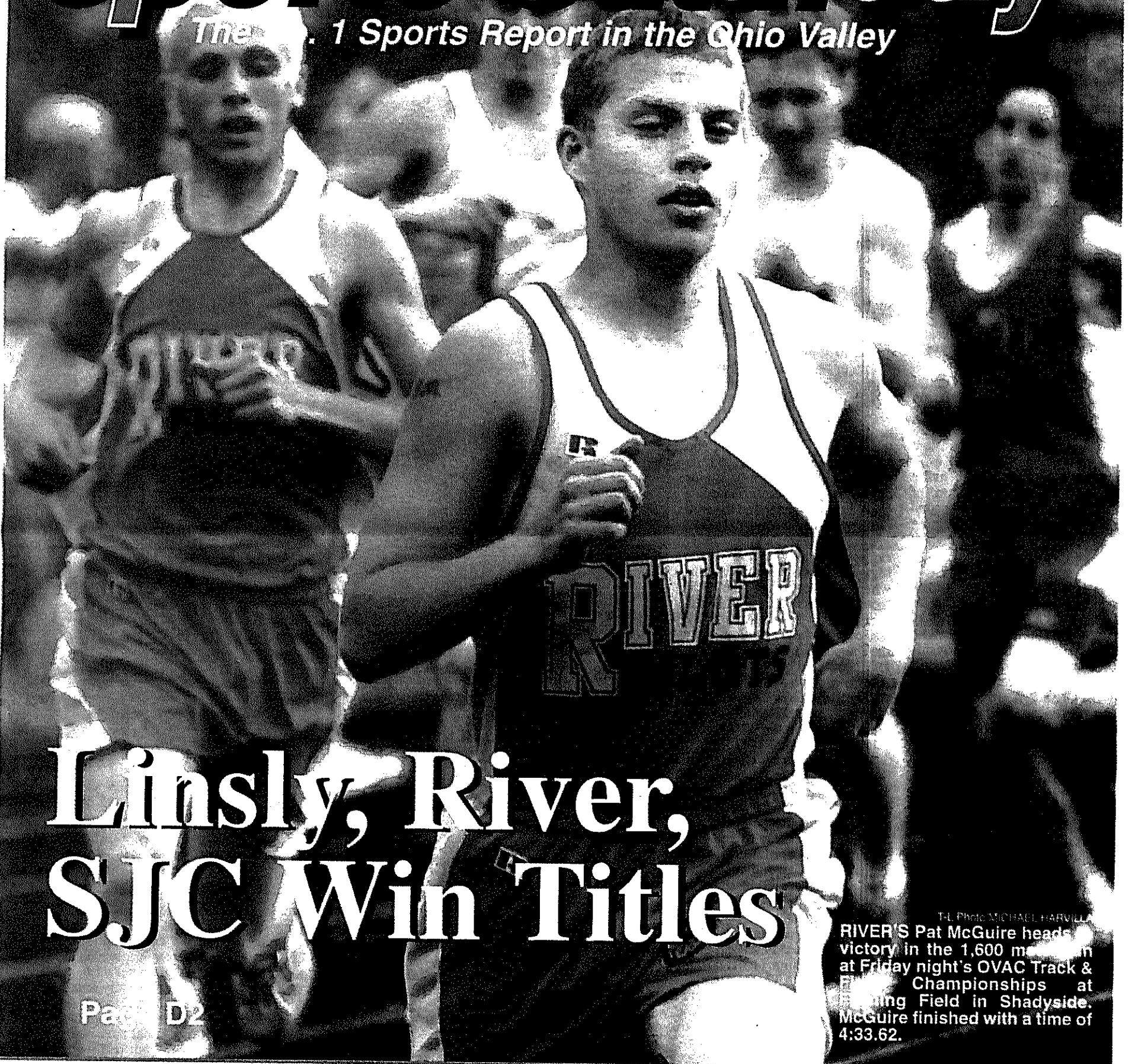

River, Linsly boys; SJC girls capture OVAC Championships

Back-to-back became the theme of the final day of the 1-A and 2-A Cal Giffin OVAC Track and Field Championships at Fleming Field in Shadyside Friday evening.

All eight teams -- which garnered OVAC banners last year -- will be hoisting new hardware again in 2003.

In Class 1-A, St. John Central fought off a furious rally from Shadyside to take the girls' title. The Lady Irish closed with 156 points, which was 23 better than the Lady Tigers.

In Class 2-A, Steubenville Central was nothing short of dominant in winning its second title in a row with a whopping 214 points. Wheeling Central finished second with 92 markers.

In the boys' team race, Linsly continued to roll up titles in Class 1-A. Coach Dave Plumby's bunch closed with 179 points, while Shadyside took the second-place crown with 139.5 markers.

In Class 2-A, River successfully defended its championship when the Pilots tallied 153 points, which was 83 better than runner-up Wheeling Central.

IN GIRLS' 1-A, the Lady Irish had built a commanding 31-point lead after four events on Wednesday and watched Shadyside creep within seven at one juncture.

But St. John Central was able to finish first in three of the final five events to seal the deal.

"The first day went a lot better than we anticipated because we thought it could have been almost a dead heat after the first day," said Lady Irish head coach Bubba Kapral. "We had a couple of key events which stopped the bleeding for us when Shadyside started to get close and our kids really performed."

The Lady Irish -- who have stars up and down the lineup -- needed a strong effort from each one of those.

"(You) can't single out one kid this week," Kapral said. "We are very top heavy on our roster with a lot of stars and each one

of them came through and did something positive for this team.

"But give Shadyside a lot of credit because they came from 31-down to seven down. Joel (Joseph) is a very good friend of mine and Shadyside is lucky to have him because he does one heck of a job with this program."

The Lady Irish received a spark from eight individual titles during their chase.

Junior distance ace Brienne Cattran gave SJC a lift when she captured the 1600 meter run in 5:28.30. She added that gold medal with the title she won in the 3200 meter run on Wednesday with a 12:32.08.

Middle distance junior Courtney Ogilbee donated a spark when she captured the 800 meter run in a sizzling 2:26.35.

Freshman ace Kayla Kidder came through with one of the biggest Green championships when she captured the 300 meter hurdles in a time of 49.33.

The Lady Irish also won the last event of the evening when the foursome of Cattran, Kidder, Ogilbee and Marri Kajfez teamed to run a 4:22.94.

The Lady Green 4x8 team of Cattran, Ogilbee, Annie Wiater and Kajfez won the 3200 meter relay crown with a 10:25.72.

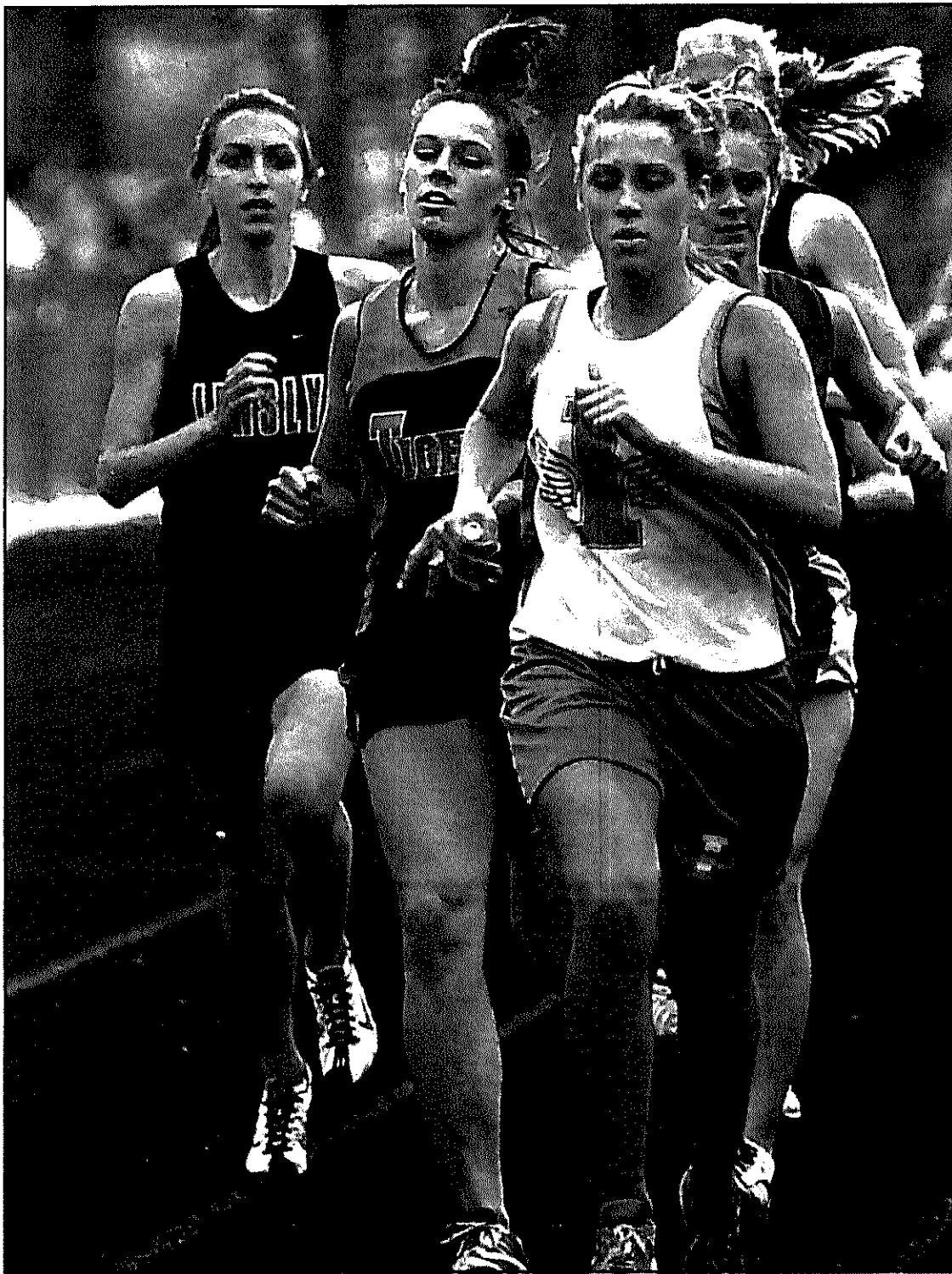
Junior Brittany Clegg prevailed in the shot put when she launched the iron ball to a mark of 32-ft-0 3/4. Junior Jena Ehni also captured the pole vault on Wednesday, soaring over 8-ft-6.

Freshman April Rotilio also came through for Johnnies when she placed second in the 100 (13.18), 200 (27.97) and 400 (59.70).

Kajfez also donated a lift when she closed in second place in the long jump (15-ft-6) and also the 800 (2:32.32).

"This is a very special championship," Kapral said. "We were one of the slowest teams to ever win an OVAC championship last year, but we knew we had almost everyone coming back and we picked up two freshman studs who gave us the speed, which really put us over the top."

Shadyside, meanwhile, closed the meet with five individual titles.

Solid senior Tristin Miracle remained unblemished in the long jump when she marked the sand at 16-ft-9 1/4. That mark established a new 1-A meet record in the process.

Senior Jenna Johnson continued to roll along in the high jump, winning the title Wednesday with a height of 5-ft-2.

Freshman Breana Burkhart captured the first running title of the day when she claimed the 100 meter high hurdles in a time of 16.56.

The Lady Tigers also took gold medals in the two sprint

relays. The team of Lacie Krupa, Miracle, Brittany Johnson and Michelle Marty teamed in the 4x1 for a time of 53.58.

The Orange foursome of Hilly Bell, Carrie Bonar, Miracle and Marty united for a 1:55.47 and the 4x200 title.

Four of the other five championships in 1-A went to Bridgeport High School.

Junior speedster Brittany Hocker added three more OVAC titles to her medal collection.

Hocker turned in a 12.69 for the championship in the 100. She then took the lap dash in a blazing 57.16 to establish a new

meet record.

The reigning Ohio State 100 meter champion then completed the sprint triple with a 26.51 and the 200 meter dash.

"I was really happy with my 400 times," said the modest Hocker. "I thought my other two times could have been a little bit faster. I felt really good running today and now I am just aiming at the state competition."

The Lady Bulldogs' shuttle hurdle team of Dana Mroezkowski, Kiley Baker, Sarah Zimmerman and Erica

Roskovich ran a 1:11.33 for the title.

Linsly's lone individual champion came in the discus when Carrie Cecil prevailed with a throw of 102-ft-4.

In Class 2-A, it was definitely a sea of blue because whatever Steubenville Central wanted to do, it did in the two-day meet.

The Lady Crusaders performed in dominating fashion, winning championships in 14 of the 18 events.

"We told the girls we wanted to get out early because last year we had to come from behind," said always-personable Central head coach Bob Stanko. "To win three events on the first day and then win almost everything today was a complete shock.

"We told the girls that this was the first time, that I know of, that we were able to qualify everyone into the finals. We wanted our kids to think we were in last place and they came out as focused as I have ever seen them and it has been quite amazing."

The Lady Crusaders received a spark from sophomore sprinter Abbey Sokol who won the 100 and 200 with 13.16 and 26.93, respectively.

Senior distance ace Mary Gilloon pulled the distance double, winning the 1600 and 800 meter runs. She turned in 2:25.54 and 5:29.57 for the golds.

Shatara Walters and Sarah Santarelli won the 100 and 300 hurdles, respectively with 16.30 and 50.69.

Jodi Bodo was the 400 meter champion in 63.12. In the field, junior Jamie Dent won the shot put and discus crowns with marks of 34-ft-1 and 110-ft-9, respectively. Jen Smith was the high jump champion with a height of 5-feet.

The Lady Crusaders also captured the top place in every relay event.

Central's 4x100 team of Ashly Sawon, Walters, Bodo and Sokol ran a 51.93. The 800 squad of Sawon, Jessie Buckmaster, Bodo and Sokol ran two laps in 1:53.02.

The 1600 squad was comprised of Bodo, Sawon, Tiffany Bender and Gilloon. That team ran a mile in 4:22.01.

The shuttle title team was made up of Samantha Lawrence, Amanda Bise, Smith and Santarelli. That foursome ran a 1:11.97.

The 4x8 crown was grabbed by Marisa Matanzo, Sarah Kendziorski, Alyssa Vandine and Gilloon in a time of 10:25.60.

Monroe Central produced a meet champion in the long jump. Lynzee Fish soared off the board to a mark of 15-ft-6 1/2.

ON THE BOYS SIDE, Linsly prevailed in 1-A for the second straight year and for the eighth time during Plumby's tenure at the Wheeling-based institution.

"I have a really great group of kids," Plumby said. "They have worked hard and they are talented and when you can put those two things together, you are going to be successful."

The Cadets received a big boost from first-year track guy Mark Plumby who is Dave's son.

Plumby -- a junior -- had been a regular for the Cadet baseball team, but decided he would give track and field a try and he is now reaping the benefits.

"My dad really pushes us and he likes to over train and that really paid off for me and the rest of the team," Mark Plumby admitted. "I will always miss baseball, but I guess I needed a change."

Plumby took home three gold medals from the meet. He captured the 100 meter dash in a time of 11.40. He then won the 300 meter intermediate hurdles with a brisk 41.07.

He also anchored Linsly's winning 4x100 team. The other three members of the unit included Heath Stanley, David Wharton and Tony Walls. The Cadet foursome ran a 44.42.

"Not being able to watch Mark play baseball hurt me a little bit, but when he decided to run track it really meant a lot to me," Coach Plumby said. "Before he came out, we didn't really have a hurdler, so I had been working with him since March and he has good speed and is a good athlete, so he has really come along in the hurdles."

"Having my dad as the coach is the greatest thing," Mark Plumby said. "My dad's face lit up when I told him I wanted to run track. He never begged me to run track or anything."

The Cadets also received a lift from Stanley who won the 200 and 400 meter dashes in 22.99 and 52.70, respectively.

Linsly won the 1600 meter run when Preston Smith finished four laps in 4:55.98.

Linsly also captured three other relay titles to go along with the 4x1 crown.

The foursome of Max Neubauer, Stanley, Wharton and Walls ran 800 meters in 1:32.71 for the gold.

The team of Wayne Green, Preston Smith, Neubauer and

Sam Adams won the 4x400 with a 3:42.48.

The 4x800 unit -- which won with a 8:45.52 -- was made up of Mike Bell, Adams, Jimmy Squibb and Preston Smith.

The Cadets won two field events during Wednesday's competition. Sophomore John Vellenoweth won the pole vault with 12-ft-6 and Walls captured the long jump at 20-ft-0 1/2.

"Give Joel (Joseph) and Bubba (Kapral) credit because they always have their teams ready to run and we knew it wouldn't be easy," Plumby admitted. "I think this might be one of the best teams I have had here and they all performed very well this weekend."

Shadyside produced three meet champions through the course of two days.

Senior Nick Ongley cleared 6-ft-2 to take the high jump crown.

Sophomore Dusty Karkowski prevailed in the 110 meter high hurdles with a time of 16.01.

The Tigers' shuttle team of Josh DePaulis, Lyle Burkhardt, Karkowski and Ongley combined to clear 40 timbers in 61.37.

St. John Central -- which closed in third place -- watched sophomore Michael Totterdale win the 800 meter run in 2:05.33.

On Wednesday, Nick Habursky claimed the 3200 meter crown with a time of 10:42.26.

RIVER came out smoking on Wednesday with four individual titles and never looked back en route to a big win in 2-A.

"This is probably the first time that we have been able to have everyone together," said River head coach Tim Frye. "We ran a lot of personal bests and that's all you can ask for."

"Our depth in each event and overall team depth really helped us because we are solid in almost every event."

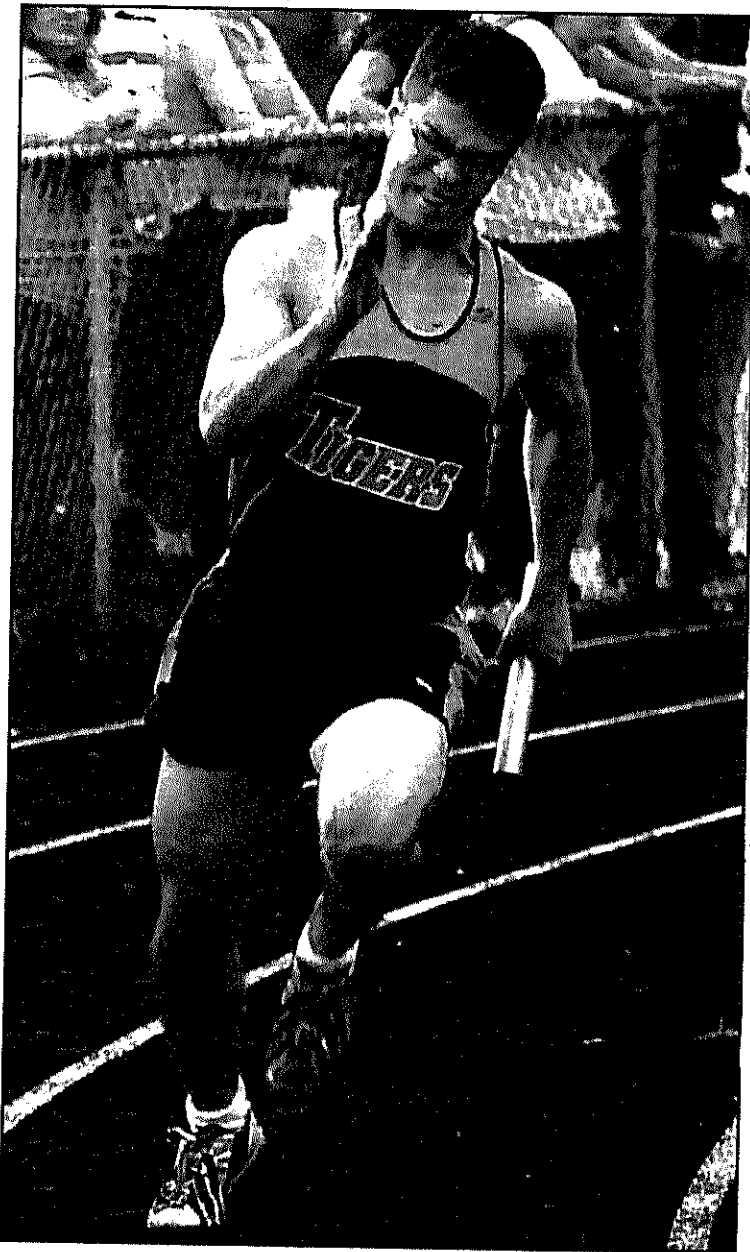
All told the Pilots were victorious in eight events, half of which came in the field.

Senior thrower Robert Oldfield got the Pilots off to a good start when he claimed the discus title (136-ft-7) on Wednesday and then the shot put with a heave of 49-ft-0 1/4.

Juniors Ryan Whitlatch and Pat McGuire served the Pilots' horses on the track.

"Those two guys are definitely horses," Frye said. "They were pretty dominant in the 800 and 1600 and anytime you throw them in there, you are confident they can score well."

Whitlatch won the 800 meter

run, circling the track twice in 2:02.66, while McGuire claimed the 1600 meter crown with a 4:33.62.

The Pilots' 4x400 team sealed the deal when the foursome of Whitlatch, Anthony McDaniel, McGuire and Eric Doty teamed for a 3:36.18.

The 3200 meter team of Whitlatch, McGuire, Anthony Amos and Steve Werkau joined forces for a 8:26.47.

Russell Kocher claimed the pole vault for the Pilots, soaring over 12-ft-6. Eric Doty was victorious in the long jump with a mark of 20-ft-0 1/4.

Buckeye Trail was led by senior Luke Snyder who captured both the 100 and 200 meter dashes in 11.55 and 23.19, respectively.

Steubenville Central's Nick Drakos was the champion in the 400 when he ran a lap in 52.49.

With three of the four Ohio Valley Athletic Conference Class A-AA track and field championships already decided, Belmont County rivals Bellaire St. John's and Shadyside took the girls small-school meet to the wire Friday night at Fleming Field in Shadyside.

OVAC TRACK Coach Bubba Kapral's Fighting Irish, who had led by as many as 32

points early on, watched Joel Joseph's Tigers pull to within seven markers before pulling away and outscoring the hosts by a 38-22 over the final four events to claim the title.

St. John's finished with 156 markers to 133 for Shadyside while Linsly was third with 82 and Bridgeport fourth at 58.

Linsly, led by sprinters Mark Plumby and Heath Stanley and four relay teams, won the Class A boys meet with 179 points with the Tigers again settling for the runner-up slot with 139.5. St. John's was third at 104 and Bishop Donahue took home fourth place at 57.

Both Class AA meets turned into runaways with the Lady Crusaders of Steubenville Central winning 12 of 13 events contested last night to pile up a whopping 214 tallies to 92 for second place Wheeling Central. Buckeye Trail was third with 84 and River fourth at 50.

Coach Tim Frye's Pilots were big winners in the double-A boys meet with 153 points while the Maroon Knights claimed their second runner-up trophy of the night with 70. Steubenville Central slid into third with 65 and Toronto and Wellsville tied for fourth with 63.

As usual, when she is involved, Bridgeport's Brittany Hocker was the queen of the Class A girls meet, winning the 100, 200 and 400 meter dashes.

However, St. John's freshman April Rotilio put on a gutsy performance to take second in all three sprints to aide the Fighting Irish.

Hocker clocked 12.69 in the 100 and 26.51 in the 200, but her best performance of the night came in the 400 where she broke the tape in a sizzling 57.16.

Rotilio also went under the one minute mark in the event at 59.7.

Kapral's team also got victories from Courtney Ogilbee in the 800 (2:26.35) and Brianna Catran in the 1,600 (5:28.30) while freshman Kayla Kidder skimmed the 300 low hurdles in 49.33.

Ogilbee's victory in the 800, combined with teammate Marri Kajfez's runner-up finish in the event, moved the Irish from a 118-111 advantage over Shadyside to a 136-115 margin with three events to go.

The Johnnies 4X400 quartet also crossed the finish line first.

Shadyside freshman Breana Burkhardt took the 100 meter hurdles in 16.56, while finishing second to Kidder in the 300's, while the Lady Tigers won the 4X100 and 4X200 baton-passing events.

Senior Tristin Miracle added the long jump title for the hosts with a record-setting leap of 16 ft. 9.25 in.

Bellaire had a pair of winners in 3,200 meter standout Aimee Vavrek (12:06.5) and shot put specialist Emily Taylor (35-11.25).

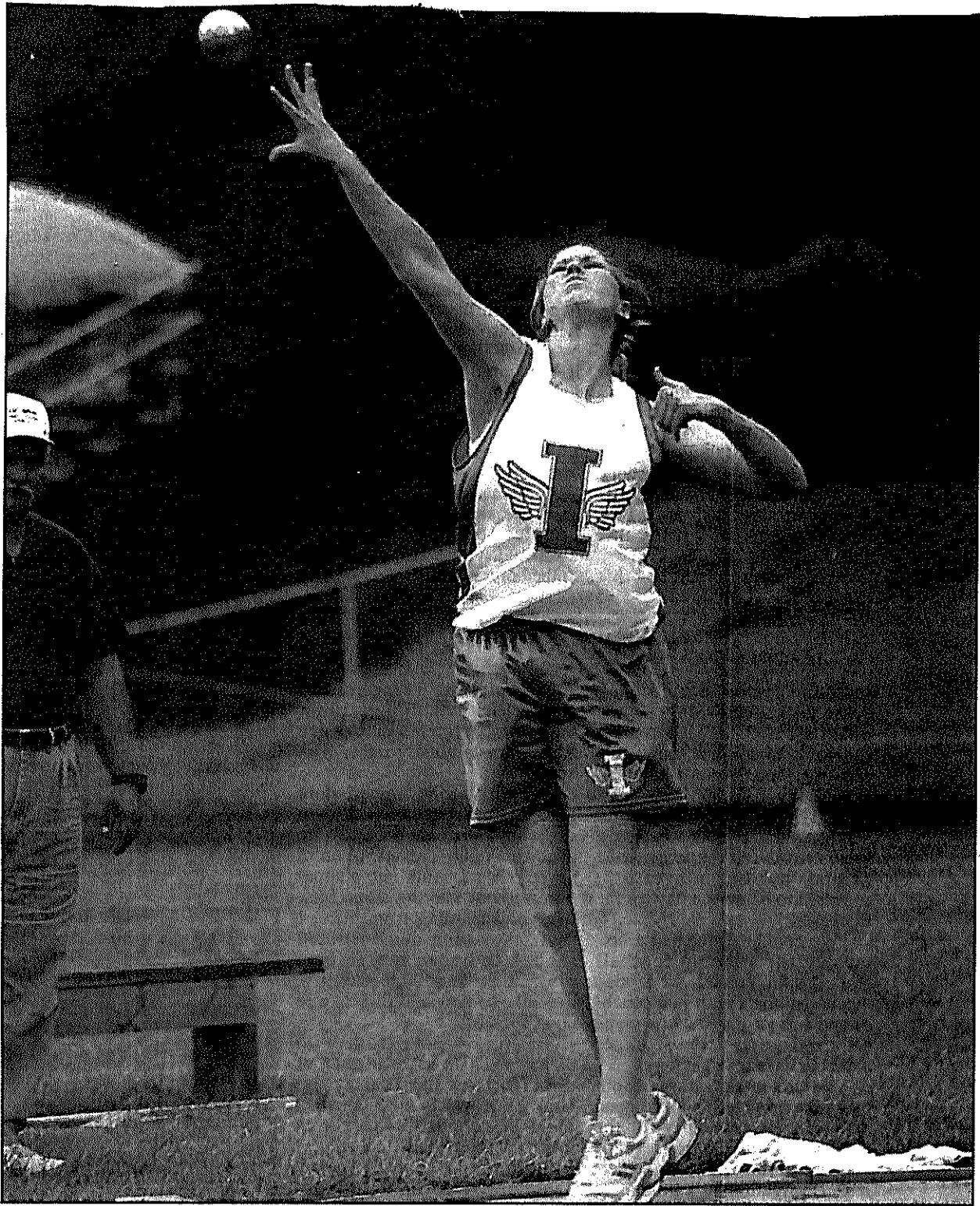

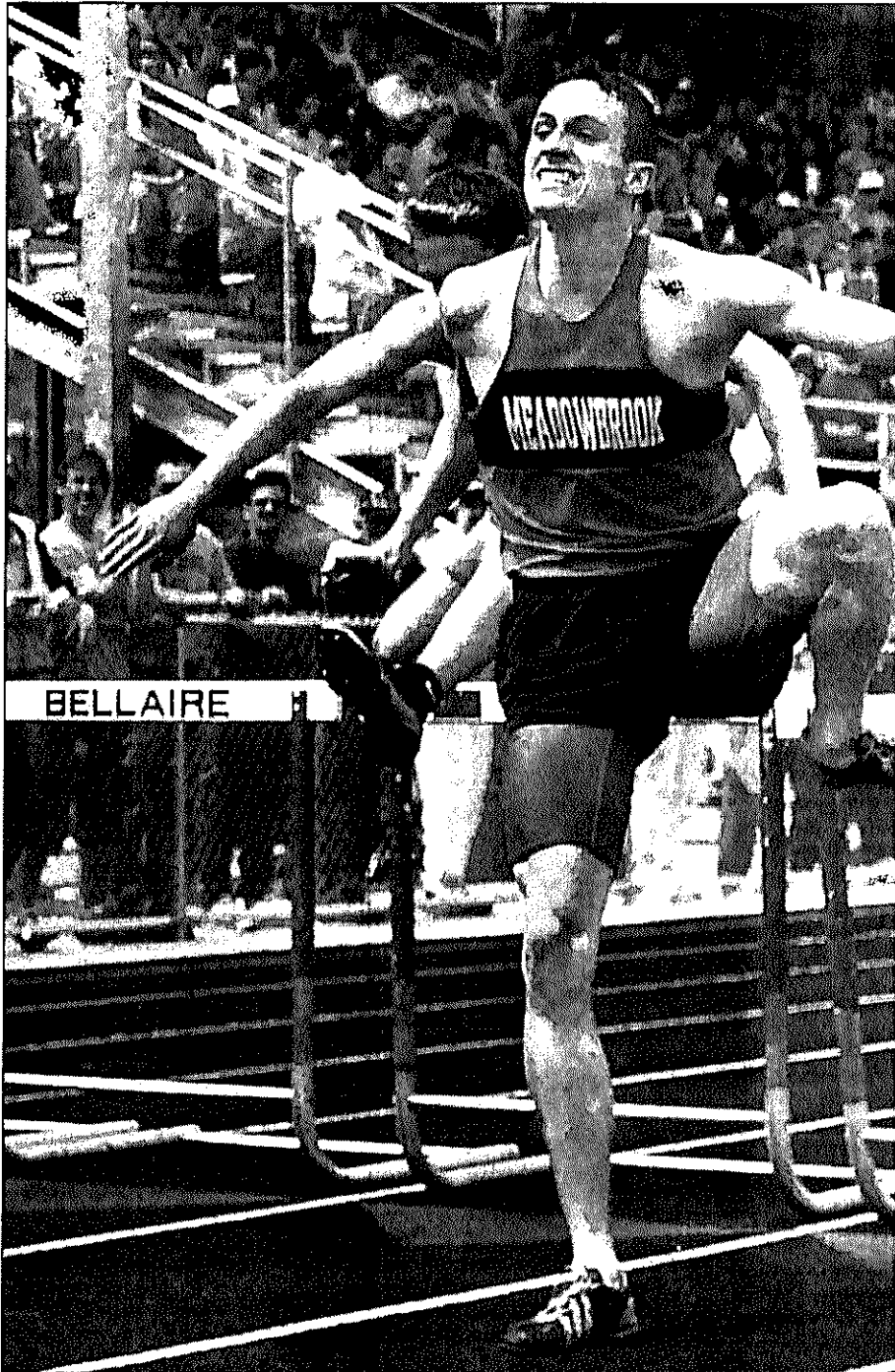

IT MAY not have been a long day for coach Scott Thornberry's East Liverpool boys, but the Poters needed the long events to help push their way over the top.

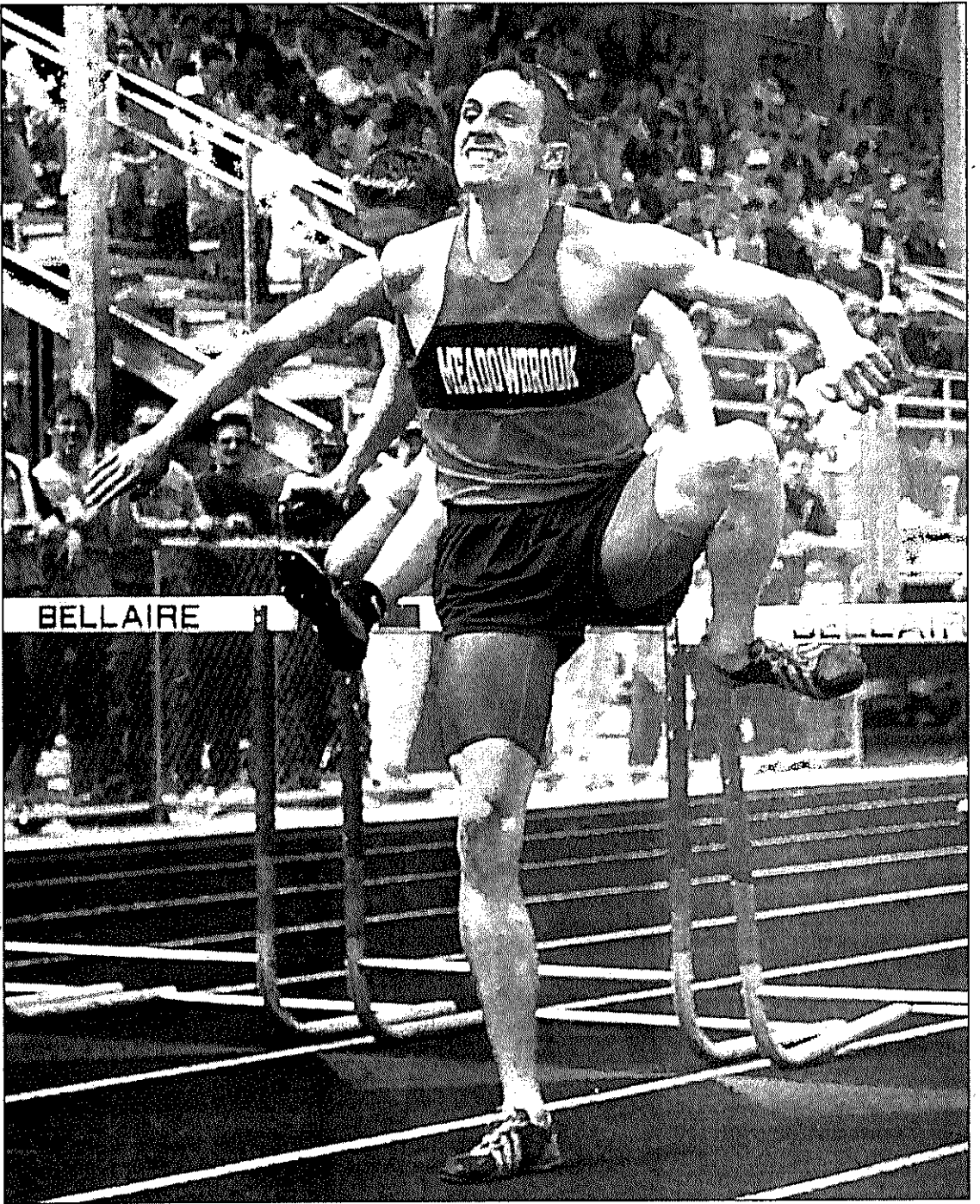

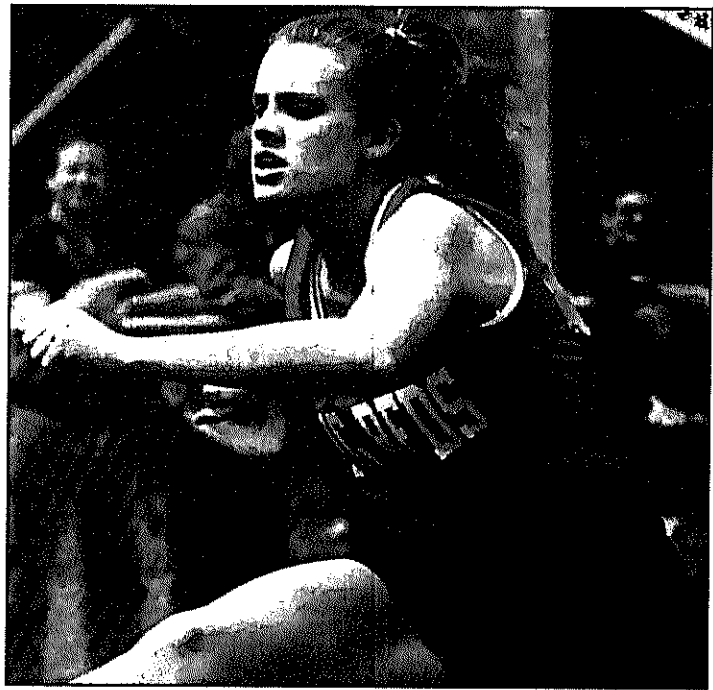

St. Clairsville was led by senior Dale Ferrell who won the 800 meter run with a blazing 2:00.9.

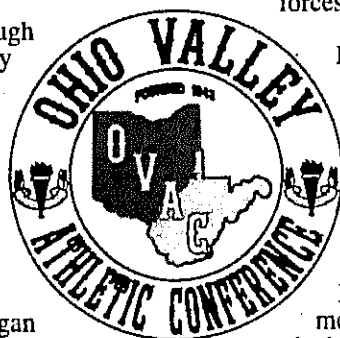
Sophomore Mitch McGary won the long jump with a mark of 21-ft-5 1/2.

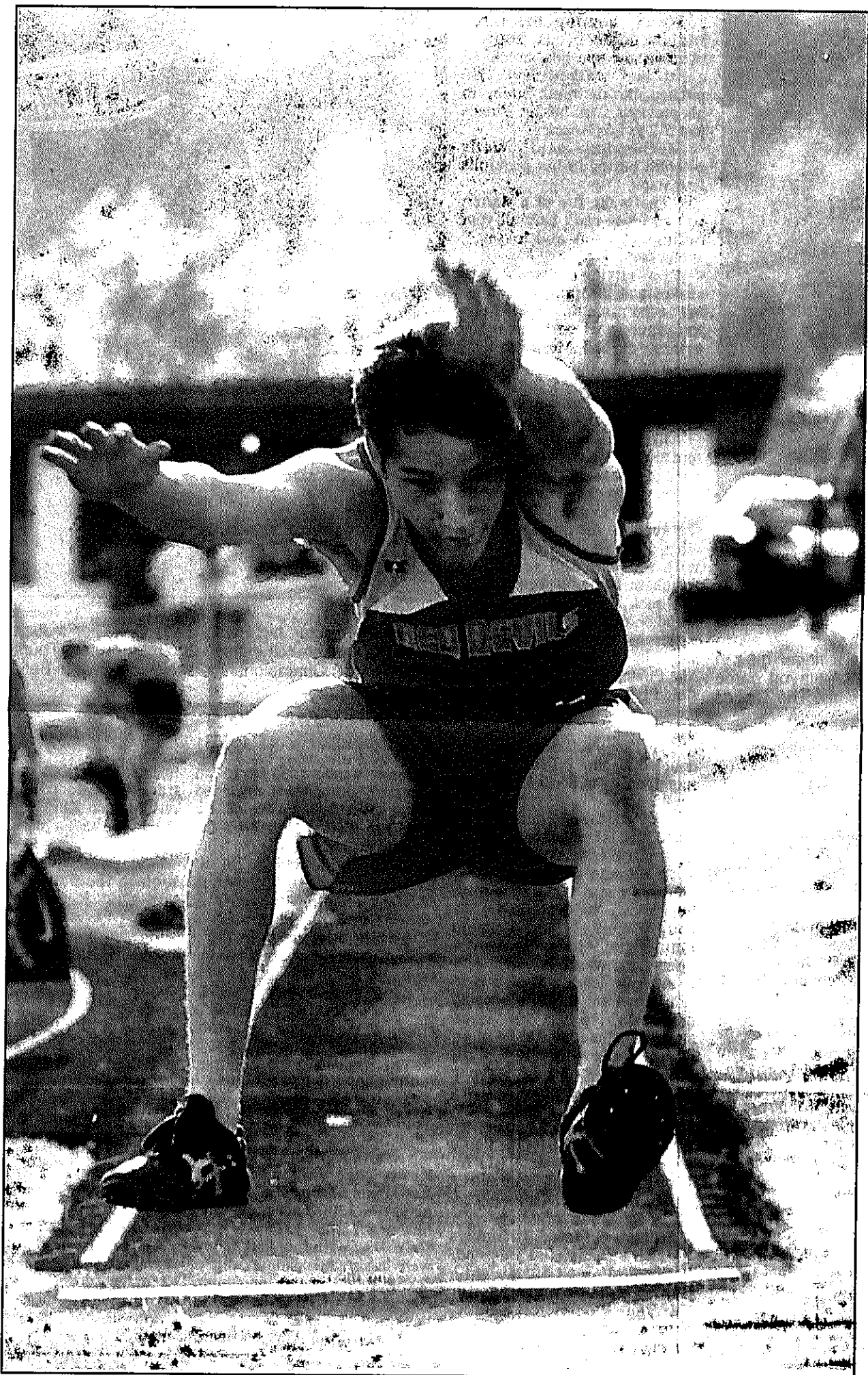
Bellaire neutralized the Lady 'Rocks somewhat with two titles of their own.
