Red Devils, Colts Claim 3-A Titles

When it comes to winning track meets, the objective is simple for head coaches. Ride your horses and get some help in other places.

That's exactly what the St. Clairsville girls and Meadowbrook boys did over the course of two days at Bellaire's Nelson Field.

The Lady Red Devils had their title clinched long before the meet's final events, scoring 140 points. Oak Glen was second with 97.5 and Bellaire — the six-time defending champions — finished third with 66.

Meadowbrook's track program has excelled at the district and regional levels for quite sometime under the guidance of veteran head coach John Epperson, but the OVAC title had avoided the Byesville-based outfit.

Not any more as the Colts won the 1600 relay and held off a valiant effort from Union Local to capture the gold trophy on that side. Meadowbrook tallied 106 points, three better than the Jets. Oak Glen was third with 87 points.

The St. Clairsville Lady Red Devils got off to a strong start Thursday and kept rolling into Saturday, winning the first track event and not looking back until it had the gold trophy.

"It's very exciting to win this meet," said rookie head coach Ben Frye. "Our kids performed great. We had a lot of standout performances, and I couldn't have asked for more from these kids."

The Lady Red Devils rode their horses in the sprints as junior ace Lindsey Neavin continued to shine in the short events.

Neavin — a state qualifier a season ago — won the 200 meter dash in a time of 26.62 and she won the 100 meter title after a ruling was reversed. After officials checked with the camera, the 100 title was awarded to Neavin in a time of 12.89.

Senior distance standout Alanna Seamon was a double winner for the Lady Red Devils. She won the 1600-meter title in a time of 5:24.19 to go along with the 3200 title she claimed on Thursday.

THE BUCKEYE LOCAL and Wheeling Park girls duked it out to the very end.

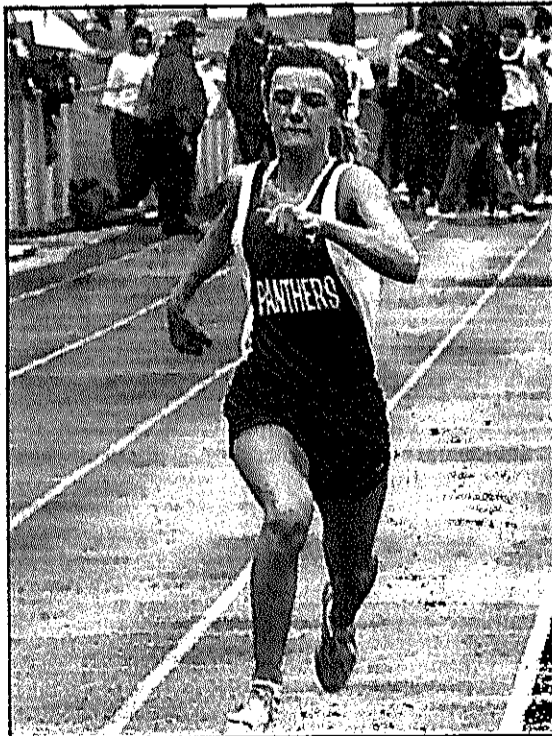
The Lady Panthers posted a second in the 4x400 relay, while the Lady Patriots won the first heat, but it was enough for just sixth place overall, resulting in a tie.

When it comes to winning track meets, the objective is simple for head coaches: Ride your horses and get some help in other places.

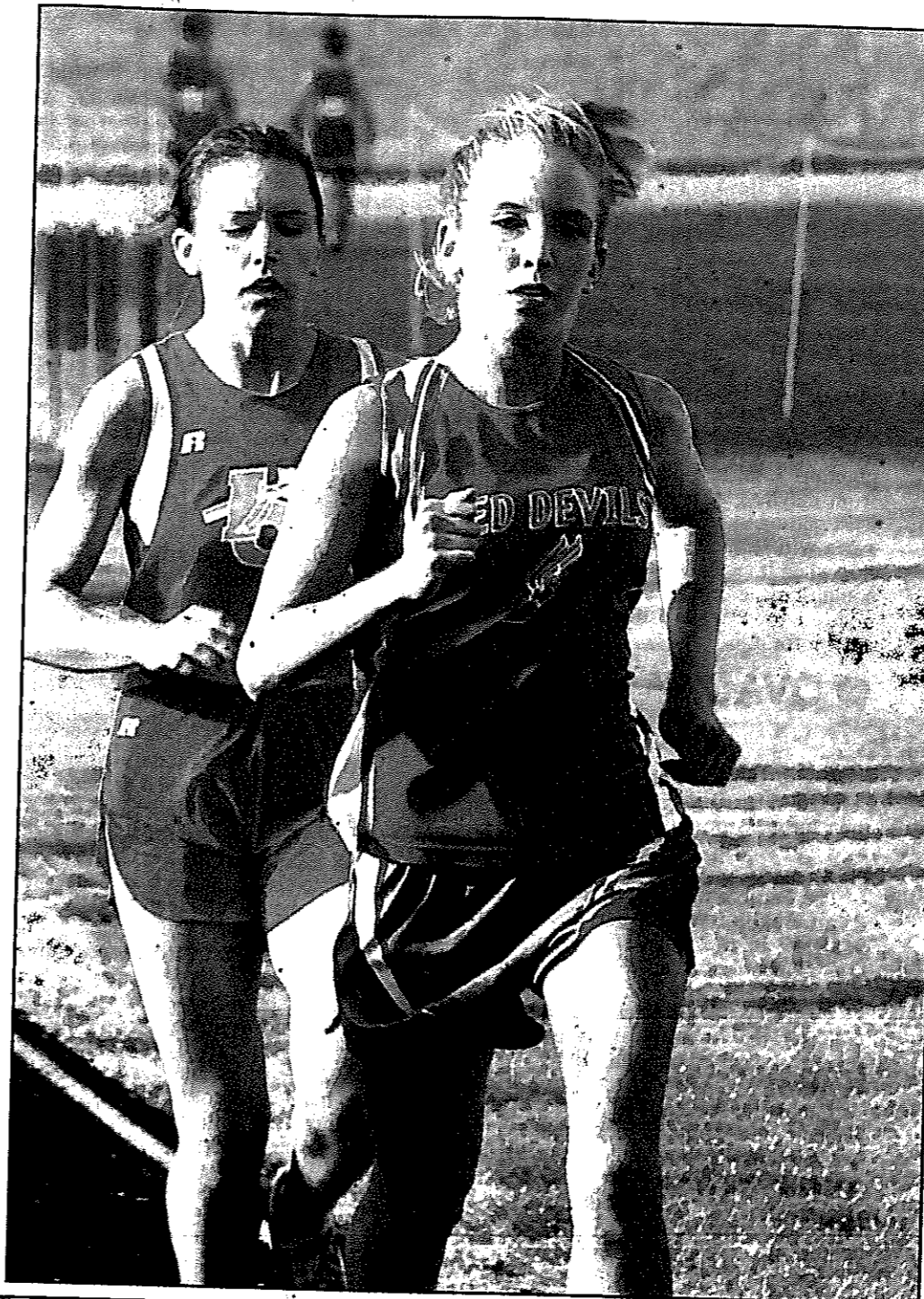

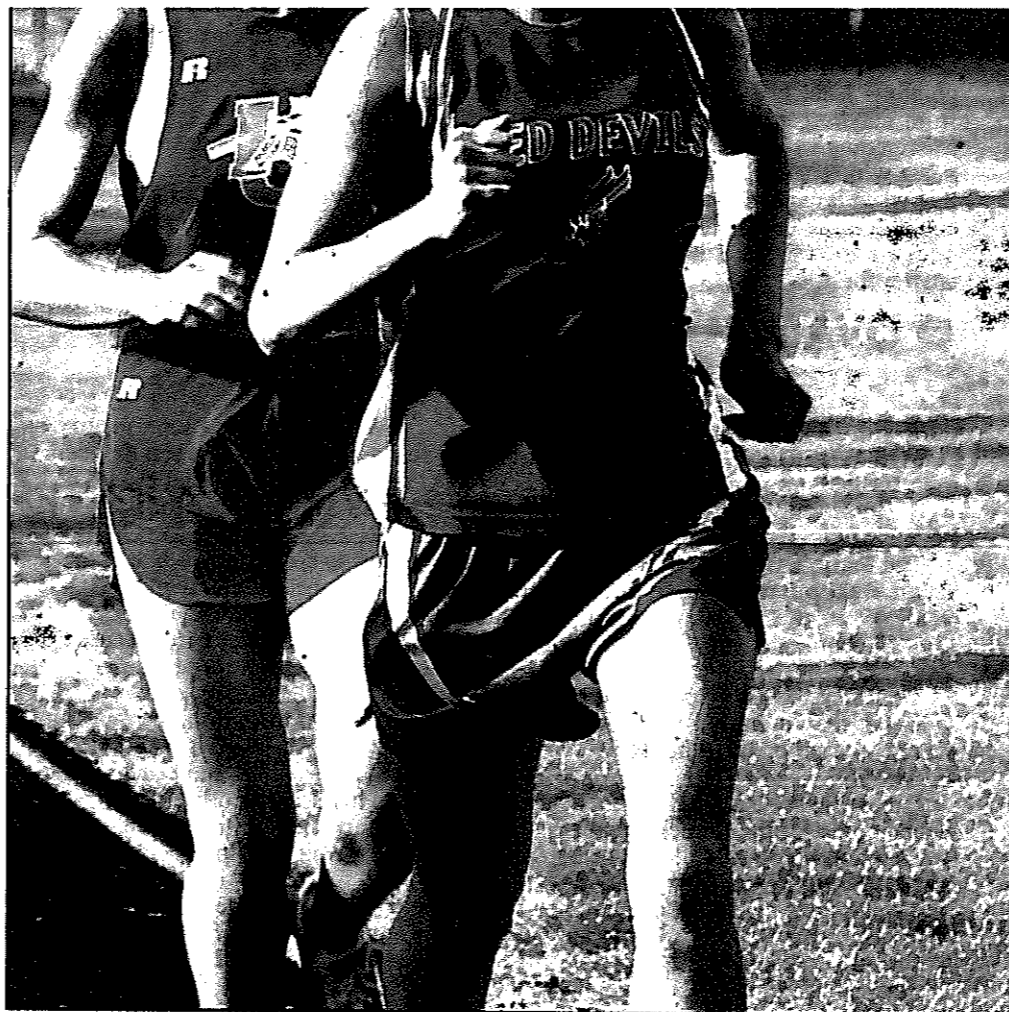

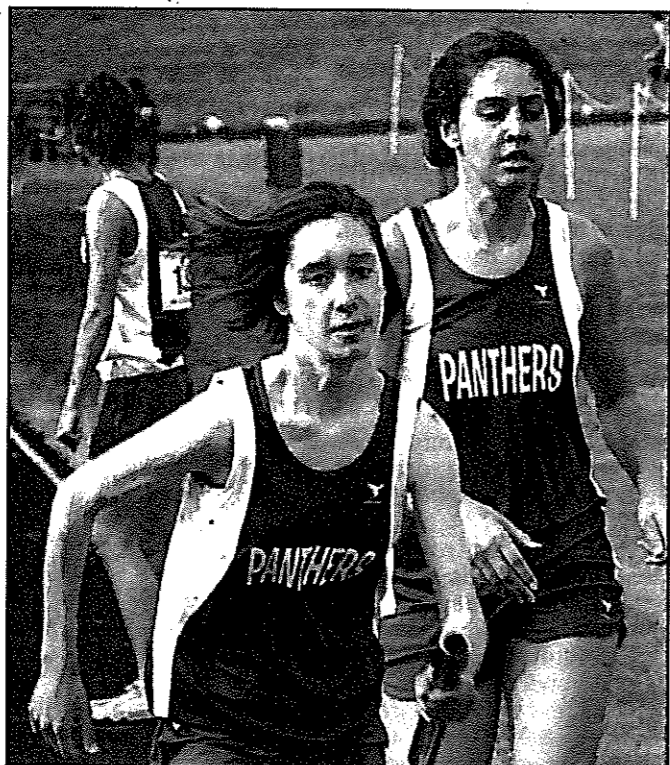

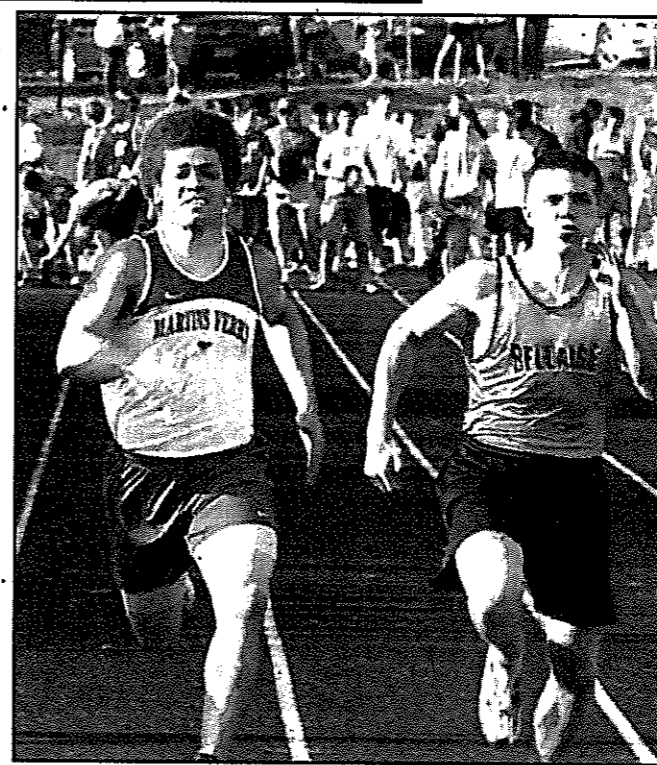

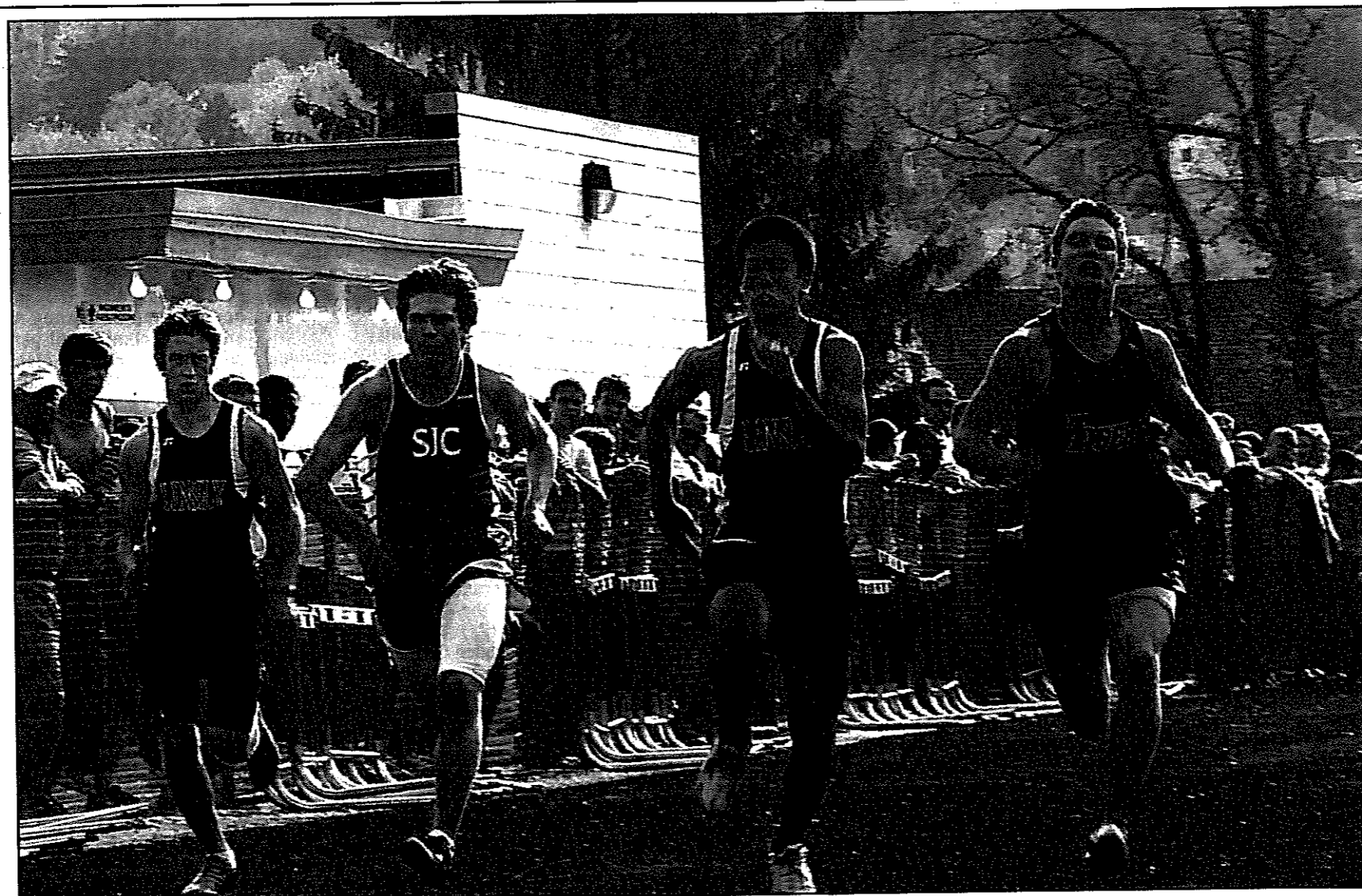

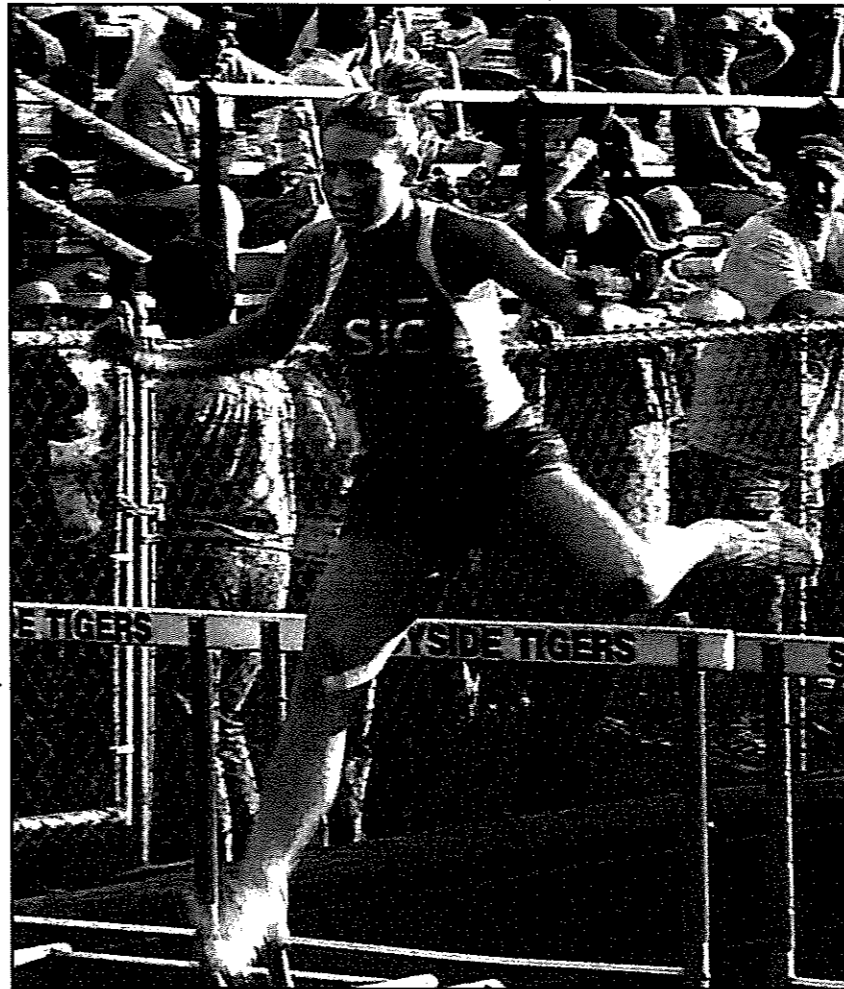

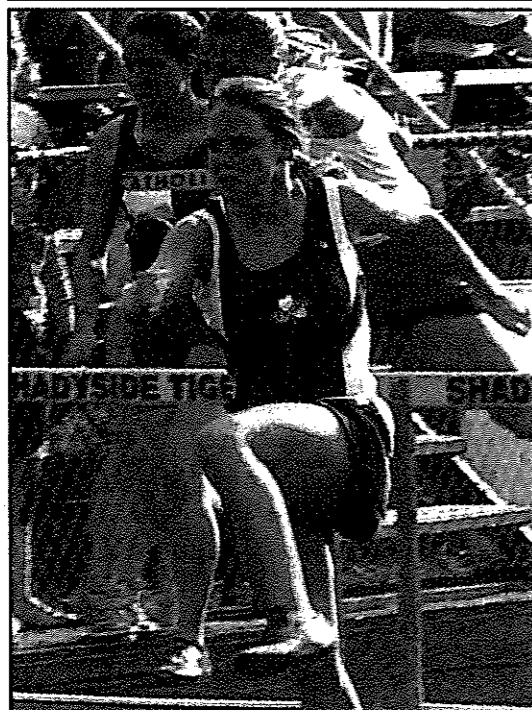

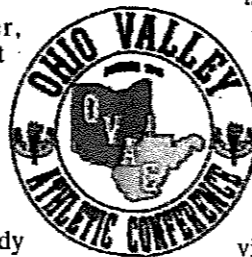
Going into the OVAC Class 2-A meet, the girls race appeared to be a two-horse race between Barnesville and Steubenville Catholic.

BARNESVILLE got back to its winning ways after building a huge lead on Wednesday and then getting enough points from their horses to hold off Catholic Central.

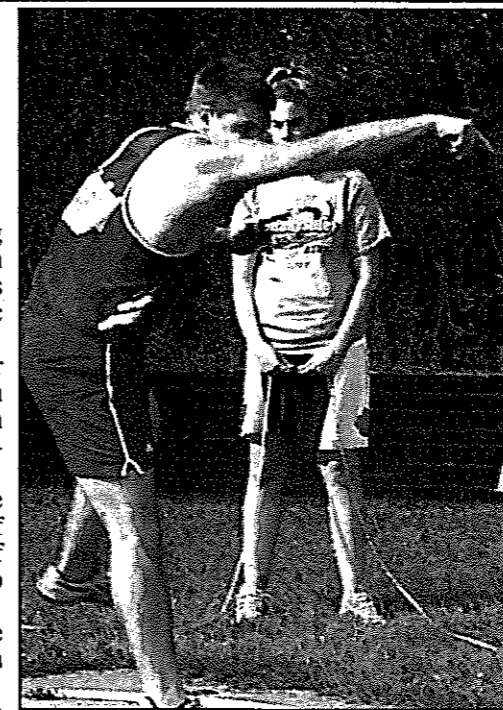
"The girls really came through for us," said Barnesville head coach Darrell Davis. "They came down here with this goal and they performed."

OWINGS MILLS, Md. (AP) — On his first day as a professional football player, Troy Smith was merely one of 29 rookies trying to land a job with the Baltimore Ravens.

"I'm at the bottom of the totem pole right now," he said. "I have that understanding."

His Heisman Trophy, the 54 touchdown passes he threw at Ohio State and even the No. 10 he wore as the nation's finest college football player, were only a memory Friday at the team's rookie camp.

Smith, the last player drafted in the fifth round of the NFL draft, informally launched his NFL career on a beautiful spring morning wearing a purple jersey with the No. 11 on it. Most of his passes were on target; some were not.

"We've got to try to have him be able to do a few more things with the ball," Ravens offensive coordinator Rick Neuheisel said. "He's got a fastball. Now we have to work on some other pitches."

Smith led the Buckeyes to two Big Ten titles and a berth in the national championship game last season. His accomplishments are well documented, but won't mean a thing in the camp that runs through Saturday.

"I think what stands out the most to everybody in the United States is he's the Heisman Trophy winner," Neuheisel said. "I think internally he just wants to learn. He's not coming in here as though he's proven something. He's coming in here wanting to prove something."

• Cal Giffin Track Championship gets under way at 3:30 p.m. at Bellaire; Small schools in action tonight

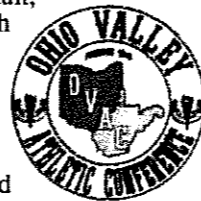

If you thought the times and marks at Shadyside's Fleming Field were impressive on Wednesday night, then you should have made the trip to Bellaire's Nelson Field for Thursday's action, where the big schools opened up their quests for the coveted conference title.

Times were fast and furious on the track and marks were impressive in the field as the Cal Giffin OVAC Track and Field Championship reached its halfway point.

The meet continues this evening in Shadyside where the small schools put the finishing touches on their competition. Big schools take the day off in preparation for Saturday's finals.

However, some of the finals were taken care during the first day of competition.

The Wheeling Park boys — who came into the meet as prohibitive favorites in Class AAAA — did nothing to change anyone's opinion, as they racked up 46 points to pace the field. Zanesville is second with 24, while Cambridge is third with 22.

The Zanesville girls headed back to Muskingum County with the lead after accumulating 27 points. Cambridge is right behind with 23 and John Marshall is third with 19.

The Class AAA girls' race is a deadlock after the first day as St. Clairsville and Harrison Central both mustered 28 points. Union Local is third with 20.

The Oak Glen boys shot out to the Day 1 lead in their meet, netting 30 points. Meadowbrook is second with 24 and Union Local is third with 23.

The Patriots boys took care of their business in impressive fashion, qualifying well and scoring well during the opening night of action.

Wheeling Park was led by junior distance ace Ryan Beabout who posted a 9:18.47 in the 3200. That time broke an OVAC record of Charlie Ward, which stood for 21 seasons.

That was the only individual title the Patriots won, but they qualified well for Saturday and scored in each of the other three events ran as finals.

Zanesville got a pair of victories on day one. Sophomore Jordan Minnick won the pole vault, soaring above 13-feet, 6-inches, while junior Brian Gaiters leaped 20-9 for the long jump title.

Cambridge's Cody Foraker claimed the discus title for the Bobcats. He twirled the platter to 144-1 for the victory.

Steubenville didn't record a point on the first day, but senior sprinter Maurice Bougard showed the rest of the field that

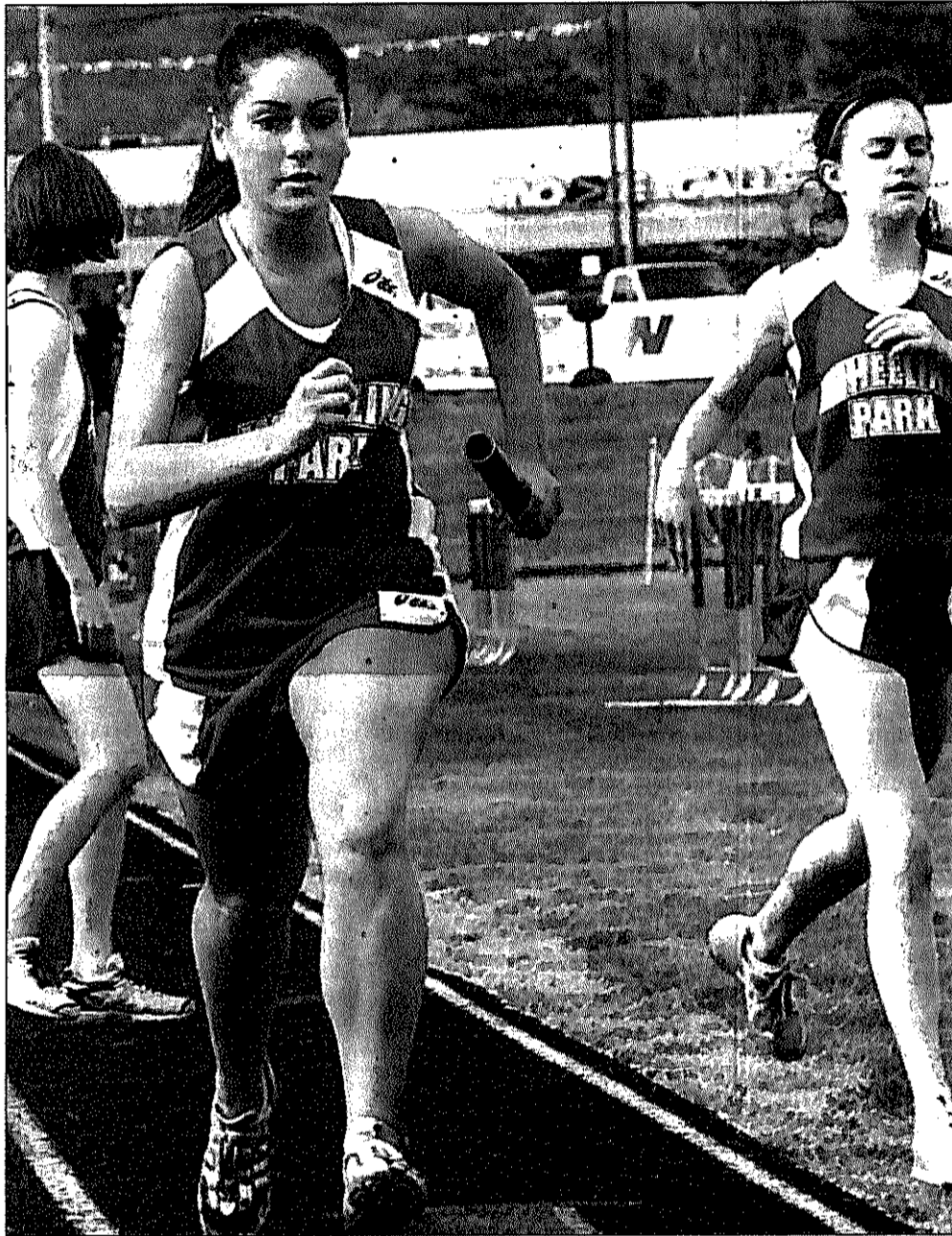

he's for real in the 100 and 200-meter dashes. He set meet records in both events. He ran the 100 semifinals in 10.69, breaking the old mark of 10.89, which stood for 16 years. He then turned in a staggering 21.66, which broke a record that stood since 1989 in the 200.

Bougard — the defending state runner-up at 100 meters — is also closing in on the Nelson Field record, which is 10.64 and was set in 1974.

Senior standout Brian Wilson claimed the 3200-meter title with a 10:02.71.

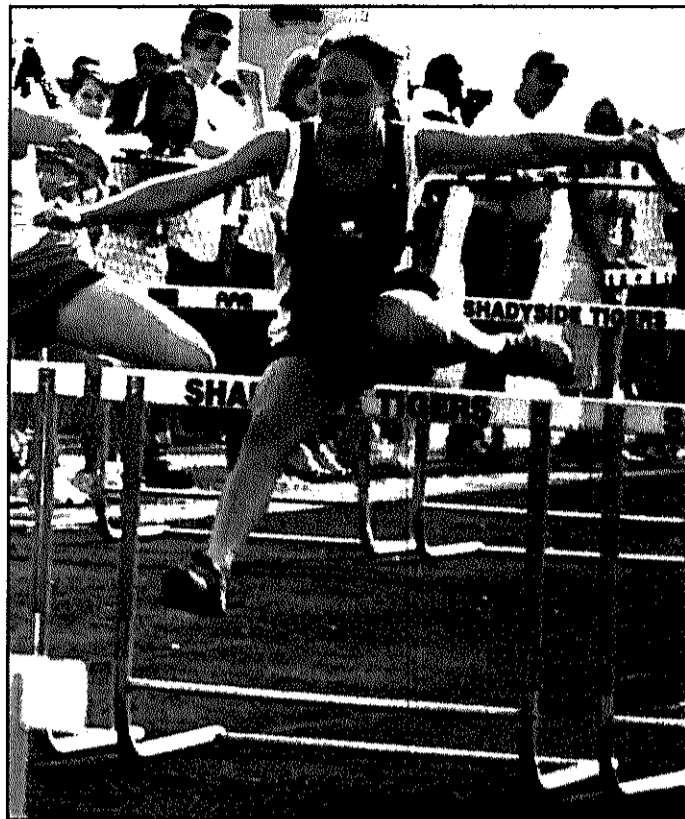

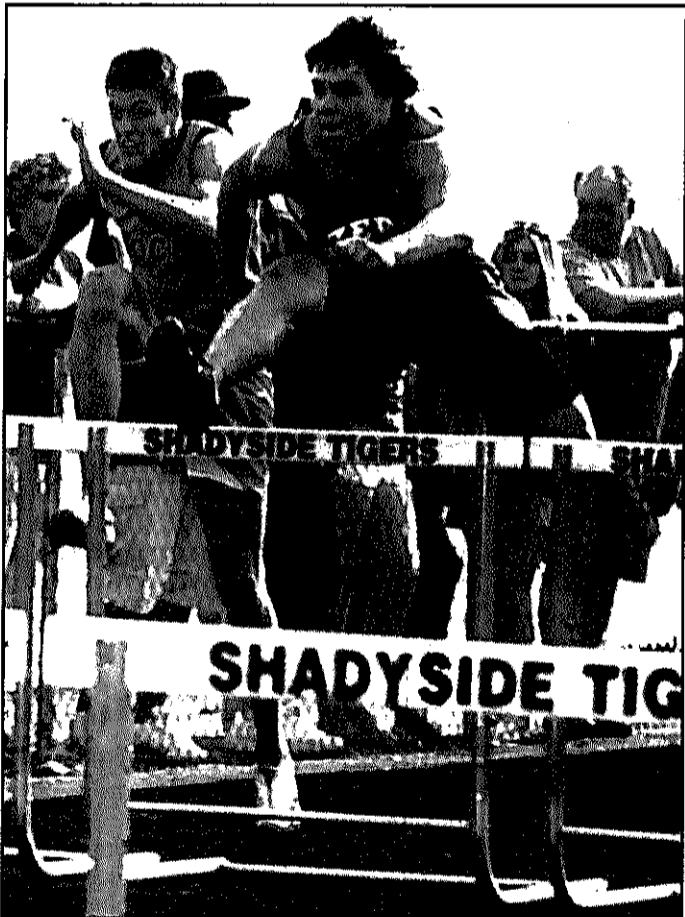

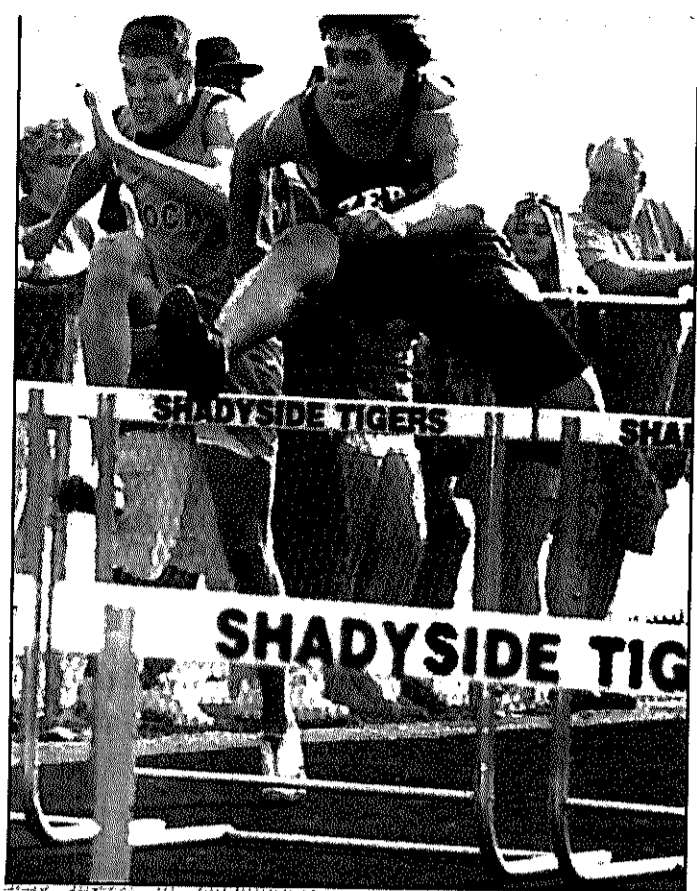

St. John Girls Claim Another

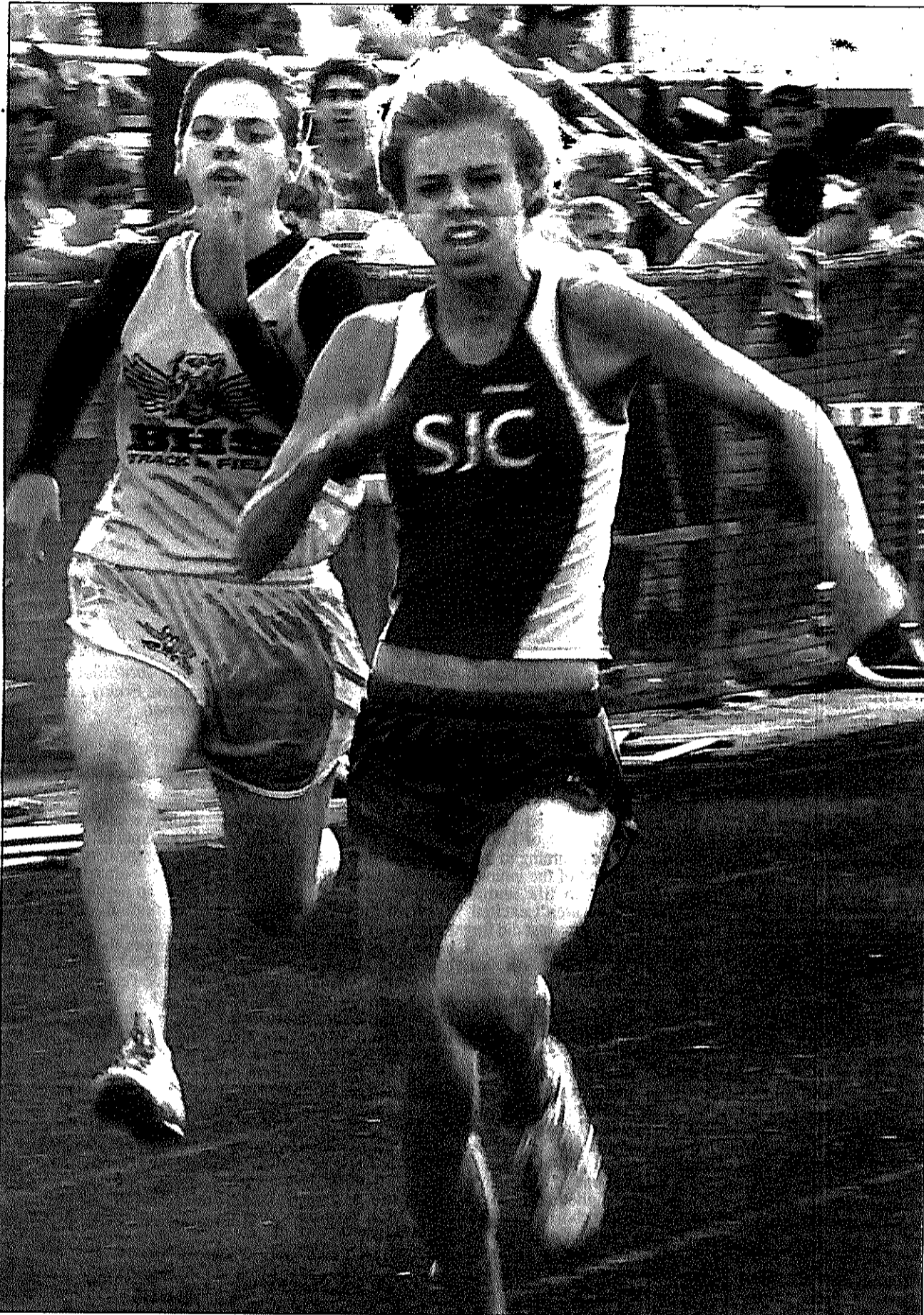

A pair of Ohio Valley track and field heavyweights flexed their muscle once again at the annual running of the Cal Giffin Track and Field Championships at Shadyside's Fleming Field.

The St. John Central Lady Irish captured the top trophy for the sixth straight season, while the Linsly boys got back to their title-winning ways, capturing the boys crown, narrowing out host Shadyside.

The Lady Irish did it in dominating fashion, scoring 201 points, which was 138 better than runner-up Linsly. This marked the third consecutive season when St. John surpassed the 200-point plateau.

"We were confident we could win, but it's always nice to see your kids step up in all of the events along the

way," said satisfied Lady Irish head coach Bubba Kapral. "We have some horses, but we have good talent spread out in almost all of the events."

Kidder — who fell in the low hurdle qualifying Wednesday — got back to form, winning the highs in 15.52. She then won the lows in a solid 47.51 clocking.

Sophomore ace Justene Delman — a member of the Lady Irish state champion 800 team from a season ago — also

had four gold medals. She claimed two individual titles for the Irish, winning the 200 dash in a time of 26.85 and the long jump with a mark of 15-ft-9.

Frosh speedster Alexis Campbell got into the act with two individual titles. She won the 100 with 12.85 and then captured the lap dash title in 62.23.

Junior distance dynamo Natalie Perzanowski also won two individual titles. She added the 1600 title to the 3200 title she claimed on Wednesday when she ran four laps in 5:12.07. She won the 3200 in 11:18.60.

Freshman Kelly Perzanowski set a meet record in the 800 meter run, breaking her sister's mark from a season ago. She circled two laps in 2:22.69, breaking the old mark by nearly two seconds.

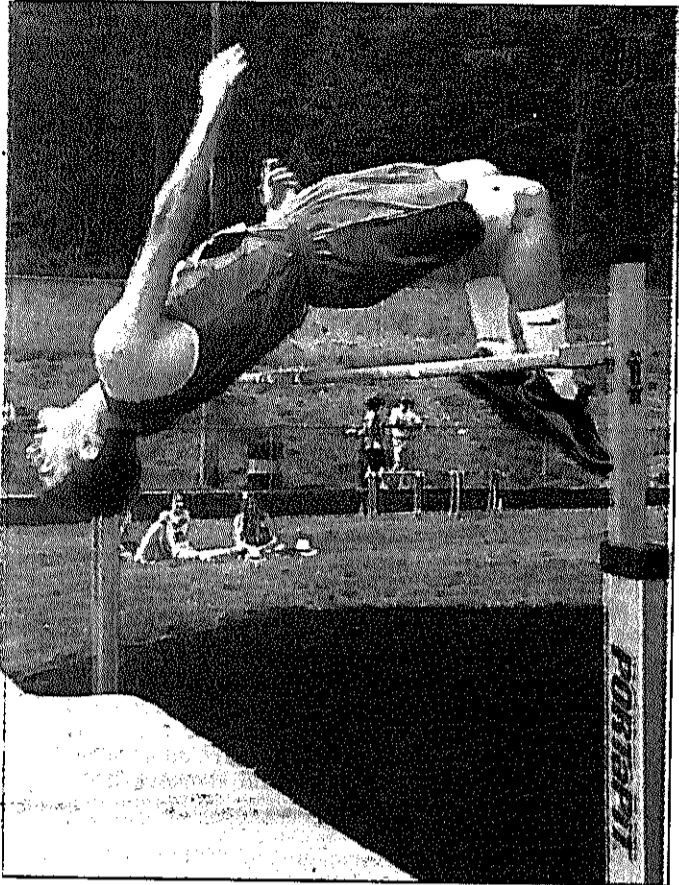

Linsly is second with 26 and Shadyside is third with 22 tallies.

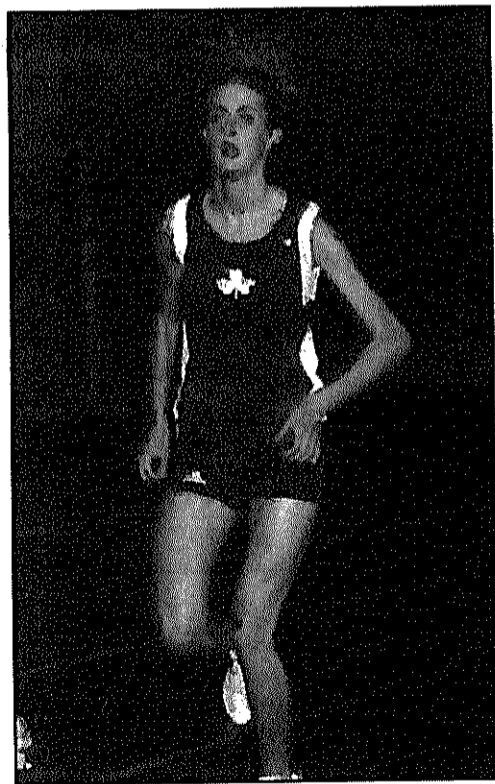

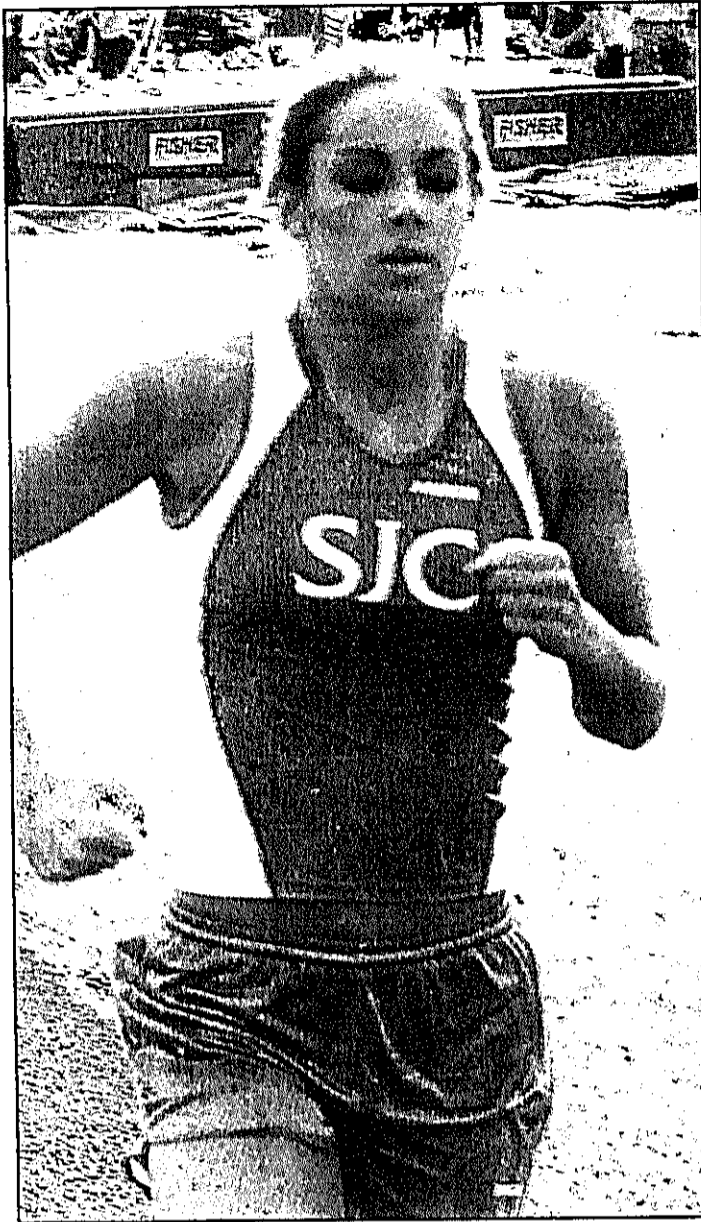

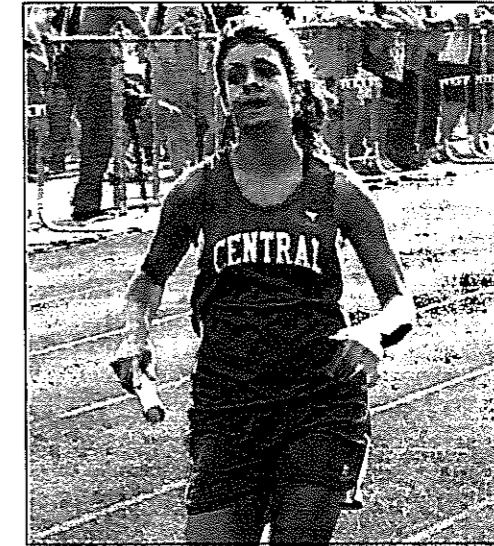
