Park Strikes Gold

Patriots boys, girls prep for regional meet by taking 4-A crowns

And as the West Virginia schools get set to begin post-season action this week with regional competition, it's safe to Wheeling Park is getting real close to its best on both the boys and girls' sides.

That point is further proven by the dominating fashion in which the Patriots swept the boys and girls 4-A titles during Saturday's Cal Giffin OVAC Track and Field Championship held at Bellaire's Nelson

The Patriot boys — who are the reigning AAA State Champions in West Virginia — notched their fifth consecutive OVAC track and field title and their 19th title in school history, scoring 138 points. Weir High and Zanesville went second and However, they claimed four of the five

The Lady Patriots, meanwhile, didn't want to be outdone by the boys, so they scored 116 points, which outdistanced Steubenville (94) and Weir High (76) for their seventh conference title in school history and second straight.

He circled the oval four times in 4:18.71, which was a little more than a second faster than the old mark, which had stood since 1985.

Beabout had won the 3200 title during Thursday's action, posting a solid 9:27.66 for the victory.

'Rocks, Colts Take Class 3-A Titles

Morgan's three distance victories help propel Barnesville girls to championship

Barnesville's girls track program knows a thing or two about winning OVAC titles. The Meadowbrook boys are learning more and more each year.

Those two perennial powers struck gold again Saturday as the Cal Giffin OVAC Track and Field Championships wrapped up at Nelson Field in Bellaire with the final day of competition in the four-day track and field extravaganza.

The Lady Shamrocks - who won the Class AA title a year ago and moved up to Class 3-A this sea-

son - didn't miss a beat, scoring 126 points, which was 12 better than runner-up and defending champion St. Clairsville. The Meadowbrook boys were hit

hard by graduation, but used their speed and depth to hold off a strong fight from Oak Glen for the AAA boys title. The Colts finished with 98 points just seven better than the Golden Bears.

Barnesville and St. Clairsville went toeto-toe for much of the meet, but the Lady Shamrocks' ace Stephanie Morgan and others proved to be too much for the Lady Red Devils.







The annual Cal Giffin OVAC Track and Field Championship has reached its halfway point as the large schools - classes 3-A and $4-\ddot{A}$ – got into the act Thursday evening at Bellaire's Nelson Field.







Wheeling Park sweeps 4-A OVAC track titles

Track teams want to be at their best when the calendar turns to May and into June.

And as the West Virginia schools get set to begin post-season action this week with regional competition, it's safe to Wheeling Park is getting real close to its best on both the boys and girls' sides.

That point is further proven by the dominating fashion in which the Patriots swept the boys and girls 4-A titles during Saturday's Cal Giffin OVAC Track and Field Championship held at Bellaire's Nelson Field.

He circled the oval four times in 4:18.71, which was a little more than a second faster than the old mark, which had stood since 1985.

Beabout had won the 3200 title during Thursday's action, posting a solid 9:27.66 for the victory.

The Patriots' only other individual winner came in the discus where Seth Myers prevailed with a twirl of 138-ft-2.

The Park baton passers strutted their stuff time and time again during the meet.

The foursome of Eric Mendenhall, Alec Wood, Travis McKinley and Brandon McKinley combined speed to win both the 4x100 and 4x200 titles in times of 43.80

The Redskins' senior pocketed the 300 meter intermediate hurdle title in a time of 39.21 to go along with the long jump crown he took on Thursday.









Steubenville CC sweeps Class 2-A hardware; Duke sets record

Coming into Friday's final day of the Class 2-A Cal Giffin OVAC Track and Field Championship, Bob Stanko liked his Steubenville Catholic Crusaders' chances of claiming both titles.

However, as he waited around Friday for the action to get under way at Shadyside's Fleming Field, he started getting nerv-

The nerves were quickly calmed as the Crusaders scored early and often on the track en route to a sweep in 2-A with both the boys and girls winning by big margins.

The Lady Crusaders - who were the odds-on favorites coming into the meet with their speed and depth - rolled to 170 points, which was 83.5 better than runner-up Buckeye Trail.

The Crusader boys, meanwhile, scored 104 points, which was 22.5 better than runner-up

"Our kids love this meet," Stanko smiled after he heard his teams had clinched the titles mathematically. "I truly believed the whole time that our boys had a chance and it depended on a lot of things and our sprinters really came through for us."

When sprinters come through, it's big because the sport of track and field is about speed and the sprint events outnumber the

distance events.

four years. He wanted it so much he asked Stanko to address the team privately Tuesday at practice.

"I was telling the guys that even though we are a relatively young team that I believed in them and we could do this," the personable Cook relayed. "Age doesn't mean anything, and I had faith in them all year long, and I told








