track team.

Speed, speed and more
speed. Throw in a solid
amount of depth and it adds
up to success. While those
factors are important, Coach
Russell Hutchins believes his
team's work ethic and desire
to be good are what separates
it.

Wheeling Park's girls sepa-
rated themselves quite well in
the 5A title chase, scoring
130 points to defeat Morgan-
town by 27.

Parkersburg South's boys
claimed the big-school crown
with 94 points, fighting off
Morgantown (86) and Cam-
bridge (83) for the crown.

The Patriots girls won for
the second straight season
and 12th time overall by
virtue of claiming five gold
medals along the way.

"A lot of quality kids and a
great coaching staff are what
allow you win this meet,"
Hutchins said. "I am just
blessed. The best part of our
kids is they come to practice
and they come to work.
They're a very driven
group."

ST. CLAIRSVILLE — Each of the
last three years, Martins Ferry track
coach Rich Materkoski left Red Devil
Stadium with a bittersweet taste in his
mouth.

The bitter part was erased this year.
The Purple Riders left no doubt as
they swept the OVAC Class 4A titles
Saturday afternoon.

"These (seniors) have been on a mis-
sion since last year, really, when they
took ownership of this team to come

out and bring this thing home,"
Materkoski said. "I couldn't be happier
for the kids. We're lucky enough to be
pretty balanced everywhere."

The Purple Riders boys routed the
field, scoring 153 points, which was
38 better than runner-up Meadow-
brook.

Ferry rung up the hefty point total
thanks to victories in 10 of the 18
events.

Power knows he has a good chance, too, after Penske's cars were the fastest in the first test of the new oval aero kits last weekend. And they have the dominant Chevrolet engines, which have won all five poles this season, four of the first five races and claimed eight of the top 10 spots Saturday.

"It was exactly the race we asked for," Power said. "No yellows. Very straightforward. Knew we would be in good shape. Had a very good car, good stops."

But Honda finally appears to be closing the gap.

Rahal took advantage of a five-car crash in the first turn of the 82-lap race to jump from 17th to sixth, steadily moved through the field into second and continually pressured Power. It's the second straight runner-up finish for Rahal, whose father, 1986 Indy 500 winner Bobby, says his son is racing at

his best.

"It's not that this person you see driving today isn't the same guy that drove last year," the younger Rahal said. "But the car I drove today is better than what I've had. I've been able to attack a lot harder."

The only other Honda driver to finish in the top 10 was Japan's Takuma Sato, who was ninth for A.J. Foyt Racing.

France's Sebastien Bourdais and American Charlie Kimball rounded out the top five. Defending race winner Simon Pagenaud, the French driver who is in his first season with Penske's team, retired after 57 laps because of mechanical problems and wound up last in the 25-car field.

While Power made the race look relatively easy, only surrendering the lead when he pitted, other drivers had bumpier rides.

Three-time 500 winner Helio Castroneves, a Brazilian, got caught in the opening lap melee in his 300th career start. He still managed to finish sixth at his favorite venue.

Rahal, an American, and Montoya, of Colombia, both complained Josef Newgarden prevented them from getting a clean run at Power for almost 20 laps. Newgarden finished a lap down after getting collected in the only major crash of the day but still collected enough points to remain seventh in the standings.

"You get 10, 12 car lengths back, you can feel the air," Rahal said. "I was five car lengths back for five or six laps in a row on his tail. You know, it was like I didn't exist. That's pretty frustrating, but it worked out fine."

Now Power and Penske can focus on their next goal - getting their third win at Indy next weekend.

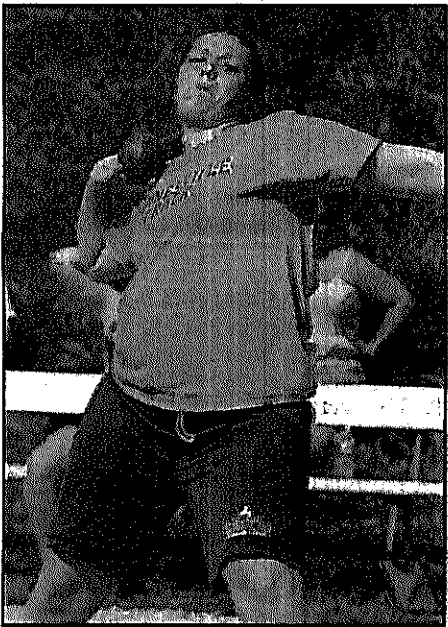

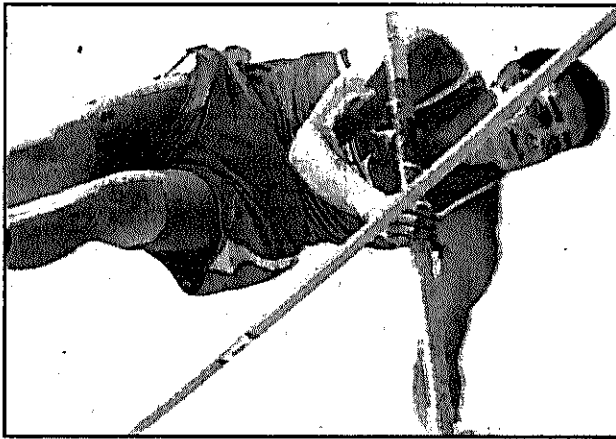

The Irish got a piece of the title and head coach Paul Xenakis was quick to point out his team didn't have its best day.

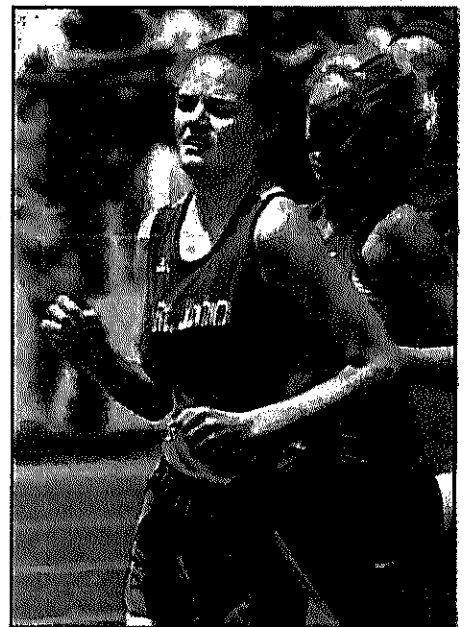

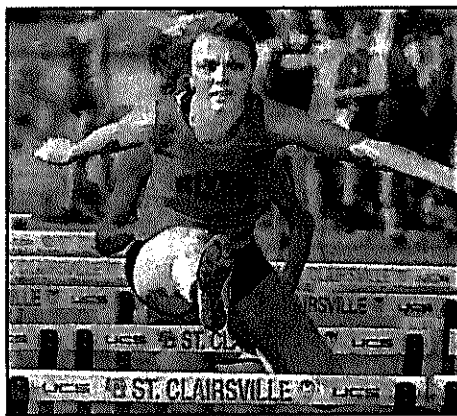

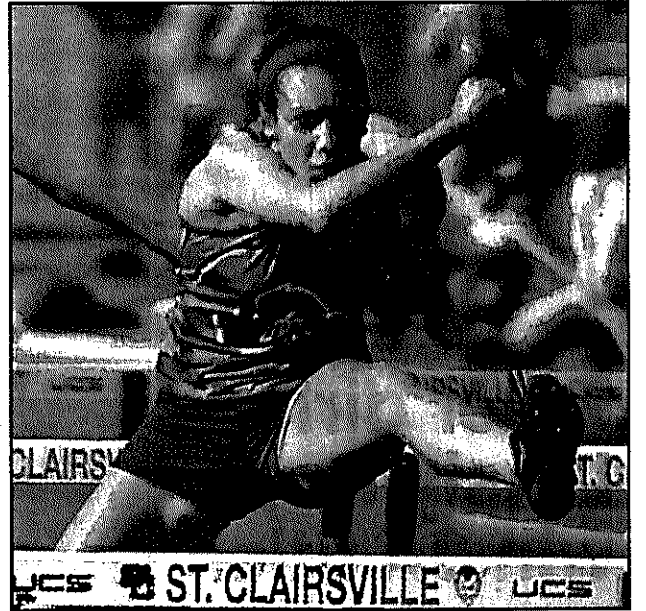
Bridgeport tacked on a run in the second then came back with three more in the fourth.

Day 1 of track meet sees an assault on record book

ST. CLAIRSVILLE — The first pieces of the puzzle are in place.

The entire picture won't come together for a few more days, but the quest for the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference's final championships of the school year — track and field

— is officially under way.

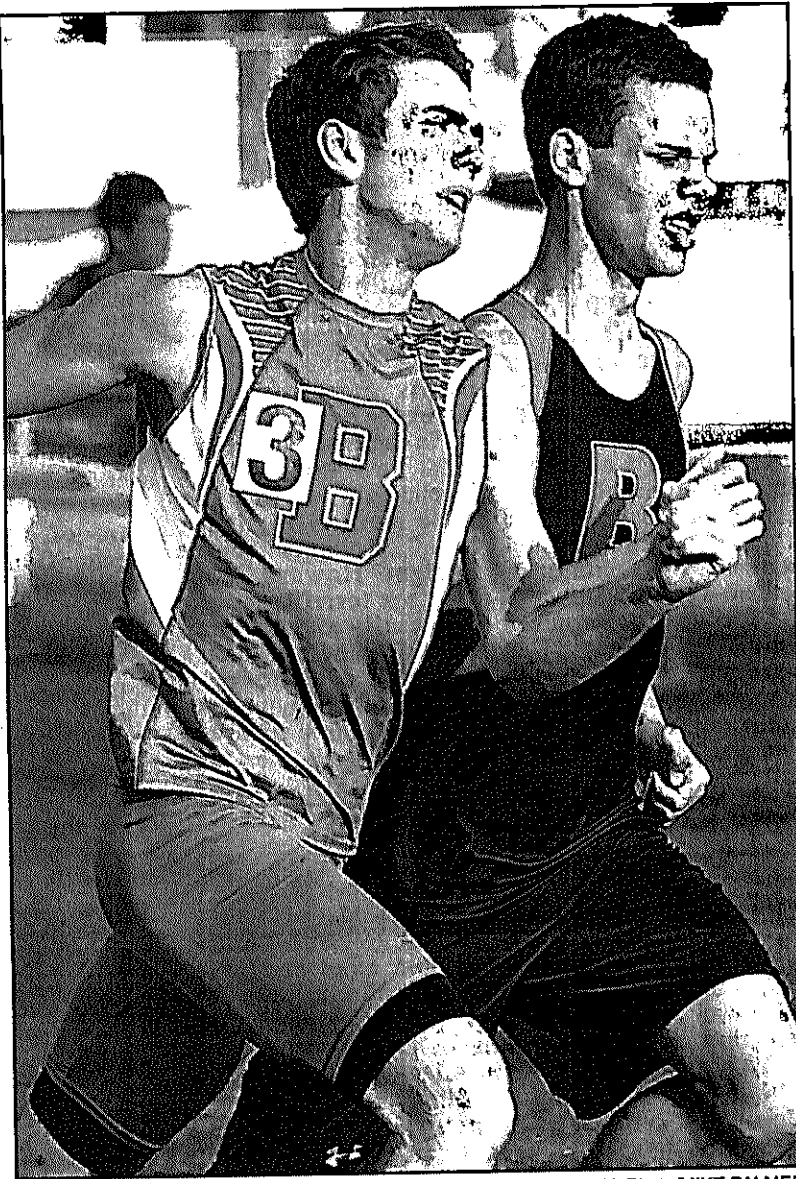

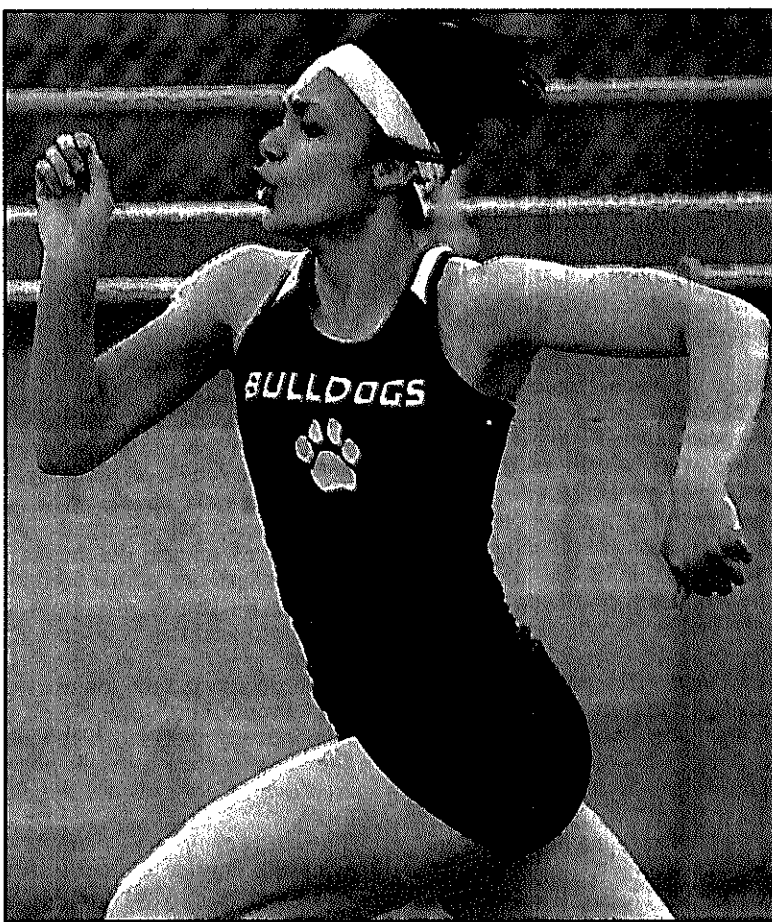

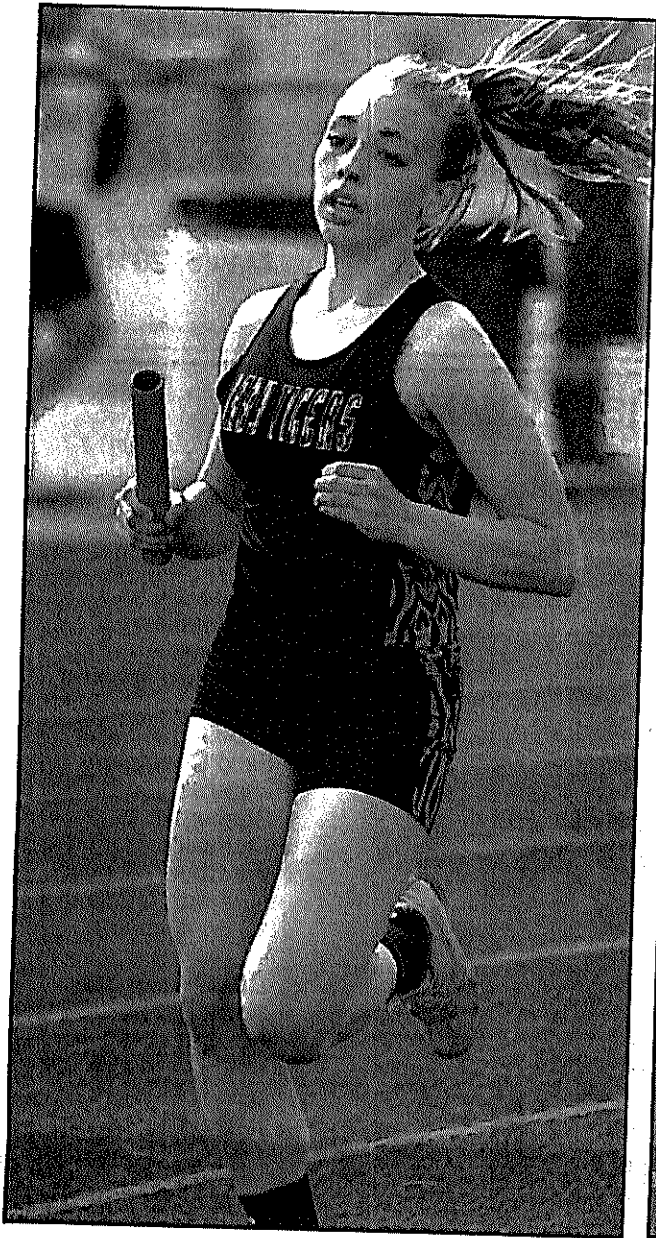

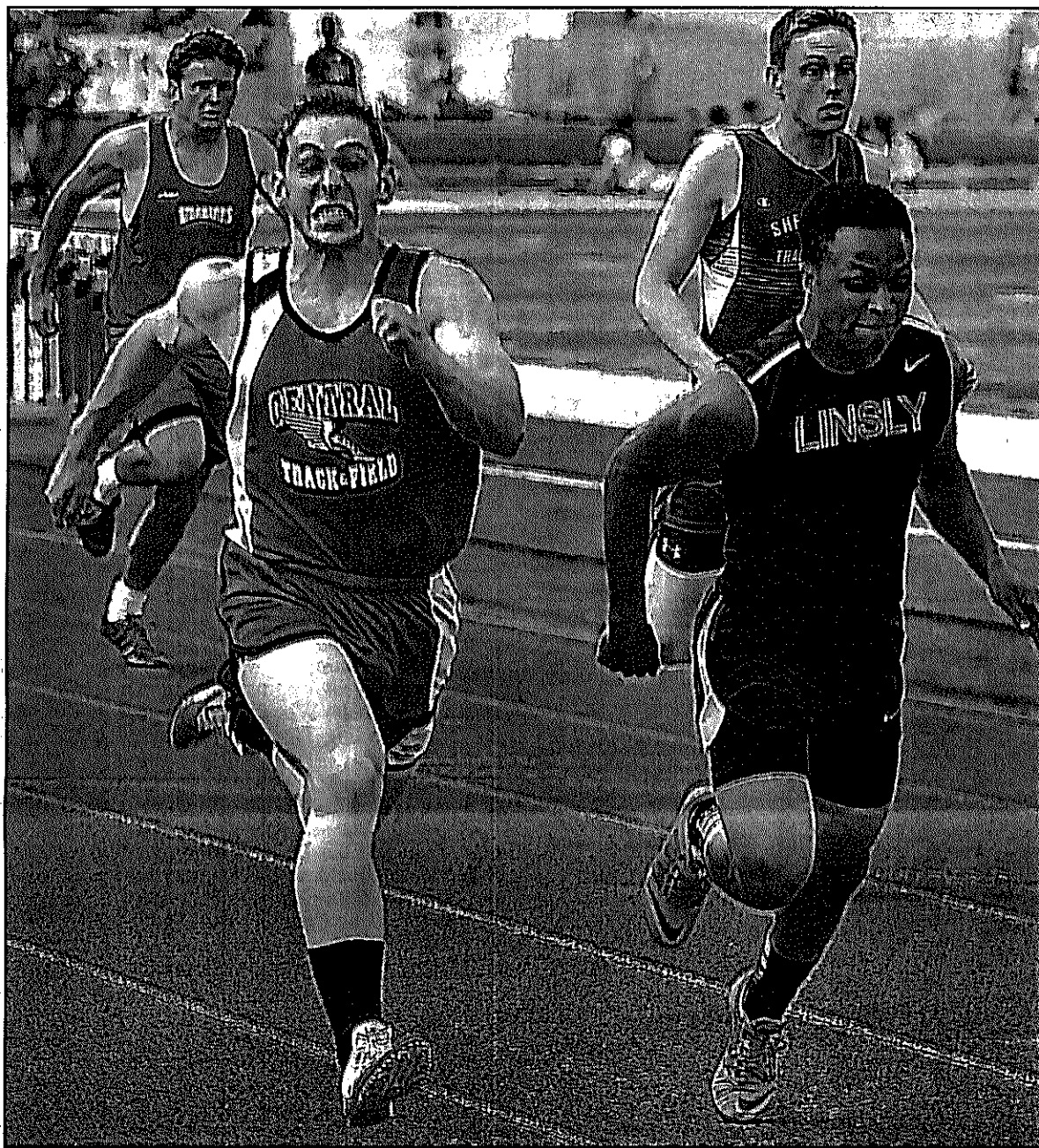
He went to the long jump pit and marked at 20-ft-5 to lead that competition as well.

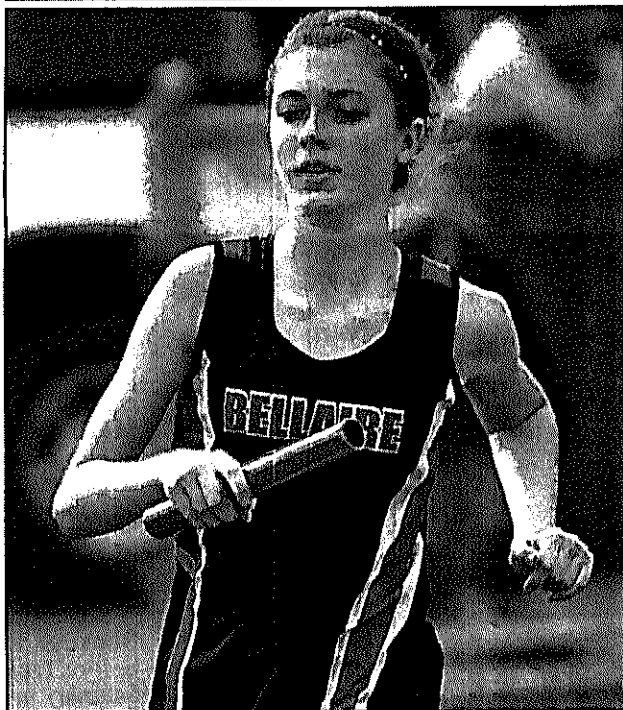
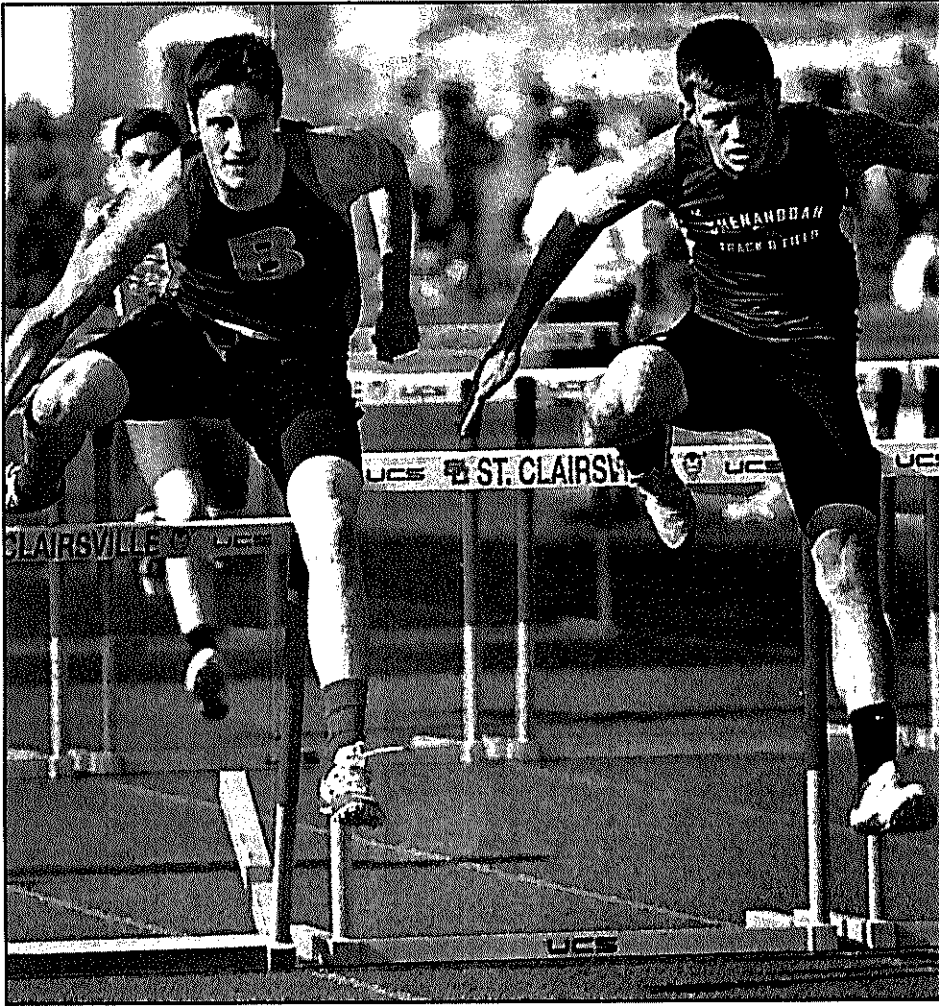

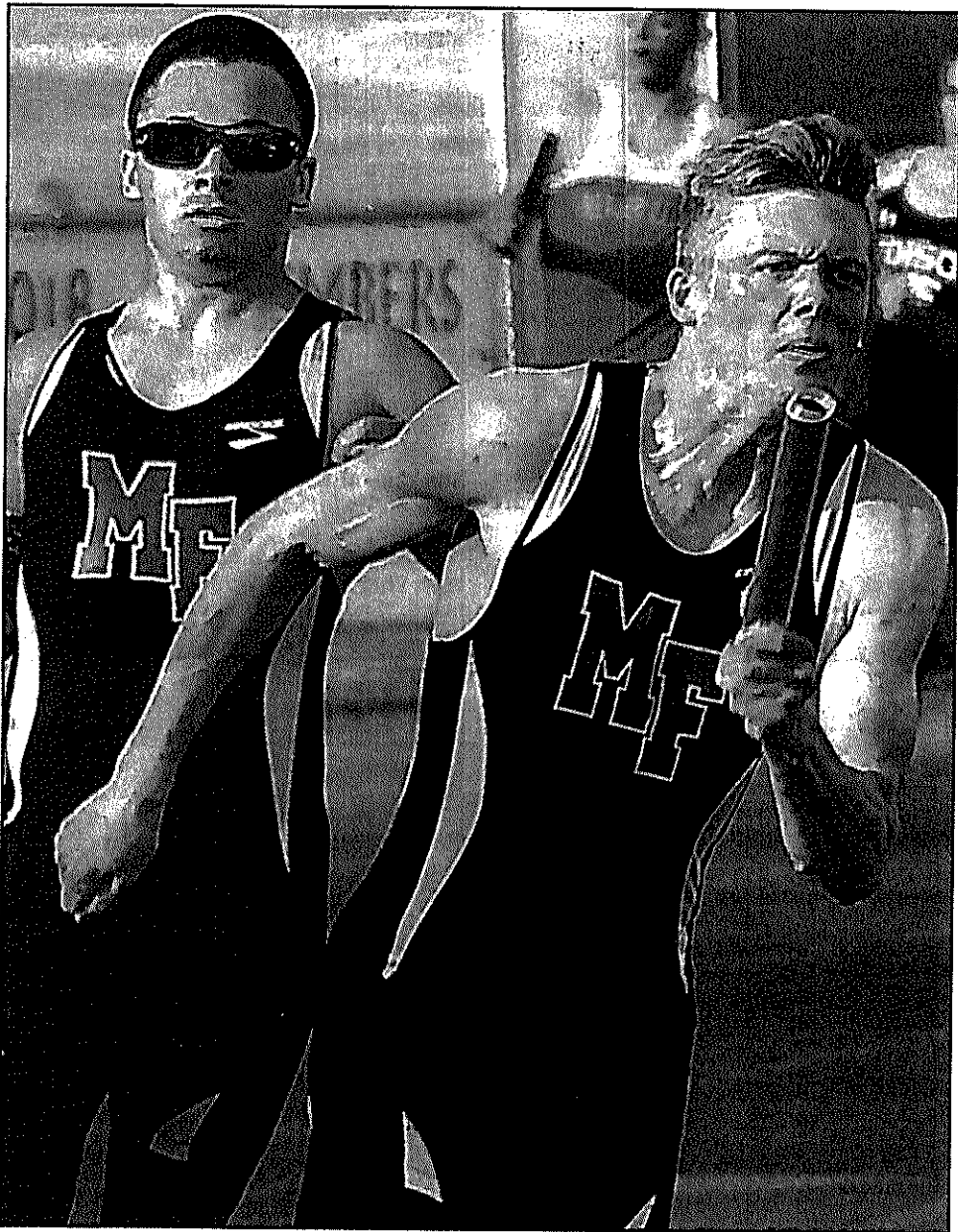
