The Indians are going, going, soon to be

The ballclub announced Friday that at the end of the 2021 season, the Indians will transition from the name they've been known as since 1915 and replace it with Guardians, one they hope inspires a new generation of fans.

The name change, which has its supporters and critics among Cleveland's fan base, ends months of internal discussions triggered by a national reckoning for institutions and teams to drop logos and names considered racist.

"We do feel like we're doing the right thing and that's what's driving this," Dolan said following a news conference at the ballpark. "I know some people disagree, but if anything I've gotten more and more comfortable that we're headed in the right direction.

"And actually, the selection of the name solidifies that feeling because of the values that the name represents."

in Kevin Warren, who is still settling into college sports after a long career in the NFL, is not an issue for the league.

"What's a blessing for our league is the collective intellectual knowledge among our ADs and our presidents," Smith said. "If we decide we need to something we'll be in good position to do so."

Warren has been the commissioner since January 2020, but navigating the pandemic has consumed most of his time in the conference. He is still building relationships within his own league.

In the ACC, former Northwestern AD Jim Phillips is in his seventh month as commissioner. Phillips is a veteran of college sports who has been active at the NCAA level. His longevity should give him credibility and relationships across the country.

Phillips already has an expansion target: Notre Dame. The Fighting Irish compete in the ACC in most sports but returned to football independence after a temporary, pandemic-induced season playing in the conference last season.

That was a really beautiful and beneficial relationship to both Notre Dame and the ACC. They had a chance to play a fantastic schedule," Phillips said this week. "They had a chance to vie for a national championship and compete in the CFP. We have a real-life example of what that could look like.'

Harbaugh, **Frost need** victories

INDIANAPOLIS (AP) - As their paths crossed at Big Ten Media Days, Michigan coach Jim Harbaugh and Nebraska coach Scott Frost appeared to have one thing in common: They are at a crossroads in their careers.

Both have been humbled in recent years. Both need to win now, quite possibly, to save their jobs.

Since returning to his alma mater in 2015, Harbaugh has gone just 49-22 and failed to provide the Wolverines with their first conference title since 2004. His teams have gone 0-5 against rival Ohio State and 1-4 in bowl games.

That's not why Harbaugh was brought back to Ann Arbor as one of the nation's highest-paid coaches. It is, however, why he received a fouryear extension this offseason for roughly half the previous deal, loaded with incentives and including a more financially friendly buyout. Standing on a stage and staring into the bright lights of Lucas Oil Stadium, where his name is memorialized in the Indianapolis Colts Ring of Honor, the former quar-terback known as "Captain Comeback" vowed to bring his program back from mediocrity. A question pertaining to the need to beat the Buckeyes and win a Big Ten title prompted the response that he was "as enthusiastic and excited" as ever. "That's what we want to do," Harbaugh said. "We're going to do it or die trying. Frost is just 12-20 overall, including 9-17 in the Big Ten, as he enters a fourth season at his alma mater. The school hired




He said a formal announcement probably won't come for several months.





"Carrie Hanna brings a wealth of leadership and experience in athletic administration that I know will benefit our coach-



All told, 73 players checked in and were on the practice field during the evening.





Oosthuizen sets new Open mark at halfway point

 South African shoots blistering 11-under, but only leads by two

SANDWICH, England (AP) - Louis Oosthuizen set a 36-hole record at the British Open and is halfway to ending that run of near misses at the majors.

Now all he has to do is hold off a cast of major champions on the weekend at Royal St. George's.

On a day of pleasant summer weather that took the fear out of the links off Sandwich Bay, Oosthuizen broke away from a three-way tie with a birdie-birdie-eagle run from the 12th hole. He shrugged off his first bogey of the week for a 5-under 65 and a twostroke lead on Friday.

Former PGA champion Collin Morikawa had a 64 in the morning and was two shots behind. Another shot back was Jordan Spieth (67), going after his fourth major.

Lurking was two-time major champion Dustin Johnson, the No. 1 player in the world who shot 65 and was tied for fourth, four strokes behind Oosthuizen.

"The game is good, but I know it's a really good leaderboard," Oosthuizen said "I'll have to play good golf this weekend if I want to come out first.

Oosthuizen, looking as calm as the conditions, was at 11-under 129, breaking the 36-hole Open re-cord first set by Nick Faldo in 1992 at Muirfield and matched by Brandt Snedeker in 2012 at Royal Lytham & St. Annes.

This will be the fifth time in the last nine rounds at a major that Oosthuizen, the 2010 Open champion at St. Andrews, has had at least a share of the lead. He was runner-up at the last two majors, to Phil Mickelson at the the PGA Championship in May and to Jon Rahm the U.S. Open last month.

"I'm not really going to think about the second spots," said Oosthuizen, when asked what he'll do differently this time. "I know my game is in a good place." He'll also be aware of the quality of player behind

him, though.



W.Va. Gets 3 Weeks **Of Practice in July**

WHEELING - The COVID-19 pandemic brought about many changes - good and bad - to life, the world and even high school sports.

When West Virginia Governor Jim Justice delayed winter sports until mid March there was a trickle-down effect to spring sports and even the fall schedule.

While the fall sports schedule will be traditional, the summer workouts, practice and conditioning schedule was altered.

Traditionally, the West Virginia SSAC had permitted each county to formulate its own three-week window in the month of June as a period in which coaches could work with their athletes.

Because of the delayed finish for spring sports, the SSAC permitted that period to be held in July, meaning area teams began workouts last Monday and will run the next two full weeks before taking the final week of the month off before official practices begin on Aug. 2.

So far, area football coaches are pleased with the idea.

"I really like it and I hope the state gives us the opportunity to continue to do this pushing forward," Wheeling Park head coach Chris Daugherty said. "Giving the kids the last week of July off before August camp is nice because it allows them to have a full week for their bodies and minds to rest."



MOUNDSVILLE – Justin Kropka stepped foot on the turf at Monarch Stadium Monday to begin his tenure as John Marshall's head football coach with a myriad of emotions and feelings.

Mostly, however, the former Harrison Central head coach was dealing with anxiety.

But, it was nothing out of the ordinary for the veteran coach, who most recently spent three seasons as an assistant coach at Wheeling University.

"The more experienced you be-come (in coaching), the feeling of excitement shifts to being anxious,' Kropka admitted.

The anxiousness stems from the normal things that coaches deal with as a new season approaches. Things like preparation time and roster status are among the big aspects. For a coach who is at a new place, in a new state, things like adjusting to new rules, new oppo-nents and the like are also weighing on the mind.

"For me, it's just anxiety that stems from wondering how things will play out," Kropka admit-ted. "Once you've coached for so long, you start seeing everything bad thing that might be coming 10 miles down the road."

One thing Kropka has learned. however, is to enjoy the opportunity that he has a little bit more. He admitted he didn't do that well at all during his time with the Huskies, but he re-learned that when he was working with the Cardinals. "My time at Wheeling re-lit my fire," Kropka said. "I realized how much I enjoyed coaching kids." And by kids, Kropka fully means at the high school level. Kropka, who is a Martins Ferry product and spent several years working under Dave Bruney, called coaching at the college level a daily coaches clinic because of the amount of knowledge he soaked in. CBJ goalie dies in freak fireworks accident

NOVI, MICH. (AP) -- Columbus Blue Jackets goaltender Matiss Kivlenieks died of chest trauma from an errant fireworks mortar blast in what authorities described Monday as a tragic accident on the Fourth of July.

Police in Novi, Michigan, said the firework tilted slightly and started to fire toward people nearby Sunday night. The 24-year-old Kivlenieks was in a hot tub and tried to get clear with several oth-er people, police Lt. Jason Meier said. Authorities earlier said the Lativan had died of an apparent head injury during a fall, but an autopsy clarified the cause of death.

The fire department and EMTs got to the private home shortly after 10 p.m. and took Kivlenieks to a hospital, where he was pronounced dead, Meier said. The Oakland County Medical Examiner's office reported preliminary autopsy results Monday afternoon.

Prior to the autopsy, police said Kiv-lenieks was believed to have slipped and hit his head on concrete while running from a malfunctioning firework.

"At the moment, we're pretty certain this was a tragic accident," Meier said.

Columbus general manager Jarmo Kekalainen tweeted: "Life is so precious and can be so fragile. Hug your loved ones today. RIP Matiss, you will be dearly missed." Blue Jackets president of hockey operations John David-son called it a "devastating time" for the team.





If the out was recorded at first base before Baez




Suns set Clippers to reach finals

LOS ANGELES (AP) -Chris Paul led the Phoenix Suns into their first NBA Finals in 28 years, beating the Los Angeles Clippers 130-103 on Wednesday night to close out the Western Con-ference finals in six games. Paul scored 41 points and Devin Booker added 22 to

Devin Booker added 22 to send the Suns to their third finals appearance in franchise history. They will face either the Atlanta Hawks or Milwaukee Bucks, who are tied 2-2 in the East finals.

Paul reached the NBA Finals for the first time in his 16-year career on the same Staples Center court where he helped bring the Clippers to respectability over six sea-sons that ended in 2017. The 36-year-old guard punished his old team by tying his playoff career high of 41 – the same amount Paul George had in pushing the Clippers to a road win in Game 5. The Suns last made NBA

Finals in 1993, when they were led by Charles Barkley and lost to Michael Jordan and the Chicago Bulls in six games. Their only other finals appearance was in 1976, a loss to the Boston Celtics in six games. Things got chippy in the fourth. Going into a timeout with 5:48 remaining, Paul stared at Patrick Beverley as he walked by. Beverley turned around and shoved Paul hard in the back, sending him to the floor. Beverley was ejected. Marcus Morris led the Clippers with 26 points despite playing with a sore knee. Bucks officials said the two-time MVP hyperextended his left knee in the third quarter of a 110-88 game 4 loss to the Atlanta Hawks on Tuesday night. The Bucks announced Wednesday that an MRI confirmed that diagnosis and said he'd be listed as doubtful for tonight's game.

Rain washes out basically entire Day 1 **Beast slate**

Mother Nature showed Wednesday and Thursday that she must not be a baseball fan.

Basically, the entire opening day of the annual Beast of the East Baseball Tournament's opening day fell victim to her fury.

Only two venues - both of which feature artificial turf surfaces - played on Thursday. They are both in Washington, Pa. at Washington & Jefferson and Wild Things Park. All told, 62 games were washed out and will not be made up.

"We're hoping it quits and we can get started (Friday)," Beast of the East director Bo McConnaughy said. "It's probably rained the last four or five years during the tournament, but not on every field. We've not had a year, in a long time, where everyone gets washed out at the same time."

The first heavy rain, which caused some flooding around the Ohio Valley, occurred Wednesday afternoon. At that point, McConanughy and other Beast officials began reaching out to the respective field directors to check on the status.

"Because of the severity of the rain (on Wednesday), we couldn't wait to start checking on field conditions," Mc-Connaughy said. "Most of the directors were already at their fields working on them."

The message McConnaughy received from basically all of the sites was that the 8 a.m. games would be questionable, but without anymore rain, they felt good about the prospects of playing the 10:30 contests. That idea – and the entire day for that matter – went by the boards when another large batch of heavy rain moved in overnight and remained over top of the Ohio Valley throughout much of Thursday. "When we called (field directors) again on Thursday morning, they were telling us they probably wouldn't get anything in until 3:30 p.m. and then eventually we all agreed to just call it a day and let the field drain, water soak in and then work on them." Using a one-call network and social media, Beast of the East staffer Shawn Torbett delivered the news of the cancellations to the upwards of 120 teams that have converged on the area with
