PENALTIES OF GAME

LOSS OF TWENTY-FIVE YARDS

Team not ready to play at scheduled time. Illegal return to game (also suspension). Clipping.

LOSS OF FIFTEEN YARDS

Substitute communicating before ball is put in play. Failure to come to stop in shift play. Intentionally grounding pass to save loss of yardage. Interference by passing team with player eligible for catch. Interference with opportunity to make fair catch. Throwing to ground the player who has made fair catch. Illegal use of hands and arms by players of offensive team. Roughing the kicker. Flagrant roughing of kicker (also disqualification). Piling up. Tripping, tackling runner out of bounds, etc. Flagrant unsportsmanlike conduct (also disqualification). One representative in case of accident.

LOSS OF FIVE YARDS

Off side. Request for time out more than three times during a half. Illegal delay of game by either team. Failure of substitute to report. Player in motion less than 5 yards back. Ball not put in play by scrimmage when so specified. Illegal attempt by snapper-back to put ball in play. Attempts to draw opponents offside. Guard or center running with, passing or kicking ball. Player taking more than two steps after fair catch. Illegal use of hands and arms by players of defensive team. Running into the kicker. Crawling by the runner.

RECENT CHANGES IN RULES

The leading changes in the rules, in the order in which they appear in the book are as follows:

A. Rule 5, Section 2, now permits a player withdrawn from the game to return at any time except in the quarter in which he is withdrawn. Substitutions may be made only when time is out for some other purpose, except for the replacement of an injured player. (See also Rule 4, Section 3.)

B. Rule 5, Section 3, now requires outside padding on certain protective equipment prohibits hard knee and elbow pads and specifies that all players must wear soft knee pads.

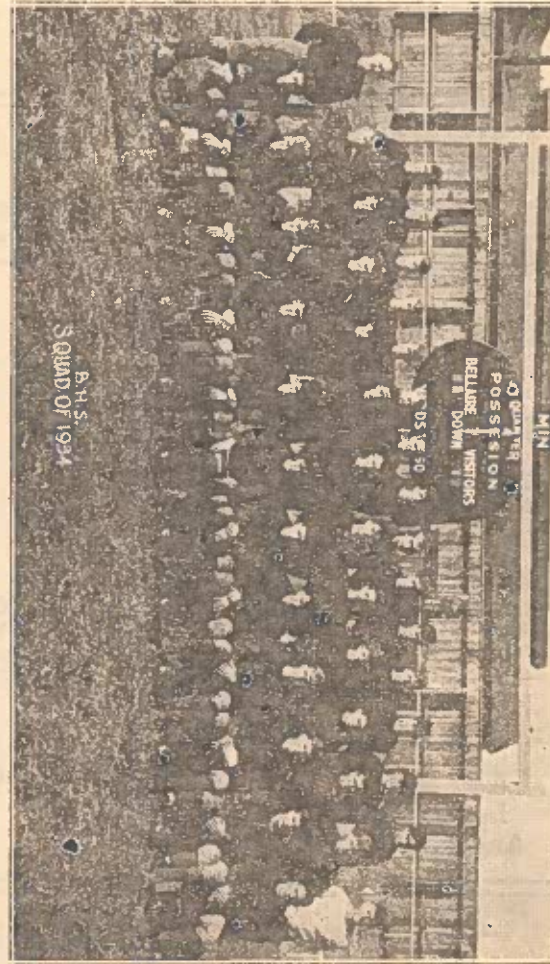
C. Five players of the team receiving a kick-off or a free-kick are required to remain within five yards of their restraining line until the kick is actually made. (Rule 6, Section 1, also Rule 8, Section 2, Article 5.)

The receiving team may signal for a fair catch and thus be protected from interference even though the kicking team is eligible to recover the ball.

D. Under the new provisions of Rule 7, Section 7, the ball becomes dead automatically when any portion of the player in possession of it except hands or feet, touches the ground. This does not apply to the holder of the ball in a place kick.
