WE SERVE IN PEACE

Belmont county can boast of the activities of the American Legion posts for its various activities, serving now in peace as its members did during the war.

Pupils of the Belmont county schools derive much from the activities of the American Legion posts, especially through the programs of Americanism and youth activities.

The National Americanism program, which is of concern to the young people, is divided into three groups, education, youth activities and community service.

The educational features include, school awards, flag education, citizenship schools, American education week, national constitution week, keeping boys in school, cooperation with parent-teachers association, cooperation with schools in observing patriotic holidays.

Youth activities include, boy scouts, C. M. T. C. and R. O. T. C. junior baseball, boys' and girls' week, junior rifle clubs, 4-H clubs, girl scouts and girl reserves, boys' state.

Community service includes, safety first programs, elimination of fire hazards, emergency relief units, playgrounds and recreation for community, aviation activities, city advertising, swimming pools, erection of memorials, community service council, conservation activities.

Nearly every post in Belmont county has sent boys each year for the past four years to the Buckeye Boys' State, one of the greatest boys schools in the state. Nearly every post has conducted the annual essay contests, and Belmont county has had numerous district winners, two of whom from Bellaire have been state winners. Junior baseball teams have been sponsored in some of the posts.

There are many other activities, not listed in which the posts have participated, to help the community, state and nation.

The American Legion invites those former service men, with an honorable discharge, willing to serve in peace as they did in war, to become affiliated. Posts are located in Martins Ferry, Bellaire, Bridgeport, Shadyside, Powhatan, Belmont, Neffs, Barnesville, Bethesda, Flushing and St. Clairsville. All of these posts are identified as one working unit for the things that are fine, and good and clean in Belmont county.

It is a rare honor to belong to the American Legion. This honor is afforded to only one out of every 50 persons in the United States.


