Dixon, the faculty adviser of the club.

Mr. Dixon has succeeded as leader in all phases of the Hi-Y program since accepting that position five years ago. The program he fosters meets the needs of the upper class boys for a club in which social etiquette, good sportsmanship, vocational guidance, as well as community and school interests are discussed in a wholesome, constructive manner. In addition to his school duties, he finds time to teach a Sunday School class, help with the community affairs, to be clerk of the Pultney Township Board of Education and to be a member of the board of trustees of the Presbyterian Church.

A Team Is Only As Good As Its Coach

Football, like politics, provides material for a great variety of conflicting opinions. Some hold, for example, that one system, of itself, is better than another.

Some believe a 6-3-2 defense is better than a 6-2-2-1, or a 7-2-2. Many are convinced that a coach makes his reputation by developing outstanding players. Yet others hold that outstanding players who were already developed make a reputation for a coach. Of course there are two sides to every question, and in football it is very possible that both sides are right. Bob Zuppke, artist, humorist, and coach, once said that if it hadn't been for Red Grange the vast majority of people in this country would think that Illinois was the name of a race horse, and Zuppke was a new kind of breakfast food. Be that as it may, the fact remains that the football coach is the most important cog in the football structure of any academic institution. In most instances his influence is more far reaching among the students, the players, and the alumni, than any other person's save the president of the college.

Among football men it is regarded as axiomatic that a football team reflects the personality of its coach. If the team plays a smart, heads up brand of football, functions as a closely coordinated unit, and knows its individual and collective assignments, the chances are a hundred to one that the coach is a circumspect fellow, meticulous about details, and possessed of a comprehensive knowledge of the sport. If, on the other hand, the coach has a superficial knowledge of the game, and is lacking in self-discipline, self-confidence, and poise, his team reacts the same way.

While a team mirrors a coach's personality, the true merits of a football mentor cannot be properly determined by the number of victories he turns in, or by his record alone. A football game today can be won and lost by many things over which a coach has

absolutely no control, so that it would be quite unfair to hold him responsible for the loss of any individual game.

The conduct and attitude of a team which is being beaten reveals very clearly the kind of coaching it received, and the kind of competitive philosophy it has had imbued into it. A well coached team looks good even when losing. It blocks well, tackles well, and thinks fast. It is beaten only because the other team is the better of the two.

The ideal combination for success on the gridiron is talented material and expert coaching. Wherever you have this combination you find an unusually successful team. Yet a large number of coaches have done remarkably well with average squads. Lou Little, for instance, took over the coaching reins at Columbia University when football was dying from campus apathy, and despite his incredibly small and undersized squad, produced a Rose Bowl champion after a few seasons. Lou's big-hearted, fearless and aggressive attitude towards life was seen in the play of his team. His eleven reacted as he would have done in a similar situation, and it played as he would have played.

Coaches today, almost without exception, constitute an exceptionally fine group of men. The day of the brow-beating, bully type of mentor has long since passed. Modern football demands teachers who are not only intelligent gentlemen, but men who are sincerely sympathetic to the problems of their young charges, and definitely interested in their physical and mental welfare.

The clean play and sportsmanship evident is present day football is due chiefly to the fact that coaches, virtually without exception, insist on fair play and a wholesome approach to the game on the part of the players. It wasn't that way twenty years ago. The coaches have changed it. Modern football is too complicated and too fast to permit a man to give a thought to anything other than his own particular assignment. A man whose mind is not on the game is practically useless to his team.

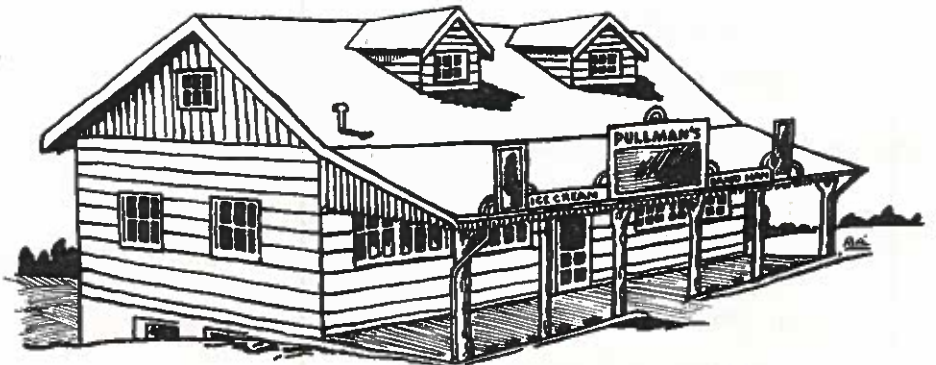

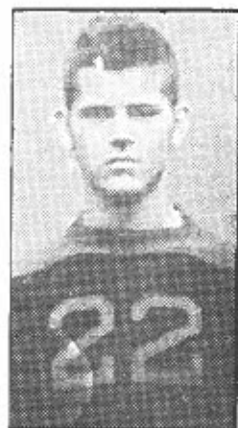

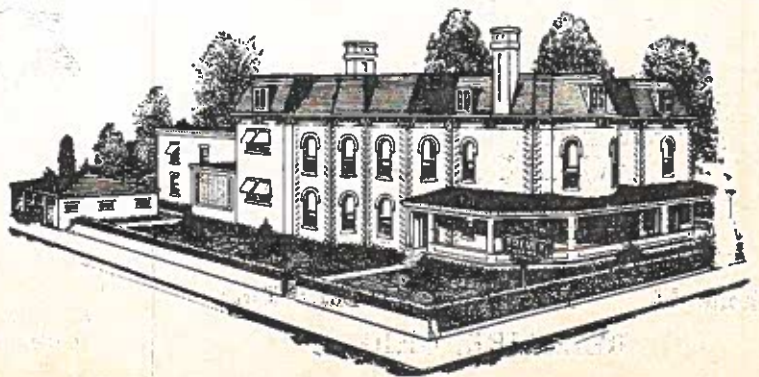
