YOU HAVE TO HAVE A LINE FIRST

That star left halfback out on the field in front of you gets most of the newspaper space, but stop and consider for a moment what makes those dazzling, twisting runs of the backfield star possible.

On every play, the man carrying the ball needs help. And it's the seven men in the front line trenches who have to give the flashy back that needed aid. Observe for two or three minutes how those unwreathed heroes in the first ranks pave the way for the next slice off tackle.

Good linemen really have a bit of the magician in them. For it's up to them to deceive, if possible, the opposition on every move. An inexperienced lineman may give the play away by continually glancing in the direction he's going to take, by slightly turning his body, by the positions of his hands, and even by the way he shifts his feet. A clever scout will notice such actions and tip off his team. Reversing the strategy, a clever lineman sometimes intentionally makes a false move to deceive the opposing eleven.

When on the offense, the skilled lineman must be able to effectively block out his opposition. To do this he must be an expert on the head and shoulder block, the body block and

the roll block. In the latter, the player throws his body against the would-be tackler above the knees, and rolls downward so as to take the defensive player off his feet.

Often a lineman has to play a double role. When his teammate pulls out of the line to form interference for the ball-carrier, the lineman has to handle two of the opposition players. To do this he has to be a master at the cross-body block.

On the defensive side, every lineman worth his salt is plotting to get across the line of scrimmage so that he may nail the man with the ball. Normally the opposing player thwarts his plan. If he does get clear, he finds it a man-sized task to stop the progress of the zigzagging pigskin carrier. The tackler has to keep his eyes open and fixed on the runner and on the spot he intends to hit. If he is well schooled, he will first aim his head at the ball carrier's waist.

When contact is made, he drives his legs forward in quick, short steps. With head and shoulders lodged against the runner's body, he completes his job by locking arms around the runner's legs and giving a quick upward pull. And it isn't as easy as it looks.

Yes, it's generally true, the star makes the points and linemen make the star.

OLD AND NEW QUARTERBACKING

The huddle has supplanted the signal-barking quarterback with almost every team in the country. Yet many coaches claim that the huddle is doomed and that old-fashioned signal-calling will come back into the picture again.

Last winter at the annual meeting of the football rules committee, debates waxed fast and furious over the efficacy of the two systems with the coaches favoring the huddle far outnumbering the exponents of the signal-calling technique.

Coaches favoring the huddle say it gives the players brief breathing spells, enables the play to be heard over the roar of the fans, and simplifies things for both the coach and the players.

Coaches preferring signal-calling over the huddle usually contend that it gives the attacking team a better chance to spot openings in the defense, speeds up the game, gives the team rhythm, and confuses the opponents. Robert (Matty) Mathews, University of Portland coach, claims his 1939 team drove 82 yards in slightly more than three minutes, using almost as many plays as it takes a huddling team to develop in a full period.

All these debates and arguments between those who favor the old or the new in quarterbacking recall some of the early signal systems used when football was in its infancy in the United States.

One of the earliest signal systems resembles the signals used by the fake mindreader and his assistant. A careless remark praising any play meant left halfback between left tackle and end. If the quarterback rubbed his knee and remarked how it hurt, the rest of the players knew the next play was a center smash by the fullback.

Later, in the '90's, some of the practice sessions resembled classes in mathematics, with long signal drills held at night. The players had to use numbers which required problems in addition, subtraction, multiplication, and even division. A wrong answer might mean a ten-yard loss, while a touchdown usually proved their answers were correct.

In Jim Thorpe's day, the Carlisle football squad used Indian words for signals while the Navy seven went them one better, using such jargon as, "Furl the top gallant clew lines and hands by the halyards—shift!" Sometimes the entire team chanted the signal.

Nowadays the most common signal is the number type. The quarterback barks out a list of numbers, such as "8-14-32-27", and one of them tells which play is coming up. The numbers from 60 to 69 might mean pass plays while those from 30 to 39 might be reverses.

Coaches, in the main, may still favor the huddle, but the old timers will tell you that barking quarterback any day.

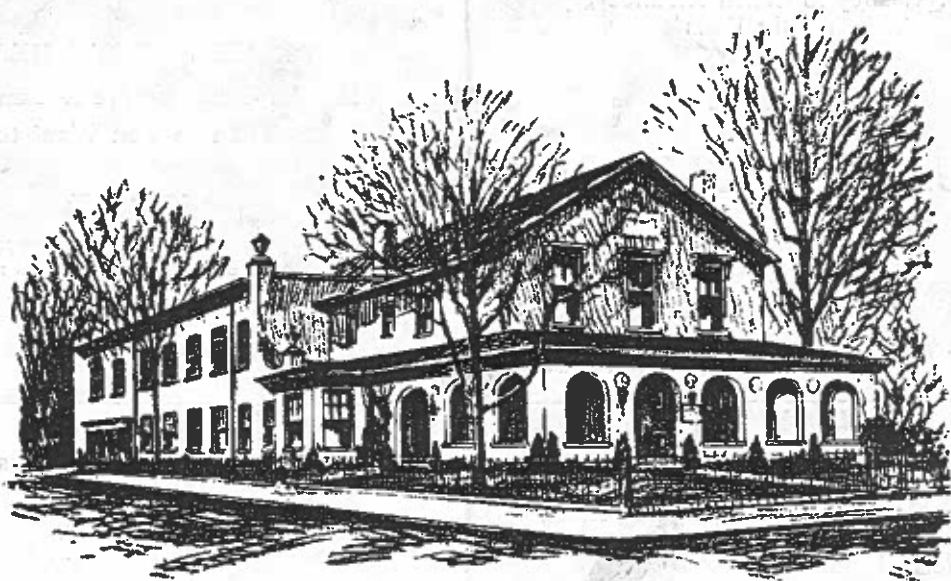
