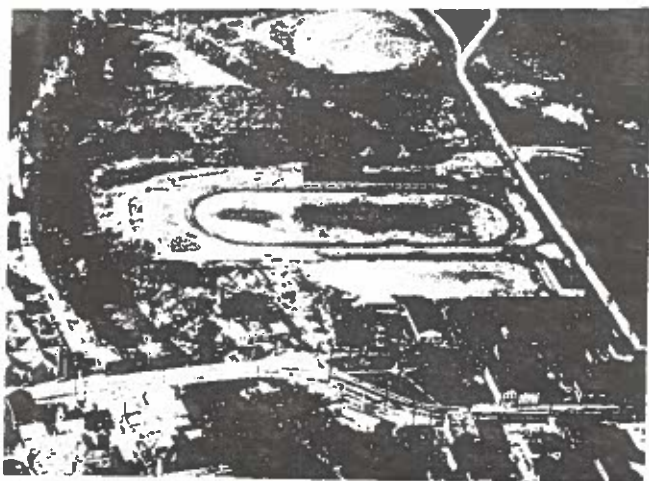

This brochure contains general information relating to the 1965 BELLAIRE RELAYS, namely, time schedule, awards, results of the 1964 meet, records; photographs, regulations and other valuable data. An Entry blank is enclosed for your convenience.

The Bellaire Relays is an open competition meet (no classification) and is sanctioned by the Ohio High School Athletic Association and the National Federation of High School Athletic Association.

CONGRATULATIONS !!!

We wish to congratulate Cleveland East Tech who last year took home the championship trophy. Tech was runner-up in 1963 and exceeded their previous years performance by nosing out Cleveland Glenville. Their fabulous relay strength plus their all around balance made them a true Bellaire Relays Champion. On behalf of the Bellaire Relays Committee - - Congratulations again.

Location: Nelson Field - 26th Street, Bellaire

Track: The Track is a 440 yard track with a 220 yard Straight away.

Scoring: Five places will count and scoring (including relays) will be as follows: 6 - 4 - 3 - 2 - 1.

Spikes: Not to be worn in grandstands or field event bleachers.

The area adjacent to the finish line will be fenced off and contestants found in this area will cause his teammates to be disqualified. The finish line officials must have a good view at all times.

A medical tent will be located in the middle of the field and available to all teams. This area will be supervised and directed by Dr. Peter Lancione along with a competent staff.

All relays will be run against time.

Relay Exchanges: The 880 yard sprint relay will be run in lanes and the team will exchange batons in their respective lanes. In all other relays, the California exchange will be used and the teams will be placed in position of the incoming runner.

Restrictions: Any boy who runs the 880 or the mile cannot take part in more than one other track event. The relays shall be counted as track events. No boy can compete in more than four events of which only three can be track events.

Shot put and discus will be thrown from cement. All other field event areas are of asphalt. Soft rubber shoes should be worn but 1-8 inch spikes acceptable.

The shot put and discus will be run in flights according to the best distances. All schools entering teams in our relays must abide by the rules and regulations adopted by their State Associations.

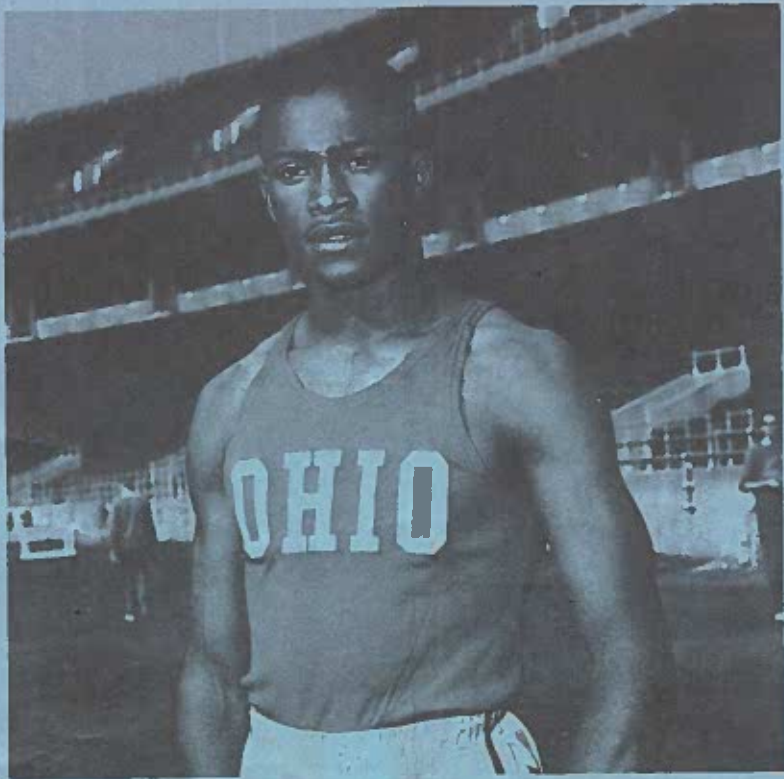

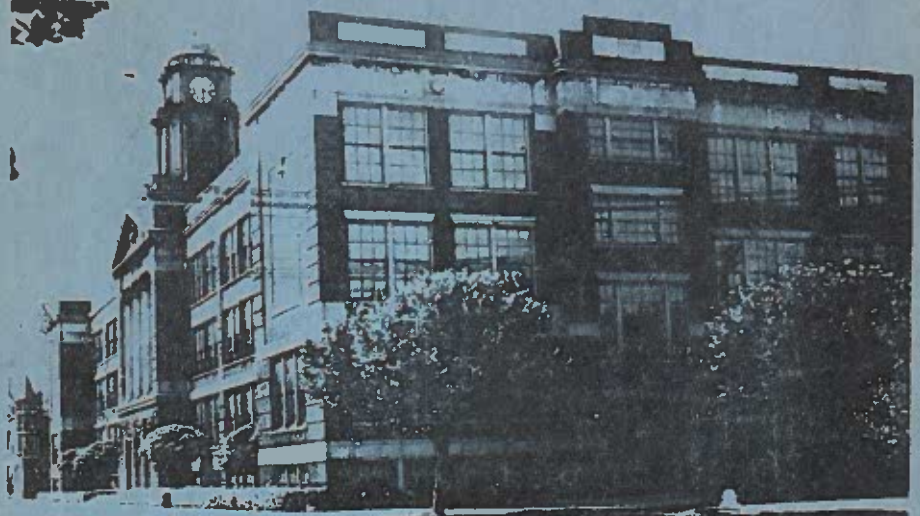
PAUL WARFIELD
