J. Marshall Conference Harrier King

Led by Mike Veronis, John Marshall High won the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference cross-country championship Saturday morning at Oglebay Park.

Veronis was clocked in 12:11 for the 2.3 mile course. He was followed across the finish line by Larry Teeters, of Brooke High.

John Marshall finished with 41 points to 50 for runner-up Triadelphia. Brooke was third with 59 points, followed by Bellaire, 80; Martins Ferry, 128; Wheeling, 148; and Wheeling Central, 175.

Third in the individual race Rich Crum, of John Marshall, followed by Steve Rust and Emmett Garlitz, both of Triadelphia; Gary Benesh, Bellaire; Mike Bellemere, Shadyside; Dan Rybeck, Triadelphia; Bruce Henthorn, Brooke; and Bob Paisley, John Marshall, rounding out the top 10.

Bellemere was Shadyside's only representative so the Tigers did not figure in the team scoring.

John Marshall not only had three finishers in the top 10 but Bruce Dakan ran eleventh to clinch it for the Monarchs.

Wednesday at Brooke High's course, the Mountaineer League cross-country race will be held, starting at 4:30 p.m.

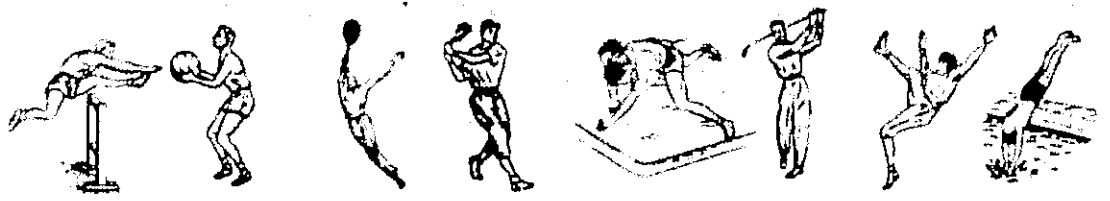
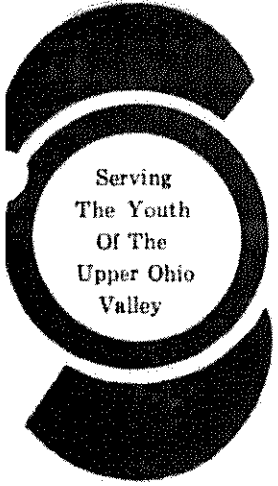
