Paden City Claims 'A' Title

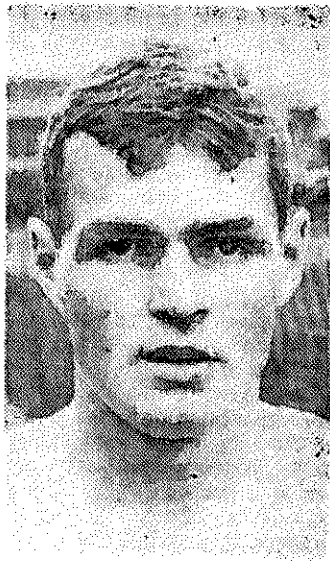

Scoring in every event, Paden City became the new Class A track and field champion of the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference Saturday as rain showered over the thinclads at Bellaire's Nelson Field.

The Class A meet was dovetailed with the triple-A fixture at Bellaire and at least one of the small-school stars proved that he was capable of holding his own against his big-school brethren. Mike Brown, Beallsville speedster who must be regarded as a prospect for state laurels, was the individual high scorer of the day with 19½ points and broke two of his own meet records in a brilliant performance in which his times compared favorably with those of Class AAA sprint champion Bob Washington, of Steubenville.

Paden City's depth and balance proved just too much for the other four schools in the "A" field. Coach Bob Burton's Wildcats piled up 86½ points, compared to 70 for runner-up Beallsville. Hopedale finished with 49 while Brilliant made 18 and Woodsfield brought up the rear with 15½.

A new champion had been assured this year because Powhatan, last year's winner, now sends its students to River High, a Class AA school. And Paden

City took home the big trophy, even though Beallsville had a 7-6 edge in first place finishes.

You might have thought Nelson Field was named for Mike Nelson, Paden City's versatile star as he won the high hurdles in 15.9 secs., equalled the meet record in the lows with a 21.2 clocking, finished second in the long jump, and anchored the winning shuttle hurdle relay team.

But Mike Brown outdid Nelson in the long jump and that helped the Beallsville ace to take individual high-scoring honors. Brown went 19 ft. 1¼ in. in the long jump but it was in the dashes where he impressed. His 10.1 in the 100 matched Washington's winning "AAA" time and his 22.3 in the 220 was even better than that posted by the Steuberville standout.

Brown also anchored Beallsville's winning spring relay team. And it was a big day all around for the Brown boys for Dave Brown took the 440 in 52.8 to wipe out at a record that belonged to Bob Dunlevy, the former WVU and Wheeling Ironmen footballer from Warwood, and also ran on that winning sprint relay team — in addition to finishing second in the fur-long.

Beallsville also had a double

winner in the weights in Bob Darby.

However, Paden City matched that with a 1-2 finish in the 880 won by Lloyd Billiter, and the Wildcats also copped the mile with Rick Koerber. Paden City was also winner of the mile relay.

Other winners were Carl Pizzino, Hopedale, in the high jump, and Dan Jones, Woodsfield, in the pole vault.

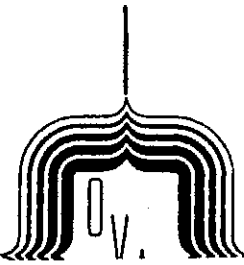

Shadyside Retains 'AA' Track Honor

The Shadyside Tigers won the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference Class AA title for the third straight year Saturday as Coach Jack Berger's squad defeated 10 rivals for the crown in the rain at Fleming Field in Shadyside.

Shadyside had only three first place finishes, Gary Silverio's record setting performance in the pole vault and victories by the shuttle hurdle and mile relay teams, as the Tigers amassed 59 1/2 points, while the Linsly Cadets were runner-up with 44 1/2 markers.

The remainder of the team scoring included Bellaire St. John's, 43; River, 37; Weirton Madonna, 24; Toronto, 19; Cameron, 16; Warwood, 12 1/2; Mingo, 10; Barnesville, 4 1/2; and Cadiz, 2.

In addition to Silverio's record, three other marks were established with two going to River's distance ace, George Armann, who won the 800-yard run and mile run, while Tom Thomas of Linsly put his name in the record book with his 15.4 clocking in the 120-yard high hurdles. Armann ran the mile in 4:35.5 and the 800 in 2:03.9, despite a heavy track.

St. John's Mike McCardle was the meet's top scorer with 13 1/2 points by winning the 100-yard dash; finishing second in the 200-yard dash and third in the long jump; and running a leg for the 800 relay team which finished third.

While the Tigers had three first place finishes, St. John's,

River and Linsly all came up the same number of performances. However, the Shadyside depth and balance paid off. The Tigers scored in 13 of the 17 events to successfully defend their crown.

Steubenville Regains Triple-A Track Crown

Williams Sets New Record in Shot Put

Returning to the throne after a two-year absence, Steubenville Big Red won the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference triple-A track and field championship in 50-degree temperatures and chilling rain Saturday at Bellaire's Nelson Field.

Paced by the flying feet of Bob Washington, Coach Norm Allison's squad finished with a convincing edge as it piled up 60½ points to 37 for runner-up John Marshall, which edged St. Clairsville for the second-place trophy by only one point.

Martins Ferry finished fourth, with 31 markers, and was followed by Wintersville, with 18; Steubenville Catholic Central, 16; Brooke, 15; host Bellaire, 14½; Magnolia, 11; Wheeling Central, 9; and Triadelphia, 8. Wheeling High, the defending champion, did not score. Neither did Weirton nor Oak Glen.

The weather was hardly conducive to record-breaking but one new triple-A standard went into the book as Steubenville's senior shot putter, Tim Williams, lofted the iron ball 53 ft. 9½ in. to wipe out a mark of 53 ft. 5½ in., which Nick Mumley, who was to go on to a college football career at Purdue and subsequently play pro football with the New York Titans, established while competing for

Wheeling High away back in 1955.

Washington was the individual high scorer of the meet as the Steubenville sprint ace captured the 100-yd. dash in 10.1 and the 220 in 22.5, both excellent times in view of the weather, and anchored the Big Rtd 880-yd. relay team to 1:32.4 clocking. He thus was credited with 13½ points.

Steubenville also won the mile relay and its high jumping ace, Dean Young, who earlier in the week had set a new all-time valley record, won when he cleared the bar just a half-inch under six feet.

The Big Red struck heavily in the sprints. Not only did Washington take the century and furlong dashes but Jim Steiner was third in the 100, Randy Crawford chased Washington across in the 220, and Al Pavlik was second as John Marshall's Greg Ferris took the 440 in 51.7.

Tim Novel, with a discus throw of 150 ft. 8 in., and its two-mile relay teams were other winners for John Marshall.

St. Clairsville copped the high hurdles, with defending champ Larry Pruneski clocked in 15.3, and the mile run, with John Browning doing 4:37.2. However, Browning's bid for a distance double was thwarted by Tom Skrabak, of Bellaire, who won a thrilling stretch duel in the 880 to cross the line in 2:06 and thus avenge his narrow loss to the St. C. veteran in the Wintersville Relays.

Sam Twardoski not only won the low hurdles for Martins Ferry in 20.5 but was a member of the Riders' victorious shuttle relay team, which did 59.9 as the rain poured down.

While Ferris took the 440, the Monarch star, who appears to be on the road to recovery from the leg injury which has been plaguing him, settled for third in the long jump, as Frank Velto, Steubenville Catholic Central, leaped 21 ft. 5½ in. to win and Stan Evans, of Wintersville, made 21 ft. 2 for second place.

The last event of the day to be completed was the pole vault, in which both Keith Thornton, Magnolia's transplanted Texan, and Ferry's Charlie Blum went over the bar at 12 ft. 11 in., quite a performance on such a day. Thornton won first place by virtue of fewer misses.

Worth noting is the fact that three shot putters — Williams, Triadelphia's Bob Caylor and Magnolia's Wib Newton — were over the 50 ft. mark. Yesterday's results follow:
