

Linsly Cops 28th OVAC Title in Row

Linsly's unbeatable Cadets splashed to their 28th consecutive OVAC swimming championships Friday despite a healthy challenge from underdog Brooke.

As the prep mermen smashed seven records in the eleven events, the Cadets gained a 121-83 edge over Brooke to capture the title while the other three contenders fell far behind.

Wilson Murray, commissioner of officials for the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference, has been elected treasurer of the newly-formed Ohio High School Athletic Association Commissioners organization.

Other officers selected at a weekend meeting in Columbus are Don Welsh, president, from the Cardinal Conference; John Dunnette, vice-president, from Hamilton County; and Al Boyer, secretary, from the Johnny Appleseed Conference.

A total of 36 conferences and leagues that operate in Ohio schools are members of the organization, which has been recognized by the Ohio High School Athletic Association and which has been invited to send a representative to meetings of the OHSAA and thus have input in the formulation of athletic policies in state high schools.

Serving as a treasurer will hardly be a new experience for Murray. Having an impressive background in accounting, he is currently treasurer for the city of Wheeling.
