

Triadelphia Girls OVAC Tennis Champs

Scoring its second major tournament upset of John Marshall in a week, the Triadelphia High girls' tennis team captured the 1976 Ohio Valley Athletic Conference title Monday afternoon at the Wheeling Park courts.

The Little Reds, who defeated John Marshall last week in the Mountaineer League tourney, piled up a total of 19 points while the Monarchs finished with 16 and St. Clairsville came in third with 12.

Triadelphia advanced five netters to the finals with Tina Loustau winning the No. 3 singles title and Kim Stevenson taking the No. 6 crown.

There were a total of 72 girls from 12 schools take-

part in the tournament, the largest high school girls event ever held in the area.




