6 Meet Records Set At Bellaire

Wheeling Park High became the over-all team champion of the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference by winning the Calvin Giffin Track Classic in the chilly evening air at Bellaire's Nelson Field Wednesday and will now turn its attention to even bigger game.

Coach Dick Del's Patriots are going south for the weekend. They will travel to Charleston to compete in the giant Gazette Relays. The Park girls' team is going along too and for both Patriot squads it will be a telling test. They will be up against the most powerful adversaries from around the state of West Virginia in the two-day meet which starts Friday at Laidley Field.

Last year Del's team took part in the Gazette Relays and the Patriots finished second to Beckley while the Patriot girls, then coached by Chuck Jerrome, finished third. However, when the state meet rolled around later in the month, Wheeling Park bested Beckley for the boys' state title.

There will be over 90 teams—counting both boys' and girls' squads and Class AAA and Class AA aggregations. However, the only other area array in the meet will be the Linsly boys' team.

Del has some concern as the Patriots turn to the Gazette meet after notching victories in the Fairmont Times Relays, the Wintersville Invitational, the Mountaineer League, the OVAC four-A meet, and the Giffin Classic. His ace 200 and 400-meter star, veteran Danny Amend, has a pulled muscle in his back and is a question mark for this weekend.

In fact, Amend competed in only one final at Bellaire—the 400-meter dash which he won in 51.2 secs., not a particularly good time for him but the weather—cold and windy—was far from ideal. Del scratched him from both the 200-meter dash and from his usual relay duties.

Nevertheless, the Patriots finished with 89 points, compared to 70 for runnerup Brooke. Steubenville was a distant third, with 48 counters, followed by St. Clairsville, with 44.

While a quartet of four-A teams led the scoring, some of the smaller schools had their bright moments in this gathering of the elite of OVAC track athletes.

For instance, there was Sistersville's mite junior speedster, all-state footballer Brian Swisher, establishing a meet record of 22.5 secs. in the 200 and equalling the meet standard of 11 secs. in the 100 and also finishing third in the long jump to take individual scoring honors with 26 points.

Another athlete from a Class A school, Woodsfield's all-state running back, Darryl Shipp, won the long jump with a 21 ft. 5½ in. effort.

Last year, Linsly Institute's Charles "Chocky" Spadafore set meet records in both the 200-meter dash and the long jump. This time he had to settle for fifth in the long jump and skipped the 200 meters, but he nevertheless enjoyed another banner meet as he won the 110-meter high hurdles in 14.9 and anchored the Cadets to a meet record in the shuttle hurdles as the quartet of Jim Griffith, Ed Tyree, Dan Tennant and Spadafore zipped over the timers in 57.8—just a tenth of a second off their performance in the Ohio Valley Track League Tuesday night at Shadyside.

The Shadeans also had an individual winner in Jim Dorfl, one of three who made 6-2 in the high jump but won out via fewer misses.

Wheeling Park got into the record-breaking act in the first running final of the day as a combination of Randy Martin, James Boyd, Dan Comer and Bill Giles clocked 8:12 in the 3,200 (4X800) relay.

Jefferson Union's Joe Vojdovich, the valley's premier discus thrower, established a meet mark in his specialty by throwing 166 ft. 8.

But perhaps the most impressive of all the record-breaking feats was that of Bob Whitehead, Brooke's hurdling star. For the first time, the 165-meter low hurdles were on the Giffin program and they were run back-to-back with the 300-meter lows. With barely 10 minutes rest between them, Whitehead won both races. He took the 165s in 20.6 and that will stand as a meet record. Then he avenged last week's OVAC meet loss to The Park's Danny Jones by copping the 300s in a meet record time of 38.7.

In all, a half-dozen new records were written into the book.

Brooke also had individual winners in Ernie Anderson, who put the shot 51-6½, and John George, a junior who was clocked in 2:01.9 in the 800 meters.

Only individual double winners were Swisher and East Liverpool distance ace Randy Burke, who copped both the 1,600 and 3,200 events. He had also won the 800 in the OVAC meet last Saturday at Wheeling Park but skipped that race last night because the streamlined schedule gave him less rest time between events.

Conditions were difficult for pole vaulting and John Marshall's Doug Wilson won at just 12 ft.

There were several costly disqualifications. Steubenville equalled the meet mark in the 4X100 relay but was disqualified because its uniforms were not uniform, of all things. However, the Big Red came back to win the 4X200 as Brad Young anchored. Young, who is just regaining peak form after an 18-day layoff due to the extraction of wisdom teeth and the death of his father, was also second to Swisher in both the 100 and 200.

Disqualification of Steubenville in the 4X100 gave Wheeling Park a victory but the Patriots' Bill Giles lost a second place in the 800 meters via a disqualification.

The last event of the day, the 1,600-meter relay (4X400) went to St. Clairsville's team of Mike Eaton, Ken Kurucz, Mike Jackson and Warren Williams as The Park, without


