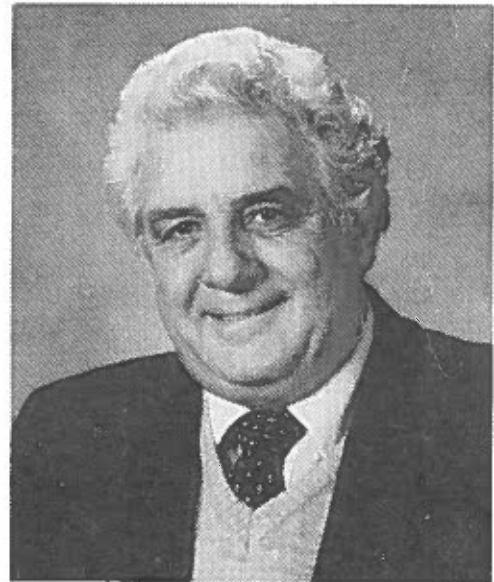


A. JAMES MANCHIN Treasurer of State

James Manchin was born in a United Mine Workers' Barracks in Farmington, Marion County, in 1927, to the late Kathleen and Joseph Manchin. He earned a bachelor's and master's degrees in political science, sociology, and education from Fairmont State College and West Virginia University. Manchin is married to the former Stephanie Machel of Wheeling and is the father of 3 children and the grandfather of 7.

He has served in the U.S. Navy during World War II, worked as slate picker in the Farmington #9 mine and was a member of the United Mine Workers of America. Manchin also worked as a hod carrier in Marion County and a glass worker in Wood County. He has served as coach and citizenship teacher in West Virginia public school system for 7 years.

James Manchin was elected to the House of Delegates in 1948, elected Secretary of State in 1976; re-elected in 1980 and then elected Treasurer of State in 1984. In 1961 he was named State Director of the Farmers Home Administration, named Special Assistant to the National FmHA Director in 1970 and named State Director of REAP, the Rehabilitation Environmental Action Program, in 1973. Notable achievements include: Named 'Mr. West Virginia' by Salem College; Received Freedom's Foundation Award of Valley Forge; Received Communications Achievement Award, International Toastmaster's Club and he is listed in Who's Who in America.

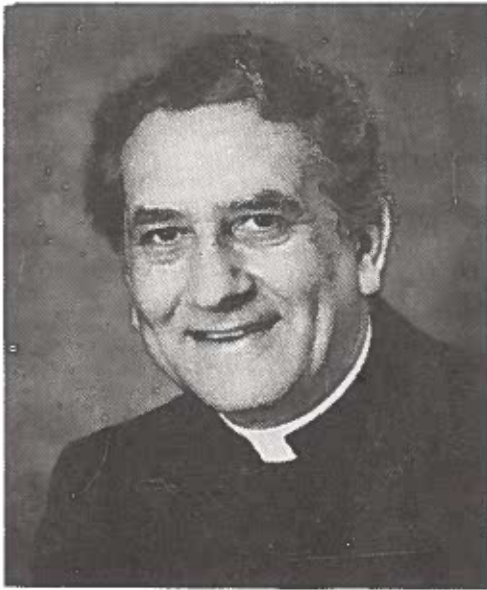

This year's honorary chairman for the 23rd annual Dapper Dan Charity Awards Banquet is Jerry Williams, Kroger zone manager for the Ohio Valley.



Williams, a lifelong employee of Kroger, began his career in 1958 as a meat cutter in a Newark, Ohio Kroger store. He was soon promoted, and in 1961 was accepted into the Kroger Management Training Program.

From 1962 to 1972, he rose through the ranks, first as a co-manager, then manager of Ohio stores in Washington Court House, Greenfield, Circleville and Athens. In 1972 he was named Perishable Merchandising Representative in the Ohio Valley, and was promoted to Meat Merchandising Representative in Columbus in 1976.

In 1977, Williams was transferred to Toledo, where he spent the next six years. In 1983 he left his position of assistant zone manager to become zone manager in the Ohio Valley.

During his career, Williams has won various awards of achievement from the Kroger Co., including the Vice President's Award in 1969 and 1971, and for being named the Outstanding Store Manager in the Columbus area.

The list of Williams' community involvement is long and distinguished. Among those organizations benefitting from his time and talents are the Jaycees, Lions Club, Kiwanis Club, United Way, Ohio Valley Athletic Conference Foundation (OVAC), March of Dimes, Wheeling Symphony, Oglebay Park and the Good Zoo. He currently serves on the Board of Directors of OVAC.

Among his most notable accomplishments is his involvement in the 1985 long-term labor agreement between Kroger management and employees. This, in part, helped the employment situation in the Ohio Valley by increasing the number of Valley Kroger employees by 45 percent in the past three years.

Williams and his wife, Jeanette, have been married for 33 years and have two daughters. They reside in the St. Clairsville area.

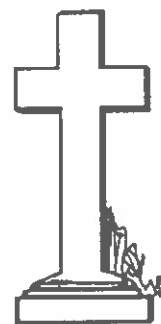
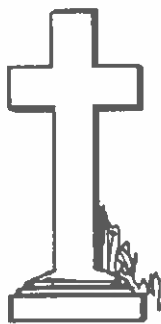

George Gundling, a native of Wellsburg, is the second recipient of the Carl Hamill Award. Gundling served as the offensive coordinator at Wintersville High School from 1960 to 1972 and the Golden Warriors went 102-17-7. Offensive coordinator at Toronto from 1973 to 1975 and the Red Knights went 25-4-1. Out of coaching for five years, Gundling, took charge of a slumping Red Knight program in 1980 and ended the season at 3-7. His 1981 team went 8-1-1 and the next year had a 9-1 season. His only loss in 1981 and 1982 was to a strong St. Clairsville team.

Gundling, a successful Wellsburg businessman for 28 years, has been active in civic and community affairs in Wellsburg. He served as commissioner on the Brooke County Civil Service Board, is presently a member of the St. John School Board and served on the board of directors at St. John Catholic Church.

Gundling, a graduate of West Liberty College, for many years played semi-pro baseball in the tri-state area.

He and his wife, Sarah, are the parents of six children, George, Diane, Mark, Becky, Lori and Mike. Mike is a student at Brown University while the other five have graduated from college and are living away from home. A daughter, Cheryl, after a lengthy illness, died in 1972.

DAPPER DAN MAN OF THE YEAR

Head Coach Bobby Douglas

After achieving the ultimate goal of winning a national championship, head wrestling coach Bobby Douglas enters his 15th campaign at Arizona State looking for history to repeat itself in 1989.

During his collegiate coaching tenure, he has recorded 180 victories, six conference championships and 11 top-20 NCAA finishes. Douglas is considered one of the nation's most knowledgeable and respected experts in his field.

In 1987-88, Arizona State earned the nation's number one ranking for the first time in school history en route to a 17-2 dual record, including ASU's initial win over Iowa. The Sun Devils then rolled to its fourth consecutive Pac-10 Conference title with six individual titlists and seven ASU wrestlers earned all-Americas accolades.

Douglas was rewarded by being named national coach of the year, as well as Pac-10 coach of the year last year.

During his 14 seasons at ASU, his teams have won 75 percent of its matches (178-58-1) and Douglas, 46, has a career mark of 180-67-1 in the collegiate coaching ranks.

In 1987, Douglas was inducted into the National Wrestling Hall of Fame following his enshrinement into the NAIA Wrestling Hall of Fame in 1985.

The Sun Devil program has risen to national prominence since he arrived on the Tempe, Arizona campus in 1974. His teams have established nearly every school record and he has tutored 47 Sun Devils to individual conference crowns and 37 of his wrestlers have earned all-America status, including 1985 NCAA 150-pound champion Eddie Urbano.

For his efforts, Douglas has been named Pac-10 Coach of the Year five times (1979, 1981, 1985, 1987 and 1988).

The Olympic Games have been part of Douglas' life since 1964, when he finished fourth (featherweight) at the Tokyo Games. At the 1968 Olympiad, he captained the U.S. squad in Mexico City. During the past four Olympic Games (1976, 1980, 1984 and 1988), he has worked as a valuable member of the U.S. coaching staff. In addition, Douglas was a member of the United States' staff at the '87 World Cup and 1988 Goodwill Games and World Championship.

In 1983, Douglas coached the U.S. National team in the Soviet Union and has served as an assistant coach for six U.S. teams (1976, 1978, 1979, 1981, 1982, 1983).

His coaching career initiated with assistant coaching assignments at Oklahoma State (1966-69), Cornell (1970-72) and Iowa State (1969-70, 1972-73). Following his second stop at Iowa State, he earned his first head coaching position at UC Santa Barbara (1973-74), where he coached one season (4-9) before coming to ASU.

His travels have led him to nearly two dozen countries where he has coached, lectured and competed. Plus, Douglas serves as head coach for the Sunkist Kids, the national freestyle champions in seven of the last eight years.

During his years as a competitor, Douglas captured five national AAU Championships and a pair of U.S. Olympic Trials titles. He was named outstanding wrestler in America in 1970. When he retired in 1970, he had accumulated a career record of 303-17-7 (.953) from his high school days through the World Championships.

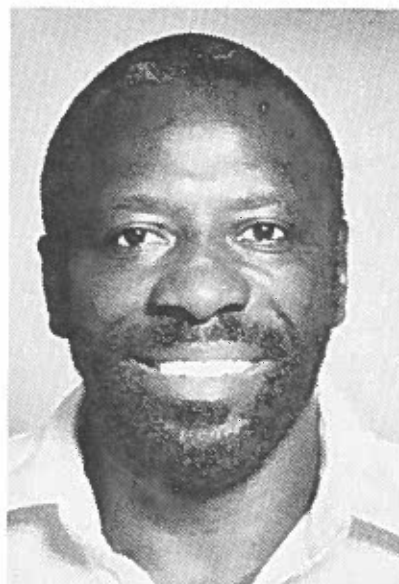
He was runnerup in the 1966 World Championship and won a bronze medal and placed fourth in two other World Championships.

In 1958, Douglas became the first black Ohio high school state titlist when he captured the 112-pound weight class at Bridgeport High.

He wrestled for West Liberty (W.V.) State College and won the NAIA title. After transferring to Oklahoma State, Douglas captured the Big 8 Conference 147-pound class in 1965. The Cowboys never lost a dual meet and won a pair of Big 8 and NCAA Championships during his career.

Douglas has written two books on wrestling techniques - "Sunkist Kids Takedown System, Takedown I" (1972) and "The Sunkist Kids Takedown System, Takedown II" (1977). His autobiography "Wrestling with the Devil" should be released in 1989.

He earned his bachelor's degree from Oklahoma State in 1967 and his Master's degree from ASU in 1981. Douglas and his wife, Jackie, have one son, Bobby (20).



JOHN D. KIRKER

1989 Hall of Fame Inductee



John D. Kirker, former sports editor of The Steubenville Herald-Star, has been voted into the Upper Ohio Valley Sports Hall of Fame.

Kirker, who will be 76 years old in June, was surprised when informed that the Dapper Dan Hall of Fame committee had singled him out for such an honor.

"I'm surprised that anyone remembers that I once labored in the sports field," he said. "After all, I retired from sports writing in 1974. That adds up to 15 years. Most of the high school athletes that you will be honoring were reading nursery rhymes instead of sports pages back then. It's hard for me to accept the fact that I am to be considered in the same bracket with some of the great men who have been inducted into the Hall of Fame."

Born in Follansbee on June 17, 1913, Kirker grew up in Wellsburg and was graduated from Wellsburg High School in 1932. "I was strictly a non-athlete," he emphasizes. "But I was working for the old Wellsburg Daily Herald while I was still in high school and was listed as managing editor at the time I left for the Army Air Corps on March 9, 1942."

In the service, Kirker rose to the rank of first sergeant with the 13th Air Force and saw duty primarily in the Philippines.

Discharged from the service in March of 1946, he went to work as sports editor for the Herald-Star two days later. He continued in that capacity until July 1, 1974, when he became district editor.

Conscientious, hard working, capable and an astute observer of the Ohio Valley sports scene, Kirker became the authority, as far as his many loyal readers were concerned. He enjoyed a large following on both sides of the Ohio River.

A confirmed bachelor, the Herald-Star scribe had a perfect attendance record at the famed Little Brown Jug pacing classic at Delaware, Ohio, for 22 years. He was a regular contributor to harness racing publications.

Kirker had a great love for the sulky sport and owned and trained 17 horses over a period of 20 years before health problems intervened.

He frequently served as emcee at sports functions in the area and also appeared as ring announcer at boxing matches. Boxing was another of his favorite sports.

Kirker is already a member of the University of Steubenville Sports Hall of Fame, into which he was inducted in 1981, and the Ohio Prep Writers Hall of Fame, which he entered in 1988.

He has served as director and secretary of the Jefferson County Fair Board and as chairman of the Friendship Park Commission.

Kirker is currently a member of the Upper Ohio Valley Camera Club, member and president of the Ohio Valley Mended Hearts Club, Wellsburg Post No. 34 American Legion and Brooke Post No. 4496 Veterans of Foreign Wars. He is a 50-year member and past exalted ruler of Wellsburg Lodge No. 1553 Benevolent & Protective Order of Elks.

IRA E. RODGERS 1988 Hall of Fame Inductee

The legendary Ira E. 'Rat' Rodgers, who came out of the little college town of Bethany to establish himself as one of the all-time greats of West Virginia University sports, will be posthumously inducted into the Upper Ohio Valley Dapper Dan Club Hall of Fame.

WVU's first All-American, Rodgers will officially be inducted by Eddie Pastilong, the Mountaineers' associate athletic director who hails from Moundsville.

The stories about Rodgers' prowess in athletics are legend but just consider the facts. A strapping youngster, he obtained his high school education by taking preparatory courses at Bethany College, since there was no high school in the community. He was permitted to play for the Bison when he was just 15 years old as there were no eligibility standards then comparable to the present-day standards.

Rodgers went to Morgantown to enroll at WVU in 1915 and, as a 5-11, 205-pound freshman on the campus of just 750 students, he carried the Mountaineer football team to a 5-2-1 record.

In 1917, Rodgers played a key role in a 7-0 West Virginia victory over Navy—a victory which propelled the Mountaineers into the national spotlight.

Rodgers earned 12 varsity letters—four each in football, basketball and baseball—at West Virginia. He captained all three teams when a senior and had offers to turn professional in both baseball and football.

Rodgers' education was interrupted by World War I after his junior year and he was sent to Camp Lee, outside of Washington, D.C., and there was graduated at the head of his class in officers' training school. He was commissioned and discharged on the same day because the war was over.

Returning to school, Rodgers—who had received some All-American recognition every year that he was in college—enjoyed his greatest season of football as the hard-hitting fullback sparked Coach Monte McIntire's team to an 8-2 record in 1919.

The Bethany native scored 37 points in the season's opener against Marietta and that still stands as a school record. He went on to tally 147 points on the season to lead the nation and that total, after all these years, also remains as a WVU record.

That season he led the Mountaineers to a 25-0 victory over Princeton that still ranks as one of the school's all-time great triumphs.

Rodgers was a consensus All-American in 1919 and obtained his degree in chemistry in the spring of 1920. A gifted shortstop, he turned down an offer from Connie Mack to join the Philadelphia Athletics and remained at WVU as a coach and teacher.

All through his collegiate days, he was outstanding academically and was active in campus affairs. He also taught a Sunday School class. And he continued to be a leader after graduation.

He became head coach in 1925 and served in that capacity through 1930. When World War II came along, he was pressed into service again and coached the Mountaineer gridgers from 1953 through '45. His nine years as a head coach combined for a record of 44 victories, 31 defeats and eight ties. In his first year as head coach, the team moved into what was then a new Mountaineer Field and posted an 8-1 record, with the only loss being to Pitt.

Rodgers also coached the West Virginia baseball team from 1921 through '42 and again in 1946. His coaching record in baseball showed 204 victories against 210 losses.

He also coached the WVU golf team for 13 years. He had proved himself well qualified as he won the state amateur golf championship in 1929—just two years after taking up the sport.

'The Rat' was elected to the National Football Hall of Fame in 1957. Seven years earlier, he was one of the charter inductees into the newly-formed West Virginia State Sports Hall of Fame, founded by the state's sports writers. In fact, he was the No. 1 choice for induction.

Rodgers resided in Morgantown until his death of cancer in 1963. His widow, Marie, still lives there and still attends WVU football games. A son, Ira Jr., is a lawyer and lives in Cleveland.

Phil Niekro

Phil and Joe Niekro, who formed the winningest brother combination in the history of major league pitching, have been declared the Ohio Valley's 'Athletes of the Decade' by the Dapper Dan Club of the Upper Ohio Valley.

This will be the fourth time that the Niekro brothers, who have enjoyed long and distinguished careers in baseball, have been spotlighted by the Dapper Dans. In 1969, Phil Niekro, then the ace of the Atlanta Braves' pitching staff, was singled out as 'Man of the Year'.

In 1978 Joe Niekro was similarly honored for his stellar performance for the Houston Astros. In 1980, after the Niekro brothers were the only 20-game winners in the National League in the '79 season, they were jointly recognized as 'Co-Men of the Year' and thus became the only persons ever to receive such honors from the Dapper Dan more than once.

The Niekros combined for 539 major league pitching victories—318 by Phil and 221 by Joe—and in 1987 passed the former record for a brother duo, a total of 529 wins by Gaylord and Jim Perry.

The sons of Ivy Niekro and the late Phil Niekro Sr., of Lansing, Phil and Joe have left an indelible imprint on the national pastime and are going to be cited for their all-time record feat.

Phil Niekro's major league pitching career extended through 24 seasons and brother Joe's through more than 21 seasons.

Phil spent most of his baseball days with the Milwaukee-Atlanta Braves, though in the four campaigns prior to his retirement after the '87 season, he had stints with the New York Yankees, Cleveland Indians, and Toronto Blue Jays. Joe broke into the majors with the Chicago Cubs and subsequently hurled for the San Diego Padres, Detroit Tigers, Atlanta, Houston Astros, the Yankees and the 1987 World Champion Minnesota Twins.

Phil Niekro, who will be 50 years old on April 1, was recently named as a minor league pitching instructor with the Braves. He and his wife, Nancy, now reside at Flowery Branch, Ga., on Lake Lanier, near Atlanta. They have three sons—Philip, John and Michael.

Joe Niekro, 44, retired from baseball, lives with his wife, Nancy, and children Natalie and Lance at Lakeland, Fla.

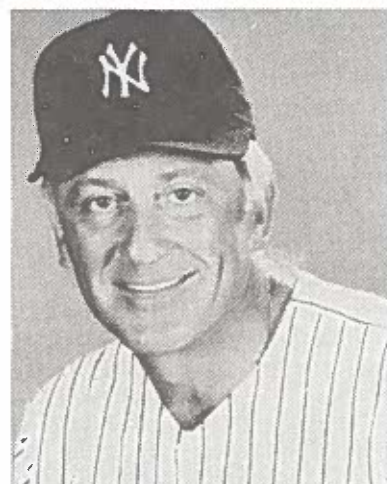
Phil Niekro's 318 victories make him a future Hall of Famer. The knuckleball artist owns and shares numerous records. He holds the National League records for most putouts by a pitcher, lifetime (340), most games started with no relief appearances in a season (44) and even owns an NL record for most games lost in a lifetime (230). He shares the major league records for most strikeouts in an inning (4), and most years 200 or more innings pitched (19). He led the National League in complete games four times and in games started four times and in 1968 led National League batters in sacrifices with 18.

Phil came out of Bridgeport High in 1957 after posting a sterling schoolboy record for the Bulldogs. He was signed to a contract by Milwaukee Braves scout Bill Maughn in '59. He first came to the majors with the Braves in 1964 but was up and down between triple-A and the big time until '67—the year the franchise was moved to Atlanta. The Braves regarded him primarily as a relief pitcher but he was pressed into action as a starter when injuries depleted the staff. In his first full season as a major leaguer, he led the National League in earned run average (1.87) as he posted an 11-9 record.

Niekro was to become something of a folk hero with the Braves for whom he became the winningest right-hander ever to wear their uniform. He pitched Atlanta into the National League playoffs in 1969 and '72. He was named to the National League squad for the All-Star game on four occasions—and later to the American League All-Star team once.

Using his famed knuckler, he was a 20-game winner in 1974 and won 21 in '79—as did Joe for Houston. He won five Gold Glove awards for his fielding prowess and was so adept with the bat that he led the NL batters in sacrifices in '68 with 18.

In 1973, he pitched a no-hitter against San Diego.

Considered over the hill by Joe Torre, then manager of the

Braves, 'Knucksie' signed with the Yankees in 1984 and won 32 games for them in two seasons. He became the eighteenth 300-game winner in baseball history and the oldest pitcher ever to hurl a shutout when he bested Toronto on the final day of the 1985 season.

Released by the Yankees in the spring of '86, he signed with Cleveland and won 11 games that year at age 47. His 11-11 record included five complete games, including a two-hitter against the Twins-the ninth of his career.

In 1987, Phil pitched for Cleveland and Toronto and finally ended his mound career back in Atlanta, where he was the starting pitcher on the final day of the season and did not get a decision.

The elder of the pitching Niekros ranks tenth on the all-time list in games pitched (864), third in games started (716), fourth in innings pitched (5,403 2/3), seventh in strike-outs (3,342), and third in walks (1,809). His career ERA was 3.35 and he had 45 shutouts.

Phil Niekro has established himself as one of the great humanitarians in sports by his work in behalf of charitable causes. His outstanding community service was recognized as he was presented the Brian Piccolo Award in 1977 and the Roberto Clemente Award in 1980. In 1979, he was voted the Lou Gehrig Memorial Award, given annually to the player who most exemplifies the qualities of character of "The Iron Horse."

Phil has become one of the leaders in efforts to raise funds to fight Spina Bifida, a birth defect.

The Chicago Chapter of the Baseball Writers of America presented him with the Louis J. Comiskey Award for long and meritorious service in January of 1987.

Joe Niekro did not sign a professional contract until after he helped George Kovalickk's West Liberty State College team to the 1984 NAIA championship. In fact, he did not turn pro until the Cubs signed him in 1966. A pitching star ever since his Little League days at Bridgeport, he spent only one season in the minors before making the Cubs' roster in 1967. He was 10-7 as a rookie in the National League that year.

Joe, who did not rely as heavily on the knuckler at that stage of his career as Phil did, won 14 games for Chicago in '68 but in '69 was traded to San Diego. The Padres subsequently dealt him to the Detroit Tigers. He pitched a one-hitter for the Tigers against the Yankees in 1970.

By 1972, Joe's career seemed to have taken a down turn and he divided his next three seasons between the minors and majors. He was with the Tigers and their Toledo farm until '73 when he toiled for Atlanta and its Richmond farm club.

In 1974, Joe caught on with Houston and his career was revived there as he turned more and more to the knuckler. He became the Astro's all-time winningest pitcher. He won a total of 41 games in two seasons (1979-80). He was runnerup to Bruce Sutter for the NL Cy Young Award in '79 (a year in which he had five shutouts) and finished fourth in the 1980 balloting. He was picked by The Sporting News as "National League Pitcher of the Year" in '79. He was picked on the NL team for the All-Star game that year but Tommy Lasorda never called him out of the bullpen.

He evened accounts with Lasorda when he was winning pitcher in a one-game playoff against the Dodgers to decide the NL West Division championship in 1980. Later, against the Phillies in the NL Championship Series, he pitched 10 scoreless innings but did not get a decision.

In 1982, Joe posted a 2.47 ERA-second best in the NL. He was also third in complete games with 16 and fourth in innings pitched (270). He had five shutouts that year too.

The younger Niekro was traded to the Yankees in mid September of 1985. He was plagued by injuries while with the Yanks, who in mid-season 1987 sent him to the Minnesota Twins. Because of an injury, he saw only limited service with Minnesota but pitched one scoreless inning against the Cardinals in the World Series and finished his career with 20 scoreless innings in post-season pitching.

Joe too has received many awards for his charitable work, especially with Spina Bifida.



BOB GOIN **Special Guest**

Bob Goin is in his eighth year as Associate Athletic Director at Florida State. Several sports programs report to Goin, and he also assists Athletic Director Hootie Ingram with day-to-day operations of the athletic department. Goin is also responsible for organizing and implementing game day operations for the football, basketball and baseball teams.

Goin has served as tournament director for the NCAA South Atlantic and East Baseball Regionals, which have been held in Tallahassee every year since 1983.

Goin came to Florida State in July of 1981 with experience as both an administrator and a coach. He arrived after two years as athletic director of California (Pa.) State College, where he was credited with expanding the athletic department. He formed the Cal State Athletic Scholarship Fund and Athletic Booster Club and established the Cal State radio network.

Prior to taking the California post, Goin was Assistant Athletic Director at West Virginia from 1976 to 1979. At WVU, he was involved in several expansion projects, including construction of a new stadium and athletic facility.

Between 1960 and 1976, he held a variety of positions at Bethany (W. Va.) College, including coaching assignments in football, basketball and baseball. Goin was associate professor and chairman of physical education and athletics at the school from 1972 to 1976, and coached Bethany football teams from 1963 to 1972.

While coaching at Bethany, two of Goin's football and baseball teams won President's Athletic Conference championships. He also won numerous individual awards, including Tri-State Small College Coach of the Year, Pittsburgh and Ohio Dapper Dan awards and the Morgantown Touchdown Club award.

Goin received a bachelor's degree from Bethany in 1959 and his master's from West Virginia in 1962.

He and his wife, Nancy, have four children; Doug, a CPA in Jacksonville, Florida; Brian, a PGA Events Director; Janice, a senior at Florida State; and Bruce, a sophomore at Tallahassee Community College.

DWIGHT D. WALLACE **Special Guest**

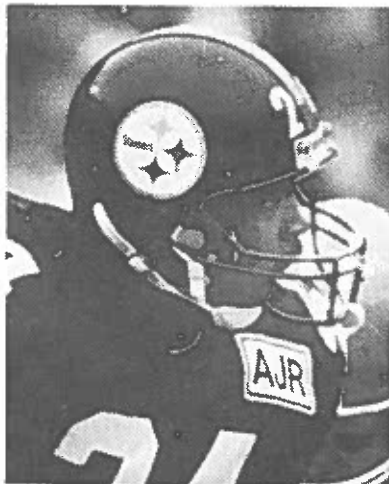
Dwight D. Wallace comes to us from Muncie, IN. He and his wife Leslie have two daughters: Denise and Amy both in college.

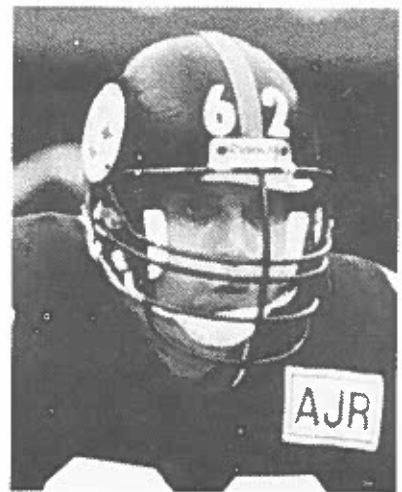

Thalman has been at Penn State since mid-August of 1986. He left a position as vice president of public relations for the Buffalo Bills of the National Football League to go to University Park. He spent 13 years with the Bills, who hired him away from the U.S. Naval Academy, where he was director of sports information for 11 years.

During his career with the Bills, Thalman served as the NFL's American Conference public relations director for several Pro Bowl games and was on the league's public relations staff for seven Super Bowls.

While at Navy, Thalman was twice cited by the Football Writers Association of America for his outstanding work and was also honored twice by the College Sports Information Directors Association for producing the best football brochure in the nation. In addition, he received the national citation for excellence for the "best winter-spring sports brochure" in the country.

After graduation from WVU with a B.A. in journalism, the Wheeling native sandwiched three years of writing for the Associated Press around a two-year military stint as an army information officer on Governor's Island, New York.

"I've been very fortunate to work with some outstanding people," Thalman said. "In my first year at Buffalo, O.J. Simpson became the first man in NFL history to rush for over 2,000 yards. While I was at Navy, we had Roger Staubach. And at Penn State, I have the pleasure of working with Joe Paterno. That's quite a trifecta."

When Thalman went to Penn State, he was placed in charge of communications and made responsible for all operations in the sports information office. Recently, his job was expanded to include development and external affairs.

"My position is largely supervisory now," he noted. "We have 28 intercollegiate sports at Penn State and we try to make certain that each one gets its due. However, I remain closest to the football situation and I still write the releases for football myself. Despite the increased executive responsibilities, I have no intention of giving that up because it means a great deal to me. My roots are still in public relations."

Thalman said that he was looking forward to "coming home" for the Dapper Dan banquet. "I have heard about how outstanding these banquets are," he said. "It'll be great to see a lot of my old friends again."

KEITH JETER Kennedy Award

Weir High's multi-talented Keith Jeter, who is being wooed by collegiate football powers from coast to coast, has won the Harry H. Kennedy Award as West Virginia's outstanding high school football player for 1988.

The 6-ft., 190-pounder from Weirton, a two-time all-stater, ran away with the poll to select the Mountain State's top griddy, just as he ran away from pursuing defenders in piling up 1,864 all-purpose yards for the Red Riders from Hancock County the past season.

Named offensive captain of the Class AAA all-state team just last week, Jeter accumulated 70 votes in the Kennedy voting to just 28 for runnerup Bryan Fisher, linebacker from Lewis County, and 18 for third-place Rick Marshall, tackle from Parkersburg, Tailback Tyrone Pierce, of DuPont, who received 17 points, was fourth in the balloting and Michael Collins, a linebacker from Huntington, was fifth with 12.

The statistics on Jeter tell quite a story. In 10 regular-season games, he rushed for 1,453 yards. Including a playoff game with Huntington, he had 1,535 yards on 224 carries, caught 17 passes for 209 yards and tallied 120 points.

Averaging 7.2 yards a carry, this finely-tuned blend of power and speed twice went over the 200-yard mark as a senior, with his season's high being 282 yards in just 23 carries against Steubenville Catholic.

Jeter wasn't a one-way star either. Defensively, as a free safety, he had 35 tackles, two fumble recoveries (one of which he returned 53 yards for a TD), and picked off four passes.

The Weir High wunderkind has not been a one-year sensation. He was an option-style quarterback when a sophomore but was switched to tail-back early in his junior campaign and made the All-Valley and All-State teams as he rushed for 1,123 yards.

In his sophomore year, as a quarterback, he rushed for 286 yards and six touchdowns in 81 carries and completed 28-of-62 passes for 417 yards. In three seasons, he accumulated 2,944 yards rushing, even though he didn't become a tailback until the third game of his junior campaign.

The latest Kennedy Award winner comes by his talent honestly. His cousins, Bob and Tony Jeter, were collegiate stars, with Bob being a tailback at Iowa and Tony an end at Nebraska. Bob set a Rose Bowl rushing record before going on to the Canadian League and subsequently to the Green Bay Packers, where he was one of the mainstays of Vince Lombardi's secondary as The Pack won the first two Super Bowls. Bob is a member of the Upper Ohio Valley Dapper Dan Club Hall of Fame. Tony Jeter also played in the NFL, with the Steelers.

Frank Jeter, Keith's elder brother, was an all-stater in 1974 when Weir made the state playoffs, and went on to play collegiately at Cincinnati.

The Weirton whiz isn't near to making up his mind about a college. 'He's just getting around to deciding where he wants to take his official visits,' McGrew said. 'There are schools interested in him all the way from UCLA to the East Coast and from virtually every major conference.'

'He has powerful legs now and when his upper body catches up, he should weigh 210 or 215. He runs a legitimate 4.5 in the 40 but I swear that he has another gear that he goes into. He has a great change of pace and is very elusive.'

The son of Frank and Shirley Jeter, Keith is the second Weirton player to win the Kennedy, which will be presented to him at the West Virginia Victory Awards Dinner in Morgantown on Sunday, May 1, 1989.
