Hall of Fame/Wall of Fame Criteria

1989 HALL OF FAME/WALL OF FAME INDUCTIONS

Today, September 2, 1989, is a very special day for Bellaire High School. This afternoon is the seventh annual Bellaire High School Hall of Fame/Wall of Fame inductions. Today at halftime, members of the Hall of Fame/Wall of Fame will be introduced. They were officially inducted into the Hall/Wall of Fame at ceremonies occurring in the high school cafeteria at 11:00 this morning.

Criteria for the Hall of Fame is the following:

a. A member must be or have been a Bellaire High School student

b. Any individual team winning a state championship

c. Any captain of a major college team (major college to be interpreted as in NCAA Division I Note: In that it was difficult determining whether some of the larger colleges were Division I at the time of the participant's captaincy, it was decided that all major colleges or universities would be considered, rather than only Division I, up to and including the 1984 school year.

d. Any first team AP or UPI All-American selection - This will include all NCAA Divisions, including NAIA

e. Any place winners (Top six places). This will include all NCAA Divisions, including NAIA.

f. Any member of the United States Olympic Team.

g. An established member of any of the major professional teams sponsored by the United States (established member to be interpreted as two or more years of registered participation unless injured).

NOTE: It was decided, through board adopted policy, in February, 1987, that the following would be included in the Hall of Fame Policy: "Not more than two members (not meeting the above criteria), selected by unanimous vote of the Hall/Wall of Fame Committee each year, will be considered through written nomination and information to support the nomination presented to and considered by the committee. This will apply to public nominations only and will be retroactive through 1987."

Criteria for the Wall of Fame is the following:

- a. All regional, district and OVAC championship teams, along with athletes who made All-State
- b. A student who has distinguished himself/herself in athletics and has brought credit to Bellaire High School will be considered by the Hall of Fame committee for induction through recommendations made to the committee.
- c. Consideration will be given to non-Bellaire High School graduate, who have distinguished themselves in athletics which has brought credit to Bellaire High School, as recommended to the Hall of Fame committee.

The Hall of Fame / Wall of Fame Committee consists of Principal Steve Kish, Athletic Director Mike Sherwood, Chairman Thomas E. Rataiczak, two Board members, Mr. Bruce Dunlap, Jr. and Mr. Dan Frizzi, Sr.; two coaches, Mr. Terry Brinker, and Mr. John Magistro; two Touchdown Club members, Mr. Roosevelt Henry, and Mr. Dave Ice; three people from the community, Mr. John Myers, Mr. Leo Ragni, and Mr. Kelley Archer.

NOTE: An item of interest is that three of 1984's Wall of Fame inductees were quarterbacks at major colleges during the same time period. They were: Miller Munjas (University of Pittsburgh), Reyman "Bud" Bonar (University of Notre Dame), and John "Katz" Kadlic (Princeton University). The nickname of "Bellaire, The All-American Town" occurred when the noted sports author of the time, Mr. Frances Wallace, was so impressed with the accomplishments of Munjas, Kadlic and Bonar, and the fact that they were all from the same small town in Ohio, that he coined the name "Bellaire, The All-American Town" in their honor. This nickname has remained with our proud town for almost fifty (50) years and is a tribute to these fine athletes and all Bellaire Big Reds.

1989 HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES:

The most recent Big Red to make it into the professional ranks is 1984's **JOHN BUDDENBERG**. Drafted in the 10th round by the Cleveland Browns, Buddenberg is currently battling for a permanent berth with the NFL club. At BHS, he participated in football and basketball for four years, lettering in both his last two years. Buddenberg still holds the school basketball records for most blocked shots in a game and a season. Although he only received special mention All-State at the end of his senior year, Buddenberg went to Akron University and quickly made a name there as a rugged and intelligent lineman with a desire and heart to play the game. Playing and lettering for four years, he was selected Sophomore-of-the Year and Senior-of-the-Year and served as captain his senior year. Buddenberg was also an honoree of the Upper Ohio Valley Dapper Dan Club.

You can't mention the word baseball in Bellaire without having the name **ED BURGY**, Class of 1971, brought up. An outstanding athlete in high school, Burgy played and lettered four years in basketball (Burgy is one of only three men ever to letter all four years in varsity basketball), three years in football, and three years in baseball (baseball wasn't started at Bellaire until his sophomore year). His baseball talents earned him a berth on the All-Valley team three straight years, serving as captain his junior and senior years. Burgy was also accorded All-Eastern Ohio basketball honors his junior and senior years. But one needs only to look at his baseball records at Bellaire High to realize what a great player he was. Burgy held the following diamond records: SINGLE GAME: Innings pitched (10), Strike Outs (23), Hits (5); SEASON RECORDS: Strike Outs (128), ERA (0.13), Triples (8); CAREER: Innings Pitched (175), Strike Outs (326), ERA (0.63), Triples (12). Upon graduation, Burgy was signed by a farm team for the New York Mets, where he played until 1974. While there, he was credited with 20 strike outs in a single game. Burgy currently resides in Bellaire and is employed by Tri-State Asphalt.

Spending most of his life in the Ohio Valley, CLYDETHOMAS, Class of 1958, has made a career of entertaining and helping Valley residents. At BHS, Thomas played basketball for four years and football for three years, lettering three years in both sports and serving as captain of both his senior year. Post season football honors saw him earning berths on the All-OVAC team and All-Eastern Ohio team in both sports his senior year. Selected Most Valuable player in both sports, he played in the North/South Basketball Game, and the Ohio/West Virginia All-Star Football Game. Upon graduation, Clyde played football for two years at Ohio University, being chosen All-Conference his junior year and having the honor of being on the 1960 National Champion Bobcat team. A veteran of the US Army, Thomas entertained fans for ten years in semi-pro and pro football, seeing action with the British Columbian Lions of the Canadian League, the Philadelphia Eagles of the NFL, and most memorably, the Wheeling Ironmen of the Continental League, where he was the leading rusher, leading kickoff returner, and most valuable player. Thomas was also honored by the Bellaire/Shadyside Tribute to Professional Athletes. A resident of Wheeling, he is an EEO officer for the Northern Panhandle Private Industry Council and has served as the Vice-Mayor or City Councilman of Wheeling for the past 18 years.

WALL OF FAME, CLASS OF 1989

RICHARD M. CHURCH, a 1951 graduate, earned 8 varsity letters in three sports at Bellaire. In football, Church played and lettered his junior and senior years. During his senior year, he received various post-season honors including All-OVAC, All-Valley, All-Eastern Ohio, and played on the All-Star team. Church was also a two-year performer and letterwinner in basketball. But his strength came on the track. A four-year letterman in the cindersport, he started out his career quickly by breaking the OVAC and Valley records for the pole vault and high jump. In his sophomore year, he again broke the OVAC record in the pole vault and earned a berth on the All-Valley, All-Eastern Ohio, and All-OVAC squads, holding those post-season honors until graduation. During his senior year, Church broke the District record for the pole vault and high jump and advanced to participate and place in the State track meet. Upon graduation, he attended Muskingum College, where he played and lettered in football, basketball, and track. From 1964-1966, Church played semi-pro football for the Massillon Tiger Town All-Stars. Presently Church is employed at General Tire and Rubber Company and resides in Mayfield, Kentucky.

Believed to be the first girl in Bellaire High School athletics to play varsity sports for four years in college, GEORGIA DAWSON, a 1984 graduate, had a very illustrious career. In high school, she was a four-year performer and letterwinner in basketball, serving as captain her junior and senior years. She placed three years on the All-OVAC team, one year on the All-Valley team, two years on the District 12 All-Stars, and made special mention All-State her senior year. She is also the only girl performer to record 1000 points and 1000 rebounds. Dawson also earned three varsity letters in volleyball, again serving as captain her junior and senior years. She was first team All-OVAC for two years and also placed on the District 12 and Eastern Buckeye League post season teams. Collecting her ten varsity letters, Dawson attained three more in track, serving as captain her junior and senior years. Upon graduation, she went to West Liberty State College, where she became a four-year performer and letterwinner in both volleyball and basketball. She served as captain of the volleyball team her junior and senior years and was selected the floor leader in basketball her senior year. Dawson placed three years on the All-Conference team and was accorded Conference Volleyball Athlete-of-the-year her senior year. She was also chosen All-Tournament Team her senior year. The Upper Ohio Valley Dapper Dan Club also honored her in 1988. Presently, Georgia will return home to become an elementary school teacher for the Bellaire City Schools beginning in January.

DENNIS RICHARD DeBLASIS, '61, started his freshman athletic career by participating in football, basketball, and track, but decided to concentrate in football and track for the next three years, lettering three years in football and two years in track. Post-season honors started coming early for DeBlasis, who was selected All-OVAC and All-Valley for three years. He also made the All-Eastern Ohio team for two years, and was named to the All-State team his senior year. DeBlasis also served as football co-captain his senior year. After graduation, DeBlasis went to Indiana University graduating in 1965. While there, he played football for four years, earning letters his junior and senior years. Presently he resides in South Burlington, Vermont where he is employed by Tamarac Services Restaurant Group.

The name of **PAUL D. DePAULIS**, Class of 1982, is a very familiar one on the baseball diamond, as he played and lettered for four years in high school. Although he only made the All-Eastern Ohio Team his junior year, during his senior year he was elected to the team captaincy and made post season honors on the All-OVAC, All-Valley, and All-Eastern Ohio squads on his way to a first team berth on the All-State team, the first performer to receive this diamond honor at BHS. During his senior year, DePaulis also was named MVP and District Co-Player-of-the-Year. DePaulis still holds over 5 school records in baseball. DePaulis also played and lettered in football for three years, serving as captain his senior year and earning Player-of-the-Week honors and the Randy Meek Memorial Award for Co-Most Valuable Defensive Player. Post-season grid honors his senior year included All-OVAC, All-Valley, and All-Conference berths. DePaulis continued his baseball career by playing and lettering for four years at West Liberty State College, serving as captain his senior year. In addition to being named All-Conference his sophomore, junior, and senior years, DePaulis was also twice honored by the Upper Ohio Valley Dapper Dan in 1982 and 1987 for outstanding achievement. DePaulis also played two years for the Warwood Reds in the OVBL and one year for the Bellaire/Muxie team. At present, DePaulis resides in Dallas, Texas, where he works for All-Tell Communications.

WALL OF FAME, CLASS OF 1989

GILBERT DICKERHOOF, M.D., Class of 1933, has the honor of joining his brother, Demmy Dickerhoof, in the Hall of Fame/Wall of Fame. Dickerhoof only lettered one year in football at BHS, although he participated three years in the sport. He quarterbacked the 1932 undefeated Ohio Valley Championship team and earned Honorable Mention All-Valley his senior year. However Dickerhoof's late-blossoming athletic talents became apparent when he entered Wittenberg College. At a time when freshmen were not allowed to participate in varsity sports, he went on to earn 11 varsity letters before graduating in 1938. Earning a letter every year he participated, Dickerhoof earned 4 letters in swimmming, three in football and track, and one in wrestling (wrestling at 150 pounds, he participated on Wittenberg's first wrestling team). As a swimmer, Dickerhoof took part in the 50-yard freestyle and 200-yard freestyle relay. An undefeated Ohio Conference diving champion, he gave numerous diving exhibitions in the Valley area at Bellaire, Barnesville, Oglebay, Wheeling Island, and Canonsburg, Pa. In track, he was the anchor man on the mile relay team, setting a track record for the Big Six meet. He also took part in the 100- and 220-yard dashes, 220-yard low hurdles, and the broad jump. In the age when everybody played the full 60 minutes in football, Dickerhoof missed only one game due to an injury. He earned Honorable Mention All-Ohio Conference as a halfback and also played defensive outside linebacker. A retired physician, Dickerhoof graduated from Ohio State University and is the retired director of the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology at St. John Hospital, Cleveland. He presently resides in Bay Village, Ohio.

Although he graduated from St. Clairsville High School in 1926, few people who attended Bellaire High School from the 1930's to the 1970's don't recognize the name of JAMES A. DIXON. At St. Clairsville, Dixon played and lettered in football, basketball, and track all three years. He served as football captain his senior year while earning Honorable Mention All-Valley honors. Upon graauation he enrolled at Wittenberg College, where he participated and lettered in football for three years and track two years. Once again, he served as captain of the football squad his senior year and earned a spot on the All-Opponent team. Dixon also had three years experience on Ohio Valley semi-pro teams and served two years in the Air Force. And then Bellaire High School acquired his services. From 1933 to 1942 Dixon served as an eighth grade or assistant football coach. He assumed head football coaching duties in 1943, 1946, and 1947, and directed the 1946 OVAC Champion team being inducted today. He also coached track (1935), eighth grade basketball (1933-1935), and boys' softball from 1934-1936. During this three-year period, his softball team was undefeated and untied and reigned as Valley Champions. A track official from 1934 to 1955, Dixon was responsible for bringing the Eastern Ohio District Track Meet to Bellaire for the first time and served as director its first year. Dixon also worked as a football and basketball official from 1926 to 1955, working six basketball tournaments and serving as president of the Ohio Valley Football Officials Association. In 1958, Dixon became the fifteenth president of the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference. Dixon spent over 40 years in the Bellaire School System as a teacher, coach, principal, and superintendent. A resident of Bellaire, Dixon has also been honored as a member of the Dapper Dan Hall of Fame.

EDWARD HEPE, Class of 1942, also had a very illustrious athletic career. Although he participated and lettered in football and basketball for three years, his notoriety was achieved in track lettering four years, serving as captain of the 1942 team, and receiving All-Eastern Ohio honors. For several years, he held the long jump record of 22' 10 1/2". In his senior year at the District track meet, Hepe won four individual events and was named MVP. After graduating from high school, he served three years in the Air Force and Army in addition to playing semi-pro basketball from 1946-1950. He later entered Slippery Rock University, where he participated and lettered in football and track all three years (Hepe graduated from Slippery Rock in three years). During his last year he served as captain of the track team and co-captain in football. In football at SRU, Hepe still holds the record for the longest punt return (90 yards) and total punt return yards for a single game (142 yards). Hepe was one of the oldest athletes to play football or run track at Slippery Rock (31 years old!). He was named Man-of-the-Year by the McDonald, Pennsylvania Lions Club in 1960. Hepe also coached the Ft. Cherry High School basketball team to the State championship in 1961 and was named "Coach-of-the-Year." Hepe is a member of the Slippery Rock University Hall of Fame and the Butler, Pennsylvania.

WALL OF FAME, CLASS OF 1989

DAVID ICE, Class of 1964, was a three-year performer for the Big Reds in football and track, lettering for two years in both sports. He earned All-Valley honors in track his junior and senior years and All-Eastern Ohio honors in football. Ice was the second shot putter in Bellaire's history to throw over 50 feet. He was also honored to perform in the 1964 Ohio-West Virginia All -Star Game. But Ice's claim to the Wall of Fame lies in his total dedication to Bellaire athletics. He has coached junior high basketball (he's still coaching) for over twenty years, and has also volunteered to coach junior high football and track. An active Bellaire Relays Committee Member, Ice also served as the past chairman of one of the largest meets in Ohio. It's difficult to mention the Big Reds Touchdown Club without instantly thinking of Dave Ice, for he has been an active member since joining and has served as the President for over 9 years. While others have achieved fame throughout the nation, Ice has been a lifelong resident of Bellaire (he currently is tri-owner of First Ward Tavern) and has dedicated his life to seeing that Big Reds' athletes get only the best attention.

TOM J. LEDDER, Class of 1967, was the captain of what some claim was the greatest team to ever play at BHS, the 1966 9-1-0 team. Playing football for four years and lettering all three varsity seasons, Ledder was a two-year honoree on the All-OVAC team, All-Valley team (Captain his senior year), All-Eastern Ohio Team (Captain his senior year), and second team All-State. Upon graduation, he enrolled at West Liberty State College, playing and lettering in football all four years. Although he served as captain his senior year, Ledder was responsible for calling the defensive signals all four years. A resident of Ft. Collins, Colorado, Ledder is employed at Wind-2 Research, Inc.

A three-year performer in football, basketball, and track, VINCE MEHL, Class of 1978, lettered three years in track, two in basketball, and one in football, and served as captain in football and track. He was a three-year performer on the All-Valley track team (captain his senior year), All-Eastern Ohio for two years, and All-State his senior year. In basketball, he played on the 1978 OVAC Champions and the first District Championship team in the school's history. In track, Mehl was a major contributor on two OVAC Championship teams (1977, 1978), and was team MVP his senior year. He set the school record in the high jump at 6'2" and the school record in the 330-yard hurdles. He also still holds the Valley record for the 330 yard hurdles, a record that will probably stand forever due to metric conversion. Mehl was selected the Rod Milburn District Track Athlete-of-the-Year in 1978, All-Valley All-Decade Track Team for the Seventies (330-yard hurdles), a Dapper Dan honoree, and was a finalist for the OVAC Class AAA Multiple Sclerosis Athlete-of-the-Year. Upon graduation from high school, Mehl attended Kent State University, Waynesburg College, and West Liberty State College where he graduated in 1982. While in college, he earned three varsity track letters. At Waynesburg, Mehl held the school record and was undefeated in the 400M hurdles, was the Mountaineer Relays 400M hurdle champ, team MVP, District 18 Champion, All-District hurdler and a qualifier for the NAIA National Track Meet. At West Liberty, he once again had an undefeated record in the 400M hurdles, was the WVIAC champ, earned All-WVIAC honors, and was again a qualifier for the NAIA National Track Meet. A resident of Wheeling, West Virginia, Mehl is employed by the Brown and Williamson Tobacco Company.

Even though he earned 10 varsity letters at BHS, **JIM NEMEC**, Class of 1955, received most of his notoriety in football. He was a four-year performer and letterwinner in football and baseball, a two-year performer and one-year letterwinner in basketball, and a one-year performer and letterwinner in track. In football, he received many post-season first team honors his senior year, including All-OVAC, All-Valley, All-Eastern Ohio, All-TV Channel 7, and All-State. In 1954, he was the leading scorer in the Ohio Valley. Nemec started 36 out of 40 games at Bellaire and scored 216 points, believed to be at the time the most points ever scored at BHS. He was a member of the undefeated (tied Ironton) 1954 OVAC Championship team being inducted today. Upon graduation, Nemec attended Purdue University, where he played football for three years, lettering two of those. Nemec also had various associations with sandlot and semi-pro teams. He played three years with the Columbus Colts in the United Football League, one year with Ft. Eustis, Virginia, and one year with the Bellaire Civics. Nemec is employed at Owens-Illinois and resides in Lilburn, Illinois.

WALL OF FAME, CLASS OF 1989

A standout athlete at Redstone High School in Republic, Pennsylvania, WILLIAM "JAKE" OLSAVSKY came a long way to get into the Bellaire High School Wall of Fame. At Redstone High School, he played football, basketball, and baseball for four years, lettering in all three for three years. During his` senior year, he also participated and lettered in track. The captain of his senior team, Olsavsky was also awarded All-State and All-American football honors. Upon graduation, he enrolled at Indiana University where he participated in football for four years, lettering three. He served as captain his senior year and was accorded All-Conference honors. Although he became active in football coaching, he came to the Ohio Valley and excited area fans for eight years with the Wheeling Ironmen. At Bellaire High School, Olsavsky coached for ten years, attaining a record of 59-35-6 (60%) and was the second winningest coach in our school's rich history. While at BHS, he had the honor of coaching two players who later made it into the pros: Ron L. Lee and Lance Mehl (both are BHS Hall of Famers). At present, Olsavsky coaches at Union Local High School and resides in St. Clairsville.

A standout performer on the gridiron and baseball diamond, 1984's **DIRK PICA** enjoyed quite an illustrious career at Bellaire High School. He was a four-year performer and letterwinner in baseball, a three-year performer and two-year letterwinner in football, and captained both sports his senior year. Post season accolades in baseball included All-OVAC first team (2 years), All-Valley (3 years), All-Eastern Ohio first team (2 years), All-Eastern Buckeye League first team (2 years), and All-State first team his senior year. Setting over 15 school records, Pica was selected the District Player-of-the-Year his senior year. Pica also was selected to play in the All-Ohio baseball series in 1984. Football post season honors included All-OVAC (2 years), All-Valley (2 years), Eastern Buckeye League (1 year), and Special Mention All-State his senior year. In 1983 he was voted the Randy Meek Defensive Player, and in 1984 received the Iron Mike Award for his courageous playing while injured. At graduation, Pica received a four-year athletic scholarship to Ohio State University, where he played and letterd in baseball for four years. At the end of his junior year in college, Pica was selected to play in the Midwest Jay Hawk League. A 1989 Dapper Dan honoree, Pica also played semi-pro baseball with Bellaire for one year. At present, he resides in Dublin, Ohio, and is employed by Russ Pharmaceuticals, Inc.

Mention the word basketball in Bellaire and the name of **DUANE POWELL**, Class of 1952, has got to spring up. Although he only played and lettered two years, he was given many post-season honors when selected first team and captain of the All-OVAC team, All-Valley team, and All-Eastern Ohio team and selected third team All-State. Powell is considered by many basketball aficionados as one of the greatest ball handlers and passers ever to play the game. Upon graduation, Powell continued to be active by playing 10 years for the Bellaire Civics baseball team and spending 1 year with the Pittsburgh Pirates farm team. He also spent 15 years as a basketball official at area high schools, and still is an active football official (20 years to date), including 5 years as an official in the West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. Powell, who resides in Martins Ferry, Ohio, is employed by Wheeling-Pittsburgh Steel.

A very versatile athlete, **DOUGLAS E. SHAFFER**, Class of 1978, participated in football, wrestling, and track at Bellaire High School for three years, accumulating 8 varsity letters. In football, he was awarded post-season honors on the All-OVAC team, All-Valley team, and All-Eastern Ohio team. In addition to receiving the Big Reds Touchdown Club Memorial Scholarship, Shaffer was selected to play in the Ohio North/South All-Star Game in 1978. On the wrestling mat, Shaffer helped the Big Reds earn two OVAC titles (he was captain his senior year), while being selected All-OVAC, All-Valley, and All-Eastern Ohio his senior year. In track, Shaffer was a State track meet participant in the 880 and mile relay. A member of the school-record holding 880 relay team and captain of the team, Shaffer earned post-season accolades for two years as All-OVAC, All-Valley, All-Eastern Ohio, and was selected to participate in the Call Giffin Track Classic, highlighting the best trackmen in the Valley. He also had the distinction of being a member of the first place shuttle hurdle relay team at the Bellaire Relays. Upon graduation, Shaffer enrolled at Waynesburg, where he participated and lettered four years in football and two years in track. Selected All-Conference two years in football and one year in track, Shaffer was also selected as captain and MVP in football his senior year. A Dapper Dan honoree, Shaffer now resides in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, and is employed by the PNC Merchant Banking Company, Pittsburgh National Bank.

HARBIN FOOTBALL RATING SYSTEM

Reprinted from The Ohio High School ATHLETE (August, 1988)

The procedure used to rate tootball teams is based upon a system developed by Jack Harbin of Cleveland and used with his permission. The present procedure has been modified by the Board of Control upon recommendation of the Ohio High School Football Coaches Association.

Points will be earned by each school on the following basis POINT SYSTEM

On the first level

Points are earned for each game a team wins, (FULL VALUE)

Points are earned for each game a team ties, (ONE-HALF VALUE)

On the second level:

Points are earned for each game a defeated opponent wins. (FULL VALUE)

Points are earned for each game a defeated opponent ties, (ONE-HALF VALUE)

Points are earned for each game a tied opponent wins. (ONE-HALF VALUE)

Points are earned for each game a tied opponent ties.
(ONE-FOURTH VALUE)

Points are earned on the following basis:

Division V opponent: win -1.0 point; tie -0.50 point Division IV opponent: win -1.5 points; tie -0.75 point Division III opponent win -2.0 points; tie -1.0 point Division II opponent win -2.5 points; tie -1.25 points Division I opponent win -3.0 points; tie -1.5 points

- 4.1 Awarding of First Level Points
 - 4.11 For all teams playing a 10 game schedule
 - a Points are earned for each game a team wins (full value)
 - Points are earned for each game a team ties (half value)
 - c. no points are awarded for game lost.
 - 4 12. For all teams playing fewer than 10 games:
 - Add total first level points earned as explained under
 311, section a, b and c.
 - b This total is then divided by the number of games actually played. To determine total first level points, the quotient is then added to the total points earned, one for each open date.
- 4.2 Awarding of Second Level Points
 - Second level points are awarded as a result of a team defeating or tying an opponent or sometimes an open date according to the following formula
 - 4.21 Defeating an opponent awards to the winner the losers first level points
 - 4.22 Tying an opponent awards the team one-half the opponent's first level points.

- 4.23 No second level points are awarded for losing to an opponent.
- 4.24 Non-member OHSAA school opponents. The school is assigned a point value based upon male enrollment in grades 9-11. Second level points are awarded based upon the point value of the OHSAA non-member school multiplied times the number of victories by the non-member school (one-half value for a ue)

NOTE. This section requires the reporting of victories earned by a non-member OHSAA school which was defeated by an OHSAA member school. It is the responsibility of the OHSAA member school to report the results of the games of non-member OHSAA schools. This reporting must be made to Lynette Young-Hipsher at the OHSAA office on Monday of each week and on Saturday, November 5, 1988 for the last week. Results unreported will not be credited to the OHSAA member school's second level point total.

- 4.241 When the non-member school plays more than 10 regular season games only the first 10 games will count unless the game with the OHSAA member school is the 11th game in which case the nine games preceding it shall be counted.
- 4.242 When the non-member school plays less than 10 regular season games, the open dates will be considered an open date except in Indiana in which case the Indiana first round tournament game will be counted.
- 4.25 A scheduled open date. Second level points are totaled, divided by the number of games played and the quotient divided by 2 then added to the second level point total.
- 4.26 An unscheduled open date (opponent on strike, closed for economic reasons, fails to honor contract, etc.). Second level points are totaled, divided by the number of games played and the quotient added to the second level point total.
- 4.3 Calculation of Total Points

The sum from the awarding of second level points above will be added to the first level points credited from awarding of first level points to determine the total points.

EXAMPLE Team A plays a nine game schedule consisting of seven (7) OHSAA member schools, two (2) non-member schools with one open date. Team A won eight (8) games losing one (1) to a non-member school (out-of-state). The eight opponents defeated consisted of four Division I teams at 3 points each, three Division III teams at 2 points each and one non-member team at 2 points which won 6 games during the season.

FIRST LEVEL POINTS are calculated as follows:

Division I 4 schools at 3 points = 12 points
Division III 3 schools at 2 points = 6 points
Division III 1 non-member

school at 2 points = 2 points

TOTAL FIRST LEVEL POINTS

Total First Level Points earned 20 Divided by number of games played 9

Equals 2 2222 quotient

Add 20 total first level points earned
Plus 2 2222 first level value for one open date
Equals 22 2222 total first level points credited

SECOND LEVEL POINTS are earned and credited based upon the victories attained by CHSAA member schools over their opponents. Team A earned 92.5000 second level points.

Since Team A had one open date on their schedule, defeated one non-member school and lost to one non-member school, adjustments are made to credit Team A at the second level for the one open date and one victory over a non-member school. No second level points are credited in the game lost to a non-member school.

Calculation: 92.5000 second level points

credited from OHSAA*

Divided by 7 number of games played

against OHSAA member schools

Equals 13.2143 average value of each win

at second level 92,5000 second level points

credited from OHSAA

6 6072 second level value for one open date (1/2 of 13.2143)

Plus 12.0000 second level value for win

(2 points × 6 wins)

111.1072 Total second level points credited

COMPILATION: Due to the complexity of the system, computer services of the OHSAA are used to record and tally the points earned by each team. The computer operates only on the data fed into it— that is, did a team win, the or lose. The margin of victory is not a factor. A win by one point or 20 points counts only as a win—nothing more.


