DAPPER DAN MAN OF THE YEAR

Head Coach Lou Holtz

Nineteen seasons as a collegiate head coach have earned Lou Holts a sterling reputation for turning pretenders into contenders - for taking football programs and elevating them a level or two on their way to the top 20.

Holts fashioned that image by utilizing his expertise at William & Mary, North Carolina State, Arkansas and Minnesota. But nowhere has he done it as impressively as at Notre Dame.

In just three seasons, Holtz has brought the Fighting Irish back to the top of college football circles. His '88 Notre Dame team finished the season with a perfect 12-0 record - the first Irish team ever to win 12 games - after moving atop the wire-service polls beginning the first week of November.

Along the way, his Irish fashioned key triumphs over eventual Big Ten and Rose Bowl champion Michigan, then top-ranked Miami (the defending national champion) and unbeaten and second-ranked USC in the '88 regular-season finale. Notre Dame's Fiesta Bowl win over unbeaten West Virginia handed the Irish their 11th consensus national crown and their eighth since the Associated Press poll came into existence in 1936 (the Irish won previously in '43, '46, '47, '49, '66, '73 and '77).



His work in '88 earned him national coach-of-the-year honors from the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA). The Sporting News, Football News as well as the Touchdown Club of Washington, D.C. and CBS Sports.

The 52-year-old Follansbee, W.Va., native became the 25th head coach of the Fighting Irish on November 27, 1985. His mission was to wake up the echoes, to push Notre Dame back toward the national rankings where it hadn't finished since 1980.

Holts wasted little time injecting equal doses of confidence, credibility and competitiveness. His Irish battled eventual Big Ten champion Michigan to the wire in the '86 season opener - and that set the tone for a series of top-notch efforts against top-notch opponents.

Notre Dame finished 5-6 - but that mark included five defeats by a total of 14 points against a schedule the NCAA rated the most difficult in the country.

In fact, the 24-23 loss to third-ranked Michigan so impressed the Associated Press voters that the Irish moved into the 20th slot in the AP poll the next week - the only time in history a team ever has moved into the top 20 by losing a game.

Notre Dame finished the '86 season with a bang - by coming from a 17-point deficit with 12 minutes left to defeat 17th-rated USC 38-37 on a field goal on the last play of the game.

The '87 campaign produced even more impressive results. Again facing what the NCAA rated the most difficult schedule in the nation, including eight teams that eventually earned postseason bowl invitations, the Irish won eight of their first nine games and earned a bid to the Cotton Bowl for Notre Dame's first major bowl appearance since 1980.

Along the way, Holts's squad recorded victories over both Rose Bowl participants - Michigan State and USC - as well as perennial powers Alabama and Michigan on its way to an 8-4 mark. Eight of Notre Dame's foes either finished the regular season in the top 20 or ranked there when they played the Irish. His work earned Holts one of four finalist spots for the Paul 'Bear' Bryant College Coach of the Year Award selected by the Football Writers Association of America.

Holts brings a wealth of experience to the sidelines -including a 141-75-5 career record that ranks him 10th in victories among active coaches and 19th in winning percentage at .649 heading into the '89 season. He has built a reputation as a motivator, a demanding disciplinarian and someone who relishes challenges and hard work.

He came to Notre Dame following two seasons at Minnesota (1984-85), seven at Arkansas (1977-83), four at North Carolina State (1972-75), and three at William & Mary (1969-71). He spent the 1976 season as head coach of the New York Jets of the National Football League. Fourteen of the 19 collegiate teams under his direction have earned post-season bowl invitations -and nine have finished in the final AP top 20.

At Minnesota, Holts breathed new life into a Gopher program that had combined for a 4-18 record in the two previous seasons before he arrived. He took over a Minnesota team that had lost 17 straight Big Ten Conference games - and pumped renewed enthusiasm into it.

The Golden Gophers' spring game prior to Holts's initial season in Minneapolis drew 42,000 fans. Their new coach rewarded that confidence by taking a 1-10 team that gave up 518 points the previous year and producing a respectable 4-7 campaign in '84. Holts earned United Press International's national coach-of-the-week honors after visiting Minnesota pinned a 17-14 defeat on a Wisconsin team that went on to finish 7-4-1 and play in the Hall of Fame Bowl. The final game of that '84 season saw the Gophers prevail 23-17 over Iowa team that finished 8-4-1 after a victory over Texas in the Freedom Bowl.

In '85, Holts did even better by coaching Minnesota to a 5-1 start, the only loss a 13-7 squeaker to eventual national champion Oklahoma. The Gophers won their first three Big Ten games over Purdue, Northwestern and Indiana and stood 20th in the Associated Press and United Press International polls after the first six weeks of the season. Minnesota eventually finished 6-5, its first winning season since '81, and defeated Clemson in the Independence Bowl played after Holts left for South Bend.

Holtz's seven-season mark of 60-21-2 (.735) at Arkansas included six straight bowl appearances after he arrived, the first time the Razorbacks ever had played in bowl games in more than four straight seasons. His first six Arkansas teams combined to average exactly nine victories per season, the best record in any six-year period in Hog history, despite the challenge of replacing legendary Arkansas coach Frank Broyles. Four of his Razorback teams finished in the UPI final top 10, five of them in the top 20.

Holts burst onto the scene in Fayetteville by taking his first team in 1977 to an 11-1 record that included only a 13-9 loss to Texas. Along the way that first season came victories over 15th-ranked Oklahoma State and 11th-ranked Texas A&M - followed by a 31-6 upset of second-ranked and once-beaten Oklahoma in the Orange Bowl. That victory left Arkansas third in both final polls and came despite the fact Holtz had suspended, before the squad traveled to Miami, three players who had combined to score 78 percent of Arkansas' touchdowns in '77. Ironically, Arkansas' bowl win that year helped Notre Dame claim the national championship after the Irish defeated Texas in the Cotton Bowl.

Here's how Holts fared during the remainder of his tenure with the Razorbacks:

• His '78 team began the year ranked second in the preseason polls, finished 9-2-1 following a 10-10 Fiesta Bowl tie with UCLA and stood 10th in the final UPI poll and 11th in the last AP poll. first six Arkansas teams combined to average exactly nine

• His '79 team won six straight games to begin the year - including a 17-14 win over second-ranked Texas - added a 29-20 victory over 17th-ranked Baylor and eventually finished 10-2 following a Sugar Bowl loss to unbeaten national champion Alabama. The Hogs finished eighth (AP) and ninth (UPI) in the final polis that year. Their 7-1 Southwest conference record was good for a league title tie with Houston, a 13-10 winner over Arkansas only by blocking a field-goal attempt on the final play. Holts was named SWC coach of the year.

• His '80 team began the year ranked sixth in preseason polls, won four of its first five games and three of its last four en route to a 34-15 Hall of Fame Bowl victory over Tulane.

• His '81 team pinned a stunning 42-11 loss on Texas for the only Longhorn defeat of the season, with Holts winning UPI national coach-of-the-week honors in the process. The Hogs ended up 8-4 and 16th in the final UPI poll after losing to North Carolina in the Gator Bowl.

• His '82 team won its first seven games and moved as high as fifth in the AP poll. That Razorback squad held six opponents without a touchdown while leading the nation in scoring defense (10.5 points per game). Arkansas defeated Florida in the Bluebonnet Bowl to end up eighth (UPI) and ninth (AP) in the final polls.

Among the Razorback All-Americans Holtz coached included defensive tackle Dan Hampton, defensive end Billy Ray Smith, kicker Steve Little, running back Gary Anderson, offensive tackle Greg Kolenda, defensive tackle Ron Faurot, guard Steve Korte, Kicker Bruce Lahay and guard Leotis Harris.

Chosen national coach of the year in 1977 by the Football Writers Association of America, and the Walter Camp Foundation, Holts saw his team play before sellout crowds in every home game during the seven seasons at Arkansas.

At North Carolina State, Holts produced the best four-year win-loss record (33-12-3) in the history of the school. All four of his Wolfpack teams earned postseason bowl invitations, giving him a personal string of 10 straight bowl games including the six at Arkansas. He took over a program that had won only three games in each of the previous three seasons before he arrived and reversed that figure by coaching the 'Pack to an 8-3-1 record in 1972. North Carolina State won seven of its last eight games that year, including a 49-13 victory over 18th-ranked West Virginia in the Peach Bowl to end up 17th in the final AP poll. Holts was rewarded by being named Atlantic Coast Conference coach of the year.

Here's what Holts's next three Wolfpack teams accomplished:

• His '73 squad won the ACC title with a perfect 6-0 record, beginning the season ranked 17th and ending it ranked 16th (both AP and UPI) after a 31-18 Liberty Bowl win over 19th-ranked Kansas left North Carolina State 9-3. His team's only losses that season came on the road at second-ranked Nebraska, at Georgia and at sixth-ranked Penn State, a team that finished 12-0.

• His '74 team won its first six games and later handed Penn State one of its two losses that year. The Wolfpack lost only consecutive league games to North Carolina and 15th-ranked Maryland before tying Houston 31-31 in the Astro-Bluebonnet Bowl. The 9-2-1 slate left North Carolina State ninth (UPI) and 11th (AP) in the final polls.

• His '75 team began the season ranked 13th (AP), with the highlight of the campaign a 15-14 road win at eighth-ranked Penn State. The Wolfpack fell to West Virginia in the Peach Bowl to end up 7-4-1.

North Carolina State's ninth-place finish in the final UPI poll in '74 marks the only time in the school's history its football team has finished in a wire-service top 10.

Holtz's head-coaching career began in 1969 at William & Mary at age 32. Despite three straight losing seasons, his second team in '70 won the Southern Conference title and advanced to play 15th-ranked Toledo in the Tangerine Bowl in the only postseason appearance in the history of the school.

Holtz's stab at professional football - between his tenures at North Carolina State and Arkansas - produced a 3-10 record. He resigned the week of the Jets' final regular-season game.

Before becoming head coach at William & Mary in '69, Holts served as an assistant coach at Iowa (freshmen, 1960), William & Mary (offensive backs, 1961-63), Connecticut, (defensive backs, 1964-65), South Carolina (defensive backs, 1966-77), and Ohio State (defensive backs, 1968). The Buckeyes won the national championship in '68 in his one season on the Ohio State staff. He worked under such respected coaches as Forest Evashevski at Iowa, Rick Forzano and Connecticut, Paul Dietzel at South Carolina and Woody Hayes at Ohio State.

Born Louis Leo Holts on January 6, 1937, Holts grew up in East Liverpool, Ohio, just up the Ohio River from his Follansbee, W.Va. birthplace. He graduated from East Liverpool High School, earned a bachelor of science degree in history from Dent State in 1959 and a master's degree from Iowa in arts and education in 1961. He played linebacker at Kent State for two seasons before an injury ended his career.

Married to Beth Barcus of East Liverpool on July 22, 1961, Holts and his wife are the parents of four children -Luanne Attenbaumer, Skip (he graduated from Notre Dame in December of '86 and now is an assistant coach at Colorado State), Kevin (he graduated from Notre Dame in December of '88 and will enter law school at Notre Dame this fall) and Elizabeth (a sophomore at Notre Dame).



EDWARD H. RENSI Honorary Chairman

Edward H. Rensi, a native of Steubenville and a graduate of Hopedale High School who has enjoyed a Horatio Alger-type rise in the McDonald's Corp., has been named as honorary chairman for the annual charity awards dinner of The Dapper Dan Club of the Upper Ohio Valley.

Stephen M. Bertz, of Cadiz, who is president of the Ohio Valley Dapper Dans, announced today that the 45-year-old Rensi had accepted the honor and would be on the dais at the giant banquet scheduled for Sunday, Feb. 11, at St. John Arena in Steubenville.

'Having a Man of the Year the caliber of Lou Holtz and an honorary chairman with the reputation of an Ed Rensi should assure us of one of the most memorable banquets since the Dapper Dan movement was established in the valley in 1967,' Bertz said.

Just a week ago, Bertz made the official announcement that Notre Dame coach Holtz would be toasted as 'Man of the Year' at the colorful dinner.

Rensi, like Holtz, credits his Ohio Valley roots as being instrumental in his success. He joined the McDonald's organization as an 85-cents-an-hour hamburger flipper in Columbus in 1966 while he was attending Ohio State University. He is now president and chief operating officer of McDonald's U.S.A. and is chief operations officer for the McDonald's Corp.

Rensi currently operates out of McDonald's Plaza at Oak Brook, Ill. His wife, Anne Bossick Rensi, is a graduate of Steubenville Catholic Central High School and they have one daughter, Marcy Jane Pennings, who within the last month has made them grandparents for the first time, with the birth of a son, Joshua Robert.

Rensi's father, Ernest, was a deputy sheriff in Harrison County, Ohio, for many years and teamed with the McDonald executive's mother, Virginia, to operate the Alameda Inn. Ernest Rensi died last August but Virginia Rensi remains in Hopedale. Alameda Inn is now managed by their daughter, Jo Sana.

Ed Rensi also has a brother, Sam, who is head of manufacturing for Remington Firearms at Ilion, N.Y. Not a brother by birth but raised in the Rensi family, Ralph Hennis still resides in Hopedale.

Two nephews of Ed Rensi are high school athletes in the area. They are Larry Dennison, a football player at Cadiz, and Matthew Liggett, a basketball player at Edison South.

The sheriff of Harrison County, Richard Rensi, is a cousin of the Dapper Dan honoree.

The Rensi brothers were high school athletes at Hopedale High, which since has been absorbed in a consolidation with Cadiz. Ed Rensi was a center and defensive nose guard in football and received All-Ohio honorable mention as a junior on the undefeated 1960 team. He was also a team manager in basketball.

Enrolling at Ohio State after his graduation from high school in 1962, Rensi dropped out of school in '66 'because I needed money.' He had been majoring in secondary education and says, "When I hang up my spatula, I still hope to teach."

Within a year after joining the McDonald's organization, he had his own restaurant. He subsequently held field service positions with the corporation in Columbus and in Washington, D.C. In 1972, he was named Philadelphia district manager. He was appointed regional vice-president in 1976 and senior vice-president of operations in '78. In 1980, he became executive vice president and chief operations officer and in '82 he was appointed senior executive vice-president.

Rensi was one of the founders of the first Ronald McDonald House, a temporary residence for families of children being treated for serious illnesses, and is a member of the international advisory board for the Ronald McDonald House program.

He is also chairman of the board of trustees for Ronald McDonald Children's Charities. Established in memory of McDonald's Corp. founder, the late Ray A. Kroc, Ronald McDonald Charities award grants to not-for-profit organizations benefitting children in the areas of health, education and culture. 'RMCC's goal is to help children reach their fullest potential.' Rensi said.

R.S. McKELVEY MEMORIAL AWARD - 1990 John Laslo

John Laslo, who was mayor of Martins Ferry for virtually a quarter of a century and who has been a highly-respected community leader and humanitarian, has been named by the Dapper Dan Club of the Upper Ohio Valley as the 1990 recipient of its Robert S. McKelvey Memorial Award.

A native of Connorville who was graduated from Wellsburg High School but who moved to the Martins Ferry area when he was 19 and has lived there ever since, Laslo will be recognized for his 'consistent compassion, hard work and dedication to the gentlemanly ideals typified by the life of the founder of the Ohio Valley Dapper Dan Club.'

Robert McKelvey, with the support of a group of other interested individuals, founded the valley Dapper Dan club in 1968 and was its president until his death in 1973.

The Upper Ohio Valley Dapper Dan Club was originally limited largely to the Toronto-Steubenville-Mingo-Weirton-Follansbee areas and when McKelvey expanded it both north and south, Laslo was one of the men whose aid he enlisted.

Laslo is a former member of the board of directors and is now an honorary director.

While mayor of Martins Ferry, he founded Colt League baseball and, through his efforts, this program for boys 15 and 16 years of age was spread throughout the United States and on to Mexico, Puerto Rico, Canada, Japan, the Philippines and to military bases around the world.

During his administration, more than \$2.2 million was spent in Martins Ferry on recreational facilities and structures. When he was councilman, he initiated the action that resulted in Veterans Memorial Park. Veterans Memorial Center and an Olympic-size pool were also constructed while he was in office.

Laslo was long associated with Wheeling-Pittsburgh Steel Corp, and was superintendent of safety and plant protection at the Martins Ferry Corrugating Plant. He is now retired from his duties with the steel company.

A self-made man, he was nevertheless an enthusiastic booster of education. He took management and business administration courses from both Ohio State University and Ohio University. He spearheaded the move that brought an Ohio University Branch to Belmont County. He also sparked the establishment of many programs for youth in Martins Ferry. Head Start, Upward Bound, Youth Work Experience, Day Care Center, Work-Study Programs, etc., were among government programs that Laslo brought to Martins Ferry.

He was equally interested in the elderly and during his administration, four high-rise buildings were erected in the city to provide low rent housing. There were also health, nutrition, transportation, hot-meal, recreational, and other programs for the senior citizens established.

Martins Ferry had the first War on Poverty program in the area and this led eventually to the formation of the Belmont County Community Action Commission. Laslo also initiated action that led to the formation of the Belmont County Improvement Corp., and the Eastern Ohio Mayors Association.

Laslo did much through the Model Cities Program, which he recognized early on as an instrument for providing needed aid to his community.

One of Laslo's greatest prides in his family. He and his wife, Sue, have three children-retired army colonel George Laslo, of Huntsville, Ala.; Mrs. Joe (Barbara Jones, of Newark, Ohio, and John W., an elementary school principal at Vermilion, O.

After the consolidation of Buckeye South, in 1972-73, Coach Lazasz served sixteen years with a 211 and a 133 record.

The last two years, at Buckeye South-West, up to the present time, he has a 6 and 25 record. His career total is 396-278.

won the District Championship in 1969-70, 1973-74 and in 1976. He went to the Regional Finals before falling to Bishop Hartley 77-76 at Athens, Ohio.

He also served as an assistant football coach under Dick Thurnes.

Being involved in several civic organizations in his community, he has served as Senior Class Advisor, Varsity Club Advisor & Assistant Athletic Director.

He and his wife JoAnn, formally, Florence JoAnn Applegarth, are the parents of four children Debbra, William, Mary and Lisa. They have one child, Lisa, who is a sophomore at Ohio University - Belmont. Mary and her husband are now living in Arkansas and have two children. William is an Electrician living in Follansbee. Debbra is now living in Mississippi and has one child. Debbra and Mary and their husbands spent time living in Alaska before returning to Arkansas and Mississippi.




TOM KEANE 1989 Hall of Fame Inductee

Tom Keane is a distinguished addition to the Dapper Dan Club's Upper Ohio Valley Sports Hall of Fame.

Tom has played in three NFL championship games with the Los Angeles Rams and coached in five Super Bowls with the Miami Dolphins.

Keane, who first broke into athletic prominence as a star at Linsly Institute, has been retired from pro football since 1985, except for over seas trips to conduct clinics, and is employed by the sheriff's department in Broward County, Fla., in community involvement projects.

The Bellaire native has become a major honoree at a Dapper Dan banquet for the second time. In 1982, he and Martins Ferry's Fred Bruney, then defensive backfield coach of the Philadelphia Eagles, were feted as Dapper Dan 'Men of the Year.'



While he has an outstanding career in the NFL, Keane is remembered most fondly by many Ohio Valley fans as the firs head coach of the Wheeling Ironmen professional football team, which won the hearts of area fans back in the '60's. H piloted the Ironmen for three seasons and was also general manager in the last two of those years. His 1962 and '63 teams won United Football League championships.

Tom was a three-sports star at Linsly and made all-valley in both basketball and football. He was on of three brothers to play for the Cadets. His elder brother, Jim, went on to star at Iowa and was the NFL's leading receiver in 1947 with the Chicago Bears. His younger brother, the late Mike Keane, played at the University of Cincinnati.

As a war-time freshman at Ohio State in 1944, Tom broke into the varsity backfield for a team that won nine straight for OSU's first perfect record since 1956. After two years in the navy and seeing action in the South Pacific, Keane enrolled at West Virginia University, where he played under Coach Bill Kern.

Tom had a year of eligibility left when the pros beckoned. He was drafted by the Los Angeles Rams and joined them in 1948. In the four years he spent at L.A., the Rams played in three NFL championship games. He was a member of the world championship team in 1951 as an offensive receiver and defensive back.

Traded to the Dallas Texans in 1952, the varsatile athlete moved on to Baltimore a year later due to a franchise switch. While with the Colts, he was second in the NFL in pass interceptions in both '53 and '54. In '53, he had 11 interceptions and was an all-pro selection. He also played in the Pro Bowl. He averaged 42.8 yards as a punter at Baltimore.

Dealt to the Chicago (now Phoenix) Cardinals in '55, Keane saw his playing career ended by a knee injury. He served as an assistant with the Cardinals in '75 and subsequently was on the staff of the Canadian League's Calgary Stampeders.

After his three seasons with the Ironmen, he became defensive back field coach of the Pittsburgh Steelers in 1965. The next year he was hired by George Wilson, former Detroit Lions coach who had been named to be the first head coach of the expansion franchise at Miami. When Wilson gave way to Don Shula in 1970, Shula retained only two assistants and one was Keane, who had been his teammate at Baltimore.

In five trips to the Super Bowl with Miami, Keane saw the Dolphins twice crowned as world champions. The Dolphins won back-to-back Super Bowls (SB VII and VIII). The 1972 Miami team established an all-time NFL record with a 17-0 record and on of Keane's defensive backs, Jack Scott, was named MVP in the Super Bowl. The next year, the Dolphins allowed only five touchdown passes, with Tom's secondary rating much of the credit.

Tom and his wife, Mary, who is from Shadyside, have two daughters, Candi, 35;, and Mary, 22, and two sons, Tom, 33, Tim 29.

He was graduated from Weir Senior High School in 1956. He attended West Virginia University. The University of Steubenville and received a B.S. degree from West Virginia Tech in Vocational Education.

His work experience has included positions in men's wear retailing with Rodak's Mens Shop in Weirton, purchasing department of Weirton Steel Division, Field Representative for National Lubricating Products in Brilliant, Ohio, Purchasing agent of the Hancock County Schools and Placement Coordinator of the John D. Rockefeller IV Vo-Tech Center.

Over the past 34 years he has been affiliated with radio station WEIR as sports director. In that time he has broadcast basketball, football and baseball games throughout West Virginia and Ohio and also has broadcast in Pennsylvania over WEDO in McKeesport.



He has been involved in various civic and professional organizations including Past President of the Weirton Rotary Club, Past Grand Knight of the Weirton Knights of Columbus, Weirton United Way, the National Institute of Government Purchasing and the American Association of School Administrators, in addition to membership in local booster clubs and the Dapper Dan Club. He is a former Weirton City Councilman and in 1986 was elected as a Hancock County Commissioner. Mr. Sorrenti has wide experience as a toastmaster and master of ceremonies throughout the Ohio Valley at various sports gatherings, and is in demand as a motivational speaker.

He is married to the former Judy Difederico of Steubenville and they have three children -J.J., 23 years old; Janna, 21 years old, and Antoinette, 18 years old.

BILL MCELDOWNEY

When Bill McEldowney began to speak the gospel of physical fitness, exercise programs were not as stylish, faddish, nor as heavily promoted as they are today.

However, in some 35 years of YMCA work in Wheeling, combined with his interest in sports that were outside the realm of his job responsibility, McEldowney touched many lives and had an impact upon the attitudes and physical being of hundreds and hundreds - perhaps thousand-of Ohio Valley citizens.

Since 1970 until his retirement, which became official on April 1, McEldowney had been executive director of the Wheeling YMCA.

He had first come to the Ohio Valley back in 1952, after his graduation from Davis & Elkins College, and has been actively involved in community life here ever since - except for the two years he spent Greer, S.C., which hired him to establish a YMCA program and where he must have surprised those southerners with a zeal and enthusiasm that was beyond the usual pace of life in those parts.

'I guess I'm a people person,' McEldowney said in an interview with this reporter. 'I'm interested in keeping them active. The greatest satisfaction I've had has been in the friends I've made and in the feeling that I've helped some people get more out of their lives than they might have otherwise."

At age 60, Bill doesn't mince words about his future. He has no intention of putting his feet up and taking is easy. He's not ready for that. 'I'll be ready to take another job,: he said. Banker Coukart, Former Shadean Gridder, Becomes NFL Official

Ed Coukart, who 30 years ago was a football player at Shadyside High School, has realized a long-time ambition.

Now senior vice-president of The Potters Bank & Trust Company at East Liverpool, he has been selected to officiate in the National Football League.

When the 1989 NFL season rolls around, Coukart will be an umpire in the crew of veteran official Gene Barth. His first appearance working a pro game will be at Three Rivers Stadium in Pittsburgh, where he will be "ump" for the pre-season contest between the Washington Redskins and the Steelers on Friday, Aug. 12.

Coukart, who was born and raised in Shadyside, will have a full schedule this year. He will be involved in 14 regular-season games and four exhibitions. Whether he "makes" the playoffs as a rookie official remains to be seen.

In his crew, as a field judge, will be Ray Dodex, of Howard, Ohio, who once was employed by Ohio Bell at Steubenville and who officiated in Wheeling at Ironmen games in the Continental Football League.



ED COUKART

Coukart, who played linebacker and guard for Jack Berger's Shadyside Orangemen in 1959 and '60 and subsequently played collegiate football at both Northwestern and Kent State

Universities, started in his officiating career in 1969 in the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference. He remembers that his first game was one between Monroe County rivals Woodsfield and Beallsville, The next day he worked Bellaire High vs. St. John's Central.

He subsequently graduated to collegiate ranks and worked in the Ohio Conference and the Mid-American Conference before he joined the ranks of officials for the Collegiate Independents, a group which works games for Notre Dame, Pitt, Penn State, West Virginia, Syracuse, Boston College, Rutgers, Temple, Army and Navy.

Last fall, he had such games as Pitt-Boston College, Syracuse-Pitt, Nortre Dame-Purdue, and WVU-Bowling Green.

"I have been trying to get into the NFL for the last six years," he said from his bank office this past week. "I didn't realize how tough it would be. They've been scouting me for four years."

Coukart is now boning up on the NFL rules, which differentiate from the collegiate rules on many points, some of them quite subtle. "The umpire does the enforcement of penalties so he not only has to know the rules but the spot of enforcement for all fouls," the Shadyside native said.

The new NFL official's wife, Marsha, is the daughter of the late Dick Matesic, former Union High and University of Pittsburgh halfback who played in the NFL with the Steelers and Philadelphia Eagles. The couple has two sons--Mike, a sophomore quarterback at West Liberty State College, and Rick, a junior linebacker at East Liverpool High.
