



DAPPER DAN "MAN OF THE YEAR" — RUDY MUMLEY

The Dapper Dan Club of the Upper Ohio Valley will honor one of its own with the club's highest award.

Steve Bertz, club president, announced today that Rudolph "Rudy" Mumley - educator, humanitarian, dynamic organizer and charity fundraiser - will be hailed as the Dapper Dans' "Man of the Year" at the 26th annual charity awards banquet, which is scheduled for Sunday, February 16, at the Wheeling Civic Center.

"We scan not only the local scene but the entire nation to select someone with impressive credentials to be our man of the year," Bertz pointed out. "It is not an honor that we accord lightly. Rudy Mumley is a unique choice because he is being honored not for achievements as either atlete or coach but for the remarkable work he has done in the name of charity through sports- oriented organizations - including the West Liberty Hilltoppers Club, the OVAC Foundation and the Dapper Dan Club."

Bertz added, "Rudy continues year after year on his relentless journey to help the less fortunate. His unselfish efforts have allowed little boys to smile and put warmth in the hearts of little girls. We can never fully know how much good he has done because happiness can't be measured.

"Most of our past Men of the Year have enjoyed the bright lights of celecbrity and the monetary benefits that accompany the level of excellence they have attained. Rudy doesn't receive any salary for his work; it's not that kind of job. He must wonder sometimes, at the end of a tiring day, if it has all been worth it, but those who have been on the receiving end know that it has. Rudy is a wonderful, wonderful person and we of Dapper Dan are proud that he is our Man of the Year."



A graduate of old Wheeling High School and West Liberty State College, with a master's degree from West Virginia University, Mumley is an air force veteran of both World War II and the Korean War. He taught at Powhatan, Shadyside and Smithfield High Schools. He was appointed principal at Warren Consolidatd High in Tiltonsville in 1964 and later served as principal at Yorkville High. When the Buckeye Local School District was formed in 1969, he was named principal at Buckeye South High and worked in that capacity until his retirement in 1979.

Mumley has served the OVAC in many roles. He is a two-time president of that organization and has worked in its behalf for more than a quarter of a centruy – always without compensation. He was a charter member of the OVAC Foundation and has served on football and basketball committees. But perhaps most important has been his outstanding work with the Ohio-West Virginia All-Star Charity Football Classic, for which he has served as game director ever since the contest was revived in 1972.

The game, which has brought in over \$400,000 for various charities, was named in his honor in 1986.

He has also used his energies in behof of the OVAC wrestling tournament and received an award from the conference wrestling coaches in 1980 in gratitude for his dedication.

Mumley has also attained a rare distinction a West Liberty State College, as a non-athlete who has been enshrined in the school's Athletic Hall of Fame. He was inducted in 1985.

He has also received the WLSC Gold & Black Achievement Award, the WLSC Gold & Black Athletic Award, and the College President's Award. He has served as president of the West Liberty Alumni Association and as a member of the West Liberty Foundation. When Bartell Fieldhouse was dedicated in 1981, he was chairman of the committee.

As an undergraduate at West Liberty, he was active in many facets of campus life, being a class officer, president of the Book Club and the student council and student manager in all sports. He was also a jayvee basketball coach and intramural director, believe it or not.

The Warwood Lions Club choice as "Citizen of the Year" in 1981, he has also been recognized by the Osiris Shirne Temple, which is one of the chief charitable beneficiaries of the all-star football game.

Mumley has belonged to the Dapper Dan Club for some 25 years and has been a member of the board of directors virtually throughout that period. He and Larry Falbo, long-time educator from Shadyside, have teamed as banquet co-chairmen for the last six Dapper Dan banquets held in Wheeling.

In 1982, the popular Mumley received the coveted Robert McKelvey Award, presented in memory of the late founder of the Ohio Valley Dapper Dan movement.

A past president of the Eastern Ohio Principals' Association, Mumley has also received several educational awards and has been recognized in "Who's Who In American Colleges and Universities."

On two occasions, Radio Station WKWK presented him with a community service award.

Rudy has a sister, Lillian, with whom he makes his home in Warwood, and two brother - Eli, of St. Clairsville, and Peter, of Towson, Md.

JERRY WILLIAMS Honorary Chairman

This year's honorary chairman for the 26th annual Dapper Dan Charity Awards Banquet is Jerry Williams, Kroger zone manager for the Ohio Valley.

Williams, a lifelong employee of Kroger, began his career in 1958 as a meat cutter in a Newark, Ohio Kroger store. He was soon promoted, and in 1961 was accepted into the Kroger Management Training Program.

From 1962 to 1972, he rose through the ranks, first as a comanager, then manager of Ohio stores in Washington Court House, GReenfield, Circleville and Athens. In 1972 he was named Perishable Merchandising Representative in Columbus in 1976.

In 1977, Williams was transferred to Toledo, where he spent the next six years. In 1983 he left his position of assistant zone manager to become zone manager in the Ohio Valley.

During his career, Williams has won various awards of achievement from the Kroger Co., including the Vice President's Award in 1969 and 1971, and for being named the OUtstanding Store Manager in the Columbus area.



The list of Williams' community involvement is ong and distinguished. Among those organizations benefitting from his time and talents are the Jaycees, Lions Club, Kiwanis Club, United Way, Ohio Valley Athletic Conference Foundation (OVAC), March of dimes, Wheeling Symphony, Oglebay Park and the Good Zoo. He currently serves on the Board of Directors of OVAC, The WheelingArea Chamber of Commerce, and the Thanks-A-Million Literacy Foundation.

Among his most notable accomplishemnts in his involvement in long-term labor agreement betwe4en Kroger management and employees. This, in part, helped bring the total number of Valley Kroger employees to over 1,000 people.

Williams and his wife, Jeanette, have been married for 36 years and have two daughters, and one granddaughter. They reside in the St. Clairsville area.

R.S. McKELVEY MEMORIAL AWARD - 1992 LAWRENCE P. FALBO

This year's recipient of the R.S. McKelvey Memorial Award, Larry Falbo, is a resident of Shadyside, Ohio. A graduate of Yorkville High School and an educator who served as a teacher, coach, athletic director and a high school principal at Shadyside High's School. A 3 year veteran of the Eight Air Force Station in England during World War II, Falbo has a master's degree from Ohio University. He also taught at Ohio University, Belmont County Branch for several years. He is now a part time employee at John Marshall High School and is serving his third term as a member of the Shadyside Board of Education.

He has been active in athletics for over four decades. He organized and directed the Eastern Ohio Valley Baseball League and was selected to coach the first Ohio State-East-West All Star Game at Columbus, Ohio. He was instrumental in organizing Little League Baseball in Shadyside.

"Certainly Larry Falbo is an ideal choice for the McKelvey Award," said Steve Bertz, the Club President. "He stands for all the good qualities which made the late Robert S. McKelvey, the first club president of our club, such a great person."

"Larry Falbo will be recognized for his hard work and dedication to the ideals typified by the life of the founder of the Ohio Valley Dapper Dan Club," said Dan Olexia, past president fo the Dapper Dan Club. "We are proud to honor a man with his experiences and dedication."

Falbo has served as a former trustee member of the Ohio Secondary School Principals Association, a past member of the OVAC Football Commission, a former football and basketball official, a member of the OVAC Rules and Ratings comittee, a past member of the OVAC Board of Directors and a member of the West Liberty Hill Toppers Club.

As an athletic director and principal at Shadyside High School, he has served as a director of baseball, basketball and golf tournaments for the Ohio High School Athletic Association.

In 1985, he served as co-chairman when the Ohio Valley paid "tribute to Lansing's finest" - one of the largest sports gatherings in the Ohio Valley.

Larry Falbo and his wife, Dorothy, have three chidren, all of whom are teachers. Rebecca teaches 6th Grade in Pickerington; Larry, Jr. is a vocational education teacher at J.V.S. in St. Clairsville, Ohio; and Dina is a 3rd Grade teacher at Bexley, Columbus, Ohio. He also has four grandchildren – Larry III, Katelyn, Sam, and Molly.

ABE BRYAN 1992 Hall of Fame Inductee

In 1967, at the first charity awards dinner ever held by the Dapper Dan Club of the Ohio Valley, Abe bryan was hailed as one of two "Men of the Year" honoreees.

a quarter of a century later, he will be inducted into the Dapper Dan Sports hall of FLame at a banquet on Sun., Feb. 16, at the Wheeling Civic Center.

Along with the late George Strager, who was the winningest coach in Ohio Valley high school football history, Bryan will enshrined in a parthenon of heroes which now numbers just 53 revered names.

They will be worthy additions to this exclusive club.

Abe Bryan didn't play football in high school at Steubenville Catholic Central because he weighed only 100 pounds at the time. But he was big enough to join the U.S. Marine Corps during World War II and won a gold star and two silver stars for valor. Wounded twice, he was also awaarded the Purple heart, with a cluster.

Subsequently, he played collegiate football for two Miamis (one in Ohio and One in Florida) and once roomed with Ara Parseghian.

Later, he served under four head football coaches – one of them having two terms – at Steubenville Highs School before he was entrusted with the job in

1964. He quickly established himself as an outstanding coach. He held the position for only nine years and never had a perfect record team, principally because Big Red was then campaigning in the redoubtable All-American Conference, along with the likes of Massillon, Canton McKinley, Warren harding, etc.

His teams were always formidable and in his head coaching career posted 60 victories against 29 losses and one tie. he achieved such respect among his peers that h became the president of the Ohio High School Football Coaches Association and twice was picked to coach in the annual Ohio North-South All-Star game, once as an assistant (1967) and once as head coach (1970). And both tims, his side won.

Bryan later served two years as athletic director and assistant principal at Steubenville High before leaving the educational field to join boich Mining Company, which he now serves as president.

The first person ever named to the Upper Ohio Valley Dapper Dan Sports Hall of Fame was a Steubenville High football coach, the late Charles "Punque" Cartledge, who was inducted aat the club's second banquet, held on jan. 14, 1968. Bryan will become the first Big Red grid mentor since Carltedge to enter the "Hall".

Bryan was graduated from Steubenville Catholic Central high in 1942. He was a catcher and short-stop on the Crusader baseball team and manager of the football team.

He put on 60 punds while in the servie, despite the fact that much of his time in the U.S. marine Crops was spent in the heat of the South Pacific Islands. He was with the Third Radar Battery of the Fourth marine Division and saw action on the Marshall Islands, Saipan, Tinian, and Iwo Jima.

Returning to civilianlife after his heroic efforts for his country, Bryan took advantage of the G.I. Bill to enroll at Miami University at Oxford, where Sid Gillman was then coaching. He became the roommate of Parseghian and they have been friends ever since.

After two years at Miami, Bryan returned to Steubenville. He was lured by the fact that the College of Steubenville then had a tem and he had the opportunity to play quarterback. But after one season in that role, he couldn't resist the call when Andy Gustafson, then head coach of the University of Miami Hurricanes, beckoned with a package deal that lured "about a half-dozen valley guys" to the land of palm trees.

"I didn't letter down there," Bryan emphasizes. "As I recall, only one of our group, Ted Buoyoucas, really played. But I got my degree from Miami."

That degree helped him to land a coaching job back home as assistant to Ray Hoyman in football and to Ang Vaccaro in basketball at Steubevnille High for the 1951-52 school year. He was also head golf coach.

In the summer, he coached an all-star team from what was called "the Little Bigger League", for Little League graduates, to a state championship.

Bryan was destined to coach football under not only Hoyman but Bill Abraham and hal Paul. Finally, Hoyman returned to the job for a second time around and when he retired to his farm, his backfield coach, Abe Bryan, was tapped by the Steubenville Board of Education for the No. 1 job.

Bryan took over the Big REd reins in 1964. He went 4-6 in his first season at the helm against a rugged schedule but in '65 St4euvenville showed ne muscle as it won eight games and lsot only to Massillon (20-14) and Warren harding (10-8).



A year later, Big Red was one of the state's touted powers. In fact, after eight games, Steubenville – led by Dwight Sims and Mike Palmer – was not only undefeated but ranked No. 1 in the state by the press service polls, with victoreis over Akron Hoban, Clevland Glenville, Weirton, Warren harding, Cincinnati Taft, Toledo Macomber, Canton McKinley and toledo Scott to its credit.

However, Massillon claimed a 12-0 nod over the Big.Red and that denied Steubevnille a perfect seson. The next week, Big Red closed its outstanding season with a 34-8 trimming of Steubenville Catholic.

That season was enough to have Bryan hailed as a Dapper Dan "Man of the year" choice, an honor he shared with Glenn Trout, who had a perfect record team at Stanton Local High at Irondale. They were honored at what was the onlyJune banquet the club ever had.

Bryan was also hailed as Eastern Ohio "Coach of the Year."

In the 1967 campaign, Big Red proved it was no one-year wonder. Again Bryan's charges went 9-1, with the only loss to Massillon, 26-16, and with victories over Cleveland JFK and Glenville, Topledo Scott, Warren harding, Canton Lincoln, Canton McKinley, Columbus DeSales, Weirton, and Steubenville Catholic.

The STeubers slumped to 5-5 in '68 but cme back to go 7-2-1 in '69 and 6-4 in '70. The '71 season saw only four victories recorded in 10 games but in '72 Bryan's charges went 7-3.

After that season, the coach gave up the reins to become athletic director.

Bryan was president of the Ohio High School Football Coaches hall of Fame in 1970. He was also elected to the national Federation High School "Hall of Fame."

In 1976, after he had left coaching, he was inducted into the Ohio High School Athletic Association Hall of Fame. He had been instrumental, whilean officer of the coaches' organization, in the adoption of the football playoff plan inOhio.

When he joined Boich Mining, he was personnel and safety director. For the last six years, he has been president. He is also a director of theOhio Valley coal Operators Association.

Bryan was hard hit by the death of his beloved wife, Geraldine, mother of their nine children, last November. he is indeed proud of his four sons and five daughters.

GEORGE STRAGER 1992 Hall of Fame Inductee

The winingest football coach in Ohio Valley history, the late George Strager, is going to enter the Dapper Dan Hall of Fame posthumously.

Strager, in a coaching career that emcompassed the years from 1950 through 1987, registered 246 victories against 115 losses and 15 ties.

A victim of a fatal heart attack in early March of 1990, Strager has been voted into the Upper Ohio Valley Dapper Dan shrine in his first appearance on the ballot.

The McKeesport, Pa., native will be inducted during ceremonies at the 26th Valley Dapper Dan Banquet at the Wheeling Civic Center on Sunday, February 16.

His two daughters, Amy Strager and Kim (Mrs. Wayne) Smith, and his sons, Scott and Duke, are expected to be present for the ceremonies, along with a large number of other relatives, friends and admireres.

A product of Salem College, where he was an All-West Virginia Conference performer, Strager began his coaching career at Sistersville High School in 1950. His last head job was at St. Clairsville, where he piloted the Red Devils for 19 years, but his last two years in coaching were at Bethany College, as an assistant under Wally Neel.



At St. Clairsville, the personable Strager posted an impressive record of 134 victories against 41 losses and nine ties. He produced three undefeated teams and twice took his gridders to the Ohio state playoffs.

Strager came from Combridge to the Belmont County seat in 1969 and immediately produced an unbeaten team (9-0), which featured speedy tailback Jeff Rice. His '78 Red Devils, led by future Ohio State and NFL star Tim Spencer, went 10-0 and won the OVAC 3-A chapionsh. His '85 club also went 10-0.

His 1983 team also was unbeaten in regular-season action but lost in the Ohio playoffs. He also piloted St. C. into the state playoffs in '86. The Red Devils were OVAC triple-A champions that year and reached the semifinals of the playoffs with victories over Ironton and Orrville before a 22-21 loss to Chagrin Falls Kenston in the semifinals to finish at 11-2.

Strager also was selected to receive the News-Register Award as the OVAC "Coach of the Year" for the 1986-87 school term.

He launched his coaching career when he signed on as an assistant to Ralph Mendenhall at Sistersville. He subsequently became head coach in three sports and piloted a West Virginia small-school championship football team in 1953 when hs Tigers went 10-0-1.

Clarksburg Notre Dame was his next stop and he coached both football and basketball there. Hired by Nick Mansuetto, then athletic director at Wheeling Central, he produced a grid team in 1962 that was unbeaten until a 13-7 loss to Charleston Catholic in the W.Va. Catholic championship game. Mike Young and Jim Thomas, now head coaches at S. Clairsville and Wheeling Central, respectively, were on his team.

In '63, Strager directed Central to its first undefeated season, marred only by a tie with Pittsburgh South Hills Catholic. The Maroon Knights climaxed that glorious campaign with a 40-6 revenge bashing of Charleston Catholic in the state title game.

In '64, genial George moved on to Cambridge but retruned to Wheeling Stadium that summer to coach the West Virginia team in the Ohio-W.Va. All-Star Charity Football game. He would subsequently pilot the Ohio forces in this mid-summer classic twice.

Duke Strager played for his father at Cambridge, where the Strager family put in five years before settling in St. Clairsville. The younger Strager went on to play collegiately at Virginia Tech. He later became an assistant coach under his father at St. C. and is now defensive ends coach at Virginia Tech, located at Blacksburg, Va.

George also stepped into a breech at St. Clairsville, when the school needed a basketball coach, and gave the Red Devils two successive winning seasons in the hoop sport.

He not only started Tim Spencer on a career that led to Ohio State, the USFL and NFL but tutored Shawn Vincent, now of the Pittsburgh Steelers, and Boby Lyons, who has played with both the Cleveland Browns and Minnesota Vikings.

The long-time coach was also a valuable teacher, with a full schedule of classes at St. Clairsville. And a busy life became even busier after the devastting death of his beloved wife, Lu, in 1978 as he stepped into provide virtually a dual role to his younger children, Scott and Amy.

Both Scott and Amy are now graduates of Ohio State University. Scott is now working in Columbus and Amy is ready to enter the teaching field in elementary education. Kim, of course, is still a resident of St. Clairsville.

The Ohio Valley Football Coaches Association took note of Strager's accomplishments last winter by electing him to its Hall of Fame. Now the Dapper Dans are going to honor his memory with representation in their "Hall", which has admitted a distinguished array of athletes, coaches and others with major accomplishments in sports – locally, nationally and internationally.

LAFFERTY LEGEND



Mr. Ernest L. Albanese, son of Rev. Gaetano and Emilia Albanese, was born at Scottdale, Pa. on September 30, 1909. Mr. Albanese has been a forceful, dynamic leader in Belmont County educational circles for 60 years as teacher, coach, administrator of Lafferty & Union Local Schools; Director, Unified Purchasing of Belmont County Schools; Chairman, Belmont County Board of Education. He has given service to education and young people for sixty years, 1931 - 1991. He has been a community leader, a strong family man, and a recognized authority in areas of public adminstration, school law, and finance. His participation and interest in athletics has been lifelong. He has held key leadership posts in nearly every organization to which he has belonged. His career is underscored by a distinguished miltary service record in WW II, having served in the U.S. Navy, active duty, 1943 - 1946; with the U.S. Navy 7th Fleet Service Force; and the U.S. Navy Reserve, 1946 - 1969, retiring with the rank of Lt. Commander. His wife, Hazel Virginia

Johnson, and he have been married more than 55 years. They have three children: Ernest Jr., a gratduate of West Point, class of 1969, where he rose to rank of Captain before leaving the U.S. Army; daughter Lynn (Mrs. Robert M. Blaney), Ohio University class of 1970; and daughter Cylnthia Peroni, a graduate of the University of Cincinnati. Mr. Albanese adminstered the C.E.T.A. Titles 2 & 6 programs for Belmont County and has brought help to all schools involved.

Mr. Albanese chaired the Eastern Ohio Six Man Football Founders Committee in 1936. He was a charter member of the Ohio High Schools Association Officials, 1936 - 1966; a member of the Ohio Valley Officials Association, 1936 - 1966; graduated from Muskingum College, where he lettered in football, basketball and track, in 1931, and is a member of their Sphinx Club.

His overall coaching record was: won - 360; lost - 123; tied - 5, for a winning percentage of .738 - all sports. These included: basketball - five county championships, two sectional championships; basketball - six county tournament championships, two sectional championships, eight county league cahampionships; football - five undefeated (six man) seasons; girls basketball - two county championships. Mr. Albanese was an innovative coach, who was ahead of his time. He was the "Red" Auerboch and Paul Brown of his era. He was blessed with the ability to discern the weakness of any team and make the necessary adjustments and find a way to defeat the opposition.

His professional memberships, community and civic activities, educational career highlights and awards/ sepcial citations are too numerous to list, but among them are: "Honor Citation Award" from Ohio Association of School Administrators, and the "Outstanding Leadership Award". The Flushing Masonic Lodge, of which he is a 58 year member, honored him on September 14,1991, with the prestigious "Service to Community Award" and this was supplemented by the following: "E.L. Albanese Day" in Lafferty; Testimonial Endorsements from Union Township, Belmont County Democratic Executive Committee, Belmont County Board of Education, Belmont County Commissioners, Ohio House of Representatives, Ohio State Senate, Ohio Secretary of State, Ohio Governor, entered in the Congressional Record, Congressman Applegate, Sen. John Glenn, Sen. Howard Metzenbaum, President Bush, and the Dapper Dan Club of the Upper Ohio Valley.

Mr. Albanese is the epitome of one who has dedicated his life in service to others. This data is testimony that he is the personification of leadership and guidance to youth.

JIM TRESSEL & JIM DONNAN Dapper Dan Speakers

Jim Tressel and Jim Donnan, whose football teams battled it out for the NCAA Division 1-AA championship at Statesboro, Ga., in December, will meet again at the 26th annual Ohio Valley Dapper Dan Club dinner next Sunday, February 16, at the Wheeling Civic Center.

Tressel, head coach at Youngstown State University, and Donnan, head mentor at Marshall University will be spotlighted speakers at the colorful Dapper Dan banquet.

Tressel's Penguins scored 19 fourth-quarter points to come from behind and nip Donnan's Thundering Herd, 25-17, in the nationally televised championship game.

Tressel, a star quarterback at Berea High School and Baldwin-Wallace College, was named as the Ohio College "Coach of the Year" in the annual Columbus Dispatch poll of collegiate and university coaches of the Buckeye state. Moreover, he received the Kodak national "Coach of the Year" award in Division 1-AA.

Donnan, a native of Burlington, N.C., who was picked as the Atlantic Coast Conference "player of the year" in 1967 after starring as quarterback for North Carolina State, has been named "Sportsman of the Year" by the Huntington Hearald-Dispatch and is regarded as a strong candidate for the West Virginia sportswriters' "Coach of the Year" Award.

"Both Coach Tressel and Coach Donnan are in great demand as speakers and we are indeed fortunate to have both of them agreee to be with us," said Larry Falbo, the banquet chairman. "Both have been nationally recognized and are highly regarded among their peers. Their appearance on the same program should make for some interesting listeneing for our crowd."



Tressel, 39, comes from one of Ohio's most distinguished football families. His father, the late Lee Tressel, gained prominence as a coach at Massillon Washington High School and was head coach and director of athletics at Baldwin-Wallace College from 1958 to '80 and was a three-time Ohio "Coach of the Year" selection. Another of Lee Tressel'ssons, Richard, is head football coach and director of athletics at Hamline University at St. Paul, Minn., and a third son, David, is teaching in the Berea schools.

Jim Tressel was a three-sports star at Berea High and a four-year letterman while playing for his father at Baldwin-Wallace, where he was All Ohio Conference QB. He has been head coach at Youngstown since 1986 and has had his team in the NCAA playoffs four times. Prior to his appointemnt to the Youghnstown job, he was offensive backfield coach at the University of Akron from 1975 through '78; quarterback and receivers coach at Mimami University at Oxford in 1979-80; and quarterback coach at Syracuse University in 1981-82. He was also an assistant under Earle Bruce at Ohio State for three years (1983-85) during which he served as quarterback, wide receiver and runniong back coach – but not all at the same time. He was a member of the staff when the Buckeyes won Fiesta Bowl and Citrus Bowl championships.

Active in the Fellwosh of Christian Athletes, thies 39-year-old father of three has been hailed as one of the "outstanding young men of America." As a collegiate student, he won numerous academic honors, as well as athletic laurels.

Tressel and his wife, Carol, have two daughters and a son.

Donnan also knows something about cracking the books. He was an ACC All-Academic choice in 1966 and '67, in additiohn to being the all-conference quarterback in '67. He was an all state single wing tailback in football and an all-state guard in basketball, in addition to winning the state singles championship in tennis whiel at Watler Williams High School in Burlington, N.C. The MVP in the Liberty Bowl in 1967 when the Wolfpack defeated Georgia, 14-7, he was also ranked as one of N.C. State's all-time leading punters.



Donnan saw service as an assistant coach at N.C. State, Florida State, North Carolina, Kansas State, and Missouri before landing at Oklahoma, where he masterminded the explosive offense for Barry Switzer, he was the offensive coordinator when the Sooners won the national championship with a 25–10 victory over Penn State in the 1986 Orange Bowl. Oklahoma made three appearances in the Orange Bowl (and won there twice) during the years (1985-89) that Donnan was in Norman.

Marshall entrusted Donnan with the head job in 1990, after George Chaump had left Huntington to become coach at the U.S. Naval Academy. In his first head coach assignment, donnan went 6-5 in his baptismal season. Last fall, his team was only 4-3 after seven games but then won the last four games on the schedule to earn a playoff berth and swept to victories in the sudden-death action over Western Illinois, Northern Iowa and Eastern Kentucky to make its way to the championsh game.

Unbeaten at its new stadium, which opened this past season, Marshall was led by dazzling quarterback Michael Payton, who was named Southern Conference "Player of the Year", Associated Press All-American, and West Virginia "Amateur Athlete of the Year."

Donnan, now 46, and his wife, Mary, have two daughters and a son. The son, Todd, is a sub quarterback on the Marshall squad.
