Steubenville Big Red, Steubenville Catholic win OVAC crowns

Steubenville and Steubenville Catholic emerged as the team champions in the 1999 Ohio Valley Athletic Conference swimming meet, which concluded Saturday afternoon at the Big Red's Natatorium.

On the boys' side of the ledger, the Crusaders won the overall title with a total of 490 points, outdistancing city rival Steubenville, which was second with 472 points. Third at 351 in the 13-team field was John Marshall, while Linsly School was fourth at 294 and Brooke fifth with

In the girls' division, another bat-tle of the Steubenville city rivals emerged, but this time Big Red claimed top honors with 528.5 points. Catholic Central took second at 506. Both teams were way ahead of third-place Linsly School, which had 257 points. Brooke was fourth at

Two meet records and one pool mark fell in the boys' competition. Steubenville's Mike Carmine won the diving crown with an OVAC championship meet total of 294.35




