The fourth inning explosion was led by Union Local's Michelle Marling who plated home the first Lady Buckeye's setting the table for five more Ohio runs.

St.Clairsville's Becky Olinski was up next and hammered a single through the gap bringing home another run. Shadyside standout Kim

Duvall would follow later in the inning with a bases loaded hit. The Tiger outfielder fought back in the count and lined a base hit down the right field line to score a pair of Ohio runs. After four innings the Ohioans held a 6-0 advantage.

In the fifth it was more Ohio offense and this time it was Bellaire's standout senior Rachel Frizzi doing the damage. Frizzi blasted an RBI single to increase the Lady Buckeye's



lead. Steubenville's pitching ace Shannon D'Arrora came up with the bases loaded and drew a walk that stretched the Ohio lead to 9-0 after, the top half of the fifth inning.

The Ohio squad would go on to score one run in the sixth inning and add four more in the top of the ninth allowing a variety of Buckeye pitchers to take the mound. Beallsville's Erica Nippert, Olinski, and St. John's Scarlett Lynn all pitched scoreless innings in relief.

Along with the softball the participants were honored by the OVAC and seemed to enjoy playing in the contest as much as the large crowd enjoyed watching it
