While the Steubenville city teams dominated on the scoreboard at the end of the day, there were plenty of individual laurels to go around.


There were two multiple winners in the boys' meet and each one broke a pool record in the process.





pool. "We have a lot of seniors and it s going to be tough without them next year, but I'm glad they ve had the season they did this year. I'm really proud of them." competition.


