





Cadet Boys Are OVAC Champs

Alex Kepner captured the No. 1 singles title, and the Linsly

ons Thursday at West Liberty State College.

The Cadets finished with an overall score of 21, topping sec-ond-place Brooke (17), and third-place Wheeling Park (12).

Scores from the doubles play Tuesday and singles competition Thursday are added together to determine the overall champion.

Other individual champions were Wheeling Park's Adam Swenson in No. 2 singles, Brooke's John McLane in No. 3, and Oak Glen's Justin Thomas in No. 4.

Kepner defeated Brooke's Colin Rojak 10-5 in the No. 1 title match, completing a run which also saw Kepner top Steubenville's David Fatula (10-7) in the semifinals and Park's Kody Tuttle (10-0) in the second round.

Rojak defeated Weirton Madonna's Josh Yacoville, East Liverpool's Sara Payne, and

John Marshall's Mike Abraham. In the No. 2 championship, Swenson beat Linsly's Rasto Kret by a 10-5 count. Swenson reached the title match by defeating Indian Creek's Justin Foust (10-2), John Marshall's Phil Fahnestock (10-8), and Brooke's Tyler Kowcheck (10-7).

McLane captured the No. 3 title by defeating East Liverpool's Zack Kinsey 10-5, while Thomas won the No. 4 crown with a 10-5 win over Wheeling Park's Jeremy McClelland.

McLane cruised in his first two matches by beating Indian Creek's John Ensell (10-1) and St. Clairsville's Christian Gabis (10-4), before winning a close one against John Marshall's Rick Minter (11-9).

Thomas defeated Weir's Chad Camp (10-6) and Brooke's Joe McLane (10-3) on his way to the title match.

Oak Glen and East Liverpool tied for fourth place with nine wins each. Steubenville, Weirton Madonna, and Cambridge tied for sixth (5), while St. Clairsville and Wheeling Central each had four wins to tie for ninth.Weir and Indian Creek finished with one win apiece.

Wheeling Park High School's boys and girls tennis teams will be seeking their third straight Ohio Valley Athletic Conference championship when the 2003 tournament begins on Monday at West Liberty State College.

The Edgar Martin Tennis Courts on the Hilltopper campus will be the scene for all four days of this year's event. Girls' Doubles competition starts at 2 p.m. Monday, with the Boys' Doubles unfolding on Tuesday at the same time.

Singles competition is set for Wednesday and Thursday, with 8 a.m. starts both days. The girls' singles champions will be deter-mined on Wednesday, followed by the boys' competition Thursday.

The 15 schools represented in the boys' brackets are Weir, Weirton Madonna, Steubenville, Weirton Madonna, Steubenville, East Liverpool, Indian Creek, Oak Glen, Brooke, St. Clairsville, Wheeling Park, Linsly School, Wheeling Central, Cambridge, Zanesville, John Marshall and Magnolia. A total of 12 teams will be vying for the girls' champi-onship. They are Wheeling Park, Magnolia John Marshall

Magnolia, John Marshall, Wheeling Central, Linsly School, Mount de Chantal, St. Clairsville, Brooke, Oak Glen, Indian Creek, Weir and Weirton Madonna.

Both tournaments will also crown individual champions in four singles and three doubles divisions. A win in each match will earn one point for their respective teams.

Total points garnered by each singles and doubles participant will determine the overall team champion in both divisions.

Graduation last spring claimed most of the top performers in the boys' division. Returning in the No. 3 singles is Brooke's John McLane, who was the 2002 run-ner-up and has a 15-2 record against OVAC opponents this spring.

Chad Camp of Weir was on the winning No. 2 doubles squad. He is playing No. 1 sin-gles for the Red Riders this spring with a 7-5 mark against conference foes. The runner-up No. 2 doubles team of Colin Rojak and Tommy Yarter, from



Brooke, are intact this season.

One of the top contenders for the No. 1 singles title should be Linsly's Mike Bialock, currently 9-2. The Cadets also look solid in the other three singles divisions with Jeff Morris (10-1) playing No. 2; Roscoe Kret (9-1), playing No. 3; and Alex Kep-

ner (10-1), playing No. 4. All of the records listed include OVAC play only. Jeremy McClelland (4-1) of

Wheeling Park is another top No. 1 singles entrant. McLane moved up to the No. 2 singles division this year, while John Marshall's top hope for a singles win might be in fourth division where Mike Abraham owns an 8-1 record.

Park has another possibility in the third singles in Adam Swenson, currently 6-0. With the 2002 No. 1 singles




