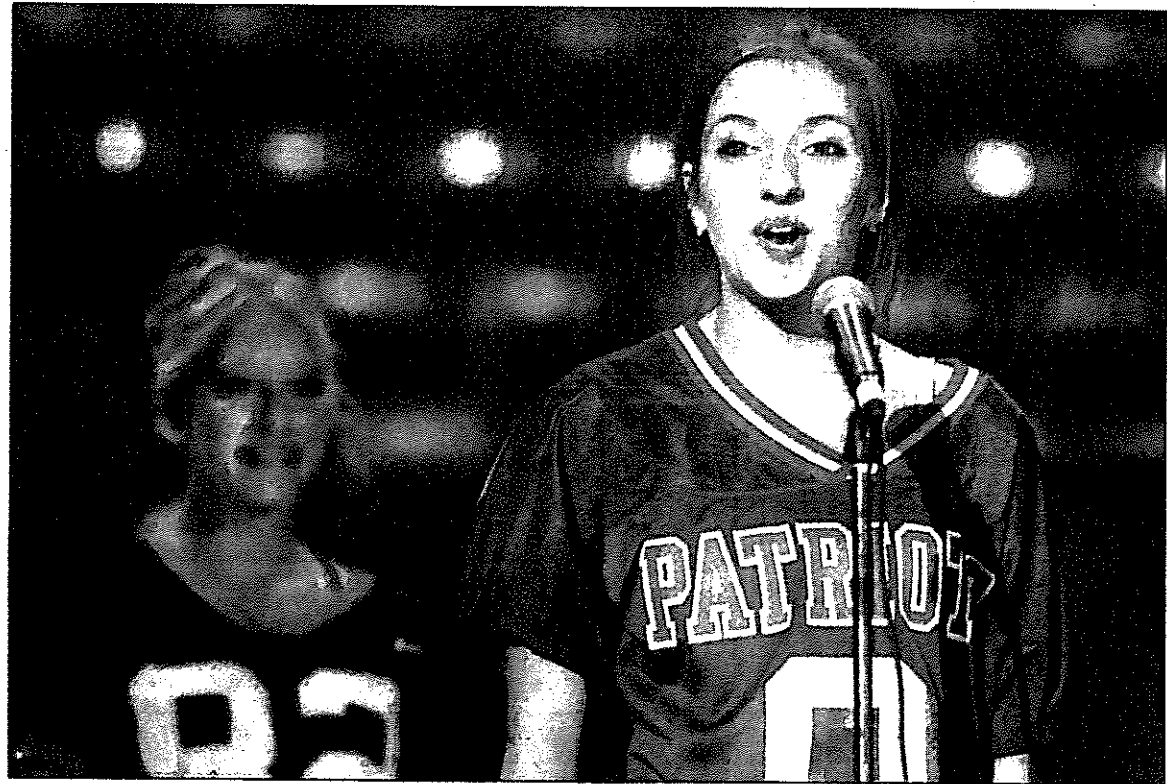

The Queens of Queens Talent and Gown Competition will be held Friday, July 22, at 7 p.m. at the WesBanco Arena in Wheeling. Tickets for the Queen of Queens Competition may be purchased at the door the night of the performance for \$5. The talent competition will showcase a wide variety of talents including singing, dancing, instrumental performances and sign language.

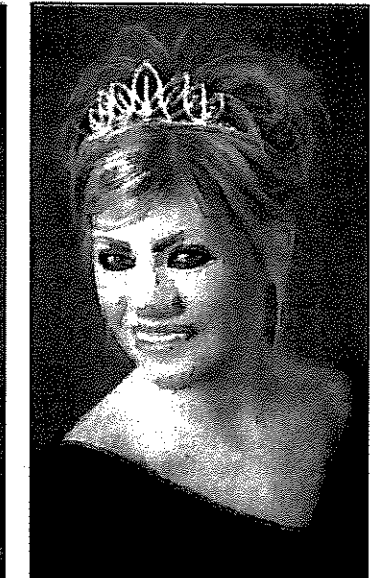
The entire 2005 All-Star Football Classic including the McDonald's All-Star Band will be televised live on Sunday, July 24, starting at 7 p.m.



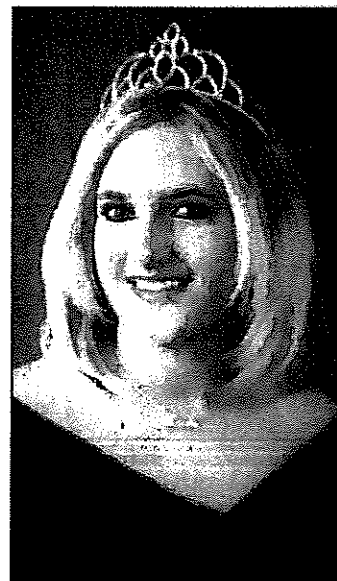

## **Lifestyles Guidelines**

**DEADLINE** for The Times Leader's daily publication is 10 a.m. at the Martins Ferry office, the day preceding the publication date. Items such as club dates, church women, twigs, garden clubs and dances will not be accepted over the phone. Every item submitted should include a name and phone number in case further information is needed. All items are printed as space permits.

**WEDDINGS:** Only weddings which occur on the weekend of publication will be used on Sunday, and run with a 2-column picture. Weddings which are submitted late, (after NOON on Tuesday), or after the wedding, will be published in the daily paper 2-column picture. No descriptions of bridal gowns will be used. Wedding and engagement pictures will be mailed back if a self-addressed, stamped envelope is submitted. Otherwise, the pictures can be picked up in one of the newspaper offices within two weeks of publication. Color wedding photographs, 2 column by about 5.25 inches, will be printed at a cost of \$20. Information used and other guidelines

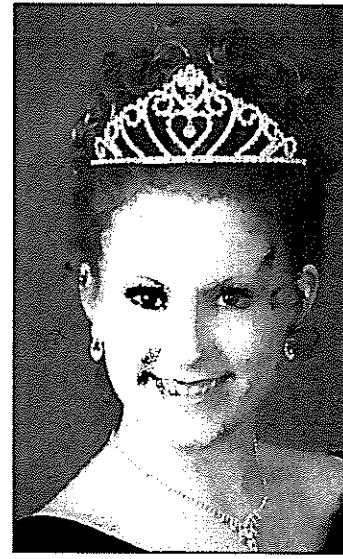
are the same as those for black and white weddings.

**ANNIVERSARIES:** Current pictures of couples celebrating a wedding anniversary will be used at five-year intervals, beginning with the 25th anniversary (for example, 25th, 30th, 35th, etc.) Pictures will be used with all anniversaries after the 50th. Write-ups will be used beginning with 25th anniversary. A 2-column space will be allocated for anniversary pictures with couples having the option of running a 2-column current picture OR a 1-column current picture and a 1-column picture taken around the time of the nuptials.

**CHILDREN'S BIRTHDAYS:** There is a \$10 charge for publishing children's birthday pictures, payable in advance. We reserve the right to edit submitted copy. Information used includes: parents' names, address, age, siblings, grandparents (living or deceased), living great-grandparents and godparents and party theme information. Age limit is 12 years. We will make every attempt to include picture on requested date.

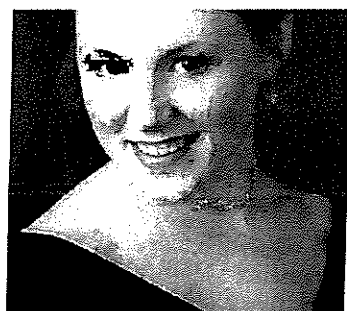
