The announcement of the winners will be at half time of the Rudy Mumley All-Star Football Classic on Sunday, July 23, at Wheeling Island Stadium.

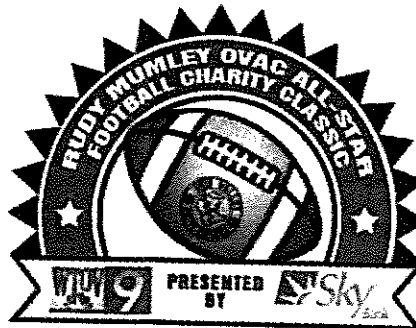
The Queen of Queens Talent and Gown Competition will be held on Friday, July 21, at 7 p.m. at the WesBanco Arena in Wheeling.
