Patriots claim first conference crown

WEST LIBERTY - The Parkersburg South girls' tennis team sent a simple message to their male counterparts - anything you can do, I can do better.

One day after the boys' team had an impressive performance winning the OVAC Tennis Tournament, the girls ran away from the pack early to win their first championship trophy in just their second season Thursday at West Liberty University.

The Patriots swept the singles portion of the tournament to go along with the No. 1 Doubles title won



Tuesday.

Kelsi Halbert (No. 1), Taylor Bush (No. 2), Merideth Dushkoff (No. 3), and Olivia Osborn (No. 4) were the happy recipients of first-place trophies from tournament director George Frazier.

"This was very important to us," Parkersburg South coach Marge Politz said. "It was a good opportunity for the girls to show what they can

"They are driven. They all played very well. They wanted it and they went and got it."


Parkersburg South finished with 24 points, well above the 15 totalled by Linsly, Wheeling Central, and Wheeling Park, last season's champion.

Last season. Wheeling Park tied with Parkersburg South in points, but was awarded the first-place trophy by virtue of more champions. This season, that is what did it in. Wheeling Park and Linsly each won a doubles title, but the Cadets claimed second place by having three finalists to Wheeling Park's two.

"We are real happy about it because we were about the fifth team in the regular season," Linsly coach Dave Riethmiller said. "The girls played really well and really rose to the occasion. This was better than anyone could have ever expected."

Linsly's Morgan McDermott was down 6-1 in her semifinal match against Wheeling Central's Alex

Bird, McCormick win individual crowns

WEST LIBERTY — It might be new to the OVAC, but Parkersburg South has already left its mark on the conference.

The Patriots pulled away from Linsly down the stretch to claim the school's first OVAC tennis title, winning the boys' championship Wednesday at West Liberty University.

Add this title to the wrestling crown the team won last January and Parkersburg South is looking more and more like a force to be reckoned with.

OVAC Boys' Tennis

"It feels pretty good and we are real excited," Parkersburg South coach Scott Ash said. "This is the second year for us in the OVAC and this is our first title, so it's pretty special. We were third place last year and this is a step up for us. The kids worked hard for it."

The Patriots had a participant in the finals of each of the four singles brackets, with Spencer Tebay winning at No. 1 and Joe Holland winning his second consecutive title at No. 3.

Linsly's Jose Bird won at No. 2, while Wheeling Central's Neil McCormick was the champion at No.

"They are pretty deep," Ash said.

"When we go next week for regionals, being in this type of atmosphere is going to help."

Tebay and Martins Ferry's Anderson Riberio had what was arguably the match of the day in their final showdown.

The two battled back and forth the entire match before Tebay won the final three points to take the match at 10-8.

"Spencer played out of his head to beat Anderson," Ash said.

For Riberio, it was a strong first performance.

The senior from Brazil is the lone Martins Ferry tennis player and he made his outing a memorable one.

In the semifinals, Riberio outlasted last season's No. 1 singles champ —








