Baker, Eaton shine

• Each wins two golds; Linsly sweeps small-school crowns; Brooke boys win

STEUBENVILLE — The 2012 OVAC Swimming Championships new format reduced the number of swimmers and events Saturday at the Crimson Center's Natatorium, but did not reduce the attendance. The crowds still filled the balcony to capacity level as fans cheered on Linsly as their boys' and girls' teams each successfully defended their small school championship.



There were changes in the big school results as Wheeling Park's girls' were unable to defend their big school title as Morgantown won the girls' title.

The Brooke boys' won the big school titles again this season passing runner-up Parkersburg South with a win the final event of the afternoon the 400 Freestyle Relay.

The Red Devils of St. Clairsville claimed third place in the boys' small school division behind the efforts of Michael Eaton with a pair of gold medals and Eric Eaton with a gold and silver. The

pair also combined with teammates Nick Tobin and Michael Blackwell to win a silver in the 200 Medley and a bronze in the 200 freestyle relays.

"This was the first time any relay team from St. Clairsville made the podium," said St. C. head coach Melanic Eaton. "I am very happy with the way we competed today, with just nine boys on our team compared to 14 or 15 on other teams. I thought we did very well considering."

Melanie, both a mom and coach to sons Michael and Eric, was especially excited about the 100 Freestyle sprint event where Michael avenged an earlier loss to Brooke's Josh Harrick.

"He has longer arms and out-touched me at the finish," said Eaton of their previous encounter. "This time I knew what I had to do to stay far enough ahead that it would not happen again."

Barnesville earned two gold medals and one bronze medal in the boys' events to help earn the team a third place finish in the small school division. Christopher

Baker won both the boys 200 Yard Individual Medley and the 500-yard freestyle event. Hunter Yevincy won a bronze the 100-yard backstroke.

Martins Ferry did not place a swimmer on the podium for the first time since 2004.

"We have just six girls and four boys this year and it is a disappointment," reflected Purple Riders' head coach Nick Levi. "We did not win a medal in 1999, but there were no boys on the team that year."

In the girls' events local swimmers claimed two bronze and one silver in three events. Shana Pramik of Bellaire was in a deadheat for the silver medal in the 50-yard freestyle. St. Clairsville's Carli Falcone placed third in the 100 breaststroke and Katie Albert of East Richland Christian garnered bronze in the 200 Freestyle.

Russell Wilson threw touchdown passes for the North. Purdue kicker Carson Wiggs put it away with his third short field goal, a 28-yarder with 4:11 left in the showcase for senior NFL prospects.

Boise State's Kellen Moore led that clinching 13-play drive that consumed 8:36 with the help of a running clock.

It snuffed out a spark provided by South quarterback Nick Foles of Arizona, who started his career with Cousins at Michigan State.

Foles had gotten the South into the end zone by firing a 20-yard touchdown pass to Arizona teammate Juron Criner with 12:55 left in the game.

It was an up-and-down day for a crew of quarterbacks with sparkling college credentials, but threw a combined five interceptions.

It was mostly up for Pead, who only had 74 yards on eight punt returns as a senior. The 5-foot-10, 193-pounder did rush for 1,338 yards and 12 touchdowns and gained a team-high 31 yards on eight carries in the Senior Bowl.

"I think he may have opened some eyes," said Minnesota Vikings coach Leslie Frazier, who led the North. "Some people may have wondered if he can do certain things. I think he may have answered some questions today."

Cousins completed 5 of 11 passes for 115 yards but threw an interception. Moore, who won a college-record 50 games as a starting quarterback, was 6-of-12 passing for 50 yards, and had a 23-yarder to set up the final field goal that put the North up two scores.

Wilson completed 4 of 7 passes for 45 yards with an 8-yard touchdown pass to Marvin Jones.

If beating the Friars was one small step, knocking off the Hoyas was a good-sized leap.

The return of point guard Tray Woodall from injury has given the Panthers a sense of identity they've lacked this season. Pitt struggled offensively without their only proven ballhandler. Though he wasn't as sharp as he was in his second game back against Providence - when he scored 17 points and made all four of his 3-pointers - he didn't have to be.

Woodall finished with just four points but added a game-high 10 assists while leading an offense that had little trouble sharing the ball. Pittsburgh finished with 20 assists on 25 field goals, picking apart Georgetown's defense with relative ease.

Pitt took control with arguably its best 10 minutes of the season, using a 15-1 run midway through the first half to go in 29-12.

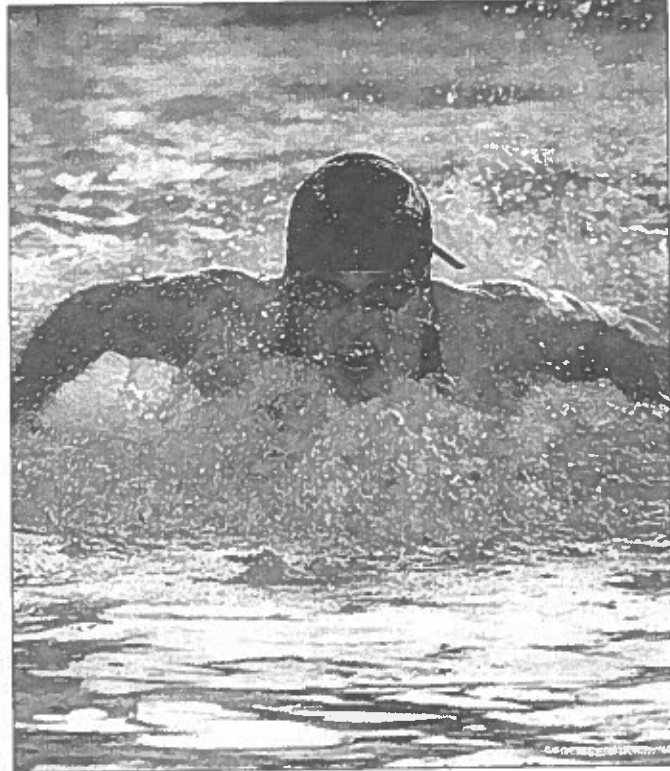
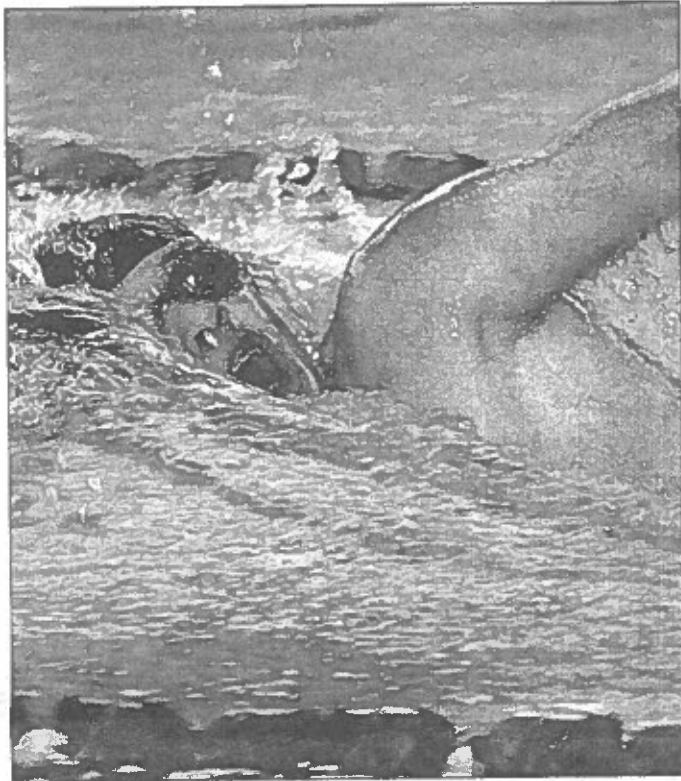

Linsly Sweeps OVAC Swimming Titles

Brooke boys, MHS girls claim Big School crowns

STEUBENVILLE — The Linsly boys and Morgantown girls swim teams dominated Saturday at the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference championships at Steubenville High School's natatorium.

The Cadets finished with 357 points to easily outdistance second-place Brooke (254) for the overall title.

"Our kids had an excellent day," Cadets coach Bill Brubaker said. "This is one meet we point toward since we can't go any further with most of them, although we will have kids going to the Eastern Interscholastic Swim Championships in February."

"We set goals at the beginning of the season seeing where we can improve and we did that."

That they did.

Linsly won five of the 11 events and junior Zach Hamm had a hand in four of them.

He won the 100 fly (55.81) and 100

back (57.99) and teamed with senior Michael Joseph, junior Chris Reardon and freshman Drew Bastian to capture the 200 medley relay (1:48.67) and the 200 free relay (1:36.20).

Freshman Cameron Thompson won the 200 free (1:55.61) by more than 6 seconds.

"We had some really great swims by a lot of kids," Brubaker said. "I have to give a special mention to senior Adam Uraco, who's had a great year for us. Unfortunately, he was the bridesmaid today, getting fourth in three events (200 free, 500 free, 400 free relay). He's worked really hard since he started as a freshman. He had never swam before and has progressed every year."

Rounding out the top 10 were: Parkersburg South (208), St. Clairsville (193), Wheeling Park (160), Steubenville (145), Beaver Local (140), Cambridge (133) and Wheeling Central and University (130).

The Maroon Knights finished second to

Linsly in the small school division.

Brooke won the large school division for the third year in a row.

"It's a dynasty now," Bruins head coach Gina Reitter said with a smile, minutes before being dunked in the pool for the third straight year.

"Our kids swam well. This is a stepping stone for us as we get ready for regionals in two weeks. It's always an honor to win an OVAC championship."

Brooke's Kevin Rowland, Brad Wilcox, Jordan Harlan and Alex Salakovich touched the wall first in the 400 free relay in 3:41.58, nearly four seconds in front of Big Red's Dominic DiCarlo, Zach Moustader, Alex Nagy and Cliff Larsen.

It was Brooke's only victory in 11 races.

Josh Harrick finished second in the 100 free (51.25) to St. Clairsville's Michael Eaton (50.93) and second in the 100 back

(58.59) to Hamm.

"Sometimes it's not your day individually, but it was our day as a team and it feels great," Reitter said. "I was happy with the way everybody performed (Saturday)."

Morgantown swam away with the girls competition with its 358 points, 104 more than Wheeling Park.

Rounding out the top 10 were: Linsly (185), Parkersburg South (166), Steubenville Catholic (153.5), Weir (146), Brooke (129), John Marshall (124.5), Wheeling Central (124) and University (109).

The Cadets won the small school title and the Crusaders were runners-up.

The Patriots' Cecelia Jebbia grabbed the 200 free (2:00.39) and the 500 free

(5:22.63). Teammate Kaitlyn Curnes won the 100 breaststroke (1:11.61). The pair teamed with Madie Friday and Stacy Chaplin to win the 200 medley relay (2:00.01).

Weir senior Kelsey Ferguson closed her OVAC career with a victory in the 200 IM and teamed with Alexis Virtue, Dominique Gilbert and Allyson Martin to place second in the 200 medley relay (2:01.18) and third in the 200 free relay (1:51.21) and 400 free relay (4:05.36). School records were set in the 200 medley and 400 free relays.

"I love swimming with my team," said Ferguson, whose 2:11.06 in the IM broke her school record. "Swimming with my team is a lot more fun than swim-

ming my individual events.

"I knew we had a good chance to podium in all three. I would much rather have a third place with them than a first place by myself. It worked out perfectly. It's a great thing to share with each other."

Parkersburg South's Audrey Sweeney won the 50 free (25.46) and 100 free (55.35).

Linsly's Zoe Scarpone won the 100 fly (1:01.59).

Morgantown's Ileana Ille, Olivia Holehouse, Jenna Pierce and Katie Murto captured the 200 free relay in 1:46.43, which set a meet and pool record.

Pierce, Holehouse, Murto and Rachel Adams won the 400 free relay in 3:53.01, which set a meet, pool and open record.

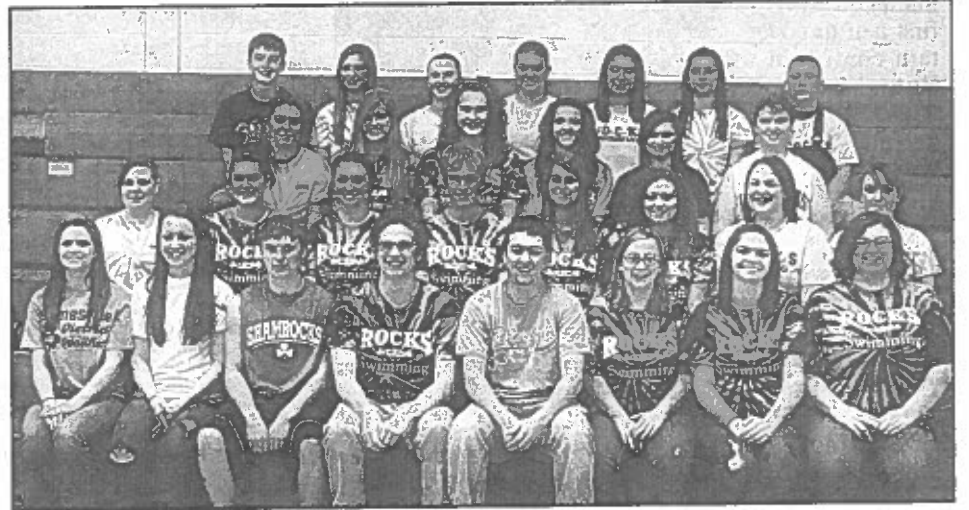
