# Cambridge Claims Boys' Title

**Engstrom brothers lead** Bobcats in final round

WEST LIBERTY — It was a bit nippy on the hilltop Thursday. But it wasn't enough to cool off Cambridge's rackets.

The Bobcats, behind twin brothers Cody and Connor Engstrom, claimed their first boys' title since 2007 as the OVAC Tennis Championships concluded at West Liberty University's Edgar Martin Tennis Complex.

Cambridge finished what it started Tuesday when it led after the doubles

"I'm very pleased," Bobcats coach Mike Denniston said. "They played hard and well and played with class and good sportsmanship.

'We knew it would be a tough tournament ... it always is. We're just pleased to come out on top."

The Bobcats finished with 20 points to claim the overall and Class 5A crowns. University followed with 16 and Morgantown had 15. Parkersburg South scored 12 points, followed by Brooke (11), Wheeling Park (8), John Marshall (6), Wheeling Central and East Liverpool (4), Linsly, Madonna and Indian Creek (2), and Steubenville and Weir (1). Oak Glen didn't score.

Wheeling Central and East Liverpool tied for the Class 4A-1A crown. Tournament Director George Frazier said after going through all of the tiebreaker scenarios both teams remain deadlocked. Therefore, both teams will receive a trophy and be invited to the OVAC Banquet of Champions (May 13) where they will pick up their banners.

It was a banner day for the Engstroms, who also teammed up to win the No. 1 Doubles crown Tuesday.

Cody Engstrom jumped out to an early lead against John Marshall's Hayden Blazer in the No. 1 Singles final and held on for an 8-5 victory.

Blazer, a junior, was the only area player to reach the finals.

Experience," Monarchs coach Mike Howard said about the difference in the match. "A little more experience. They both hit it hard. It was a good match.'

Howard said Blazer had a great season and he's looking forward to seeing what he can do in the West Virginia Class AAA regional tournament next Thursday and Friday back at West Liberty.

## Cambridge **Boys Jump** To Lead

### Morgantown beats Brooke in doubles

WEST LIBERTY - The OVAC Tennis Championships featured boys' doubles Tuesday at West Liberty University under sunny skies and warm

temperatures.

Cambridge finished the first day of competition with champions in Nos. 1 and 2 doubles. The top-seeded tandem of Cody and Connor Engstrom earned its seeded title by capturing the final against Abe Valenzuela and Sven Wermuth of University High 8-6.

Cambridge's No. 2 tandem of Aaron Ruby and Kamden Payton, were unseeded and upset two seeds in a row to get to the final against second-seeded Grant Tebay and Juan Cardenas from Parkersburg South. Ruby and Payton won the final by a

8-6 score.

The No. 3 doubles position had seeded teams featuring Morgantown's Andrew McQuain and Iain McKay, playing the Brooke tandem of Chris Beaman and Austin Barnhart. Morgantown won the final by a score of 8-4.

The team scoring at the end of the first day of boys' competition has Cambridge in the lead with 10 points, followed by Morgantown and Parkersburg South with six points apiece.

# All Four No. 1s Claim Singles Titles



### Linsly captures Class 4A-1A crown

WHEELING — The move from West Liberty University to the Wheeling Park Tennis Bubble because of the weather did little to affect the outcome of the OVAC Girls' Tennis Championships.

Form held true for the most part Wednesday as all four No. 1 seeds claimed singles titles as the two-day event wrapped up.

University had two of the winners, and that was enough to lift the Hawks to their second straight overall and Class 5A championships.

Linsly captured the Class 4A-1A crown. The Cadets finished tied with Oak Glen in points, but won on the final tiebreaker — the team that has its No. 1 Doubles due advance furthest.

The Hawks accumulated 24 points, followed by Morgantown with 20 and Parkersburg South with 13. Linsly and Oak Glen had 11, followed by Wheeling Park with eight, John Marshall and St. Clairsville with four, Madonna and Wheeling Central with three, Brooke with two and Indian Creek one. Weir didn't score.

Jackie McDermott led the way for the Cadets, finishing second at No. 1 Singles to Morgantown's Stephanie Arnold, Arnold, the top seed, topped No. 2-seeded McDer-

Linsly captured the Class mott, 8-5, for her third straight 4-1A crown. The Cadets victory in the category.

"(Arnold) won most of the big points," Linsly coach Dave Riethmiller said. "Jackie had some game points and break points in those early games but still fell down, 4-0.

"Arnold played great. She was playing well in the big situations."

This was McDermott's first appearance at No. 1 Singles. The junior won the No. 2 Singles titles the last two years.

Linsly's Amika Ékenam advanced to the semifinals at No. 2 Singles, while teammate Emmy Weaver won a match at No. 3 Singles. Jasmine Shah also won a match at No. 4 Singles.

The Golden Bears Abbi Sayre reached the semis at No. 3 Singles.


