The 2017 OVAC Tennis Championships will be held at West Liberty University beginning Monday and running through Thursday. The tournament schedule for this year is different from previous years. The girl's and boy's competition will be held on consecutive days instead of alternating between the two for singles and doubles competition. Monday features girl's doubles and Tuesday features girl's singles. Play begins each day at 8:30 a.m.. Boy's doubles competition is Wednesday, and boy's singles is Thursday, also beginning at 8:30.

Matches will be moved to the Wheeling Park Bubble if weather does not permit play at West Liberty University. A champion and runner-up in both girl's and boy's school competition will be decided over the course of the 4-day tournament in two divisions again this year: 1A/4A schools and 5A schools. Each individual match win earns

a point for their school's team.

Singles and doubles champions and runners-up will also earn special individual awards in the various divisions.

The defending champions from 2016 are 5A: Morgantown High girls; 1A/4A: Linsly girls; 5A: University High boys; and 1A/4A: East Liverpool High boys. This year's team competition appears to be very evenly matched!

During the OVAC Tennis Championships, coaches will vote on a male and female player who best exhibits good sportsmanship while competing in the tournament to earn the Carol Strasser Sportsmanship Award. Strasser was a long time Ohio Valley tennis player/physical therapist who was known for outstanding sportsmanship and who served for several years as the OVAC Tennis Director. The award was created to honor her work and commitment to tennis and her good character.

West Liberty University will provide athletic trainers during the tournament and the West Liberty University men's tennis team will provide racquet stringing service during the week. The tournament seeding meeting will be held today at Wheeling Park High School beginning with the girl's seeding at 4 p.m. followed by the boy's seeding
