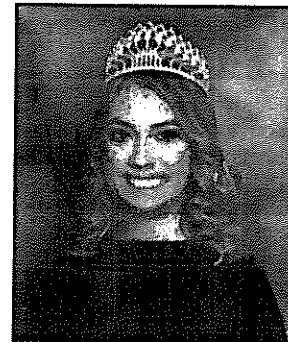

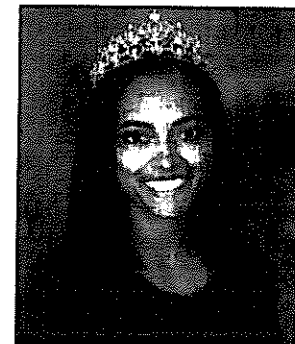

OVAC All Star Marching Band, Drill Team, cheerleaders and Queens.

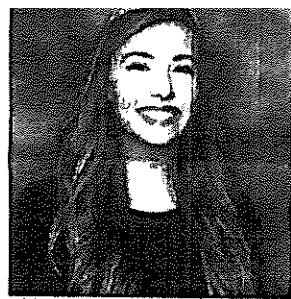

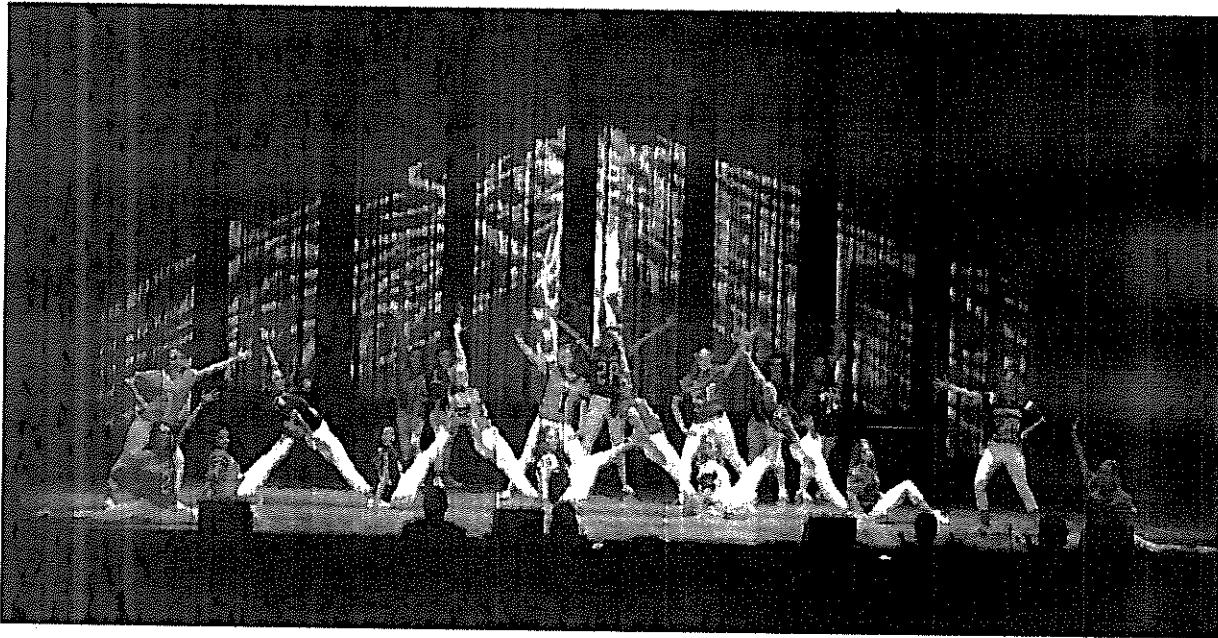
