

WELLSBURG - Right when the first horned sounded, it was clear the Wheeling Park and St. Clairsville swimming teams were in a time of 1:53.20. The time broke every on a mission.


With a reigning champion returning in four events, Wheeling Park coach Pat Durkin feels confident about this year's squads, but knows that they'll have to put
