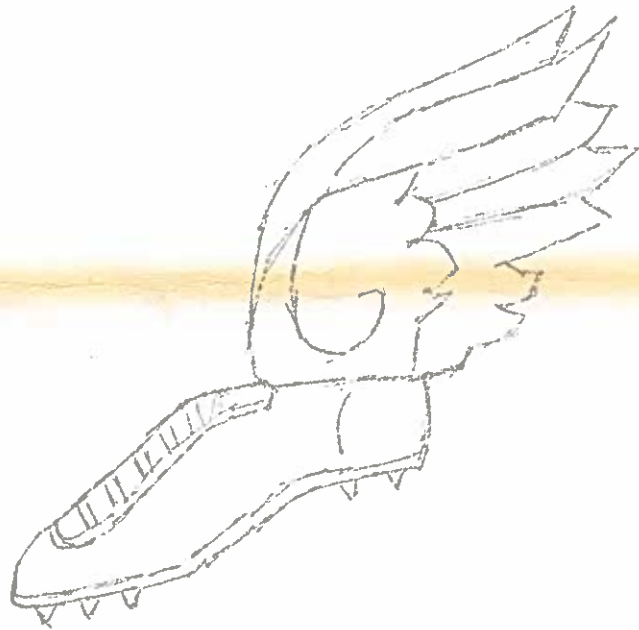

Today we pay tribute to a man that has been a credit to our community for over a decade. To all boys of our local schools, he has been an interested spectator and to some an inspirational crutch. Always interested in school and civic affairs along with his day to day duties connected with his pastorate at the First Evangelical and Reformed Church of Bellaire, he has always had time to lend a helping hand when needed.

Rev. Richards attended high school in Schwemksville, Pa. From there he attended Ursinus College, graduating in 1917 with a B.A. degree. His next two years were spent as a Trench Mortar platoon Sgt. in the 316th. infantry of the 79th Div. In 1922 he graduated from Central Theological Seminary of Dayton, Ohio with a Bachelor of Divinity Degree. Formally our very learned Minister finished his education by gaining his T.H.M. at Princeton Theological Seminary, Princeton, New Jersey. Another highlight in Rev. Richards education was his privilege of attending Cambridge University in 1919 as an exchange student. The opportunity to study at this fine English University stands high in his memory.

Athletically he lettered in Baseball in High School, being captain in his senior year, played baseball at Ursinus, was tennis champion at Central Theological Seminary along with playing baseball while attending school in England. Perhaps his keen interest in athletics was helped along its way by the experiences he gained as coach of Fairview High School, Dayton, Ohio for two years in both baseball. We are thankful for the help he has given us directly by officiating our track meets in the past.

We have given you a picture of our "Man of the Hour." Many more words of appreciation could be spoken in his behalf, but words alone can not express our gratitude for all he has done. The only words that can come close are: "THANKS and GOD BLESS YOU."
