JOHN MARSHALL IS HOST

Eismon Speaker at OVAC Dinner Meeting Tuesday

W. Gordon Eismon, executive secretary of the West Virginia Secondary Schools Activities Commission, will be the guest speaker at the coming dinner meeting of the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference.

Eismon will discuss the new National Federation high school football rules, which will be in vogue in both Ohio and West Virginia, and will also clarify some of the problems involved with all-star athletic contests.

The dinner meeting will be at 7 p.m. on Tuesday, Aug. 26, at John Marshall High School. Through arrangements made by Donald Haskins, new principal at John Marshall, dinner guests will have an opportunity to tour the school at 6 p.m.

Among items to be considered by the conference at the Tuesday night session will be (1) control of the Ohio - West Virginia all-star football game; (2) official membership for the new Brooke High School; (3) an increase in dues for the 1969-70 school year; and (4) the number of passes to be issued to each

school for conference events.

The annual Pepsi-Cola Award will be presented to John King, of Magnolia High School. Joe Oviets, head of the Moundsville Pepsi-Cola plant, will present a check for \$250 to young King.

Past president awards from the OVAC will go to H. G. Martin, Warwood principal who was conference president in the 1957-58 school year, and James Dixon, Bellaire superintendent who served in the 1958-59 school year.

Conference spring sports awards will also be presented. The awards follow:

TRACK — Class A, Powhatan, donor, Quay Mull of Mull Machine Co.; Class AA, Shadyside, donor Fred Tweedie; Class AAA, Wheeling, donor, Times-Leader.
